- 1. <u>Call to Order:</u> P. O'Brien called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m.
- 2. <u>Approve Agenda</u>: Motion to approve the June 1, 2016 agenda, made by J. Finch and seconded by S. Locke. Motion carried 7-0.
- 3. Public Comments on Agenda Items: None.
- 4. <u>Announcements/Communications:</u> J. Rabe explained to the Solid Waste Management Board (SWMB) that the Recycling Coordinator position was reposted through June 1, 2016 in effort to attract more applicants; interviews will likely be held during the week of June 6-10, 2016.

J. Rabe notified the SWMB that the Brown County (BC) Port & Resource Recovery Department will be holding their 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Stakeholder Meeting on June 15, 2016 at 12:45 p.m.

J. Rabe notified the SWMB that the Tri-County Solid Waste & Recycling 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Tri-County Board/Committee Meeting will be hosted by BC Port & Resource Recovery in Green Bay on June 22, 2016 at 2:30 p.m. J. Rabe indicated that the meeting was well attended by

members in previous years and a SWMB meeting agenda will be posted in case a quorum of members is present; no SWMB business will be conducted at this meeting.

- 5. <u>Approval of Minutes May 18, 2016 Open Session:</u> Motion to approve the May 18, 2016 open session minutes, made by J. Finch and seconded by S. Locke. Motion carried 7-0.
- 6. <u>Discussion/Action 2015 Financial Reports</u>: K. Pernsteiner presented the 2015 Statement of Revenues and Expenses (Audited) to the SWMB as follows:

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K. Pernsteiner reviewed the major changes between 2014 and 2015 amounts with the SWMB. K. Pernsteiner explained that overall revenues were slightly higher and operating expenses were down significantly in 2015; the largest reduction in 2015 Operating Expenses

was due to a Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) Escrow Adjustment that reduced the Depreciation and Amortization expense. K. Pernsteiner also indicated that a Prior Year Adjustment line was added to the 2015 Statement of Revenues and Expenses to document Pension Liabilities.

J. Rabe explained that the WDNR Escrow Refund that was expected in 2015 was not received until January 2016, so it will be included in the 2016 Statement of Revenues and Expenses.

Discussion ensued amongst the SWMB.

Motion made by J. Finch and seconded by M. Easker to accept the 2015 Financial Reports as presented by K. Pernsteiner. Motion carried 7-0.

7. <u>Discussion/Action – Compactor Installation Update:</u> J. Rabe explained to the SWMB that the Compactor Installation Project (SW03-16) was last discussed at the May 18, 2016 open session meeting. The SWMB approved an option to award a modified bid schedule (SSR Compactor Bid to exclude wall replacement) to Immel Construction for not more than \$440,700, to create a separate Request for Bid (RFB) for the purchase and installation of a second MSW Compactor and to increase the 2016 Budget for MSW and SSR Compactor Installation to \$700,000. J. Rabe presented the SWMB with Immel Construction's revised Bid Schedule 2 as follows:

\* The Recycling Compactor manufacturer selected for bid item 3 is Marathon.

J. Rabe reviewed Immel Construction's original Bide Schedule 1 and revised Bid Schedule 2 with the SWMB and explained that the total revised Project Award amount is \$464,100 (previously \$557,400). J. Rabe indicated that if the SWMB chooses to accept Immel Construction's revised Bid Schedule 2, a separate RFB will be published to include the purchase and installation of the second MSW Compactor (estimated cost ~\$250,000). The revised total project cost is expected to be ~\$715,000 and will require an additional 2016 Budget Adjustment when the second Bid Award is considered.

SWMB Staff recommend accepting Immel Construction's original Bid Schedule 1 and revised Bid Schedule 2 for a combined total of \$464,100.

Discussion ensued amongst the SWMB.

Motion made by P. Eisen and seconded by J. Finch to accept Immel Construction's Bid Schedule 1 – MSW Compactor Installation and revised Bid Schedule 2 – Recycling Compactor installation for not more than \$464,100 and to create a separate RFB for the purchase and installation of a second MSW Compactor. Motion carried 7-0.

- <u>Discussion/Action Tri-County C&D Waste Recycling Update</u>: J. Rabe presented the SWMB with the Tri-County Construction & Demolition (C&D) Waste Recycling Update as follows:
  - BC and Winnebago County (WC) have operated successful C&D waste recycling programs, using Landfill Reduction & Recycling (LRR) in Appleton to handle processing; LRR in turn uses the Outagamie County (OC) Regional Landfill (LF) for disposal of fines and residuals.
  - Building on the success of the combined, Brown, Outagamie and Winnebago (BOW) County asphalt shingles, e-waste and other recycling projects, Staff were tasked to evaluate options of increasing C&D diversion tonnage (up to 40,000 tons/year); BC prepared a Request for Quote (RFQ) and received one quote from LRR (higher than the rates WC & BC are currently being charged); subsequent negotiations involved both a reduction in processing rate and a reduction in disposal rates for fines; centered around a long-term agreement (5-years).
  - A verbal consensus was reached amongst BOW Directors and LRR; Staff are working through individual purchase of service agreements and insurance requirements.

Discussion ensued amongst the SWMB.

Motion made by J. Finch and seconded by S. Locke to accept the Tri-County C&D Waste Recycling Update as presented by J. Rabe. Motion carried 7-0.

- 9. <u>Discussion Sludge Site Operations Update:</u> J. Rabe presented the SWMB with the Sludge Site Operations Update as follows:
  - WC continues to accept papermill sludge from Appleton Coated and Clearwater Paper for disposal (approximately 50-150 tons/day)
  - WC continues to accept fly ash from Weston and Pulliam to mix with sludges to provide stabilization/daily cover (reduced to approximately 210 tons/day); stockpiling

Weston fly ash and bottom ash for 1' stabilization placement in areas where final grades are reached.

- Riverview Construction (Riverview) is providing 1 day per week operational assistance with sludge/ash mix grading, 1' stabilization layer placement and installation of interior drainage piping and sumps.
- Odors, stability and interior drainage are no longer issues.
- Remaining airspace volume calculations/filling activities show Sludge Site reaching capacity at the end of September/early October 2016 (at current weekly tonnages); SWMB Staff notified Appleton Coated and Clearwater Paper accordingly plan will be to divert material to OC Northeast Landfill for disposal.

Discussion ensued amongst the SWMB.

- 10. <u>Future Agenda Items:</u> P. Eisen requested a BOW Solid Waste Disposal Agreement status update and a progress report on the WC Lifecycle Financial Analysis. J. Rabe indicated that he has follow-up Investment Comparisons from C. Orenstein for the SWMB to consider.
- 11. <u>Set Next Meeting Date:</u> The next SWMB meeting date is scheduled for June 15, 2016 at 9:00 a.m.
- 12. <u>Adjournment:</u> Motion to adjourn made by J. Finch and seconded by S. Locke. Motion carried 7-0. Meeting was adjourned at 10:12 a.m.
