### APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

Agenda approved.

### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES:**

Minutes from meeting on April 20, 2018 approved.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

None

#### **MENTAL HEALTH COURT:**

Members of the sub-committee went to Outagamie County to observe their treatment court's meeting and court session. Jail staff and mental health providers are assessing the needs based upon the current jail population. The assessment will be used to determine what resources are necessary. Sheriff Matz will provide an update at the October Safe Streets meeting. There may be a request for budget consideration from the county board.

#### **OVERDOSE FATALITY REVIEW**

Barry Busby reported that there are a number of stakeholders involved in the review process. The goal is to determine where education and services can be improved based on investigation and information that is obtained following a death.

#### **STATUS REPORTS:**

#### DRUG COURT:

The numbers for Drug Court and all other Safe Streets programs are attached.

Phase 4 of the Drug court program was recently modified to add 6 months to the program. This means that participants will be in the program for a minimum of 18 months. The goal is to provide more in the areas of relapse prevention, support and extra programming to assist participants prior to and after their graduation. There is also a mentor group to provide additional support.

Carol and Jennifer attended the coordinators conference and the team plans to attend the Standards Training in October.

Graduations are planned for November and January.

#### SSTOP:

Numbers are attached.

There has been an increase in the number of OWI assessments needed in general. Therefore, Rachael will be the case manager for SSTOP participants.

### 24/7 PROGRAM:

There are approximately 31 participants in the Drug program and 103 in the alcohol program. Sheriff Matz reported that they are continuing to see improved accountability with the Drug free program.

Commissioner Bryan Keberlein questioned whether there could be an alternative site for the drug testing for individuals that live in the northern part of the county. There is no easy answer for that question.

### **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE DIVERSION PROGRAM:**

There are 61 active participants in the pre-charge program and 74 in the post-charge program. There are 3 pending revocation in the post-charge program and 13 pending revocations in warrant status.

#### DRUG DIVERSION PROGRAM:

There are 30 active participants in the pre-charge program, which includes UW-Oshkosh students. There are 21 active participants in the post-charge program. There is one pending revocation and 11 pending revocations in warrant status.

The drug diversion program also includes mandatory diversions offered to those that have over-dosed and might otherwise be charged with possession of a narcotic.

#### DA PROSTITUTION DIVERSION PROGRAM

The Benedict Center in Milwaukee is used for participants that live in the Milwaukee area. Reach counseling is used for local participants. The goal is to provide resources including counseling, housing referrals, employment, education...

#### STEP UP PROGRAM:

No update available.

#### RE: THINK

Similar to the overdose reviews, committee members are interviewing clients to determine where improvements can be made. This includes determining how to better integrate individuals into the community following incarceration.

There is a push to improve resources which is limited by a lack of funding.

#### Good Choices

The program is very sparingly used by Winnebago County and the City of Menasha.

### **DHS Diversion Program**

Numbers attached. There has been an increase in referrals to the program. This may be due in part to the mandatory diversions for overdose cases.

#### Teen Court

Numbers attached. Sessions are now held at the court house and it is working out well.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

There was discussion regarding DHS services provided to inmates at the jail, including AODA assessments and referrals and information regarding services available upon reintegration into the community.

Todd Timm has retired from DOC. As a new DOC supervisor, Joan Koch has been invited to be on the panel.
