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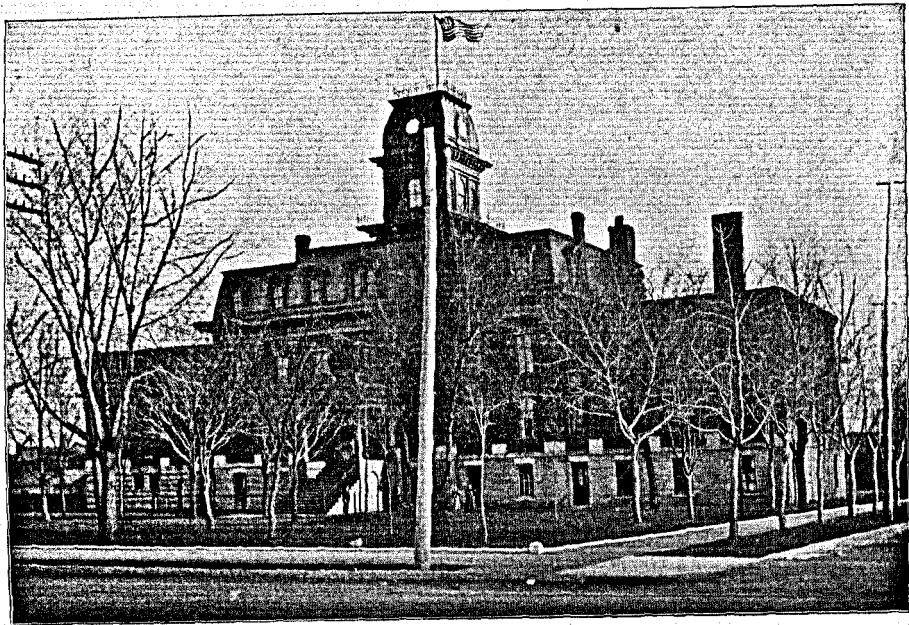

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen: The Town Board of the Town of Nepeuskun hereby petitions your Honorable Body, the County Board of Winnebago County, and sets forth that at the annual town meeting, held in the town of Nepeuskun, Winnebago County, Wis., on the first day of April, 1913, it was voted to construct the bridge at the outlet of Rush Lake over the Wausau creek, known as Outlet Bridge, located in Section 13, Town 17, Range 14, East, lying wholly within the Town of Nepeuskun, in said county, and at such Annual Town Meeting, said town has provided for the payment of such portion of the cost of such construction as required by section 1319 of the Statutes of 1911. **Black Wolf Bridge.**

Supervisor Raddatz offered Petition No. 1, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen: The Town Board of the Town of Black Wolf, hereby petitions your Honorable Body, the County Board of Winnebago County, and set forth that at the annual town meeting, held in the Town of Black Wolf, Winnebago County, Wis., on the first day of April, 1913, voted to construct the bridge across the creek at the intersection of Sections 20 and 29, Town 17, Range 17, lying wholly in the Town of Black Wolf, in said county, and at such annual town meeting said town provided for the payment of such portion of the cost of such construction as required by Section 1319 of the Statutes of 1911. That the cost of construction of said bridge will not be less than \$400 and will exceed \$500.

Therefore, We, the undersigned Supervisors of said town, petition your Honorable Body to take such action as the law requires.

### Change of Name of County Farm.

Supervisor Luscher offered Resolution No. 1, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen: Whereas, The County Farm owned by Winnebago County has been known as the County Poor and Poor Farm, situated in the Town of Oshkosh, Winnebago County, Wisconsin, and has been run as such owing to the fact that the County Poor House was in existence before the County Asylum, and,

Whereas, Nearly all of the work that has been done on said farm has been done by the inmates of the Winnebago County Asylum, and

Whereas, Chapter 481 of the Laws of 1911, known as Section 567-A, provides for a uniform system of accounting, and the superintendent is required to report to the Board of Control in triplicate by the Superintendent of each County Asylum, an inventory of all properties on hand on the last day of the fiscal year, and

Whereas, Under said law it will be impossible for the Superintendent of the County Asylum to make an accurate report of the doings of the County Asylum so long as the said land is controlled as the Poor and Poor Farm.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, By the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, That hereafter what has been formerly known as the Poor and Poor Farm shall be known as the Winnebago County Asylum Farm, and

Be It Further Resolved, By the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County that the Superintendent of the Winnebago County Asylum be and he is hereby instructed to take charge of said farm as Superintendent of the County Asylum and the proceeds and funds from said farm to be known as the County Asylum Fund.

Be It Further Resolved, By the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, That the County Poor House, situated in the Town of Oshkosh, together with five acres around and upon which the said Poor House is built, be known and used as the County Home, to be set aside and marked off by the Superintendent of the County Insane Asylum.

### Tuberculosis Sanatorium.

Supervisor Perry offered Report No. 1, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen: Your special tuberculosis sanatorium committee, who were appointed at the special session of the County Board, held on April 25th, 1913, for the purpose of investigating a site for the location of Winnebago County tuberculosis sanatorium, and for the securing of plans for said tuberculosis sanatorium, beg leave to report that they have devoted considerable time in investigating the different sites, that advertisements have been inserted in the newspaper and that they have thoroughly investigated all sites which have been called to our attention; we further beg leave to report that we have investigated the sanatoria at Racine and Milwaukee counties and have been in consultation with the State Board of Control, and the Wisconsin Anti-Tuberculosis Association to secure ideas as to what would be necessary for the proper site; that we have had three sets of plans submitted by different architects, which are herewith submitted to Your Honorable Body; that we have devoted considerable time and energy on said plans and the different sites; that the best authorities are those who have studied and investigated the problem of fighting tuberculosis and they agree that the institution should be reasonably well removed from the thickly populated section and yet be reasonably accessible; that said sanatorium should be located away from any swamp where the dampness and fogs are prevalent and that it should be located on a highly elevated piece of land, sloping to the south, with a forest on the north or northwest, if possible; that your committee visited in particular the following sites: Lyness Hill, situated in the town of Nekimi, six miles from Oshkosh on the Waupun road; the Ross place in the town of Nekimi, seven miles southwest of Oshkosh; a site at Fisk's in the town of Utica, known as the Barker place, at Fisk's; your committee went north to Gillingham's Corner, through the town of Clayton, through Mikesville, Allenville, Larson, Winneconne, Omro and Zion and took in most of the crossroads on the way, making numerous calls and investigations, and with reference to all the sites investigated, your committee respectfully recommend two sites, having in view the requirements of the Board of Control. We have secured options from the owners of the land. One of the sites which your committee would recommend is known as the Barker place at Fisk's Station, in the town of Utica, consisting of 10 acres of land with two small houses on it for \$2,000, and the other a piece of land consisting of five acres of land at or near Brooks' Corners, in the town of Oshkosh, owned by Fred D. Brooks, for the sum of \$2,500. The options are hereto attached and made a part of this report and recommendation. Your committee further would recommend as to the plans that the plans submitted by Henry Auler, architect of Oshkosh, are the most suitable plans. The plans are herewith submitted and made a part of this report. That the estimated cost, estimated by the architect of the plans which your committee recommends, for the building complete, including heating, plumbing, wiring, painting and vacuum cleaner system is the



sum of \$25,500. This estimate is an estimate on the brick construction.

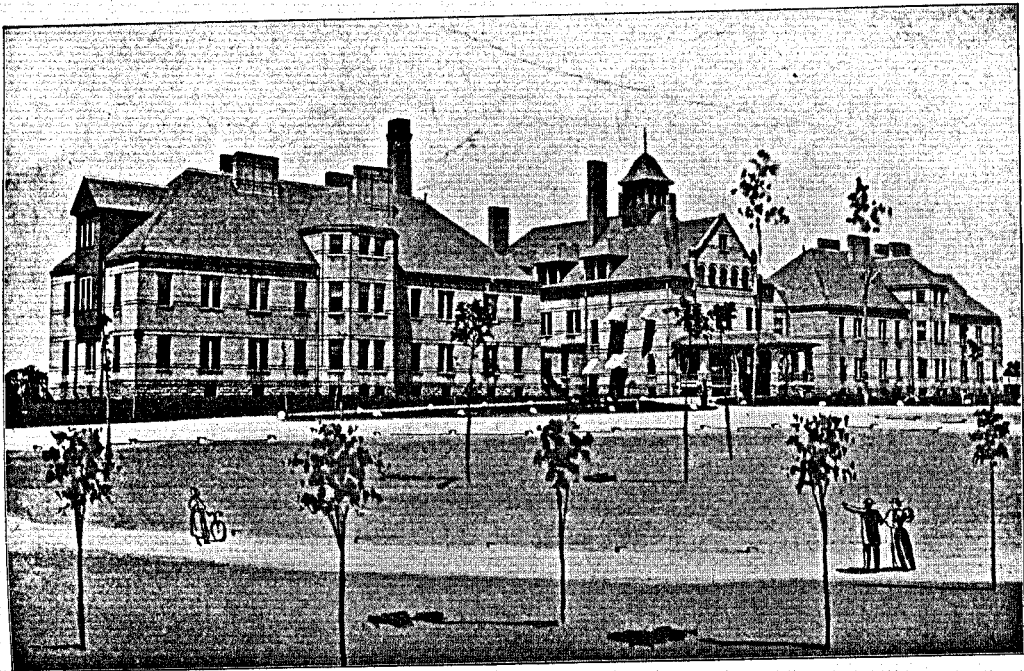

#### Tuberculosis Sanatorium.

Supervisor Perry offered the following Report No. 1 and Resolutions therein contained:

Oshkosh, Wis., July 29, 1913.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: Whereas, at the special session of the County Board of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, held on the 23rd day of May, 1913, there was a motion made, seconded and carried to accept the Brooks site for the Winnebago County Tuberculosis Sanatorium, and

Whereas, The State Board of Control of the State of Wisconsin after a diligent and thorough investigation of the said Brooks site for the purposes aforementioned, refused absolutely to approve of the said site, and

Whereas, Your special tuberculosis sanatorium committee has made further investigation of the matter of a suitable site for said purpose and to that end called upon the State Board of Control of the State of Wisconsin for their valued assistance in that regard, realizing the wisdom of their judgment, your special tuberculosis committee in conjunction with the said State Board of Control, on the 24th day of July, A. D. 1913, viewed sites in the following named towns of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, to-wit: The towns of Utica, Omro, Winneconne, Winchester, Neenah, Vinland and Oshkosh, and

Whereas, the State Board of Control of the State of Wisconsin, subsequent to viewing the various sites aforesaid, unanimously recommended to your honorable body the site at Fisk's, known as the Gallup place, for the reason set forth in a communication from the said State Board of Control to the Special Tuberculosis Committee of this County Board, which is hereto attached and made a part hereof.

Now Therefore, Be it Resolved, by the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, that the site so earnestly recommended by the said State Board of Control and which meets with the approval of your Special Tuberculosis Sanatorium Committee, be and the same is hereby accepted as the site for the Winnebago County Tuberculosis Sanatorium.

Be it further Resolved, by the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, That your Special Tuberculosis Committee be and they are hereby authorized and instructed to procure the said site at Fisk's, known as the Gallup place, at a price that will conserve the best economic interests of the county of Winnebago; and said committee is hereby authorized and instructed to proceed to condemn said property.

Be it further Resolved, That any and all resolutions heretofore adopted bearing on the matter of a site for the Winnebago County Tuberculosis Sanatorium be and the same is and are hereby rescinded.

The letter is as follows:

Madison, July 26, 1913.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: At the request of the members of your Committee on Tuberculosis Sanatorium, Dr. Lindley, Mr. Lewis and Mr. Smith of the Board of Control, joined them in an inspection of those sites which, in the minds of the Committee, might be considered as suitable from which to select a site for the proposed Tuberculosis Sanatorium. The inspection was made July 24. Places visited included Oshkosh, Fisk, Omro, Winneconne and midway between Oshkosh and Neenah. We understood it to be the desire of the Committee to submit to your Honorable body the site, which in your opinion, everything considered, is most suitable for the purpose for which this institution is intended.

To reach a conclusion many points have to be considered. A Sanatorium of this kind must not be too far from railway or electric lines; patients going to and from the sanatorium should be permitted to travel in as easy and convenient a manner as possible and without too many changes of conveyance. What is said of travel of patients applies almost equally as well to the travel of friends and relatives of patients.

The site should have a southern exposure, well drained in a locality sufficiently elevated to avoid as much as possible fogs and other unnecessary dampness. The buildings should be protected against northerly and northwesterly winds by a grove of trees; the trees will also afford a park during the summer when shade is as desirable as is protection in winter.

The question of transportation of building material, coal and supplies of all kinds necessary to the maintenance of such institution is a most important one. Teaming for any distance is expensive and at certain seasons of the year very nearly impossible; it places an unjust burden on the taxpayers; when once the institution is built, there is no remedy.

The surroundings should be pleasant; the institution should not be so located that the patients will be disturbed by those in the immediate vicinity nor by passers-by; neither should it be located in

some lonesome and forsaken place that may have a depressing effect.

There are other considerations which have led the board to the conclusion, which they unanimously reached, but these are the most important. We have at all times considered the welfare of the persons to be committed to the Sanatorium as being paramount to every other consideration. The question of a most central location is an important one, but this must give way to the consideration mentioned above, particularly when coupled with the question of passenger and freight transportation.

We are of the opinion that the site at Fisk is far superior to any other shown us by your committee. It would be a pleasure to approve of the Fisk site, should you make it your selection. We doubt if any county in the state has a better one. Should you select this site and build in the same substantial and pleasing manner that you have built your other county buildings and supervise it in the same efficient manner you have them, you will have an institution that Winnebago County and the State of Wisconsin may well be proud.

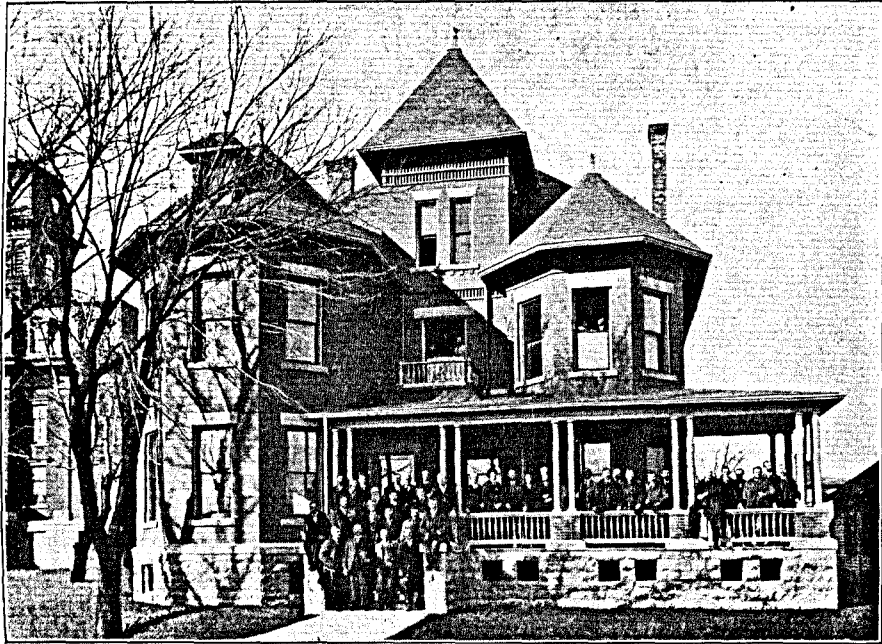

#### ANNUAL REPORT

Of the Trustees of the County Asylum, Asylum Farm and County  
Home.

The Board of Trustees of the Asylum for the Chronic Insane of  
Winnebago County, Wisconsin, respectfully submit herewith their re-  
port of the institution, covering the year ending June 30, 1913.

We would report that the institution has run on smoothly

during the past year, the buildings have been kept in good repair, new cement floors have been laid in the basement of main buildings, but no new buildings have been built during the year, as all are in good, substantial condition, and the improvements and additions made in the last few years makes our institution rank among the best in the state.

The cold storage building for which you made appropriation in November, 1909, and which was built in 1910, is proving a boon to the institution, as it gives us facilities for handling and preserving our produce and food stuffs much more economically than ever before.

Our splendid apple crop of a year ago supplied apples for the patients continuously for the year through use of the cold storage. The apple orchard, which was so carefully planned by the old friend of some of the older members of this Board, and an able former trustee, Hon. A. H. F. Krueger, is now grown to rival any orchard in the county for beauty as well as yield of high-grade fruit. This is abundantly substantiated by the awards made at our County Fair in September, when the apple exhibit from the County Farm, consisting of twenty-three exhibits, brought nineteen prizes.

The side track put in by the Soo railroad last year has been a splendid help in getting coal and supplies this year.

We have contracted for 1,500 tons of screened lump West Virginia splint coal at \$3.75 per ton F. O. B. Asylum, which will, we expect, supply the Asylum and County Home with necessary fuel until July 1, 1914.

With the wholesome condition in which our institutions now are we know of no changes that require added appropriations and therefore ask for no special appropriation.

The earnings of the institution and farm for the past year show a small gain over a year ago, making it the best year in the history of the institution.

### COUNTY PHYSICIAN'S REPORT.

Dr. Brockway read his Report No. 11, as follows:

To the Honorable Board of Trustees of the County Asylum and County Home and the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: I herewith submit my report as County Physician for the year ending June 30, 1913. I have visited the County Asylum and County Home regularly twice a week since January 1, 1913, and the County Jail and County Workhouse whenever called. Special visits were made to all institutions when necessary.

#### County Asylum.

At the County Asylum there were twenty-four deaths during the year, most of them people of advanced age, thirteen of these being women and eleven men. The causes of death were heart disease in eight cases, dementia in its different forms, in seven cases, arterio sclerosis in one case, paralysis in one case, tuberculosis in one case, one pneumonia, two apoplexy, one cancer, one epilepsy and one due

to old age. Of these only one was due to acute disease, that of pneumonia, all of the others being chronic diseases and in most part caused by their insanity.

There were four major accidental injuries during the year, two broken arms, a broken hip and sprained hip joint, all caused by falls. The broken arms and injured hip recovered and the broken hip case recovered from the injury sufficiently to be able to sit up, dying later of heart disease due to advanced age.

I have always found the sanitation of the building good and a plentiful supply of nourishing and well-cooked food furnished the inmates. I have found the attendants to be uniformly kind and considerate of the welfare of their charges and the superintendent and matron to be doing everything in their power to ameliorate the condition of their charges.

#### County Home.

At the County Home there were eleven deaths during the year, nine men and two women. Of these, three were due to heart disease, two to tuberculosis, one cancer, one Bright's disease, one abscess of the brain, one cystitis, one locomotor ataxia, and one due to the debility of old age. There was one birth during the year, a male child, the mother and child leaving the institution as soon as able.

At this institution I have always found the rooms clean and sanitary, food well cooked and wholesome, and the overseer and wife, with their assistants, doing everything possible for the comfort of the inmates.

#### The County Jail.

I have visited the jail whenever called, there has been no serious illness at this institution and I have always found it clean and sanitary, the food good and well cooked, and the prisoners well and humanely cared for by the sheriff and his assistants.

#### The County Work House.

I have made several visits to the workhouse on account of illness of prisoners. There was no serious illness during this fiscal year, the greater part being due to dissipation. I have inspected the prisoners' quarters and have always found them clean and comfortable, the food excellent and the Superintendent willing and anxious to help the condition of his charges.

I have always found the management of all the county institutions courteous and of great assistance to me in my work.

**Report of Supervising Librarian.**

To the Board of Libraries of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, for the period from October 1st, 1912, to October 1st, 1913.

Gentlemen: The success or failure of the traveling library in any community depends almost wholly upon the one in charge at the station, and it is necessary that every effort should be made to place them in the hands of persons who are interested and who keep in touch with the people of the community. The annual visit to seventeen stations was most satisfactory and resulted in the estab-

lishment of new stations at Nekimi and Pickett and the revival of an old station at Orihula.

All of the libraries were in the field during the Winter save a few that were kept on hand for exchange purposes.

There are now forty-four libraries, all of which have been spoken for. The list of stations for the Winter is as follows:

294 books were added by purchase and 15 by gift, making a total of 309. There were 43 books discarded on account of their worn condition.

The entire collection now consists of 2,623 volumes. The total circulation for the year was 2,889, an increase of 425 over last year. The largest circulation on any one library was 215 at Rush Lake, and the next largest 214 at Nekimi.

The contents of a traveling library was exhibited at the Winnebago County Fair in September, and created a good deal of interest. It has been planned to make this exhibit an annual event.

All libraries not placed have been put into the hands of interested and enthusiastic workers and it is hoped that the winter's work will show good results. The fact that there have never been enough libraries to supply the demand will show the need of the usual appropriation of \$200.00 and this is respectfully requested.

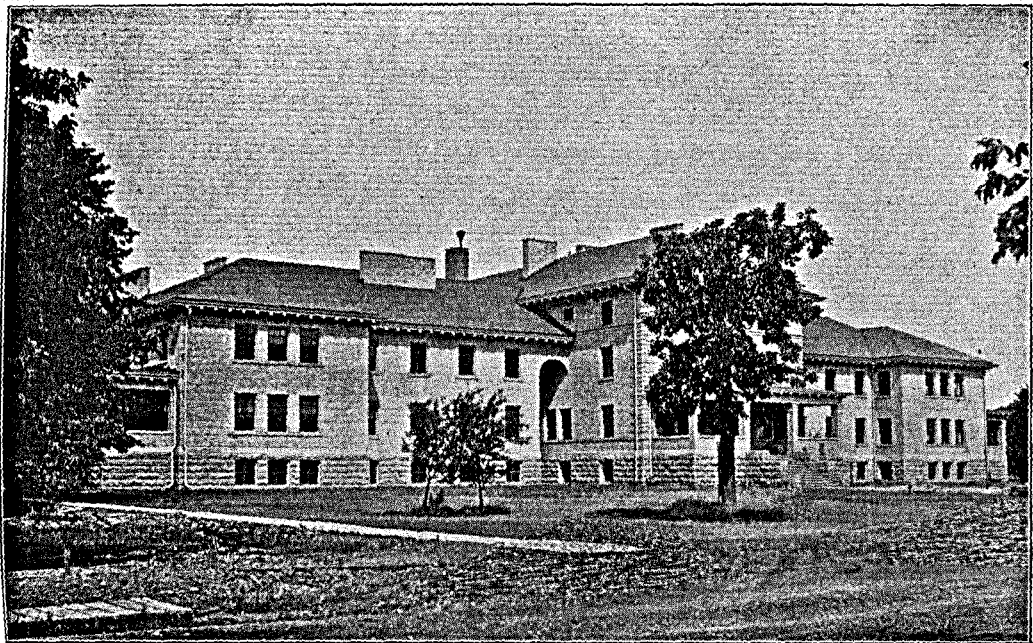

Gentlemen: I hereby submit my annual report for the year ending June 30, 1913, as required by law, and certify that the state-

The work of the schools of the county during the past year has been of a very satisfactory character. They are all thoroughly classified and working under the Course of Study for the common school of the State of Wisconsin.

To supplement the regular work of the school and to furnish opportunity for needed drill in several special lines, the following contests have been held throughout the county:

#### Adding Contest.

The Adding Contest was similar to the one held last year. Each school was entitled to a representative and there were about forty contestants taking part in the County Contest held on Saturday, May 24th, at the Oshkosh Normal School. Admirable results have been obtained through the work in addition.

#### Spelling Contest.

As in the Adding Contest each school was entitled to a representative in both the Oral and Written contests. There were sixty contestants in the Oral spelling and thirty-five in the written spelling. The winner of the written spelling to act as representative of the County at the State contest at the State Fair held in Milwaukee. There is a marked improvement in the spelling throughout the county.

#### Declamatory Contest.

The Declamatory Contest was open to all 1913 graduates of the rural schools. Each town was entitled to a representative who was previously chosen by local and town contests. There were eleven towns represented in this contest. This work has furnished excellent training for public speaking.

#### Breadmaking Contest.

The Breadmaking Contest held last year created sufficient interest to warrant the work being continued. There were twenty-three entries, two loaves being entered by boys and the remainder by girls. The contest is proving successful and the people in the various districts show great interest in the same.



## Sewing Contest.

The Sewing Contest was one added this year. Any girl attending the rural schools the current year could enter the contest. There were thirty entries of practical kitchen aprons, all made by hand. A great deal of interest has been created by this and the Bread-making contests and the prospects are that they will be even more popular next year.

During the past year many new Farmers' Clubs were organized in different parts of the county in which debates and discussions were held upon interesting questions.

This supplementary work is without question of as much importance as the regular work of the school and will be kept up during the coming year.

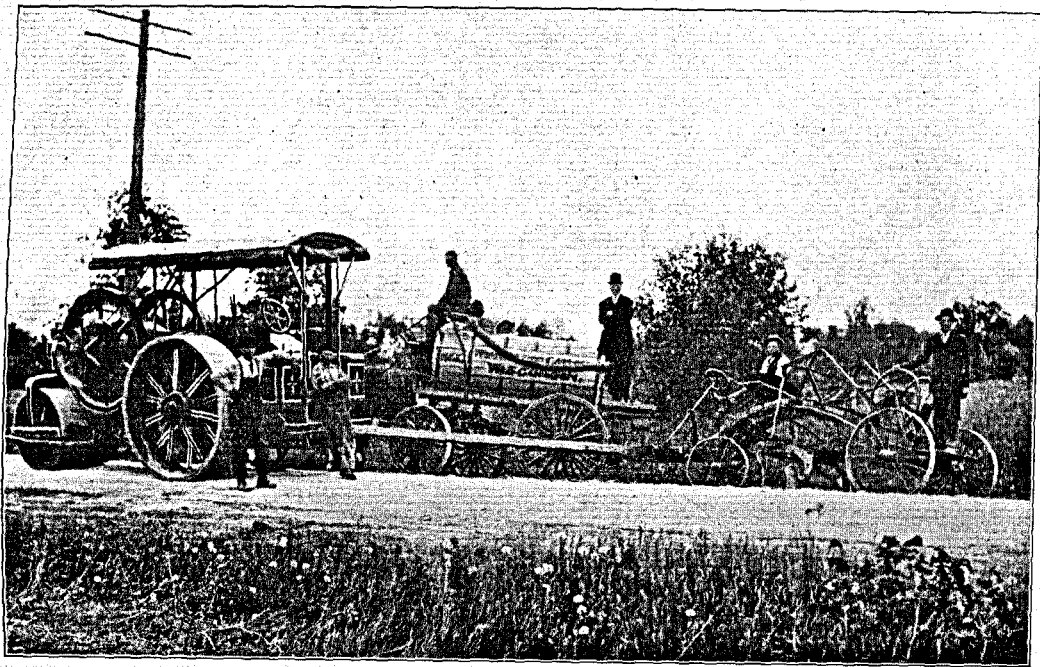

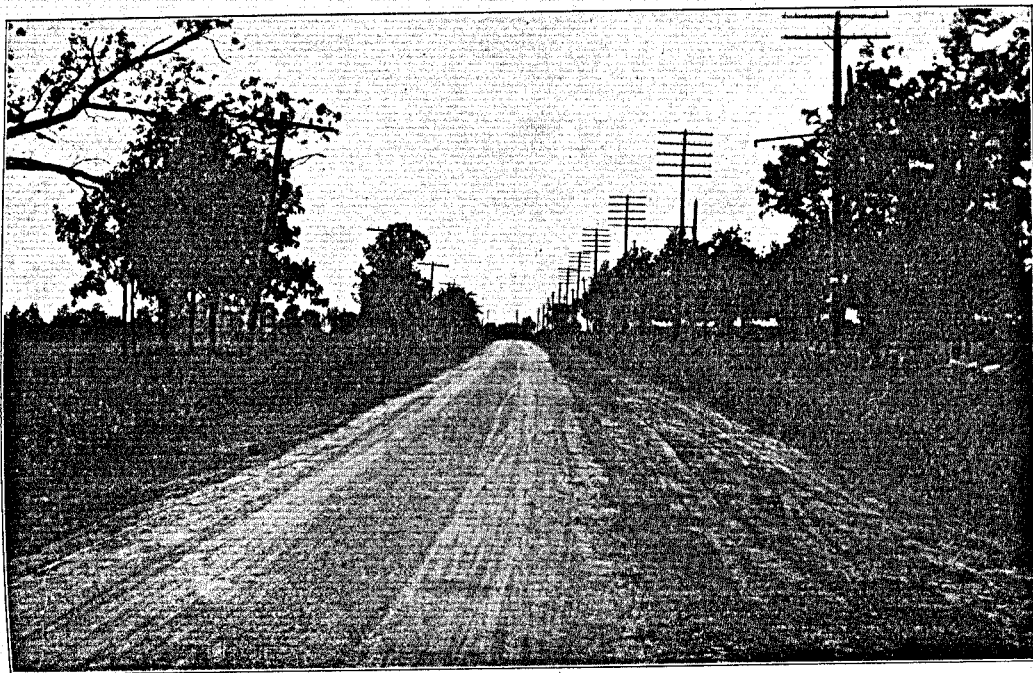

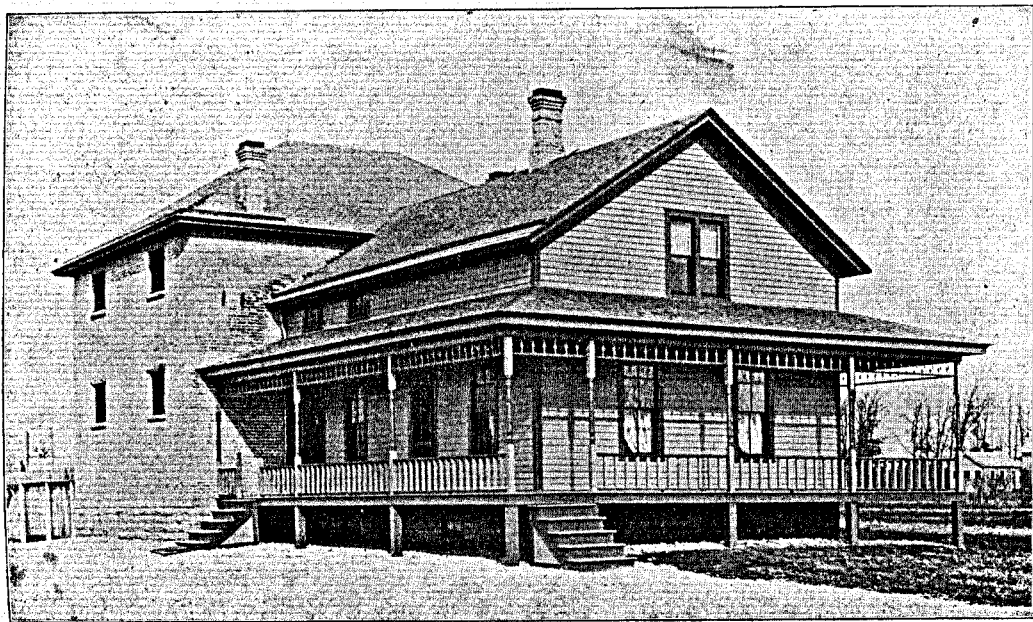

The Board met pursuant to adjournment, Vice Chairman Arnemann presiding.

Present full Board excepting Supervisor Brooks who was ill.

**Report of Special Committee.**

Supervisor Morrissey offered the following Report No. 1.

Oshkosh, Wis., Jan. 6, 1914.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: Pursuant to resolution dated November 14, 1913, providing for the investigation of the Winnebago County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy, located at the village of Winneconne, Winnebago County, Wisconsin, your Special Investigating Committee beg leave to submit to your honorable body, the following report, together with the recommendations of the said special committee.

Your committee began its investigation into the conditions of the aforesaid school soon after the adoption of the resolution empowering the committee to proceed with the investigation, by employing a stenographic reporter to make a complete and verbatim report of the entire proceedings, and by employing counsel to look after the interests of the committee. The committee met and organized at the courthouse on the day following the appointment and elected William Grimes, Supervisor of the town of Menasha as secretary, at which meeting such help as was necessary for the rigid and thorough investigation of the said school was employed. That on the 17th day of November, A. D., 1913, the committee met at the court-house, and that upon the request of the attorneys for the complaints it was decided that the said investigation be carried on at the village of Winneconne, Winnebago county, Wisconsin, and it was further decided at said meeting that complainants be permitted to file specific charges with the committee, which was done on the 21st day of November, A. D., 1913. That subsequent thereto, and on the 24th day of November, A. D. 1913, the committee proceeded to Omro, thence driving to the village of Winneconne, and at half past nine o'clock in the morning of said day began the taking of testimony, and continued so to do until nine o'clock in the evening of said day. An adjournment was then and there taken until the 8th day of December, A. D., 1913, at which time the committee proceeded to take further testimony relative to said matter, commencing at half past nine o'clock in the morning and continuing the taking of testimony in said matter until long after nine o'clock in the evening of said day, at which time a further

adjournment was taken until eight o'clock in the morning of the following day, to-wit: the 9th, day of December, 1913, when the taking of testimony on the said hearing was resumed and the committee completed the taking of testimony at a quarter after three o'clock in the afternoon of the said 9th day of December, 1913.

Your committee beg leave to further report that a great many witnesses were sworn and voluminous testimony taken on the part and in behalf of the complainants, as well as on the part and in behalf of the respondents, to-wit: the school board. That all of the said principals of the said agricultural school were subpoenaed and gave testimony, besides numerous farmers and men in other walks of life, as well as the present secretary of the school board and State Senator Merritt F. White.

That the testimony taken on the said hearing is exceedingly lengthy, consisting of over four hundred pages, the complete transcript of which testimony is now on file with your committee; that it is impossible for us to set out any amount thereof in this report, but said testimony shall be filed with this report, for the convenience of any supervisor, who may be sufficiently interested to wish to peruse the testimony, as it was given verbatim on the said hearing at Winnebago.

Your committee further beg leave to report that the matter was fully argued before your said committee on the 26th day of December, the entire day being consumed by argument on the part of Sommers & Velte for the complainants, and E. J. Dempsey for the respondents; that your committee proceeded to consider the evidence on the 27th day of December, and worked diligently and conscientiously until five o'clock in the afternoon of said day.

That after a careful and due deliberation of all the matters pertaining to this hearing, it appears to your said committee that the Winnebago County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy was established for the sons and daughters of the residents of Winnebago County, in which to secure a substantial education along the lines of agriculture and domestic science and manual training. That unfortunately, the law which created the said school merely defined the course of study therein, without providing for the giving to the graduates thereof any credit for any work done therein, in other schools of higher education and like endeavor. To illustrate: a farmer's son or daughter may go there and finish the course of study prescribed in said school, and if he or she wishes to ascend higher and to attend the State University at Madison, Wisconsin, the Normal schools or even the High schools, he or she would receive no credit whatever for the work already done by them in the agricultural school. The testimony shows, without question, that the county school of agriculture is and was not operated as an ideal agricultural school should

be. Your committee visited the said school on the second day of the hearing, to-wit: on the 8th day of December, 1913, and they found certain sections of the school in session while other sections of the school were not in session; the domestic science teacher appeared to have her department in working order, but the principal of the school and the assistant principal of the school were in attendance at every session of the investigation and were also at the session held in the City of Oshkosh, on the 26th day of December, the day the matter was argued before your committee.

The evidence discloses that the environments of the school are in a deplorable condition. One part of the school farm is a veritable "Frog-Pond", and whatever attempt the county board has ever made to drain the farm, it has never been drained, and the school has been in session, in the interim, for a number of years. Abundant testimony was adduced to indicate the presence of burdocks, Canada thistles, Blackeyed Susans and Morning Glories, in and upon the grounds of the farm, and when the farmers of this county saw what they naturally would suppose ought to be an ideal spot, in the way of agricultural neatness and perfection, such a decayed and unkempt condition, they began to wonder, and their wonder begot amazement.

Your Committee further beg leave to report that the "Welfare Association," an organization composed of the farmers of this county, filed charges, in writing, consisting of fifteen distinct charges, charging the school-board of the said school with incompetency, the said charges being signed by Messrs. Sommers & Velte, the attorneys for the said "Welfare Association." In this connection, however, your committee would report that the charges were not sustained by the proof, with the exception that the Winnebago County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy is verging on a collapse, and will become a failure unless some action is taken at once.

This condition appears to be the result of somebody's fault. That something is wrong either with the location of the school or with the conditions in and about the government of the school is unquestioned. The charges submitted to your committee are herewith filed and made a part of this report, and all exhibits with reference to the matter, introduced on the hearing thereof, are also herewith filed and submitted to your honorable body of your scrutiny, and made a part of this report.

#### Findings.

As a result of the investigation conducted by your committee on Nov. 17, 24 and Dec. 8 and 9, 1913, your committee finds, as follows, to-wit:

First: That the Winnebago County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy, located at the Village of Winneconne, Winne-

bago County, Wisconsin, is verging on a collapse and will become a failure unless some steps are taken at once to correct the evils there existing.

Second: That the cause of the conditions existing at said school are as follows:

(a) The present law governing said schools with regard to its failure to provide for the giving of credit to graduates thereof, and the passage of a new law recently enacted, giving to High schools the right to establish a course of study in agriculture and domestic science and giving to them credit for the work done in the said high schools, should any student or students thereof attend the State University or Normal schools, whereas the past and present graduates of the agricultural schools receive no credit for their work done while in attendance there, under the present law.

(b) The apparent antagonism which exists between many farmers of Winnebago county, including the "Welfare Association, and the school board of the school has contributed to some extent to the present condition of the school.

(c) The location of the Winnebago county School of Agriculture and Domestic Science is not an ideal one.

(d) Lack of harmony between the members of the faculty of the school during the past four years.

(e) Lack of harmony between the school-board and the faculty of the school during the past four years.

(f) The unkempt condition of the school lands, as a whole.

(g) The lack of executive ability on the part of the present principal and the lack of executive ability on the part of the principal who immediately preceded the present principal.

(h) The political factional differences existing in the village of Winneconne, which have crept into the school with a blighting influence.

(i) All of which combined have conspired to place the school in its present benighted condition.

Therefore, Your special investigating committee to whom was referred the arduous duty of making a painstaking, careful and thorough examination of the conditions existing at the school, would respectfully recommend that the Winnebago county school of agriculture and domestic economy be saved, if possible; that it be resurrected from its present woeful condition and regvanized into a new life by the inauguration of a campaign of education to be started at once.

that steps be taken by your honorable body in an effort to have the law changed, now governing schools of a like endeavor so that graduates therefrom may receive credit for their work done therein, in all of the superior schools of learning, in the State of Wisconsin.

(2) That a campaign of education be instituted among the farmers of Winnebago county to the end that they send their sons and daughters to the said Winnebago County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy, at Winneconne, Wisconsin; that it is their school, that it belongs to no particular person or persons and that it belongs to no particular faction.

(3) Your committee would further recommend that all influence inside the village of Winneconne be eliminated from the said school, and that the faculty be given notice not to mix in factional differences at the village of Winneconne.

(4) Your committee declare that they are equally divided on the question of recommending that the chairman of the educational committee, the principal of the school, and the members of the school board, Messrs W. S. Audiss and Peter Gunderson should resign.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: Whereas, the legislature of 1913 created chapter 751 known as section 702-1 to 702-13 inclusive providing for a county board of education has been duly passed, and

Whereas, subdivision 10 provides that the county board of education is hereby authorized to exercise all the powers and privileges conferred by law upon the county agricultural school if the county board of supervisors should so determine.

Now therefore be it resolved by the board of supervisors of Winnebago county, Wisconsin that the county board of supervisors of Winnebago county hereby determines that the said county board of education shall have full power and authority over the Winnebago county school of agriculture and domestic economy on and after its election and organization.

Remarks by Dist. Attorney, Supervisors Morrissey and Grimes. Supervisor Getchius withdrew his motion. Remarks by Supervisors Morrissey, Meeleus, Fiss and Howlett. Supervisor Grimes offered as a substitute for this resolution the following—Resolution No. 2.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: Whereas, a feeling of antagonism which has been aroused between the Winnebago County school board and a large number of Winnebago county farmers must result disastrously to said school, if allowed to continue, and

Whereas, the only means of removing said antagonism within the power of the county board lies in the appointment of a school board, who are entirely independent of Winneconne factions, and agreeable to the farmers who supply students to the said school, and

Whereas, the establishment of said school has cost the taxpayers of Winnebago county some \$60,000.00 no person who has the welfare of the said school and the honor of the county at heart should stand in the way of its success, nor should any personal consideration be permitted to prolong said antagonism, and

Whereas, any action that may be taken by your honorable body in an endeavor to assist said school without removing said antagonism would clearly be ineffective, fruitless and impotent, and

Whereas, any educational institution where the faculty are quarreling among themselves, where the governing board is quarreling with the faculty, and where both board and faculty are quarreling with a large number of the supporters of the said institution, who supply the students for the school is a disgrace to the county in which it is located, and a blot on the fair name of Winnebago county,

And Therefore, with malice toward none, and without reflecting in the slightest degree on the character or integrity of any person concerned, but wholly in the interest of our county school of agriculture.

Be It Resolved, that we recommend that Hon. M. F. White of the committee on education should resign as chairman of such committee and that Mr. Gunderson and Mr. Audiss should resign as members of the school board, and in such case there be appointed on said board two able and progressive and successful farmers, whose duty it shall be, in addition to handling the affairs of the school in accordance with the laws governing supervision of such institutions, to appoint on the several committees necessary to successfully handle the short course, stock show, grain contests, awarding the prizes and to co-operate with the faculty of said school, in advisable extension work, representatives of the several cities and towns of the county in order to create and broaden the interest in said school.

Whereas, the Special Committee after considering all of the evidence by separate vote on each of said charges preferred against the School Board and the members thereof found that such charges were not sustained, and

Whereas, at the commencement of said proceedings the specific charges preferred against Senator White were withdrawn.

Resolved, that the action of the committee in refusing to sustain said charges be approved by the County board.

Whereas, it appears from the investigation of the above mentioned school by unanimous report from the investigating committee that the present School Board are in no way responsible for the present condition of the school.

Therefore be it Resolved, that the County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy located in the village of Winneconne, Wis. remain in charge of the present School Board.

And Be It Further Resolved, That at the end of the present school year said school be closed and remain closed until such time and such laws shall have been passed by the State Legislature as would warrant the reopening of said school, and

Be It Further Resolved, That said School Board be instructed that upon receipt of any state aid due Winnebago County for maintaining the said school during the past year such money shall be turned over to Winnebago County and placed in the general fund.

### Sub-Committee's Report.

Supervisor Loescher read Report No. 2 of the committee as follows:

The undersigned committee, appointed to draw up a report of the committee of the whole, beg leave to report that they have considered all resolutions presented to them and recommend the passage of the following resolutions.

#### 1st—Introduced by Supervisor Stanley.

Whereas, Your committee appointed at the November session of the County Board of Supervisors to investigate the Winnebago County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy have found that said school is not under the present method of organization, serving the best interests of the public because of the fact that the work required by law to be done in the Agricultural Schools is now being done as a part of the work of the various High Schools of the state, and

Whereas, It has been found no credit is given in higher institutions for work done in this or other Agricultural Schools of the state, and

Whereas, The attendance of pupils at the short course of the University of Wisconsin is becoming so great that only with difficulty can they accommodate at that institution without over crowding the same, and

Whereas, We believe that the work being done in the short course of the University of Wisconsin could be carried out to greater advantage to the people of the state through the several Agricultural Schools, located in various parts of the state, thereby making it possible to localize the work and adapt it to the needs of the various communities in which the several schools are located, thereby greatly increasing the efficiency of the instruction in said schools.

Therefore Be It Resolved, That the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County memorialize the legislature, at its next session, and instruct the several representatives from said County to use their best efforts to provide by law for the taking over by the state of the several Agricultural Schools located in different parts of the state, the same direction of the University of Wisconsin and to be used as extension schools, experimental stations and for carrying on the work now being done in the short course of the University of Wisconsin. The state to reimburse the counties to the amount expended in the construction of said County Agricultural Schools.

#### 2nd—Introduced by Supervisor Grimes.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: Whereas, The low spot on the County School tract, termed the "Frog-Pond" has become an eye-sore to the patrons of said school and the same might be drained at a very small cost, greatly benefiting the school land, and Mr. Gunderson's land as well, by deepening the aforementioned ditch.

and putting in 5 inch tile,

Therefore Be It Resolved, That \$200.00 of the \$3300.00 appropriated for maintenance of said school for the current year be set aside by the school board, the same to constitute a drainage fund to be used under the provisions of section 1381 of the Wisconsin statutes to drain the flooded portion of said school land.

### 3rd—Introduced by Supervisor Grimes.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: Whereas, It develops and has become known, understood and admitted, through the investigation of conditions affecting the Winnebago county school of agriculture and domestic economy, by the special committee of the county board appointed for that purpose, that students graduating from any of the several county schools of agriculture and domestic science, in the State of Wisconsin and desiring thereafter to enter the University of Wisconsin or other higher educational institutions, can under the present defective and inadequate law, receive absolutely no credit for the time, studies mastered or training received, within such county school and in the case of those graduates who do go higher, and put themselves in a position to command the salaries paid teachers of agriculture throughout the State, the two year course at the agricultural school is of no avail whatever, and therefore an unjustifiable sacrifice of two of the very valuable years of the students life; and whereas this failure or inability on the part of those in authority at the State institutions of learning to accord to graduates entering from the county agricultural schools of the State due credit for the training received therein is one of the fruitful causes of the falling off in attendance at such county schools and thereby diminishing their usefulness and threatening their very existence, and whereas many students come to county schools of agriculture not sufficiently proficient in the common school branches of study to derive the best results from the agricultural course of study given.

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, by the board of Supervisors of Winnebago county that we demand of our State Senator and of our assemblymen an earnest, persistent and untiring effort to have amended section 553-H of chapter 27 which limits the course of study in county schools of agriculture, harmfully and unnecessarily, that the county agricultural school board may be enabled to include a regular academic course for students desiring the same, and to put said school on an equal footing with those high schools of the State which include agriculture in their regular course of study.

Be It Further Resolved, That we demand the best efforts of the said state senator and assemblymen toward the enactment of a law whereby students entering the University of Wisconsin or other educational institutions shall be accorded full credit for studies mastered or training received in any county school of agriculture and domestic economy within the State of Wisconsin.

Be It Further Resolved, That copies of the above resolution be forwarded to the clerk of the several counties who have established county schools of agriculture and domestic economy with a request that the same or resolution of similar import be adopted at the March 1914 session of their respective county boards.

### 4th—Introduced by Supervisor Grimes.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: Whereas, Much money has been expended for creamery and

cheese making apparatus testers, vats, separators, etc., and the faculty is still without milk with which to demonstrate the use of said machinery, and

Whereas, The importance of skill in dairying is conceded by all successful farmers and educators of the State and therefore the facilities for teaching this particular branch of agriculture should be the best attainable.

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, That one or more cows sufficient to furnish them milk necessary for test making, creamery and cheese making demonstrations and experiments be transferred from the county farm at Winnebago to the school barn at Winneconne.

That the janitor of said school be required to attend and care for said animals according to instructions of school principal, and in the absence of available food from school land the school board shall supply the same, using the school maintenance fund for the purpose.

**5th—Introduced by Supervisor Grimes.**

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: Whereas, Owing to the lack of facilities for transportation the location of our county agricultural school is at a decided disadvantage, and while we are powerless to change the location we may offset this advantage by making said Winnebago county school of agriculture and domestic economy one of the best of its kind in the State, to this end,

Be It Resolved, That the board of said school be and they are hereby instructed to have delivered at said school barn thirty yards of clean gravel suitable for concrete, and same to be used in constructing a silo, 8 feet in diameter, 23 feet high, whereby the preparation of properly balanced rations which we believe is the key to successful dairying may be demonstrated by the faculty and practiced by the students,

Be It Further Resolved, That \$100.00 of the \$3300.00 appropriated for said school be set aside by the school board for the purpose of constructing said silo, the same to be built as soon as weather conditions will permit in the spring.

**6th—Introduced by Supervisor Grimes.**

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: Whereas, We have heard many complaints of the charges for board and lodging which is demanded of students at Winneconne and we have been unable to find a record of any cash receipts for articles, cooked at said county agricultural school.

Therefore Be It Resolved, That the school board be and they are hereby instructed to investigate the possibility of an arrangement whereby the products of the school kitchen, the milk products and all perishable food might be utilized to reduce uniformly, the board bills of students attending the school.

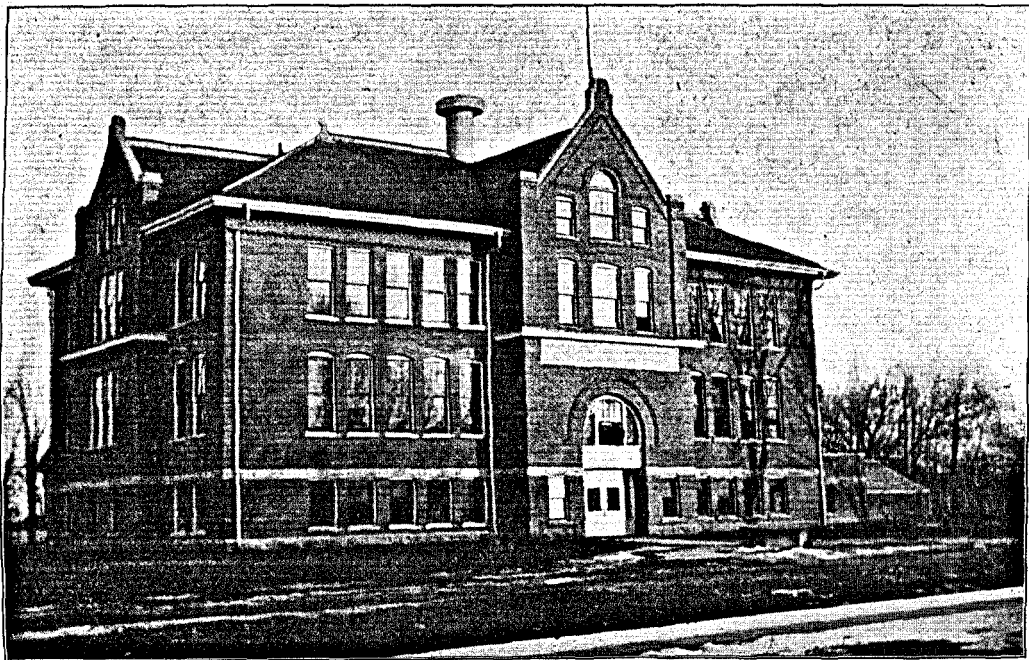

## RULES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, ADOPTED MAY 23, 1913

I. The meetings of this Board shall be held in the Supervisors' room, and the hour for the daily meetings shall be 9 a. m., providing that on the first meeting in each week the hour of meeting shall be 10 a. m.

And the County Board shall continue in continuous session from day to day until adjourned, unless adjourned to a day certain or sine die.

II. At the first meeting of the Board it shall be the duty of the Chairman, or in the case of his absence the Vice-Chairman, or in their absence, the Clerk, to call to order.

The Clerk shall then call the roll of Members.

A quorum being present, the Board shall proceed to the election of a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

(Amended to provide for Vice-Chairmen as authorized by Ch. 110, of 1903.)

III. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to appoint the following standing committees, each to consist of the number of members as set after the name of each committee, viz:

- Equalization, 13;
- Finance, 9;
- General Accounts, 9;
- Illegal Assessments, 5;
- Justices and Constables' Accounts, 9;
- Sheriff's and Coroner's Accounts, 9;
- Insane, 5;
- Poor and Poor Farm, 5;
- Workhouse, 3;
- Corporations, 5;
- Public Buildings, 5;
- Roads and Bridges, 5;
- Per Diem and Mileage, 5;
- Printing, 5;
- Bonds and Salaries, 6;
- County Abstract and Tract Index System, 5;
- Rules, 3;
- County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy, 5.

IV. The Board may adjourn for such time as shall be necessary for the Chairman to prepare the list of committees and no business can be done until the same shall be announced.

V. The Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, shall take the chair at the hour to which the Board may from time to time stand adjourned, call the Board to order and direct the calling of the roll of members by the Clerk.

VI. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the Clerk, and any mistake therein shall be corrected by the Board; provided, that upon the last day of the session the journal for that day will be read and, before the final adjournment, corrected.

VII. After the reading and correction of the journal, the order of business shall be as follows:

1. Reception of Petitions, Memorials, Accounts, etc.
2. Presentation of Resolutions and disposition of same.

3. Reports of Standing Committees.
4. Reports of Select Committees.
5. Consideration of Miscellaneous Business.

VIII. The Chairman shall preserve order and decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Board; and shall clearly and distinctly state every motion or question before debate.

IX. The Chairman shall be entitled to vote on all questions taken by ayes and noes, and his name shall be called last; when the vote on any question is a tie it shall be deemed to have been lost.

X. Every motion or amendment shall be reduced to writing when a request therefor shall be made by any member; and all petitions, memorials and substitutes shall be reduced to writing and read before they shall be considered by the Board.

XI. Every written resolution shall have attached thereto the name of the person introducing it; and when referred to a committee, the names of such committee shall be endorsed thereon.

XII. Every member, previous to speaking, shall rise and address the Chair.

XIII. When two or more members rise at once, the Chair shall designate the member who is to speak first; but in all cases the member who shall first rise and address the Chair shall speak first.

XIV. No member shall speak more than twice upon the same question without leave; and when called to order by the Chairman shall take his seat, and shall not be allowed to proceed without leave of the Board.

XV. A vote on any question shall be taken by ayes and nays when called for by any member; and SHALL be so taken on all questions involving the expenditure of money; and whenever a vote is so ordered and taken, the members voting in the affirmative and negative, as well as those absent or not voting, shall be recorded at length in the records of the proceedings of the County Board.

(Amended to conform to Sec. 709, Stat. of 1892.)

XVI. No account or claim against the County shall be audited unless it be made out in items and duly verified and be filed with the Clerk of the Board, except as otherwise provided by law.

XVII. When a motion is under consideration, no motion shall be entertained except:

1. To adjourn.
2. To lay on the table.
3. For the previous question.
4. To postpone to a day certain.
5. To commit to a committee.
6. To amend or to substitute.
7. To postpone indefinitely.

These several motions shall take precedence in the order in which they stand in this rule.

XVIII. A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, and for the previous question, shall be decided without debate, except as hereinafter provided.

XIX. A motion to postpone indefinitely or to a day certain or to commit shall not be again entertained on the same day or in the same stage of the proposition.

XX. A substitute shall be open to amendment the same as the original proposition; but when adopted, shall not be subject to amendment. If an amendment or substitute is lost, another substantially the same shall not be entertained.

XXI. When a motion or question has once been determined, any member voting with the majority may move a reconsideration of the vote, but such motion shall be made and acted on at the same or next succeeding meeting, and shall not thereafter be made except by unanimous consent.

XXII. The previous question may be moved by any member, and the Chairman shall then say: "It requiring five members to second this motion, those in favor of sustaining the motion will rise." If five or more members then rise, the previous question shall thereby be seconded and an opportunity then be given to any two members opposed thereto to briefly state their objections. The question shall then be: "Shall the question be now put?" which, if carried by a vote of two-thirds of the members present upon a call of the ayes and nays, the Board shall immediately proceed to vote upon the pending amendment, if any, and upon the main question.

XXIII. In filling blanks, the largest sum and the longest time shall be first put.

XXIV. These rules shall not be changed, amended, or repealed, unless the proposition or amendment is introduced in writing and the same laid over to some subsequent meeting of the Board, not less than five days intervening, and then only with the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

XXV. Any of these rules may be suspended upon any pending measure by unanimous consent or by two-thirds of the members present.

XXVI. These rules and all amendments or additions thereto which may hereafter be made shall govern the Board until altered or repealed, as herein provided.

XXVII. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in "Jefferson's Manual," so far as they remain in common use and are practicable and applicable and not inconsistent herewith, shall govern the Board.

XXVIII. Whenever the Board shall have gone into a committee of the whole and shall have arisen, the Board shall at once be in session for the receiving and acting upon the report of the committee of the whole, and for the transaction of any and all other business of every kind.
