

Chairman Parker appointed Supervisor Grimes, who succeeded a Supervisor Jennijohn, to serve on the same committees of which Supervisor Jennijohn was a member.

Chairman Parker made a few appropriate remarks upcn opening the session.

Accounts were presented and referred to appropriate committees.

Chairman Parker, for Mr. Ganzer, invited the members of the Board and County officials to a dinner at the Work House Thursday the 16th at 5 o'clock p. m. On motion the invitation was accepted.

Chairman Parker read a letter from Wisconsin Highway Commission saying that Assistant Engineer W. C. Beulow would meet the Board and address them the afternoon of the 16th. Also a letter from L. K. Bronson, Secretary of Chamber of Commerce, stating that Dr. Harvey D. Brown would speak at the Chamber of Commerce on Wednesday evening, inviting the members to attend.

Also a letter from Dr. Greenwood in reference to Tuberculosis Sanitarium.

Also an appeal from the Mayor of Black River Falls for aid for the flood sufferers.

Supervisor Loope offered Resolution No. 1 asking that a committee be appointed to investigate the matter of building a Tuberculosis Sanitorium and report to this Board at this session. On motion, laid over to Monday the 20th.

• Chairman read a letter from Miss Tate asking to be heard Thursday the 16th at 10 o'clock. Motion extending an invitation as above. Carried.

Chairman Parker read a letter regarding Irrigation.

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Asylum Trustee Pinkerton offered Report No. 1, as follows:

### ANNUAL REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE COUNTY POOR FARM AND INSANE ASYLUM.

The Board of Trustees of the Asylum for the Chronic Insane of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, respectfully submit herewith their report of the institution, covering the year ending June 30, 1911.

The completion of the cold storage building and root cellar has materially assisted in the care of meats and vegetables at the institution, and relieved the congestion and unsanitary condition which formerly existed. During the year we have put in a good wash room and shower bath in the basement, adding much to the efficiency of the institution in caring for patients, and prevents much unnecessary tracking of mud and dirt through the institution. We have also completed a vegetable preparing room in the basement, which was much needed.

Ward No. 1 has been improved by putting in a steel ceiling in ward and corridor and wiring concealed, which was formerly exposed. We have contracted for 1,500 tons of screened West Virginia splint coal at \$3.90 per ton F. O. B. hospital, which will, we expect, supply the asylum and poor farm until July 1, 1912.

The drilling of a new well, for which an appropriation of \$1,000 was made at your last November session, has been completed. A detailed report of the work has been filed with the County Clerk by the joint Committee of Trustees and Committee on Insane. A sixinch well has been sunk to a depth of 673 feet, which is supplying an abundance of water which we believe will meet our requirements in dryest season. On test we filled our 80,000 gallon tank in ten hours, and now pump our required supply in six hours each day, where formerly we were obliged to keep the pump going continually. As the well was completed after July 1, figures for same will necessarily appear in next year's report. We have taken up with the "Soo" railroad the matter of putting in a side track from their main line to our institution, a detailed report of which will be submitted by the Committee on Insane. The help of such a side track in handling our coal supply each year will, we estimate, pay for itself in three years and relieve congestion of work at a time when

the harvesting of farm produce requires our best efforts. Following is a tabulated statement for the last fiscal year. com-

### COUNTY PHYSICIAN'S REPORT.

Dr. Bath read his report No. 6, as follows:

To the Honorable Board of Trustees of the Winnebago County Insane Asylum, and the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: The following is my official report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1911:

### COUNTY ASYLUM.

During the year I have made the regular semi-weekly visits to the institution, also many special visits that have been necessary from time to time. The sanitary conditions at the Asylum have been perfect, nothing having been neglected by the Superintendent or Matron which would add to the comfort or welfare of our unfortunate inmates. The food supplied them has been abundant and wholesome, well cooked and served.

The patients have been well clothed, and during sickness all necessary nursing and care have been given them, and much extra attention which would add to their comfort.

There was one case of infectious disease at the Asylum during the year, measles, in an employe, but by prompt and thorough isolation no new cases developed.

During the fiscal year there have been twelve deaths, with causes as follows:

One chronic gastritis. Two chronic endocarditis. One accidentally killed by train. One epilepsy. One carcinoma of breast. One pulmonary tuberculosis. One arterio sclerosis, and senility. One cystitis. Two acute cardiac dilatation.

There has been no serious injury of any kind during the year.

### COUNTY POOR HOUSE.

At this institution the semi-weekly visits have also been made regularly and numerous special visits. Here there have been nine

deaths during the year and one birth. The cause of the deaths were:

Two pulmonary tuberculosis. Two arterio sclerosis. One cirrhosis of liver. One carcinoma of lung. One carcinoma of oesophagus. One senility. One pneumonia.

Those in charge of the Poor House have kept the inmates neat and in comfort. The buildings have been kept spotlessly clean and well ventilated.

### COUNTY JAIL.

Calls to the County Jail have been promptly responded to. There has been no serious sickness here during the year and the prisoners have been well cared for.

### COUNTY WORK HOUSE.

There have been numerous calls to the Work House during the year. No deaths or sickness of any moment has occurred here. The quarters for the prisoners have been kept clean and orderly, and the necessary attention given the inmates during sickness.

Again, to the members of the Board, the Trustees of the Asylum, and the heads of the various institutions, I am deeply indebted for their assistance and co-operation.

### HUMANE SOCIETY.

### (Incorporated)

Oshkosh, Wis., October 30, 1911.

To the Honorable Chairman and Members of the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen: I have the honor to herewith submit to you the twenty-third annual report of the Winnebago County Branch of the Wisconsin Humane Society. A few remarks about the society will not be out of order at this time, as it is the first report I make to your honorable body. The Humane Society was founded in the city of London, one hundred years ago, by Richard Martin; a member of the British Parliament. It is known as the Royal Humane Society. It proved to be such a grand success that shortly after it was copied and organized in Germany and France, and now exists in every civilized country on the globe. The first society in the United States was organized in 1866 by the immortal Henry Berg, a wealthy resident of New York City. It is known as the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty.

Humane education is now compulsory in twelve states of the Union, and steps are being taken to make it so in Wisconsin. When we reflect on its past history, of the countless bitter tears that it has wiped away and the many aching hearts it has soothed, and animals it has relieved, we cannot help but think of the beautiful lines written by Cowper:

"I would not enter on my list of friends, though graced with polished manner and fine sense, yet wanting sensibility, the man who needlessly sets foot upon a worm."



The work of the schools of the County during the past year has been of a very satisfactory character. They are all thoroughly classified and working under the Course of Study for the schools of Wisconsin.

In addition to the regular school work the following work has been taken up for the purpose of increasing the efficiency of the public school in the community in which it is located.

# SPELLING CONTESTS.

A spelling contest was held in the Oshkosh Normal School on Saturday, May 27th. Each rural school in the County was entitled to a representative in this contest. Sixty-one (61) schools were represented. Teachers have reported a marked improvement in spelling as a result of this work.

#### ADDING CONTESTS.

On the same date an adding contest was held in the Normal school, and each school was entitled to a contestant in this event. Seventy-three (73) schools had representatives in this contest, and the work had a splendid effect upon the arithmetic work of the pupils in the rural schools.

# DECLAMATORY CONTESTS.

A declamatory contest was held on the same date and place as the adding and spelling contests. In this event each town was entitled to a representative and eleven (11) of the sixteen (16) towns responded. The work of the contestants proved that a high class

of work is being done by pupils of the rural schools along this line.

Each of the above County contests required a number of preliminary meetings in the district and town, and had the result of bringing the people of the various communities together in social and educational meetings.

This, I believe, is the solution of the rural school problem, to make the rural school the social as well as the educational center of the community, and in this manner secure the interest and cooperation of all the people of the community in the school.

There have also been organized in the County, during the past year, fifty-seven (57) corn-growing clubs. These clubs were organized during the early fall of 1910, and throughout the winter studied the subject of corn from bulletins received from the State University and other sources. In the spring corn was furnished from the County Superintendent's office to 487 members of the various clubs. The year was not ideal for the purpose, but, in spite of this fact, very good results were obtained. In all 207 acres of corn were planted, and the average yield per acre, as reported by the club members, was 142 baskets.

The contest for this club was held at the County Fair, but only 89 persons entered corn as much of it was not yet ripe at the time the contest was held. This, however, is an excellent showing for the first year. The Winnebago County Fair Association gave the winners in the contest a total of one hundred (100) dollars in prizes, and the result of the whole will be a much greater interest in this contest next year.

For the ensuing year the same work will be continued and, in addition, extension work in domestic science, farm arithmetic, and in the use of the Babcock milk test will be taken up.

In order to carry other work of the County Schools I would recommend that appropriations for the following purposes be made by this board:

SUPERVISOR OF ASSESSMENT'S REPORT.

Supervisor of Assessment, D. M. Shea, offered Report No. 12, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: In compliance with the statutes I hereby present my Annual Report for the year 1911. While it is gratifying to be able to say to you that, with the exception of the towns of Nepeuskun, Poygan and the city of Menasha, there has been an increase in the assessment of 1911 over that of 1910, yet the assessment is far below representing the true value of all property in the county liable to taxation. In arriving at the true value of real estate I have used the sales method, covering a period of five years.

Table 9 shows the assessment of real property of the several districts, and also the true value of same.

Tables 1 to 8, inclusive, show the assessment, also all changes made by the Supervisor of Assessment in the different kinds and classes of personal property.

Table 10 shows the total assessment and true value of real and personal, and also the assessment and true value of all property.

REPORT OF SUPERVISING LIBRARIAN.

To the Board of Libraries of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, for the period October 1, 1910, to October 1, 1911.

Gentlemen: The outlook in the work with traveling libraries is most promising. As usual the demand is greater than the supply and all libraries have again been placed for the winter. With the aid of Mr. Patch, County Superintendent of Schools, and personal visits by the Supervising Librarian, new stations were established at:

Clayton, No. 2; Mikesville; McKinnie, No. 6; Pickett, No. 3; Poygan, No. 2; Vinland, No. 1; Winchester, Zittau, and our old station, Larsen, No. 1, which had not been heard from in some years, was again supplied with a library.

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Of these stations Winneconne and Rushford-Grange have two libraries each.

In order to make the libraries as attractive as possible, a thorough examination of the contents of each box was made during the summer and books that had not been used for some time were taken out. For this reason it was found necessary to discard 31 books, also 22 on account of their worn condition, making the total number of withdrawals 53. Books added during the year were:

By purchase, 276; by binding of magazines, 14; by gift, 79. A total of 369 volumes, making the total number of volumes now in use 2,314; 47 books have been rebound.

The total circulation for the year was 2,272, an average of 94; the largest, 394, was at Eureka.

These figures give only a slight idea of the practical knowledge to say nothing of the pleasure and recreation the libraries bring to the out-of-way places and it is to be hoped that the County Board of Libraries will again succeed in getting the full appropriation of \$200 for the purchase of books, rebinding and other expenses.





Supervisor Raddatz offered report No. 1 as follows:

Gentlemen: We, the undersigned Roads and Bridge Committee, beg leave to report that we have had under consideration the question of the building of roads in Winnebago County, and the question of buying machinery; that part of the committee visited Madison and took up the matter with the Good Roads Commission, and they informed us that they would take charge of the work in Winnebago County and have the work done by day work; that said State Commission has selected W. W. Noble, of Eureka, Wis., to superintend the building of roads.

The committee looked over the machinery which was on exhibition at Madison and the committee having met on the 20th day of February, A. D., 1912, to consider the question of building machinery beg leave to further report that we have bargained to buy the following machinery for the sum of \$4,500.00:

One 10-ton motor roller, single cylinder with friction clutch pulley.

One No. 2 Aurora cast steel jaw crusher, mounted on trucks having wheels with 10 ft. tires, with 24 in. folding elevator and 12 in. by 32 in. revolving screen with three sizes perforation, first section  $\frac{34}{100}$  in., second section  $1\frac{34}{100}$  in., jaw  $2\frac{34}{100}$  opening 11x20, fitted with manganese dies.

One 25-ton western portable telescope bin complete.



#### RULES OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

#### RULES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, ADOPTED NOVEMBER 9, 1909.

I. The meetings of this Board shall be held in the Supervisors' room, and the hour for the daily meetings shall be 9 a. m., providing that on the first meeting in each week the hour of meeting shall be 10 a. m.

And the County Board shall continue in continuous session from day to day until adjourned, unless adjourned to a day certain or sine die.

II. At the first meeting of the Board it shall be the duty of the Chairman, or in the case of his absence the Vice-Chairman, or in their absence, the Clerk, to call to order.

The Clerk shall then call the roll of Members.

A quorum being present, the Board shall proceed to the election of a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

(Amended to provide for Vice-Chairmen as authorized by Ch. 110, of 1903.)

III. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to appoint the following standing committees, each to consist of the number of members as set after the name of each committee, viz:

Equalization, 13: Finance, 9; General Accounts, 9; Illegal Assessments, 5; Justices and Constables' Accounts, 9; Sheriff's and Coroner's Accounts, 9: Insane, 5; Poor and Poor Farm, 5; Workhouse, 3: Corporations, 5; Public Buildings, 5: Roads and Bridges, 5: Per Diem and Mileage, 5: Printing, 5: Bonds and Salaries, 6; County Abstract and Tract Index System, 5; Rules. 3: County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy, 5.

IV. The Board may adjourn for such time as shall be necessary for the Chairman to prepare the list of committees and no business can be done until the same shall be announced.

V. The Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, shall take the chair at the hour to which the Board may from time to time stand adjourned, call the Board to order and direct the calling of the roll of members by the Clerk.

VI. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the Clerk, and any mistake therein shall be corrected by the Board; provided, that upon the last day of the session the journal for that day will be read and, before the final adjournment, corrected.

VII: After the reading and correction of the journal, the order of business shall be as follows:

1. Reception of Petitions, Memorials, Accounts, etc.

2. Presentation of Resolutions and disposition of same.

#### RULES OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

3. Reports of Standing Committees.

4. Reports of Select Committees.

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5. Consideration of Miscellaneous Business.

VIII. The Chairman shall preserve order and decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Board; and shall clearly and distinctly state every motion or question before debate.

IX. The Chairman shall be entitled to vote on all questions taken by ayes and noes, and his name shall be called last; when the vote on any question is a tie it shall be deemed to have been lost.

X. Every motion or amendment shall be reduced to writing when a request therefor shall be made by any member; and all petitions, memorials and substitutes shall be reduced to writing and read before they shall be considered by the Board.

XI. Every written resolution shall have attached thereto the name of the person introducing it; and when referred to a committee, the names of such committee shall be endorsed thereon.

XII. Every member, previous to speaking, shall rise and address the Chair.

XIII. When two or more members rise at once, the Chair shall designate the member who is to speak first; but in all cases the member who shall first rise and address the Chair shall speak first.

XIV. No member shall speak more than twice upon the same question without leave; and when called to order by the Chairman shall take his seat, and shall not be allowed to proceed without leave of the Board.

XV. A vote on any question shall be taken by ayes and nays when called for by any member; and SHALL be so taken on all questions involving the expenditure of money; and whenever a vote is so ordered and taken, the members voting in the affirmative and negative, as well as those absent or not voting, shall be recorded at length in the records of the proceedings of the County Board.

(Amended to conform to Sec. 709, Stat. of 1898.)

XVI. No account or claim against the County shall be audited unless it be made out in items and duly verified and be filed with the Clerk of the Board, except as otherwise provided by law.

XVII. When a motion is under consideration, no motion shall be entertained except:

1. To adjourn.

?. To lay on the table.

3. For the previous question.

4. To postpone to a day certain.

5. To commit to a committee.

6. To amend or to substitute.

7. To postpone indefinitely.

These several motions shall take precedence in the order in which they stand in this rule.

XVIII. A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, and for the previous question, shall be decided without debate, except as hereinafter provided.

XIX. A motion to postpone indefinitely or to a day certain or to commit shall not be again entertained on the same day or in the same stage of the proposition.

#### RULES OF THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

XX. A substitute shall be open to amendment the same as the original proposition; but when adopted, shall not be subject to amendment. If an amendment or substitute is lost, another substantially the same shall not be entertained.

XXI. When a motion or question has once been determined, any member voting with the majority may move a reconsideration of the yote, but such motion shall be made and acted on at the same or next succeeding meeting, and shall not thereafter be made except by unanimous consent.

XXIL The previous question may be moved by any member, and the Chairman shall then say: "It requiring five members to second this motion, those in favor of sustaining the motion will rise." If five or more members then rise, the previous question shall thereby be seconded and an opportunity then be given to any two members opposed thereto to briefly state their objections. The question shall then be: "Shall the question be now put?" which, if carried by a vote of two-thirds of the members present upon a call of the ayes and nays, the Board shall immediately proceed to rote upon the pending amendment, if any, and upon the main question.

XXIII. In filling blanks, the largest sum and the longest time shall be first put.

XXIV. These rules shall not be changed, amended, or repealed, unless the proposition or amendment is introduced in writing and the same laid over to some subsequent meeting of the Board, not less than five days intervening, and then only with the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

XXV. Any of these rules may be suspended upon any pending measure by unanimous consent or by two-thirds of the members present.

XXVI. These rules and all amendments or additions thereto which may hereafter be made shall govern the Board until altered or repealed, as herein provided.

XXVII. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in "Jefferson's Manual," so far as they remain in common use and are practicable and applicable and not inconsistent herewith, shall govern the Board.

XXVIII. Whenever the Board shall have gone into a committee of the whole and shall have arisen, the Board shall at once be in session for the receiving and acting upon the report of the committee of the whole, and for whe transaction of any and all other business of every kind.


