Meeting Notes:

Introductions

- Updates from around the system
 - From Keith M.; WDNR (emailed in advance):
 - TMDL = WDNR reviewing/responding to public comments received will post to webpage when complete
 - LMP watershed management = April 16th met w/Austin and Jessica and WDNR staff to discuss watershed plan/planning process
 - Winnebago County Chad
 - Marsh bogs floating because of high water
 - Watershed plan is being drafted to submit for MDV money to use for demo farm network and cost-share
 - NRDA for breakwall projects in Winneconne permits are going out for public notice; funding is set
 - Anticipating bidding out in summer and hopefully winter installation in 2020
 - WDNR Ted
 - Has been receiving many permit applications for nuisance relief
 - System needs education for consultants about proper planning to improve navigation while protecting aquatic plants
 - High water = lots of phone calls about wake
 - Calumet County Dani
 - Farmer led group has named itself CASA
 - Met with other counties to move forward with Demo farm (FDL, Calumet, and Manitowoc) funded through NRCS – potentially also funded with MDV money for costshare (point discharge money to the county for non-point implementation)
 - Waushara County Todd
 - Recently became member of multi-jurisdictional group in central sands to look at how and what they can do as counties about application rates for nitrates and phosphates.

- Hopefully coalition can work with UW to study and eventually lead to change in legislation
- Heading into 2nd phase of well water testing program
 - Anticipating high levels of nitrates in central sands area
- Sand bags? A concern for people who sandbags their homes because people may be tempted to dump in the water to dispose of it
- o Fond du Lac County Paul
 - 3 demo farms in county talking about a fourth; MDV money helping to make it possible
 - 9 key element plans will help with MDV funding (improve flexibility for how money can be spent)
- o LWQIA
 - Booth at Master Gardeners show 5/18/19 at FDL County Fair grounds
 - Matthias M. award will be presented at breakfast on the farm in FDL County (June?)
- o Fox-Wolf
 - EPA put out email that they expect to release RFA soon for GLRI funds
 - EPA has their own pool of funding for non-point grants
 - Haven't released RFA since 2017; Have \$14 million for 30 projects in 2019
 - Once RFA is released, will have 45 days to submit proposal
 - Fox-Wolf has been advocating for longer grant periods than 3-5 year
 - Upper Fox-Wolf qualifies for GLRI, but has not yet qualified
 - Possible submit something in partnership with FDL County (pull together proposal)
 - Great if other counties can support that proposal
 - Not sure what the focus will be yet of RFA
 - Do not anticipate another RFA in 2020, maybe 2021
- Others? Mark
 - WI Outdoor news talked about Walleye limit on Winnebago System
 - Might be a good outlet for this project for outreach media
 - Example write articles about the predicted conditions of the lakes in 2050
 - Korin will share this idea with Austin to see what they can come up with
- ECWRPC Bob
 - Thanked Fox-Wolf for presentation earlier this year
- Towns Association Bob
 - Wake issue has come up at townships as well as 'what to do with sandbags'
 - Not sure what to tell people about sandbags where to go with them
 - Maybe this should be added to discussion at emergency management level?

Discuss Winnebago Waterways Program at Fox-Wolf integration with LMP

What role would the Steering Committee like Fox-Wolf to fill for implementation?

- The lake management plan will need a home once it is done at the end of 2019.
- Consensus among Steering Committee members was that the Winnebago Waterways Program at Fox-Wolf would be the best choice to manage the plan, manage implementation grants, provide coordination, guidance, and grant writing for implementation
- Proposal for the 2020 contract for Winnebago Waterways Program coordination by Fox-Wolf
 - Fox-Wolf will put together a proposal for work plan for 2020.
 - County staff will contact Executive Committee members to schedule a meeting at the end of June or early July

- Fox-Wolf will send the proposal to the Steering Committee prior to the Executive Committee meeting for review
- o Fox-Wolf will present the proposal to the Executive Committee at the meeting

Water Level Management Update

- Eight participants three-hour session held on 5/2/2019
- Walked through:
 - o Overview of water levels and lake management planning
 - Focus group questions/discussion
 - Stakeholder matrix
- Discussion: summary of results from Water Level Focus Group meeting (held on 5/2/2019)
- Reviewed and discussed final draft recommendations for the water level section

- Continue to include Steering Committee on emails to Tech Teams about reviewing LMP drafts
- Send final recommendation list to SC after Focus Group meetings
- Executive Committee send them the final draft version once it is ready
 - Remind them that an executive summary for each topic will be included in the lake plan.
 - \circ An overview of the document and recommendations will be presented at EC

Project Updates

Aquatic Plant Management

- Nearing completion of the first draft.
 - Describes the importance of plants
 - Describes the decline of vegetation after impoundment and goals for the system
 - Will serve as an APM strategy for the lakes and provide guidance to help people develop site-specific APM plans.
 - Wrapping up last few sections and recommendations
 - Ted suggested adding 'increase localized planning efforts' to the APM Strategy goals
 - Also include information about how property values improve as water clarity improves
- Next steps:
 - o send draft to Technical Team for review
 - Form Focus Group and plan meeting date/time

Aquatic Invasive Species

- Revision is complete Chris is working on adding photos, figures, and polishing the formatting.
- Actively recruiting for AIS Focus Group

Community Engagement

- Held first Community Engagement Team meeting on 5/1/2019
- Next steps:
 - o Begin drafting community engagement section of plan
 - Send draft to the Team for review
 - Form focus group and plan meeting date/time

Watershed Management

- Email request for Doodle Polls from Jessica went to Steering Committee
- Taking a bit longer to dissect data from TMDL
 - o Breaking down TMDL subbasin data into HUC12s
- Have been working on writing background for HUC12s based on info that has been available
- Will be holding one meeting for counties to learn about strategy to advance watershed portion of the plan in June
 - Counties will choose BMPs to use for modeling
- Holding modeling workshop in August for SNAP+
- After those meetings, Fox-Wolf will put it all together and will collect input from producers

Water Quality

- Collected additional data from WDNR
- Tour of Appleton Drinking Water facility and meeting to follow on 5/29/19
- Next steps:
 - Review data and information collected
 - o Analyze data
 - Begin drafting water quality summary (Korin, Dani, and Emily)
 - Send draft to Tech Team for review
- Focus group won't be held until after recommendations for watershed management are drafted

Habitat

- Has been on hold as we advance other topics
- Discussing collaboration with USFWS Blueprint project for mapping priority zones
