ADJOURNED SESSION COUNTY BOARD MEETING Tuesday, May 20, 2003

Chairman Joseph Maehl called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the County Board Room, Fourth Floor, Courthouse, 415 Jackson Street, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance and an invocation by Supervisor Rankin.

The following Supervisors were present: Sevenich, Barker, Griesbach, Hotynski, Scoville, Maehl, Koziczkowski, Klitzke, Widener, Lauson, Albrecht, Pech, Thompson, Steineke, Madison, Radewan, Sundquist, Wingren, Jacobson, Norton, Hert, Robl, Eichman, Kline, Kramer, Schaidler, Farrey, Sievert, Arne, Diakoff, Brennand, Egan, Rankin, Rengstorf and O'Brien. Excused: Nielsen, Tierney and Finch.

Motion by Supervisor Robl and seconded to adopt the agenda. CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE.

REPORTS FROM COMMITTEES, COMMISSIONS AND BOARDS

Supervisor Rengstorf commented on what a wonderful tour the Board took yesterday of Park View Health Center, the Heckrodt Wetland Reserve and the new Sheriff's Office and jail. Supervisor Rengstorf reported that the jail is almost complete and that the prisoners will be moved to the new facility by the end of June. He also stated that the Sheriff's Office/jail project has come in almost \$3 Million under budget.

Supervisor Widener reported that Park View Health Center has passed their state inspection. He also stated that a public hearing on the study of the future of Park View Health Center will be held at 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, May 27, 2003.

Supervisor Barker announced that there will not be a Legislative Committee meeting in May.

Supervisor Lauson brought to the Board's attention the WIOUWASH QUAD Trail Fundraiser/Clayton Fest invitation that was placed on their desks. He stated that the proceeds from this event goes to the Town of Clayton Trail Fund and will be used to construct a recreational trail along the new Highway 10, which will connect with the WIOUWASH Trail. He commended the Town of Clayton and all the other participates on putting together this great event and he encouraged the Board to attend.

Supervisor Sievert also spoke to the Board about Clayton Fest and the trail fundraiser. She stated that the recreational trail tunnel that will run under Highway 10 is under construction. The State of Wisconsin has provided, at no cost, railroad crossing lights for the trail. Supervisor Sievert added that they are trying to fund this project with only grant money and fund raising—not money from taxpayers. She also explained that once this trail is complete, it will connect with the WIOUWASH Trail, giving more county citizens access to this wonderful recreational trail.

Supervisor Rankin asked that the Board look at the Winnebago County Public Health Department's brochure, as it shows the depth of work and the progress made by that department.

Supervisor Schaidler announced that there will be a Winn Tomorrow meeting at 6:00 p.m. on May 29 in the Winnebago County Highway Department's upstairs conference room. At this meeting, the consultant will present tentative plans and an outline of the comprehensive land use plan for the rural and urban areas in Winnebago County. Supervisor Schaidler encouraged everyone to attend this meeting and get involved in the process now, as it will be coming to this Board in the near future.

Supervisor Koziczkowski announced that because the Winnebago County Human Services Department did not end up with a previously anticipated budget shortage, they will be returning the \$250,000 that the County Board transferred from the General Fund to the Human Services Department budget. Supervisor Koziczkowski stated that there is also a \$39,000 overage that the Human Services Department will also be putting back in the county's General Fund. Chuck Orenstein, Winnebago County Finance Director, explained that because so much of the Human Services Department's state/federal funding is unpredictable, when they looked at their budget near the end of 2002, it appeared that they would be over budget if they didn't request the \$250,000 transfer from the county's General Fund. As it turned out, their wasn't a shortage, but they actually ended up with an additional \$39,000.

Supervisor Barker asked if Channel 10's new television setup in the county board room was improving the quality of the televised county board meetings. It was felt that the new system worked very well and produced a high quality transmission.

Supervisor Griesbach commended Keith Laux and his staff at the Human Services Department for cutting their 2002 budget by \$1.5 Million and still coming in \$39,000 under budget.

Supervisor Norton asked that the Board look at the Advocap Board's 2002 Annual Report that was in their packet. He stated that Advocap's programs are very beneficial to the citizens of Winnebago County.

COMMUNICATIONS, PETITIONS, ETC.

Notice of Claim from Gloria Mack alleging negligence by Winnebago County in not properly responding to her previous claim was referred to the Personnel & Finance Committee.

In addition, Park View Health Center has been recognized as the only nursing home in the State of Wisconsin to have zero federal violations and to be recognized as a five-star facility. Executive Van De Hey credits Park View Health Center's administration, staff and the Park View Health Center Committee for this achievement.

Executive Van De Hey reported that Advocap held their volunteer appreciation dinner at the Expo Center. It was also a very nice event and attended by more then 100 people.

Executive Van De Hey reported that she and Supervisor Sundquist attended the 1st Annual Oshkosh Convention and Visitors Bureau breakfast at which they presented an award to the Winnebago County Board because of its efforts in promoting tourism in this area and the State of Wisconsin. Executive Van De Hey presented the plaque to Chairman Maehl.

Executive Van De Hey recommends the Board's approval of Resolution No. 196-52003, "Authorize Execution of Ground Lease Between Winnebago County and Chamco, Incorporated.

Transfer \$60,000 from Contingency Fund to HIPAA Compliance Fund in Information Systems Department to fund expenditures needed to bring Winnebago County into compliance with HIPAA

WHEREAS, the United States Congress adopted legislation called the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) in 1969, and

WHEREAS, part of this law is centered on privacy of Protected Health Information (PHI), and

WHEREAS, these laws require that any business's, governments, and any other parties that have access to or provide PHI comply with certain requirements of the law, and

WHEREAS, some of these requirements standardize codes used in the electronic transfer of PHI when sending and receiving electronic claims and establish standards for the format whenever any PYI are electronically transmitted, and

WHEREAS, in order to come into compliance with these laws, Winnebago County will have to make certain purchases of computer hardware, software and other outside services, and

WHEREAS, because of the newness of this program it is very difficult to predict exactly what it will cost to come into compliance, and

WHEREAS, our best estimate of the costs we will incur to come into compliance at this time is around \$60,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby transfers \$60,000 from the Contingency Fund of Winnebago County to the HIPAA compliance project within the Information Systems Department for the purpose of coming into compliance with the HIPAA regulations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any remaining funds after the project is complete are to be transferred back to the General Fund of Winnebago County.

WHEREAS, State acquisitions such as these are purchased with Stewardship Funds, a segregated fund that is already bonded.
