- Presented Rent Smart to 8 inmates at OSCI. Next Rent Smart session at OSCI scheduled for December 3.
- Beginning a Rent Smart series at the Oshkosh Area School District Second Chance campus on Nov. 4.
- Collaborating with Winnebago County Housing Authority to develop a cleaning guide for the Rent Smart curriculum specifically for public housing and immigrant renters in response to WCHA request.
- Beginning collaboration with financial education colleagues on creation of mindfulness-based financial education interventions to be included in existing financial education curricula.
- Expanding financial coaching to COTS clients after request from COTS staff.
- 53 of the 156 participants that have earned the Rent Smart certificate to date through statewide online classes are Winnebago County residents.

- Another big milestone was the presentation of a report to the economic development corporation New North Equity Diversity Inclusion Belonging Executive Council. Extension Community Development Educator Diana Hammer and I co-lead the workgroup on Small business and Entrepreneurship. Through research, first hand experiences with EoC, and in consultation with a Black business owner, we made two recommendations to the Council that will be brought forth to the New North Board in November. Recommendation 1: Expand resource allocations to BIPOC owned businesses & Recommendation. 2: Leverage BIPOC-led community organizations and leaders to intentionally resource existing efforts while building trust for New North. Both recommendations integrated motivation and concrete actions.
