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RESOLUTION: Approving \$300,000 from the Spirit Fund's Government Identified 3 Community Projects Category to Purchase Mobile Traffic Barriers for the City of 4 Neenah 5

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS: 7

- 8 WHEREAS, the City of Neenah intends to provide safety to citizens attending local events sponsored by the 9 city or local non-profit organizations as well as citizens looking to provide goods to others (such as in the case of a 10 farmers' market) through the use of mobile traffic barriers; and
- 11 WHEREAS, by purchasing mobile traffic barriers, the City of Neenah will be promoting safety and decreasing 12 its current operating expenses; and
- 13 WHEREAS, the mobile barriers are reusable and will not need to be replaced in the foreseeable future; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the City of Neenah completed a Spirit Fund application on-time, requesting \$300,000, and
- 15 WHEREAS, by purchasing mobile traffic barriers, the City of Neenah will be promoting safety and decreasing 16 its current operating expenses; and
- 17 WHEREAS, the mobile barriers are reusable and will not need to be replaced in the foreseeable future; and
- 18 WHEREAS, the ARPA Strategy and Outcomes Commission recommends a grant of \$300,000 from the

19 Winnebago County Spirit Fund; and

- 20 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that \$300,000 from the Spirit 21 Fund's Government Identified Community Project category be approved to purchase mobile traffic barriers for the City of 22 Neenah.
- 23 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that upon completion of the 24 project, the City of Neenah will submit supporting documentation to the Winnebago County Finance Director outlining 25 the expenditures. The documentation will be submitted within 6 months of the completion of the project but not to 26 exceed 5 years from date of disbursement.
- 27 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that the City of Neenah shall 28 be responsible for reimbursement to Winnebago County for any disbursed funds which are determined by 29 Winnebago County to have been misused or misappropriated. Any reimbursement of funds which is required by 30 Winnebago County shall be due within 45 days after giving written notice to recipient of such misuse or
- 31 misappropriation.
