- 1. Call to Order: P. O'Brien called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m.
- 2. <u>Approve Agenda:</u> Motion to approve the March 21, 2012 agenda, made by K. Robl and seconded by J. Finch. Motion carried 8-0.
- 3. Public Comments on Agenda Items: None.
- 4. Announcements/Communications: None.
- 5. <u>Approval of Minutes March 7, 2012 Open and Closed Session</u>: Motion to approve the March 7, 2012 open and closed session minutes, made by J. Finch and seconded by P. Brennand. Motion carried 8-0.
- 6. <u>Discussion Legislative Update:</u> J. Semrau updated the Solid Waste Management Board (SWMB) on Assembly Bill (AB) 643 as follows:

- Legislation seeks to exempt certain materials from the \$13.00/ton in State surcharges assessed on each ton of solid waste disposed of in a Landfill.
- There are three (3) main areas of exemption:
 - Residual from Recycling Facilities
 - Currently trash that people mistakenly recycle, as well as recyclables a Recycling Facility is unable to capture (together called residual or residue), are subject to the State surcharges.
 - Exempting them would reduce the cost of recycling and benefit the BOW Single Stream Facility.
 - Exemption would also apply to residual from a Construction and Demolition (C&D) Recycling Facility.
 - AB643 encourages C&D recycling as presently C&D Landfills are exempt from surcharges.
 - Exemptions are capped at 10% for traditional recyclable processing facilities and 30% at C&D processing facilities to ensure AB643 does not encourage poor processing.
 - o Brownfields/Remediation Soils
 - When the WDNR supplies a brownfield with a project activity number, contaminated soils from the site would be eligible for an exemption.
 - Reduces the cost of remediation; allows State brownfields grant to be used for remediation versus State fees.
 - o Bad Debt
 - Currently, landfills are required to submit and pay the \$13.00/ton in State surcharges on each ton of solid waste. Occasionally, especially during poor economic times, customers may not pay the Landfill (those with credit accounts).
 - AB643 would protect the Landfill from some of costs incurred when a customer fails to pay for service; a waiver could be sought for accounts that are at least 120 days old.
 - Retailers are not required to remit sales taxes on behalf of non-paying customers.
- Impact of the legislation would be a decrease in revenue of the surcharges by approximately \$1.5 million/year total for three (3) instances above (per DOA Fiscal Estimate prepared by WDNR).
- AB643 was introduced in February 29, 2012, and a public hearing was held on March 7, 2012. The fiscal estimate was received on March 16, 2012.
- AB643 remained in the Natural Resources Committee when current legislative floor period session ended on March 15, 2012.

Discussion ensued amongst the SWMB.

- 7. <u>Discussion Regional Landfill Transition Update:</u> J. Rabe updated the SWMB on the Regional Landfill Transition as follows:
 - Outagamie County (OC) is done hauling to Winnebago County (OC) as of March 2, 2012;
 Brown County (BC) began diverting trash loads (5 loads/day) to OC to assist with fluff lift construction in preparation for all BC semis (mid-April); BC will haul to WC until

- early to mid-April, then begin full scale hauling to OC; remaining WC airspace will then be utilized by ~June 30, 2012 using WC waste only
- WC Cat D8 dozer shipped to OC on March 19, 2012 OC is having Fabco service the unit at their cost before putting into service; WC will send Al-Jon compactor to OC once BC ends hauling to WC.
- J. Rabe assisting OC with regional landfill operational planning will begin making regular site visits to improve operations.
- Seagulls are back WC will again have USDA/APHIS/Wildlife Services personnel onsite to harass gulls starting next week and continuing until closure ~June 30, 2012.
- K. Pernsteiner added that more fencing was added to the site to help with liter control.

Discussion ensued amongst the SWMB.

8. <u>Discussion – Landfill Gas Project Updates</u>: J. Rabe updated the SWMB on the landfill gas operations as follows:

- J. Rabe updated the SWMB on landfill gas projects as follows:
 - WPS Revenues power sales and landfill gas usage revenues for February 2012 were \$271,989.
 - Engine/Generator #5 warranty update sent letter on February 23, 2012 to Inland declining offer; letter was passed along to upper management (nothing new to report).
 - Engine #4/5 Law Enforcement Center Mechanical Technologies Inc. (MTI) is waiting for the dump radiators to be delivered before final work is completed in April/May. Coordination with Facilities chiller project continues.
 - Snell Road Flare System on hold until air construction permit issues resolved (nothing new to report).
 - Sunnyview Flare System Modifications on hold until air construction permit issues resolved (nothing new to report).

<u>Air Pollution Control</u> magazine will be running a new/updated story on WC's landfill gas collection/compression/utilization systems in tandem with Bosar Consultants & Super Radiator Coils (previous short run in Jan/Feb 2011 issue of <u>MSW Management</u> magazine).

Discussion ensued amongst the SWMB.
