ADJOURNED SESSION COUNTY BOARD MEETING TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 19, 2002

Chairman Joseph Maehl called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the County Board Room, Fourth Floor, Courthouse, 415 Jackson Street, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance and an invocation by Supervisor Rankin. COMMUNICATIONS, PETITIONS, ETC.

A Notice of Claim was received from Jason Blake for lost personal property while incarcerated in the Winnebago County Jail was referred to the Personnel and Finance Committee.

Petition for Zoning Amendment from Randall S. Schmiedel, Bros. LLC, Town of Black Wolf, for zoning change from A-2 to R-1 for a single family residence was referred to the Planning & Zoning Committee.

Petition for Zoning Amendment from Tim and Judy Klusman, Town of Clayton, for zoning change from A-1 to R-1 for Lot 1 and A-2 for Lots 2, 3 and 4 for residential use was referred to the Planning & Zoning Committee.

Petition for Zoning Amendment from Tim and Judy Klusman, Town of Clayton, for zoning change from A-1 to A-2 for agricultural use was referred to the Planning & Zoning Committee.

COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S REPORT

Executive Van De Hey spent time in the past two weeks talking about Governor McCallum's "Reform Budget". Although many of the legislators are not in favor of the Governor's Budget, at this time there does not seem to be an alternative. The entire matter seems to be up in the air. Executive Van De Hey stated she is evaluating the County budget. A hold has been placed on positions, "big expenditures" and travel until approximately June. She feels it is premature to announce any programs, etc. that would be cut in the event the reduction in Shared Revenue occurs.

A copy of the Moody Report was sent to each Supervisor. The report shows Winnebago County retained its AA2 credit rating.

Executive Van De Hey presented Chuck Orenstein, Finance Director with a plaque for "Excellence in Financial Reporting".

Executive Van De Hey asked for the support of Resolution No. 387-22002: "Oppose Assembly Bill 457 (Prohibit Mandatory Overtime for Health Care Workers)" and Resolution No. 392-22002: "Authorize Total Project Budget of \$5,638,454 for the Winnebago County Public Safety System and Appropriate Funds from the General Fund to be Reimbursed by Subsequent Bond Issues".

COUNTY BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Chairman Maehl wanted everyone to know the County Board, by statute must have a public hearing once each year; however, Winnebago County has a public hearing each meeting. He welcomed everyone who came to speak to the Board. He thanked everyone who sent letters and called regarding the ethanol plant.

RED CROSS PROCLAMATION

RESOLUTION NO. 394-22002: Proclaim March, 2002 in Winnebago County as Red Cross Month

WHEREAS, the American Red Cross was founded in 1881 by Clara Barton, a woman selflessly devoted to the needs of humanity; and

WHEREAS, compassion, courage, character civic duty - are inherent in the Red Cross mission to prevent and relieve human suffering, and Oshkosh, Wisconsin shares these grand ideals; and

WHEREAS, the Red Cross, chartered and authorized by Congress to act in times of need, providing compassionate assistance to people afflicted by personal, local or national disasters; and

WHEREAS, people have counted on the Red Cross for the information and skills they need to be safe at home, at work, at school and at play. Last year the American Red Cross locally trained nearly 13,000 people in lifesaving CPR, First Aid, Babysitter's Training, Basic Aid Training, Lifeguard Training, Water Safety Instructor and Community Disaster Education, Disaster Preparedness Courses, Preventing Disease Transmission, HIV/AIDS Presentations; and

WHEREAS, the American Red Cross provides lifesaving blood and blood products whenever and wherever needed – always with the safety of the blood as its number one priority; and

WHEREAS, Red Cross staff deploy with the U.S. military to provide emergency communications and a caring presence to service men and women separated from their families; and

WHEREAS, in 1943, President Franklin Delano Roosevelt called upon the American people with this request "...that during this month our people rededicate themselves to the splendid aims and activities of the Red Cross."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, by virtue of their authority vested in the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, do hereby proclaim March, 2002 as American Red Cross Month.

COUNTY HIGHWAY K CAPITAL PROJECT

John Haese, Highway Commissioner made a presentation on the County Trunk K Capital Project. The project, an extension of 20th Avenue, City of Oshkosh, is approximately 1/2 mile in length to convert two lanes to four lanes. The project will begin at Carl Traeger School and end at Claireville Road. The biggest question had been sidewalks. The project is in the Town of Algoma, who would be responsible for sidewalks. They are not able to fund them at this time; therefore, sidewalks will not be included in this project. The project will begin at the end of the school year and be completed by the beginning of the 2002-2003 school year. The total estimated cost of the project should be \$900,000, with \$348,000 being federally funded.

RELOCATION OF SECURITY STATION TO COURTHOUSE 2ND FLOOR

Mike Elder, Director of Facilities and Property Management Department, was asked to put a cost on relocating the security station from the first floor to the lobby of the second floor of the Courthouse. The following would need to be completed to make the second floor security system functional:

- Build and install half wall barrier;
- Modify electric system;
- Reconfigure elevator controls;
- Modify fire stairway doors to be exit only;
- Replace Courtroom security system;
- Replace duress buttons in Courtrooms and install new buttons in other Departments;
- I.D. Card System

The total cost for this project would be \$298,830.00. Supervisor Egan stated this concept was looked at by both the Judiciary & Public Safety and Facilities & Property Management Committees. Both committees said they do not recommend the changes. Much discussion ensued on other options available. Sheriff Brooks indicated he had made a recommendation to Executive Van De Hey, based on the County's financial constraints, to remove the security at the front door and add an additional roving police officer. The staff of two police officers, including overtime on County Board nights, has cost approximately \$55,000 in the past four months.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Supervisor Widener reported an employee of Park View Health Center, Rosaline Rowl, was recommended and a commendation was given for her to receive an employee service award from the Wisconsin Association of Homes and Aging. It will be several months before a decision will be reached on this award.

Supervisor Barker reminded all Legislative Committee members of the Monday, February 25th, 9:00 a.m. meeting. Each member will be receiving an agenda in the mail.

Supervisor Finch stated applications for the essay contest for the Scholarship Program are now available at all nine high schools. Any senior interested in applying can pick up an application from their guidance counselor.

Supervisor Egan addressed the Board regarding the Ethanol Plant. He shared concerns relating to the ethanol plant received from citizens regarding those who were either in favor or against the plant. He, along with those on both sides, is concerned about air and water. He shared his visit to Benson, Minnesota to visit the plant. He feels there is more information that needs to be shared with the Board before there can be an educated vote. He is attempting to set up a round table for the Chamber, Farm Bureau, Town of Utica, Winnebago County, STEP Now (Stop The Ethanol Plant Now) and Mr. Olsen to see if there is any common ground. At this point he has not had any success. He will try again. Supervisor Egan requested that Chairman Maehl schedule a Special Order of Business meeting to bring specialist in to get the facts. Supervisor Egan withdrew Amendatory Ordinance 5, "Town of Utica on behalf of Robert J. Portratz, et al and Marilyn K. Arndt Potratz".

RESOLUTIONS & ORDINANCES

RESOLUTION NO.393-22002: RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE BORROWING OF NOT TO EXCEED \$3,830,000; AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS THEREFOR

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin (the "County") hereby finds and determines that it is necessary, desirable and in the best interest of the County to raise funds for the public purpose of refunding obligations of the County, including interest on them, to wit: refunding the County's outstanding General Obligation Promissory Notes dated November 1, 1995 (the "1995 Notes") maturing in the years 2003 through 2005 (the "Refunding"), and there are insufficient funds on hand for said purpose;

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors deems it to be necessary, desirable and in the best interest of the County to refund the 1995 Notes maturing in the years 2003 through 2005 for the purpose of achieving debt service cost savings;

WHEREAS, counties are authorized by the provisions of Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes to borrow money and to issue general obligation refunding bonds for the purpose of refinancing their outstanding obligations;

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors of the County hereby finds and determines that general obligation refunding bonds in an amount not to exceed \$3,830,000 should be issued, and it is now necessary and desirable to authorize their issuance and sale; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Supervisors of the County that:

Section 1. Authorization of the Bonds. For the purpose of paying the cost of the Refunding, there shall be borrowed pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, a principal amount not to exceed THREE MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED THIRTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,830,000) from a purchaser or purchasers to be determined by competitive sale (the "Purchaser").

Section 2. Sale of the Bonds. To evidence such indebtedness, the Chairperson and County Clerk are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to make, execute, issue and sell to the Purchaser for, on behalf of and in the name of the County, general obligation refunding bonds in a principal amount not to exceed THREE MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED THIRTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,830,000) (the "Bonds"). There be and there hereby is levied on all the taxable property in the County a direct, annual tax in such years and in such amounts as are sufficient to pay when due the principal and interest on the Bonds.

Section 3. Notice of Sale. The County Finance Director (in consultation with the County's financial advisor, Robert W. Baird & Co. Incorporated) is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of the sale of the Bonds to appear in such newspapers and at such times as the Finance Director may determine.

<u>Section 4. Official Notice of Sale.</u> The County Finance Director (in consultation with the County's financial advisor, Robert W. Baird & Co. Incorporated) shall also cause an Official Notice of Sale to be prepared and distributed and may prepare or cause to be prepared and distributed an Official Statement or other form of offering circular.

Section 5. Award of the Bonds. The Bonds shall be offered for public sale on March 19, 2002. Following receipt of bids for the Bonds, the County Board of Supervisors shall consider taking further action to provide the details of the Bonds and to award the Bonds to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders therefor.

Section 6. Conflicting Resolutions; Severability; Effective Date. All prior resolutions, rules or other actions of the County Board of Supervisors or any parts thereof in conflict with the provisions hereof shall be, and the same are, hereby rescinded insofar as the same may so conflict. In the event that any one or more provisions hereof shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provisions hereof. The foregoing shall take effect immediately upon adoption and approval in the manner provided by law.

RESOLUTION No. 380-22002: Encourage Enactment of Legislation to Allow Additional Court Costs for Use to Establish Court Security Fund Statewide

WHEREAS, court security issues are now more important than ever; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County is seeking ways to fund new security measures in Winnebago County to assist in compliance with Supreme Court Rule 70.39; and

WHEREAS, the states of Texas, Illinois and Iowa have implemented or are in the process of implementing a procedure that establishes a security fee as a court cost for individuals who have committed crimes for the purpose of assisting and paying for courthouse security; and

WHEREAS, Texas Code of Criminal Procedure Article 102.017 provides that a defendant convicted of a felony offense pay a \$5.00 security fee as a court cost and that a misdemeanor offender pay a \$3.00 fee, with such fees being deposited in a security fund which is used for the purpose of providing security services for court buildings including x-ray machines, metal detectors, electronic locking systems, security personnel, alarms, bullet-proof glass, etc.; and

WHEREAS, the state of Illinois has established a \$15.00 security fee per action with the funds to be collected from that fee to be used for similar purposes; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Statutes do not presently allow for counties to charge such a security fee; and

WHEREAS, if legislation were enacted similar to that in Texas or Illinois, counties could establish a set fee to be paid directly to the County as a court cost to create courthouse security funds, the proceeds of which could be used for courthouse security.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby goes on record as encouraging the State Legislature and Governor to enact legislation that would allow an additional court cost for all cases filed in the Clerk of Courts Office to be used to establish a local county security fund for the purpose of increasing courthouse security.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby directs the Winnebago County Clerk to transmit this resolution to all legislators representing Winnebago County constituents, to Governor Scott McCallum, to the Wisconsin Counties Association, to the Wisconsin Sheriff's Association, the Wisconsin Clerk of Courts Association and the Winnebago County Clerk's Association.

ORDINANCE No. 381-22002: Amend Section 5.01 of the General Code of Winnebago County (Huber Law Prisoner Fees)

WHEREAS, Section 303.08(4), Wisconsin Statutes, allows counties to establish a daily charge for maintenance and costs of a prisoner's board in the County Jail; and

WHEREAS, Section 303.08, Wisconsin Statutes allows prisoners to be assessed a charge for the cost of incarceration; and

WHEREAS, it is reasonable and necessary that the per capita daily cost charged to the Huber

Law prisoners for their board be amended from time to time to reflect the actual cost of food and labor in relationship to the feeding of prisoners; and

WHEREAS, in lieu of incarceration, some prisoners are sentenced to home detention and required to wear a tracking bracelet; and

WHEREAS, it is reasonable that said prisoners be assessed a rental cost for said bracelet as well as a cost for monitoring said persons.

NOW, THEREFORE, the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago does ordain as follows:

That Section 5.01(2)(a) of the General Code of Winnebago County be amended to read as follows:

5.01 HUBER LAW PRISONERS.

(2) Per Capita Daily Costs. (a) the per capita daily charge for maintenance and cost of a prisoner's board in the County Jail is hereby established as \$16.00 per day for all Huber Law prisoners. Each prisoner shall be charged for all meals served during each day incarcerated, regardless of the prisoner actually consuming each meal.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago that said amendment shall take effect on March 1, 2002.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago that Section 5.01(2)(a) of the General Code of Winnebago County with regard to the per day charge for all Huber Law prisoners be amended to the following amounts on the following dates:

July 1, 2002 \$16.50 October 1, 2002 \$17.00 June 1, 2003 \$18.00

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago that Section 5.01(4) of the General Code of Winnebago County is created to read as follows:

(3) Electronic Monitoring Fee. All prisoners who are assigned an electronic monitoring device shall be assessed a fee of \$6.00 per day plus any actual costs in relationship to the use of the global positioning system with regard to the use of said device and the tracking of said prisoner.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago that Section 5.01(4) of the General Code of Winnebago County shall go into effect as of the date following the date of publication.
