Funding	Sarah Wright/Heidi Keating	Sarah reported that re:TH!NK received the USDA Farm to School grant. The efforts will take place in the Oshkosh, Omro, and Winneconne school districts, and the funds will run over a two year period, starting on December 1, 2013. Heidi reported the county board passed an amendment to fund one year, which will give time to apply for DFC. The money for the county is coming out of reserve.	
Leadership Transition	Heidi	Two year terms of ending, so it's time to think about leadership transitions. Sarah is recruiting for nutrition (name is changed to Nutrition and Healthy Food Systems Committee)—two community members are interested. Active Communities will discuss leadership at the next committee meeting. Dan has another year for Substance Abuse. Advocacy has morphed into the Heroin Task Force, and will be meeting as needed. 		the riverwalk and park. There is a plan to use the butts when there's talks of	
		moving to smoke-free parks in the county.

		Working with Oshkosh North as a partner on a project to promote the drug	
		drop box.	
		Doing nutrition education at the Boys & Girls Club.	
Committee	All	Healthy Lifestyles (Cheryl): the Mental Share Shop meets quarterly; focus is	
Updates		on suicide prevention. About 30-40 people attend the meetings. Teen	
		Screen has been approved by the Oshkosh School Board to start in 2014; this	
		will focus on 9 th graders by consent. The cost is \$50/student and this has	
		been approved in the school district's budget. The group is also working on	
		No Wrong Door Training to ensure the customer is being treated	
		appropriately. There is a three year roll-out plan.	
		Nutrition and Healthy Food Systems (Sarah): Lots going on with Farm to	
		School. Sabina is doing nutrition education at different schools and is looking	
		at Farm to School at the high school level. Had several food tasting programs.	
		There are a variety of initiatives for Farm to School going on throughout the	
		state. Working on Eat Smart partners, including FVTC and Kwik Trip	



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		Heroin Task Force (Joe): Good response from the initial meetings; the	
		response is encouraging. Harm reduction had one meeting, and both	
		treatment and low enforcement have meetings coming up.	
		Tobacco (Anna): Backpack Tobacco Act is being considered, and this is to	
		make other cigarette products taxed like cigarettes, and to have all products	
		behind the counter. Doing tobacco compliance checks. Doing candidate	
		education through in-district meetings. Starting to look at the e-cigarette	
		issue.	
		Active Communities (Kim): most meetings are happening at the	
		subcommittee level, including a Health in Planning presentation to the Town	
		of Menasha, looking at doing a campaign in the "off-season" beyond Drive	
		Your Bike. Working on planning for 2014.	
		SAP (Dan): Oshkosh Special Permit training at special events, also working	
		with county clerk. Neenah passed the Sober Service ordinance. Cheers!	
		Responsible Beverage Server Training will take place in Oshkosh. Jason	
		Weber is putting together a drug bulletin.
