Discussion (Smart Approaches to Marijuana- SAM)	Emily/Heidi	In August a survey was sent to the coalition to get input on joining Smart Approaches to Marijuana (SAM) Wisconsin. Focus is on preventing a Big Marijuana industry like Big Tobacco, using cannabis based medicine. Because of national DFC funding, no lobbying and because the national SAM is lead by a lobbyist we are encouraged to not join in order to play it safe. CADCA suggested disassociating from SAM. So, Wisconsin is going to be working on Marijuana prevention using national education resources available and not under SAM. The group wants to have talking points ready to go and get all Wisconsin coalitions working toward the same initiatives and education topics surrounding marijuana.
