

Winnebago County Communication and Information System Advisory Committee

Meeting December 15, 2016 at 8:30 am

Location: Winneconne/Poygan Fire Department

New business:

I, II, III – An upgrade on the Premier CAD and Mobile Client (P1) was done 11/07, it will be passed onto agencies soon. Another upgrade is estimated for the first quarter in 2017.

End of life for LRMS is September 2018.

The CAD system has to be upgraded at the end of 2017 or beginning of 2018. The current equipment end of life is the end of 2017, but per Motorola we can stay on it until April or May of 2018.

Outagamie County is currently looking into options on whether or not they will be staying on the Foxcomm system. They should know what direction they intend to go by the end of the year.

Per Sheriff Matz, if Outagamie goes on their own, it would affect the cost of our current program due to the shared percentages of the current costs. If that happens, it is not certain whether or not Calumet County will continue to be a part of the system. A lot of the updating and new programs are dependent on cost and cost sharing. Estimates have come in on the different options, but discussions haven't started. Notice must be given to Foxcomm by the end of this month if any agency intends to leave, so we should have more info on this in a few weeks.

IV – Nothing to report

V – Chief Krings explained card #33 being possibly added to dispatch's Pro-QA program for use when a facility is calling for transport of a patient to another medical facility. There has been some difficulty for first responders, for instance with the doctors, when a clinic calls for an ambulance for a transport of a patient to the hospital. This card allows altered level responses so that first responders and/or officers may not be needed on every call. Motion made by Krings to add card #33, motion seconded by Tim Seaver, all approved.

Every other month on the same night as the sub-committee meetings, there have been radio drills done with dispatch on the MABAS system. Everything seems to be going well, there haven't been any complaints, and the fire departments are pleased with it. No issues. Per Chief Krings, he has stepped down as the division president and Scott Rieckman is now in that position.

VI – Per Sheriff Matz, there were issues with the way Van Dyne first responders were being paged as some of the first responders reportedly weren't receiving pages in central and southern Fond du Lac. They are now paged by our comm center and by Fond du Lac's to avoid the issue.

Dead spots have been found along the lakeshore in the southern part of the county. A message was sent out questioning a possible fix for this, if it is even possible within the current costs, and no answer has

been received. No other departments report any significant issues. Yearly updating/maintenance on the towers is being completed today and tomorrow. It should not affect anyone as far as communication abilities go, except for the jail which they are aware of.

Captain Cianciola is working on updating the manual to include committee member changes and jurisdiction updates (ex. Fox Crossing, Winchester/Clayton). He hopes to have the entire manual complete for review for January's meeting.

VII – Per Rob Mertins, Town of Winchester fire will be going live January 3, 2017. They will begin taking calls as of that date, and Town of Clayton will be responding into their township for first responder calls.
