
LEGAL ASSISTANCE CLINIC



The Legal Assistance Clinic can help you with legal problems, whether you are proceeding *pro se* (without an attorney), or if you need the help of an attorney free of charge.

Volunteers are available at the Menasha, Neenah and Oshkosh Public Libraries one evening each month to help you represent yourself, or, in some cases, for possible referral to an attorney who may represent you without a fee.

There will even be volunteer attorneys available to evaluate your problem, and in most cases, give you advice about how you could proceed.

You may be already suing someone. Maybe someone is suing you. You may need to modify an order; such as child support or placement of your children. You may need the protection of a restraining order. Or maybe you are feeling that you have been wronged, and do not know what you can do about it.

Office hours are:

- Menasha Public Library (440 First St): the first Tuesday of each month, between 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.
- Neenah Public Library (240 E. Wisconsin St): the second Tuesday of each month, between 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.
- Oshkosh Public Library (106 Washington Ave): the third Tuesday of each month, between 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.

The Legal Assistance Clinic offers help in the following case types:

- Family law (like divorce, child support, placement)
- Small claims (like landlord/tenant, debtor/creditor, consumer/merchant)
- Domestic Abuse/Harassment injunctions
- Probate or Wills
- Property disputes

Depending on the issue you bring to the clinic, a volunteer might assist you in finding the proper forms to file, will help you fill them out and make the appropriate number of copies, and direct you where to file them. Or, the volunteer may direct you to an attorney who can advise you as to the best course of action.
