

Whereas the town of Algoma has filed a petition with the county board asking for an appropriation to defray the expenses of building a certain bridge, commonly known as Boyd bridge, wholly in section 35 and 36, in the town of Algoma in said county, and that said town has provided for the payment, such portion of the cost of construction as required by law and that the cost of such construction will not exceed \$400.00.

Whereas the county board has adopted a site for the building of a county sanatorium on the poor farm. Said site having been approved by State Board of Control, a letter of approval is here attached and

Whereas the county board has adopted plans and specifications for the building of the county tubercolosis sanatorium.

Petition for Bridge-Town of Rushford.

Office of Town Clerk, Town of Rushford. Eureka, Wis., August 12th, 1914.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County-

Gentlemen: The petition of the undersigned town board of the town of Rushford, County of Winnebago, respectfully represents that on the 11th day of August, 1914, at a special town meeting of said town, the electors thereof voted to construct a bridge lying; wholly within said town, as described in the resolution hereinafter mentioned; that at the same time due provision was made for the payment by the said town of Rushford of the proportion of the cost of constructing such bridge required by law to be paid by the said town as appears from the following, which is a true copy of said resolution:

"Resolved, By the qualified electors of the Town of Rushford, County of Winnebago, duly assembled in special town meeting, this IIth day of Amgust, 1914, that the town board of said town be and it is hereby authorized to construct a bridge lying wholly within said town, located in section No.

20. Road District No. 5, on the road starting at a point known as the Bell School House Corner and running west to County Line, at a total cost of not exceeding Eight Hundred Dollars, to be defrayed in part by the said town of Rushford and in part by the county of Winnebago, as provided by law; and the said town board is hereby directed to levy a direct annual tax sufficient to pay the proportions of such cost, so to be paid by the town of Rushford, and to take such action as may be required by law in order to secure an appropriation by the county of Winnebago to pay the proportion of such cost required by law to be paid by the said county;

Gentlemen: Your Committee on Rules beg leave to report that they recommend the following resolution:

Resolved, By the Beard of Supervisors of Winnebago County, That there be and is hereby created a new Rule to be known as Rule No. 29, as follows, to-wit:

No resolution for the appropriation for money shall be in order until the day after its presentation, and reference, except upon the consent of twothirds of the members of the County Board present.

Remarks were made by Supervisor Getchius, who moved to refer the resolution back to the committee until Wednesday. The motion was carried, and resolution referred.

Remarks were made by Supervisor Meeleus, who moved that reports of Superintendent Manuel, and Trustees of the Asylum, be received without reading. The motion was lost.

Annual Report of the Trustees of the County Asylum, Asylum

Farm and County Home.

Trustee Pinkerton offered Report No. 1, as follows:

The Board of Trustees of the Asylum for the Chronic Insane, and the County Home, of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, respectfully submit herewith their report of the two institutions covering the year ending June 30, 1914.

Our institutions and the county farm are, at the close of this year, in the best condition they have ever been.

No new buildings have been built but some substantial repairs have been made during the year,—the most extensive being the rebuilding of a part of the west barn for cattle stable, cement floors and a complete set of modern stanchions, with calf and bull pens, have been installed, which enable us to more effectively care for our stock. At the main buildings cement floors have been completed in the north wing basement. New floors and steel ceilings have been put in Superintendent's apartments; new ventilators installed for fans for heating system; flues for one of our large boilers renewed; new steel ceiling and galvanized ventilators in boiler and engine house, also all gutters and cornice and gutter spouts repaired and repainted on main buildings.

While the season was excessively wet in the early part of the year, our yield of farm produce averages about equal, on the whole, to that of other years.

We have contracted for fifteen hundred tons of screened lump West Virginia Splint coal at \$3.55 per ton F. O. B. Asylum, to supply the institutions until July 1, 1915. This is the best price we have ever been able to get on the grade of coal we must have to meet our requirements.

The special representative, sent by the State Board of Control for establishing the new system of uniform accounting for all county institutions, has installed for us the entire new system as required by law, and the new form of our report this year is the report required by the State Board. We have, in conjunction with the Committee on Insanc, taken a careful inventory of all county property and established actual values on land, buildings, and all equipment, as near as we can determine. The new system, as now established, while somewhat more exacting in detail, is a much more complete and satisfactory system than that formerly used, and is, we believe, a substantial advantage to the county.

We have felt for several years that the county could use to good advantage some additional acreage in the County Farm, and now since the taking of some acres of our best land for the Tuberculosis Sanatorium, together with the necessity of hiring pasturage for some of our cattle, which we have done for several years, and the actual showing of earnings from our farm for last year with a profit of \$7,342.51 justifies our conclusion that we should recommend to your honorable body the purchase of 80 or 100 acres of land to be added to our County Farm. Several tracts of land in the neighborhood have been offered to us which can be considered when your honorable body so direct.

We completed the last payment due on our bond issue last Year, so the institution is now free from indebtedness.

Your Board of Trustees deem it unnecessary to ask your Honorable Body for any special appropriation this year, in that our earnings for the year due from the State are \$19,415.96, earnings for poor from towns and cities (not county poor) including clothing, is \$3,529.85, estimated receipts from the farm and other sources based on last year's record will be \$3,000, which with our balance on hand July 1, 1914, of \$25,800.90, gives us total resources from which to carry on the institution to January 1, 1916—of \$51,746.71. As shown by our report cur total operating expense for the past year has been \$32,286.75—as our funds due from the State are received but once a year, in February, it is necessary for us to figure eighteen months in advance. The amount chargeable for our own county insane of \$16,658.34 and \$657.47 for the Winnebago County Poor makes a total saving to the county of \$17,315.81; this is the amount our county would be obliged to

pay to maintain our patients in any other county institution if we had none. From this you can readily see that our county institutions are a valuable asset to Winnebago county from a financial standpoint.

We would not consider our report complete without an expression of the continued satisfaction we feel with the very efficient management of our institutions by Mr. and Mrs. Manuel, who are, in the places they fill, benefactors to our county and our community.

Their report, together with that of Dr. Brockway, who has given the county another year of faithful and efficient service, is attached hereto.

In submitting this, our annual report, we can only add that we have endeavored to give the institution our best efforts, and hope that the same meet with your approval.

We wish to express to the employees of the institution, Dr. Brockway, the County Physician, the Board of Trustees and the members of the Honorable Board of Supervisors our deep appreciation of the consideration and co-operation with which you have aided us in the discharge of our duties.

Dr. Brockway offered Report No. 3, as follows:

To the Honorable Board of Trustees of the County Asylum and Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: The following is my report as County Physician for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1914.

I have made the regular twice a week visits to the County Asylum and County Home and special vists when called or urgency of a case required.

COUNTY ASYLUM.

The sanitary measures carried out during the year were excellent and there were no contagious diseases in the institution throughout the entire year. There were two major accidents, a broken hip in an old man caused by falling out of bed, and a woman breaking her collar bone by falling on the hard floor while in a maniacal fit. Both of these recovered.

The following deaths occurred during this year:

In July, 1913, there was one death, in August three, September one, October one, November three, December three, January two, February two, March two, April one, May two and June one. Of these, thirteen were males and nine females.

Don't forget that this abstract department belongs to you, the people of Winnebago county.

The causes of death were as follows:

Seven were caused by dementia in its several forms, five disease of the heart, four paralysis, two apoplexy, one septicaemia, one arterio sclerosis, one congestion of the lungs and one Bright's disease.

The sleeping quarters of the patients were frequently inspected by me and always found to be kept clean, comfortable and sanitary.

I have frequently inspected the food while being cooked, and afterward when served, and have always found it to be of excellent character, well cooked, appetizing and varied enough to give a wholesome and nutritious diet. Supt. Manuel, his wife, the matron.

the attendants and cooks, have all worked together continually and to the best of their ability, to furnish the best possible care to the unfortunates in their charge.

THE COUNTY HOME.

There were twelve deaths at the Home this year, eleven males and one female. They were all aged people with the exception of one, a middle aged man who died of tuberculosis. The causes of death were disease of heart in four cases, paralysis two, cancer two, prostatitis one, one suicide and one as the result of a broken hip which was caused by an old man accidentally falling down the basement stairs.

There were no contagious diseases except the one of tuberculosis who came there in the advanced stage of the disease.

Frequent inspection of the food invariably showed it to be of good quality, well cooked and wholesome.

Mr. and Mrs. Hough, with their assistants, have kept the building clean and sanitary and done everything possible for the comfort and welfare of the inmates.

THE COUNTY JAIL.

I have responded to calls to the Jail whenever a physician was needed. There was little illness there during this year and no deaths. I have always found the Jail clean and sanitary, the food furnished prisoners good and well cooked and the prisoners well treated.

THE COUNTY WORKHOUSE.

There were a number of calls to the workhouse this year, all but one being for illness due to the effects of alcoholism, several of these were seriously ill and one died from acute alcoholism. In this institution I have always found everything clean and well kept, the food of best quality and the prisoners kindly treated.

The management of all the county institutions have invariably done all in their power to alleviate suffering among their charges and have always promptly and cheerfully assisted my work in every way possible, for which I thank them. I also wish to thank the Trustees of the Asylum and members of the Board of Supervisors for the interest shown in the county health work.

Report of the Supervising Librarian.

Miss Julia Rupp offered the following, Report No. 16:

To the Board of Libraries of Winnebago County for the period from October 1, 1913, to October 1, 1914.

Gentlemen: The Winnebago County Traveling Library System has grown to be a collection of 2,761 books divided into 46 libraries all in use during the winter months with the exception of two which are kept on hand for exchange purposes. Visits to 28 stations were made in October and proved very satisfactory; everywhere a hearty welcome was extended and the query in regard to the libraries brought forth enthusiastic statements as to their usefulness and to the pleasure and recreation they afforded the people in the country.

With the aid of Mr. Patch, County Superintendent of Schools, many of the teachers were enlisted to carry on the work of reaching the people in the various communities.


Special help has been given to Winneconne the past year by the loan of several libraries at a time to help fill in the village library which has been organized there.

The total number of books added this year was 167; of these 150 were by purchase, 5 by gift and 12 by exchange. 29 books were discarded on account of their worn condition. The total circulation was 3,144, with an increase of 255 over last year. The largest circulation on any one library was 515 in Clayton, in charge of Mrs. Herman Inde. The circulation although showing an increase, does not by any means give an idea of the actual use to which the books have been put. It seems impossible to have the people in charge of libraries see the importance of a record in regard to the use of the books.

New stations were established at Medina Junction, a school in Winchester Township, and a school in Clayton Township. Two stations were revived, one near Poygan Marsh, and the other in the Ball Prairie School.

The complete list of stations is as follows: 3 Allenville; 2 Black Wolf; Butte des Morts; 2 Clayton; Clemensville; Delhi; Elo; 3 Eureka; Fisk; 2 Gillingham's Corners; Koro; 2 Larsen; Medina Junction; Mikesville; 3 Nekimi; 4 Omro; Orihula; Oshkosh; Picketts; Poygan; Ritcher's Landing; 2 Ring; Rush Lake; 2 Waukua; 2 Winchester; 2 Winneconne; Ball Prairie School; Zittau.

Assessor of Income's Report.

D. M. Shea offered the following, Report No. 24:

Thirteenth Annual Report of the Assessor of Incomes.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Centlemen: Pursuant to law, I have the honor to present to
you my annual report:

The law requires that during the month of April of each year, the Assessor of Incomes call a meeting of the assessors of the several districts of the county, for conference and instructions in their duties as assessors. In addition to the information and knowledge gained, there is also a great gain in the improved spirit of "good government" in the desire to comply with the intent of the law, to avoid under-assessments for the purpose of a small local gain in county and state taxes at the expense of neighboring assessment districts. It might be added that there are four or five districts in the county where the assessors are disposed to adhere to the spirit prevailing more generally a few years back, viz.: to seek to keep their assessments so far under true value as to acquire an unfair advantage over their neighbors in the county equalization. Through the work of your committee on equalization, with any assistance that this office has been able to furnish them, such unfair assessments have had little or no effect. In this connection is to be commended the desire of equal and fair treatment almost uniformly shown by members of the county board. It gives me pleasure at this time to especially commend the work of assessors of the village of Winneconne and the city of Oshkosh, where assessments were made of unusual accuracy, discrimination and independence of previous assessments.

The law defines with clearness upon what property taxes shall be levied and the precise manner in which assessments shall be made. Regarding the enforcement of the laws of the past, let us go back to the year 1897.

The first State Tax Commission was created nearly seventeen years ago, and held their first meeting on the 10th day of June, 1897. The conditions that led to the creation of the State Tax Commission are best described in the language of the commissioners themselves, page 69.

"No intelligent man can become familiar with the methods of raising taxes now ip vogue in Wisconsin without being impressed by the fact that they are very defective in many particulars, and fall far short of what the intelligent and progressive people of this state have a right to demand."

In their first report the Commission points out that the property of Wisconsin was assessed at less than forty per cent of its value, as shown by the United States census (page 71, Report '98). The commissioners say, on page 75: "A great and growing evil in our state is the pervailing custom of assessing property at a sum far below its true value." * * "If the assessor is disposed to be fair as between different taxpayers of his district, he will, perhaps start with some former assessor's value of a particular parcel, or with his own arbitrary modification of such value, and assesses the adjoining property by comparison with the first, the next by comparison with the second, and so on till the first standard is virtually lost sight of. When the average assessor once departs from the standard of true value, he speedily comes to have no standard except a sort of comparison between like properties so circumstanced as to be easily compared. It consequently happens, unless the assessor is a person of diligence and unusual judgment, that his valuations soon show wide variations not only in respect to dissimilar properties and different classes of property, but even as to properties which differ only in ownership. The habit of undervaluations is one of such long standing that in most assessment districts sets or series of arbitrary valuations for assessment purposes have become established. These, originating in slight departures from true value, have been changed from time to time according to the notions of successive assessors, previous assessments being taken as a guide or standard, rather than actual values, until the whole becomes but a mass of arbitrary figures. Assessment valuations have come thus to be, in fact, and are commonly considered and treated as something apart from and unrelated to actual values."

(Page 77, Report of 98). The feeling on the part of the assessor that he is bound by no definite rule or standard begets indifference and carelessness, gives bias or prefudice free play, and with easy-going or intentionally dishonest officials, affords both room and cover for favoritism and partiality. "In very many instances, perhaps in a majority of cases, the assessment has come to be hardly more than a farce. But this so-called assessment, roll with a piece of perjury attached in the form of all desessor's oath, is solemnly accepted as the basis on which citizens are asked and virtually forced to make their contributions to the heavy and constantly increasing burden of taxation. These perjured documents are also supposed to form the basis of the county equalization, and ultimately the basis for the apportionment of state taxes."

This is the method which grew up under Sec. 1052, R. S., which provides that real estate shall be assessed "at the full value which could ordinarily be obtained therefor at private sale." In the case of Schettler vs. City of Fort Howard, 43 Wis. 48, Chief Justice Ryan says, speaking of the law and its abuses: "The statutes are so carefully framed that it does not lightly trust the conscience of assessors. It requires from each a precise and positive amdavit that he has made his assessment upon statutory rule. If an assessor does not annex his affidavit to his assessment roll he does not complete his duty, and there is in law, no assessment. If the assessor make and annex the affidavit to an assessment made in violation of the statutory rule he takes an absolutely false oath in the execution of his office. What faith can be reposed in an assessment so made and so verified? What security is there that such an assessment is just, equal or honest in either respects, even upon their or fire is a place that he the rule of the assessors?"

We know that throughout Wisconsin property was assessed all the way from twenty per cent of true value to eighty-five. We know that the same conditions prevailed in the different assessment districts of the county. We know, too, that these conditions have not been entirely eliminated. It was to remedy, and if possible, remove these conditions that laws were passed organizing in this state a new system of supervision. First, a commission of three members was created in 1897, with limited powers and no salary, to investigate and report. Second, in 1899, a permanent commission was created, consisting of three members who were provided with a suffable salary and vested with considerable powers of supervision over the assessors and assessments of the state. Third, in 1891, the duties and powers of this commission were much expanded, increased and broadened, and toutth, the new office of "County Supervisor of Assessments" was created to act in toon-

junction with and under the general direction of the State Tax Commission, and having a general supervision over local assessors, boards of review and boards of equalization. At the November session in 1901, the county board complied with the law by appointing a man to fill this new office. At the November session of 1902, this officer made his first report to the county board.

Too much credit cannot be given to the men who composed the county board of that year, in opposition to some few of their own members, the arguments of the mayors and other officials of the different cities, the newspapers of the county, and the general public sentiment at that time, for the first time in many years the valuation of the taxable property of the county was fixed by the board at a greater amount than the assessment, notwithstanding the fact that none knew better than the members of the previous county boards that the assessment did not comply with the law in so far as representing true value. "In order to best describe the condition that prevailed at that time. I will quote the following from the report of the supervisor of assessments of that year: go upon record here in recognition of the faithful efforts put forth by many of the assessors in an honest effort to comply with the law, and which has in some cases changed friends to bitter enemies and making the assessor the object of more or less unkind feelings throughout the neighborhood." None know better than the assessors and members of the county boards of the past thirteen years the efforts that have been put forth to get an assessment that would more nearly comply with the law. We all remember many instances where good, honest, conscientious men were elected to the office of assessor or member of the county board and were politically slaughtered at the next annual election for daring to do their duty as such officers. भागित है। अर्थ होता के उन्हें जाता है।

The county board of Winnebago county stands alone in my opinion, in their efforts to study and inform themselves upon the question of assessments and taxes, and they are being rewarded by having the same officials who in the past have criticized their work appear before them and congratulate them on their present efforts to arrive at a true cash value of all taxable property in the county.

There are men sitting on your board at the present time who were members of the county board previous to the year 1902, when the valuation of this county by the local assessors was approximately \$30,000,000, and the equalized value fixed by the board at approximately \$15,000,000. How this amount was arrived at no one seems to know, but those were the days when each local assessor of the state was a law unto himself and was intentionally keeping the assessment of his district down for the purpose of gaining an advantage over other districts in the county equalization, and the

county board would go the assessors one better in their efforts to gain an advantage in the state equalization.

Under the guidance of the State Tax Commission and the local supervision of the Supervisor of Assessments, the work of the local assessors has been much improved, and through the methods introduced and put in force, it is practically impossible for one district to gain an advantage over another by an assessment made at anything less than true value.

It has been my desire to bring the assessment of this county to a substantial compliance with the law, without asking for a re-assessment of any of the several districts on account of the additional expense caused by such assessment, but I have arrived at the conclusion that there are two or three districts in the county where the influence is so great and the opposition against a full value assessment so strong that the only way to obtain a legal assessment in those districts is to ask for a re-assessment.

The Tax Commission used the five year sale method to arrive at the true value of the real property of the state. This method is used by me in arriving at the true value of real estate of the several districts of the county. The figures are furnished this office by the commission.

The method used in arriving at the true value of personal property, I will explain to you informally and gladly answer any question that you see fit to ask in regard to anything contained in the report.

The members of the committee on equalization are entitled to words of commendation for the spirit of honesty and fairness shown toward every district in the county. This was manifested in the harmonious session held by the committee at this time.

In conclusion, I wish to thank the members of the board for the many courtesies extended to me, not only this year but also in the past.

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

Road and Bridge Committee Report-Road in Town of Utica.

Supervisor Raddatz offered the following, Report No. 11:

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen: Your committee appointed under Section 1338 of the statutes to act for Winnebago County in the matter of an appeal by Mr. Bradley et al. of the Town of Utica, from a road decision bearing date of September 10, 1914, Town Board of said, Town, beg leave to report:

Just think of the reduction in the cost of abstracts since the Winnebago County Abstract was started from former prices, fifty per cent less.

That on November 24th in order to obtain a clear and correct idea of the situation, condition, etc., of said road, we visited, viewed, and walked over the same its entire length, and found the portion of in dispute entirely void of improvements as such, except for a ditch in a N. W. and S. Easterly direction; and a slight ridge running east and west in or near the center of where travelled track should be, which we were informed was made by a plow turning four furrows together to mark the quarter lines across the marsh. We found evidence of a wooden bridge having existed over said ditch at a point some fifteen rods north of where road should be. We found the two parallel depressions caused by repeated travel with wagons leading to the point where bridge had been. depressions being sodded over, seemed to indicate that the road had been used much more during the existence of the bridge or at some former time. We found much of the hay on the marsh at both sides of road uncut, while more on equally low ground had been cut and stacked. We found the remains of a fence running parallel with and presumably in the center of said road, but not extending to either end of the disputed portion of the road in question, the entrance to which was entirely open to the public, and free of fences. We found a goodly number of interested parties, taxpayers of the town of Utica and members of the town board, on the ground, who were desirous of being heard before your committee formulated its report to your Honorable Body. And in view of the conflicting claims made by those present in reference to the laying out, alleged abandonment, and necessity of said road, it was

decided to hear all interested parties at the court house in the city of Oshkosh, on December 12, 1914, when your committee could have the attention of the county's legal advisor, receive and have recorded stenographically all the evidence in the case.

On December 12th, your committee met pursuant to adjournment at 10 o'clock A. M. in the supervisors' room of the court house and proceeded to hear the testimony offered by counsel for the opposing forces and ascertain for ourselves from the witnesses undr oath, the actual situation.

Our late esteemed and able friend, F. X. McCabe, was present and took a shorthand report of all testimony, and administered the oath to the twenty witnesses sworn. The taking of testimony having consumed the day to 5 P. M., and many intricate legal questions having developed, your committee adjourned subject to the call of Chairman Raddatz to a time when the notes would be transcribed and in a condition for our perusal. In the meantime, the fatal illness of the County Stenographer occurred and prevented the issuance of a typewritten copy of the testimony in the case. lieving the expense of hiring the work done unjustifiable and unnecessary, Mr. Raddatz called the committee together December 28. 1914, to hear the laws governing such cases, explained by the opposing counsel, and having cited Supreme court decisions applicable to the case in question, and also to consider the relative value of the testimony submitted for and against the improving of said disputed portion of road in question. After due consideration of the testimony which showed conclusively that the road in question had been travelled more or less continuously from as far back as the memory of men now living can go; without any protest from any source, up to a very recent date. The testimony of the present chairman of the town of Utica, which admitted ordering plank to bridge the ditch where it crosses the road in question, is ample and undisputable proof of the knowledge of the town authorities, of the existence of a road over the disputed section.

Come in the Register of Deeds office and have your abstracts made or continued by the county.

In view of the foregoing facts and conclusions, your committee find:

First: That the road in question has not been abandoned;

To Memorialize the Legislature.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen: Your Special Committee who were appointed in accordance with the following resolution, to-wit:

Resolved, By the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin: That a committee consisting of at least three members of this board be appointed by the chairman at this meeting, whose duty it shall be to draft a resolution on or before the November session, memorializing the next legislature to repeal all useless and freak laws now on the statute books passed in the several legislatures last past; and also to offer amendments to such other laws that are now a burden upon the tax payers of the state; and be it

Further Resolved, That each member of this board offer suggestions and produce facts to said committee as to which laws shall be repealed or amended.

Dated at Oshkosh, Wis., May 2, 1914.

Don't forget that this abstract department belongs to you, the people of Winnebago county.

And which said resolution was adopted on the same day and the undersigned were appointed as such committee; and that the time for making such report was extended to the January session of this board. Your committee therefore beg leave to report that they received communications, memorials and resolutions from supervisors of several of the leading counties of this state bearing on the several laws in question, all of which are hereto attached and made part of our report. Your committee further report that we have had under consideration the several laws hereinafter mentioned and recommend that they be repealed, amended or re-enacted as follows, to-wit:

First: Your committee has had under consideration the present State Highway law known as section 1317-M-1 to 1317-M-16 inclusive of the statutes of 1913, and particularly that portion of it relating to state and county aid for highways; that Winnebago county favors good roads; that the members of this board unanimously favor good roads at as low a cost to the taxpayers as possible, considering quality, and are in sympathy with good road improvement; but that a limitation should be placed upon the amount of money that the respective counties and towns may be compelled to raise as an appropriation for highways in any one year, as hereinafter mentioned. That your committee have had more or less correspondence with officials in several of the leading counties of this State showing the amount of money raised for highways and the class of work done all of which is hereto attached and made a part of our report.

The Winnebago County Abstract is a good thing; help push it along and make it a success.

Second: Your committee further report that we believe that the present state aid highway law as carried out under the state highway commission is extravagant and wholly unnecessary; that the money now spent to maintain this commission had much better be expended in the actual construction of highways, inasmuch as the townships pay one-third, the county one-third, making two-thirds of all moneys expended, yet no work can be executed under the present law unless the State Highway Commission consent thereto, which destroys all local control of all roads put upon the state highway system.

Third: We therefore recommend that the present State Highway law should be repealed.

Fourth: That a law be enacted placing the construction of highways under the supervision of counties; the engineering work to be done by a staff of state engineers, that each county have a

highway commissioner or county superintendent of highways and fix his salary at not less than \$1,000 per annum in counties having a population of 25,000 or more, and in counties having a less population to be fixed at not less than \$800 per annum. A compulsory law requiring each county to raise not less than two-tenths mills or more than four-tenths mills and towns not to raise less than four-tenths mills nor more than eight-tenths mills on the taxable property of the counties and towns in any one year, according to the last equalized valuation of such counties and towns.

Provided further, that owing to the time lost in moving machinery about the county and unnecessary expense in doing so, we recommend that the construction of road work shall not be done on to exceed four stretches of roads, in any one year.

That a majority of the County Board of Supervisors shall designate on what road the money shall be expended, and provided further that on roads leading into a city who now maintain their own street, a part of such money may be expended within the borders of such city up to platted lots not less than fifty feet frontage.

Fifth: Your committee further report that should the honorable legislature not see fit to repeal said state highway law and enact a county highway law, then we recommend that a limitation be placed upon the amount of money that the state and counties and towns may be compelled to raise as an appropriation for said state, counties and towns highways in any one year, to-wit: that the state can not raise less than one-tenth mill nor more than two-tenths mills and the counties not less than than one-tenth mill nor more than two-tenths mills, and the towns not less than two-tenths mills nor more than four-tenths mills on the equalized valuation of the taxable property of such state, counties and towns, and provided further that a majority vote of the County Board of Supervisors shall designate on what roads the money shall be expended, subject to the approval of the State Highway Commission, and provided further that on roads leading into a city who now maintain their own streets or roads a part of such money may be expended within the borders of said city up to the platted lots not more than fifty feet frontage.

The prices for abstracts made by the county are twenty-five cents for each transfer and one dollar for the certificate.

Provided further, that owing to the time lost in moving machinery about the county and unnecessary expense in doing so, we recommend that the construction of road work shall not be done on to exceed four stretches of roads in any one year.

Sixth: Your committee further report that in either event that said highway law be left as a state or changed to a county system. We recommend that after the roads are constructed to conform to either law that they should be kept up ever afterwards out of the moneys collected out of inheritance and automobile taxes within said county or counties and the use of such prisoners as the state can furnish and that the inheritance and automobile laws be amended to conform to the proposed change in the said law.

COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION.

Your committee further report that they have had under consideration chapter 751, laws of 1913, known as the county board of education.

Whereas this board is of no assistance to the office of the county superintendent of schools; instead of burdening the superintendent with extra work, giving him less time to visit schools than heretofore and by increase of unnecessary cost to the taxpayers by the organization of a board of examiners for common school diploma, thereby depriving local teachers and the county superintendent of schools of all authority in such common school diploma examinations.

Always keep in mind the words "Winnebago County Abstract" at the court house when you want work done in that line.

We therefore recommend the entire repeal of said chapter 751, laws of 1913 and the restoration of section 704 and kindred statutes thereby repealed or mdoified.

MUNICIPAL COURT. WINNEBAGO COUNTY.

Your committee further report that chapter 664, laws of 1913

be amended by striking out the word "Circuit Court" where it appears in said chapter relating to appeals from Justice Courts.

ELECTION LAWS.

Your committee further report that we recommend that the state election laws be codified, revised and simplified so as to be easier understood by our people and especially our election board.

MARY ANN LAW.

Your committee further report that we have had under consideration the so-called Mary Ann law or second choice law. That from actual experience we believe the second choice part of the election law is unjust, expensive, unnecessary and confusing and should be repealed.

RELATING TO TAXATION OF MINERAL RIGHTS.

Your committee further report that we have had under consideration chapter 367, laws of 1913, relating to the taxation of mineral rights; we recommend that said law be amended, that the owner or his heirs or assigns who reserved in any deed or conveyance all rights and reservations to enter upon and take away any mineral from any lands within the State of Wisconsin should have the same right to redeem taxes or tax certificates as the owner of the fee.

Tell your neighbors about the Winnebago County Abstract, made by the county.

UNIVERSITY.

Your committee further report that the tuition fee charged to non-resident students at the University shall be at least equal to cost of housing and instructing them, and remove the State University from the domain of politics, provide sufficient revenue to maintain a high standard of educational excellence, banish its lobbyists from the halls of the legislature and make it subservient to the people who support it. We are informed that there are now more than 1,300 non-resident students in attendance at the University; we recommend the enactment of a law which will provide for a sufficient non-resident tuition fee to cover the additional cost of instruction caused by the attendance of said non-resident students.

LEGISLATURE.

Your committee further report that we recommend the enact-

ment of laws and an amendment to the state constitution if necessary which will limit each session of the legislature to not to exceed ninety days in duration; and to provide that all bills shall be introduced within the first thirty days of the session except such as are known as emergency bills and that all appropriations for state institutions shall be made by separate enactments.

LEGISLATIVE LIBRARY.

Your committee further report: We find that the most prolific source of bills for the legislature is the legislative library. This is provided for by Section 373-F of the statutes.

By sub-division 5 of section 172-23 there is provided a perpetual appropriation of \$21,800 from the general fund to be used by the legislative reference library, that is the legislative department of the library commission.

Lock these notices over again, so that you will remember what to do and where to go to have your abstracts made or continued.

We recommend that the reference library should be purely a reference library for reference used by the legislature and other officials and prohibit every officer and employes there from directly or indirectly initiating, preparing, drawing, recommending or assisting in passing any legislative bills and recommend the repeal of sub-division 5 of Section 172-23 of the statutes, which undoubtedly would put a stop to the activity of the grist mill of laws. The appropriation for the legislative reference library is not an ordinary appropriation. It is perpetual, goes on forever, unless repealed.

Your committee further report that we recommend the repeal of chapter 738, laws of 1913, known as the Eugenic Marriage Law.

As an argument for the repeal of said law, say you may develop potatces and cattle by eugenics, but whatever you get above the brute you must have freedom and choice; political philosophers are now trying to regulate birth; permission to have offspring would depend on the amount of political pull one has. Nature does more than the eugenic professors can do; she is ever building up the strong, and tearing down the weak. What explanation is there for Shakespeare? No professor of eugenics mated his parents. They were obscure yet nature developed one of the rarest specimens of humanity the world has known. What eugenic cause for Lincoln?

STATE COMMISSIONS.

Your committee further report that it believes that many of

the State Commissions and boards which came into existence in the last few years have been vested with power which practically destroys local self-government, and the people have been wrongfully deprived of the right and privilege of controlling, managing and directing their own business affairs; that useless commissions and their self important emissaries be wiped out of existence and where it can be done with propriety that two or more commissions be consolidated in one.

GAME WARDEN.

Your committee further reports that we recommend the repeal of section 1498-1498A, known as the law providing for the appointment of a state game warden and deputies, and that these duties should be performed by sheriffs, constables and other police officers of the state.

Your committee further report that we recommend that the word "whenever" at the beginning of section 1498 be stricken out.

FISH LAW.

Your committee further report that we recommend that Section 4560-F-11-1 be amended by adding at the end of sub-section 1 of said section, the following words, to-wit: Provided that any citizen of Wisconsin, may use a gill net with not less than 1% inch square mesh for the purpose of taking any of the fish above named including pickerel from said waters at any time of the year, and provided further that any violation of this section, by taking away any other fish than above mentioned shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison, not less than one nor more than three years, or by fine not exceeding one thousand dollars.

SPEARING FISH.

And your committee would further report that they have under consideration sub-division 5 of section 4560 D 1, and would recommend that said sub-division 5 be repealed.

REPEAL LAWS OF REVISION OF THE STATUTES.

Your committee further report that we recommend the repeal of section 116, Revised Statutes, also all sections pertaining to the revision of the statutes, for the reason that we find the work done by the revisors expensive and not giving satisfaction. We recommend that a statute be enacted, revising the statutes every five years; and contract for same let to a first class publishing house who make it a business.

AUTOMOBILE REGISTRY FEE.

Your committee further report that we recommend that Section 1636-47, 5 be amended so as to read as follows, to-wit: There shall be paid annually to the Secretary of State for the registration of each automobile a fee of five dollars, having twenty-five horse power or less, and twenty-five cents for each additional horse power, and for the registration of each motorcycle a fee of two dollars. Fee registrations shall expire December 31st of each year.

Your committee further report that we are laboring under an obsession; that society will be perfect if we pass laws enough. These cures always affect more evils than the disease itself. If the making of law were left to truly wise men, there would be very few of them. There are so many laws that no individual can possibly know all of them or obey all of them. No one in a life time could read them all and after he finished, know what they were.



Williams does for and in consideration of a certain sum hereinafter mentioned, agree to board, wash and mend for all prisoners who may be confined in the jail of Winnebago County, and to furnish good, wholesome and well prepared food in sufficient quantity for \$3.25 a week after commitment, and 25 cents a meal before commitment of twenty-one meals, and all parts of the day or week. The board to be computed on the same basis of 21 meals to make a week's board, and in no case to charge for more meals than are actually furnished; and said David R. Williams agrees to keep the register so as to show the hour of taking in and out of all prisoners.

It is further agreed that no bills shall be presented to the County Board for articles used in the preparation of food for said prisoners, nor in doing the mending and washing for the same; and it is further agreed by and between the said County of Winnebago and said David R. Williams that said County of Winnebago shall provide all heat and light for said jail, Sheria's residence, including fuel for cooking purposes for said jail and residence.

One hundred seventy (\$170.00) dollars per acre for the entire farm of 76 acres, including the buildings thereon and one hundred fifty (\$150.00) dollars per acre for the north 40 acres, without buildings, adjoining the County Farm.

Sanatorium.

Supervisor Loescher offered the following, Report No. 3: To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen: Upon the demand of your honorable body for a report on the Sanatorium now in course of construction, I am pleased to submit to you the following illustration which will outline to you the work your committee has done up to the present time—your committee has kept a correct report of all its work, same being in the hands of the secretary, but we deem it advisable at present not to present to you a full report of the meetings of your committee as we shall at the termination of this committee tender to this Board all proceedings in proper form—setting before you each

item as clearly as possible for your consideration—which today we may be unable to do as much of the work is not yet finished.

In going into this report, I must take you back to the birth of this committee and as you are all aware, your Board had accepted the plans and specifications and it was generally understood that \$25,000 was sufficient to complete and equip this institution including a site and all furnishings both in and outside, and it was the general understanding of this committee that you desired brick or other material that would make it a lasting benefit to this county. With this idea in view, your committee got together on June 5, 1914, to take the matter in hand, elected its secretary and got in shape to do your bidding; but upon taking up the plans which you had adopted and the State Board of Control had approved of we found that we were not yet done with that board, for the plans had not been returned, and when they were they came with some material changes that looked very discouraging to this committee. Minor changes that were inexpensive your committee was willing to make concessions to the State Board, but when they requested us to add 20 ft. to each wing-widen out the administration wing 4 ft. and various other changes that would involve an expense of \$5,000, your committee notified the representative of the State that they would not make the change, but would add 5 ft. to each of the sun porches, change the minor items about the proposed building, widen the north wing 4 ft. but under no consideration would we take it upon ourselves to add 40 ft. to the main building, and we gave them to understand that if they were not ready to accept our plans with those changes, we were ready to report to the County Board that it would be impossible for this committee to take charge of the construction of the building. Needless to say, our plans came back O. K.'d by the State Board and we were ready to advertise for the construction-which was done, but much valuable time had been wasted and the summer was going fast; but on September 16th, or thereabout, your building was staked out-following instructions to the letter in regard to the locating of the building. We found that it was impossible to make connections with the sewerage system of the County Farm, neither would it be practical to get water and light from the other institutions—for water would mean the enlargement of the main now laid from the Asylum to the County Home, and then continue to the Sanitorium. In the matter of light it was found that the present system at the Asylum was of but sufficient size to accommodate their present need; so we found that where your Board had figured for sewer, water and light, we were compelled to provide same—on the ground of the Sanitorium. Water was a necessary article and we ordered the sinking of a well and went into the matter to provide ample water, not only for the need

of the building and grounds but also for fire protection—an 8 in. well was driven 300 feet deep at a cost of \$750; for sewerage we were compelled to build septic tanks at an expense of \$850 and for light we purchased a combination water-pumping and light-generating outfit at an expense of \$1,445, after the building was under cover and plastered we found that it would be better to have the basement ceilings plastered and so decided; the expense was \$150.

Although this report is incomplete, still it gives the exact amount contracted and money expended.

At present we must provide a road to get to the building and same is under consideration.

This committee has also taken under consideration the planting of trees along the road leading to the Sanitorium; also several groups of trees to the west and north of it. A road has been considered from the main road south of the building up to within about 100 feet of the center of the building, then to the right around the back looping around and returning into the main road near the front of the building. In deciding the material for the road we thought it advisable to build a 9 foot center of cement; this would give the patients a walk as well as the institution a road and seats could be placed along the side, under the trees for rest and comfort—for it may be some time before shade could be provided.

The prospects for your Sanatorium are better than any in the State, the location and surroundings ideal and with a little expense on the grounds, it can be made a garden spot; your committee has labored with this in view, while in their hearts it is their ambition to give your county the best Sanitorium in the State, if not in

the United States. The possibilities of what you can accomplish lies only in the interest you take in the enterprise. Your good sense and sound judgment has placed this institution in a location that God has blessed with a clear view and fresh, clean air.

Your committee as it goes to and from the site can vouch for this—and where the State condemned, God has surely blessed. It is the general belief of this committee that the sun porches should have been built larger—a mistake that is no one's fault; but when one steps out upon the east or the west porch and gets a glimpse o't Old Winnebago and Butte des Morts, you wonder why we all don't get out and live a bit closer to nature. And we in consideration of what is expected of your institution have given weeks of thought as to the management and care of the institution and we earnestly hope that you will do justice in this matter.

Several of your committee were non-believers, when this committee was appointed; but, I for one, can say that you wouldn't know it by the way they worked and may be we are converted to the cause; we have at least come in contact with those who are greatly interested and from this point of view have recommended to you Trustees that in our estimation would relieve you of the expenditure of a great deal of money and care; I wish to state here that it is not the idea of this committee to ask the election of any one: we merely recommend. The matter could lay over until May if so you wished, but it has been the wish of your committee to do what they can at the least possible expense and we do not wish to undertake the furnishing of this institution without consulting with the woman who is going to have charge. She must be appointed by the Trustees and your committee does not and will not buy one thing that she would not advise; for upon her rests the responsibility with the Trustees of the success of the institution. It is our idea that the matron in charge is better able to know what is necessary for your institution than we are and we don't want to burden her with unnecessary material where we do wish her to have what is needed to make our Sanitorium a success, for to this end your committee has ever had an eye. We thank you.



Town of Nepeuskun: Starting at a point on the county line of the Oshkosh-Waukau-Berling road, at the Intersection of Sections 6 and 7, running cast and south-casterly on said road, as far as the money will go.

Town of Omro: Beginning at the southwest corner of the southeast quarter. Section 30, running cast on the Oshkosh-Berlin road, as far as the money will go.

RULES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, ADOPTED MAY 24, 1914

I. The meetings of this Board shall be held in the Supervisors' room, and the hour for the daily meetings shall be 9 a. m., providing that on the first meeting in each week the hour of meeting shall be 10 a. m.

And the County Board shall continue in continuous session from day to day until adjourned, unless adjourned to a day certain or sine die.

II. At the first meeting of the Board it shall be the duty of the Chairman, or in the case of his absence the Vice-Chairman, or in their absence, the Clerk to call to order.

The Clerk shall then call the roll of Members.

A quorum being present, the Board shall proceed to the election of a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

(Amended to provide for Vice-Chairmen as authorized by Ch. 110, of 1903.)

III. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to appoint the following standing committees, each to consist of the number of members as set after the name of each committee, viz:

Equalization, 13; Finance, 9; General Accounts, 9; Illegal Assessments, 5; Justices and Constables' Accounts, 9: Sheriff's and Coroner's Accounts, 9: Insane, 5: Poor and Poor Farm, 5: Workhouse, 3: Corporations, 5; Public Buildings, 5: Roads and Bridges, 5: 19 6:1 Per Diem and Mileage, 5: - 12 Be 5 Printing, 5: 4년. Bonds and Salaries, 6; County Abstract and Tract Index System, 5; County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy, 5.

IV. The Board may adjourn for such time as shall be necessary for the Chairman to prepare the list of committees and no business can be done until the same shall be announced.

V. The Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, shall take the chair at the hour to which the Board may from time to time stand adjourned, call the Board to order and direct the calling of the roll of members by the Clerk.

VI. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the Clerk, and any mistake therein shall be corrected by the Board; provided, that upon the last day of the session the journal for that day will be read and, before the final adjournment, corrected.

VII. After the reading and correction of the journal, the order of business shall be as follows:

- 1. Reception of Petitions, Memorials, Accounts, etc.
- 2. Presentation of Resolutions and disposition of same.

- 3. Reports of Standing Committees.
- 4. Reports of Select Committees.
- 5. Consideration of Miscellaneous Business.

VIII. The Chairman shall preserve order and decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Board; and shall clearly and distinctly state every motion or question before debate.

IX. The Chairman shall be entitled to vote on all questions taken by aves and noes, and his name shall be called last; when the vote on any question is a tie it shall be deemed to have been lost.

X. Every motion or amendment shall be reduced to writing when a request therefor shall be made by any member; and all petitions, memor-1 ials and substitutes shall be reduced to writing and read before they shall beconsidered by the Board.

XI. Every written resolution shall have attached thereto the name of the person introducing it; and when referred to a committee, the names of such committee shall be endorsed thereon.

XII. Every member, previous to speaking, shall rise and address the Chair.

XIII. When two or more members rise at once, the Chair shall designate the member who is to speak first; but in all cases the member who shall first rise and address the Chair shall speak first.

XIV. No member shall speak more than twice upon the same question without leave; and when called to order by the Chairman shall take his seat, and shall not be allowed to proceed without leave of the Board.

XV. A vote on any question shall be taken by ayes and nays when: called for by any member: and SHALL be so taken on all questions involving the expenditure of money; and whenever a vote is so ordered and taken, the members voting in the affirmative and negative, as well as thoseabsent or not voting, shall be recorded at length in the records of the proceedings of the County Board.

(Amended to conform to Sec. 709, Stat. of 1898.)

XVI. No account or claim against the County shall be audited unless. it be made out in items and duly verified and be filed with the Clerk of the Board, except as otherwise provided by law.

XVII. When a motion is under consideration, no motion shall be entertained except:

- To adjourn.
- 2. To lay on the table.
- 3. For the previous question.
- 4. To postpone to a day certain.
- 5. To commit to a committee. 6. To amend or to substitute.
- 7. To postpone indefinitely.

These several motions shall take precedence in the order in which they stand in this rule.

XVIII. A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, and for the previous question, shall be decided without debate, except as hereinafter provided.

XIX. A motion to postpone indefinitely or to a day certain or to commit shall not be again entertained on the same day or in the same stageof the proposition.

XX. A substitute snall be open to amendment the same as the original proposition; but when adopted, shall not be subject to amendment. If an amendment or substitute is lost, another substantially the same shall not be entertained.

XXI. When a motion or question has once been determined, any member voting with the majority may move a reconsideration of the vote, but such motion shall be made and acted on at the same or next succeeding meeting, and shall not thereafter be made except by unanimous consent.

XXII. The previous question may be moved by any member, and the Chairman shall then say: "It requiring five members to second this motion those in favor of sustaining the motion will rise." If five or more members then rise, the previous question shall thereby be seconded and an opportunity then be given to any two members opposed thereto to briefly state their objections. The question shall then be: "Shall the question be now put?" which, if carried by a vote of two-thirds of the members present upon a call of the ayes and nays, the Board shall immediately proceed to vote upon the pending amendment, if any, and upon the main question.

XXIII. In filling blanks, the largest sum and the longest time shall be first put.

XXIV. These rules shall not be changed, amended, or repealed, unless the proposition or amendment is introduced in writing and the same laid over to some subsequent meeting of the Board, not less than five days intervening, and then only with the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

XXV. Any of these rules may be suspended upon any pending measure by unanimous consent or by two-thirds of the members present.

RULE XXV. Any of these rules may be suspended upon any pending measure by two thirds of the members present.

XXVI. These rules and all amendments or additions thereto which may hereafter be made shall govern the Board until altered or repealed, as herein provided.

XXVII. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in "Jefferson's Manual," so far as they remain in common use and are practicable and applicable and not inconsistent herewith, shall govern the Board.

XXVIII. Whenever the Board shall have gone into a committee of the whole and shall have arisen, the Board shall at once be in session for the receiving and acting upon the report of the committee of the whole, and for the transaction of any and all other business of every kind.

RULE XXIX. No resolution for the appropriation for money shall be in order until the day after its presentation and reference, except upon the consent of two-thirds of the members of the County Board present.
