- Most referrals have come from Court Commissioner

New business

- Drug Court and SSTOP participants are now engaged in life skills and criminal thinking groups run by staff for those programs
- DHS has 3 assessors retiring in the very near future, so there will be a transition period where many new people are training
- DA's office applied for a grant to start a Misdemeanor Drug Diversion Program which could fall under the SAFE Streets umbrella. The grants have not yet been awarded
- OWI fast track program is on hold, waiting for the Drug Diversion grant
