Approve new coalition structure	Emily	 Emily passed out latest draft of re:TH!NK structure concentric circles- in the middle: Leadership Council/re:TH!NK staff next layer: Active Communities/Food systems (AC/FS) and Mental Health/Substance Abuse (MH/SA), Youth Coalition next layer: big items the coalition is working on (can change and fluctuate) last layer: all the other "things" going on; regional/multi-county organizations group discussion: with the two halves: AC/FS and MH/SA- will there be a merging of the current committees? whatever works best. If someone wants to work on specific projects, then maybe the committee level isn't best, and that's ok. We'll see how it'll morph over time. this new structure is more future-oriented; not as many silos of committees sometimes the work is happening in the broader circles (not just within re:TH!NK) 	 Latest draft of re:TH!NK structure approved Create companion documents for leaders and projects

Priorities for 2015	Emily	 staff have been talking a lot about what we do as staff vs. what we do as coalition Currently, there's a list of 15 priorities (several years old); we want to think about priorities being a little more generic; then each half (AC/FS and MH/SA) be more specific Ex. priority = built environment to help people be more active; then AC would figure out how to do that How do we succinctly answer "What does re:TH!NK do?" Think about going deeper with a few things at the coalition level rather than being spread thin on a lot of things at the coalition level; be thoughtful about what the priorities of the entire coalition should be; where do we need a lot of partners Should we wait to change priorities until 2015 CHIP since priorities may change after that? there may be changes in community needs 	Keep current list of re:TH!NK priorities until CHIP 2015 comes out, but rename to "re:TH!NK Goals and Strategies"





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		 If we keep the current document until 2015 CHIP comes out, the priorities are still relevant for now The current priorities seem more like goals in the strategic plan Regional CHIP: currently going on, includes Winnebago, Outagamie, and Calumet counties; Doug Gieryn is chair; Risk Behavioral Survey just completed and St. Norbert's is working with data, hopefully ready by April Substance Abuse may not be changed much from CHIP 2015 because their driving force is the DFC grant and the Heroin Taskforce was community driven with every CHIP, physical activity, nutrition, mental health, and substance abuse (alcohol) are always the priorities, but what is the order do we need to wait if the CHIP won't really change much? After the CHIP, there could be a surge from the community to work on these things we're flexible enough that when CHIP 2015 comes out, it should fit, but if something new comes out, we can add it; leave the 15 priorities right now, but name "re:TH!NK Goals and Strategies"

How the two halves want to function is kind of up to them. (How many chairs they want). How do the two halves connect to leadership council? Discussion: It may be too much of an ask to have people on both leadership council and chair the committees the leadership council can be more general/administrative It may be valuable to have a few committee chairs (not staff) in leadership council to advocate for community Suggestion to have a non-staff "community person" sit on both leadership and one of the halves; then serve as a liaison move from working board to more of a governing board- can be run by paid staff; include community leaders; advisory board for committees committees committees can come to the council to propose projects and give updates, the council may be able to give guidance without bias Summary: New version of the leadership committee: we would have two staff coalition coordinators; two liasons (one from each half; they may or may not be in leadership positions); Youth coalition rep; Doug/fiscal agent rep; 2-4-ish people to represent	possible new "leadership committee/board members" and send out before next LC meeting in March to decide who will contact who
