COMMITTEE REPORTS

Supervisor Barker informed the Board that the Affirmative Action Committee met and will soon be distributing a copy of all the information gathered about Winnebago County.

1. STATUS REPORT ON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE REVISION – Jerry Bougie, Director of Planning & Zoning

Mr. Bougie called the Board's attention to the green sheet that was placed on their desks. This is a timeline of what has been happening since Planning & Zoning appeared before the Board in January. He told the Board that meetings had been conducted with the towns, and some minor changes in the text of the ordinance had been made. On March 1, a public meeting was held on the proposed ordinance. On March 5, the Planning and Zoning Committee voted to move the ordinance to the March 20th County Board Meeting for adoption of the new ordinance. This will also include Shore land and airport overlay sections. Mr. Bougie then took questions from the Board.

2. VOTER PHOTO ID LAW – Nadia Perez and Megan Wolfe of the Government Accountability Board

Ms. Perez started their PowerPoint presentation with some background on the court ruling that happened today, temporarily striking down the Voter ID Law. This means at the April 3rd election, people will not be asked to show photo ID. On April 16, there will be a trial to determine whether this becomes a permanent injunction.

Ms. Perez and Ms. Wolfe presented their PowerPoint presentation, which included the following highlights:

- Major Impacts of the Law
- Acceptable forms of Photo Identification
- Registration & Proof of Residence
- Election Day Voting
- Absentee Voting

After going through their presentation, Ms. Perez and Ms. Wolfe took questions from the Board. A copy of their PowerPoint Presentation is on file in the County Clerk's Office.
