- Facilitated two meetings of the Diversity Affairs Commission, this first year the focus will be upon building the framework and educating ourselves and the community.
- Completed a four week series with Todd Taking Care of You, have an average attendance of 13 participants

Foundations in Horticulture class officially ended at the end of January. Class was an online class conducted between Oct. 19, 2020 and Jan. 29, 2021. In addition to the weekly activities, 3 live Zoom webinars and 4 live labs were conducted. Students have until the end of March to continue reviewing materials. Work is now being conducted to officially evaluate the course and the students' experience.

Those that took Foundations in Horticulture can now take the next step to enter the Master Gardener Program. For those that wish to join the Winnebago County program an orientation was held that explained local volunteer opportunities and the next steps to enter the program (Master Gardener Onboarding.)

Existing Master Gardener volunteers are currently going through annual enrollment. "Enrollment" lets us know if a volunteer plans to continue in the program in 2021. It also gives them the opportunity to review the Volunteer Expectations and Conditions of Service agreements. These important documents require their agreement in order to continue in the program. This is a requirement of ALL Extension volunteers. In addition, we are starting to plan for and prep volunteers for the 2021 gardening season since restrictions are still in place due to Covid-19.

Planning for the 2021 Sunnyview Garden partnership season is continuing. Registration materials are being revised and produced.

- 18 participants statewide earned the Rent Smart certificate for the January online classes. 8 of those 18 were Winnebago County residents. There are currently 13 participants in the February online sessions; 3 are Winnebago County residents. Online classes have been scheduled for March, April, and May.
- Working with a new cohort of Habitat for Humanity Money Matters clients. Clients are required to complete the Money Matters curriculum and have a conversation with me about their financial situation. 11 clients have been referred.
- Winnebago County Eviction Prevention Task Force continues to work with an outside facilitator on understanding eviction data in the county. We have begun discussing existing and potential resources to serve those in danger of eviction, including expanding Rent Smart classes for both tenant and landlord education.
- Currently taking financial coaching training through UW-Madison. This will allow me to expand my services to a larger audience.
- Member of the Extension Call To Action Initiative Group #1, Expanded Understanding of Land Grant Universities.
- Represented Extension at the January meetings of the Fox Cities Housing Coalition and the Winnebagoland Housing Coalition.
- Completed Mental Health First Aid for Youth training.
- Member of a regional team that presented Encouraging Financial Conversations provider training in January. 57 professionals attended at least one of the six classes, 10 of those participants were from Winnebago County.
- I will be on FMLA leave beginning February 17 through at least March 5.

- Working with SOAR on a new series. Starting February 10th and ending on February 24th. This is a live cooking lesson where I am providing educational materials.

- I have continued to work with a team including Kim Miller and the City of Oshkosh in light of the Community Garden RFP that was launched last fall to create a sustainable plan for the Phoenix Rising Community Garden. One barrier for interested applicants is having to hold liability insurance, and as I had learned about the Madison nonprofit Rooted, we set up a meeting with them to hear about how their nonprofit takes on liability to foster more community gardening to happen in their community.
