POSITION TITLE: Therapeutic Wellness Specialist

DEPARTMENT: Park View Health Center

PAY BASIS: Hourly

PURPOSE AND SUMMARY:

Provides an ongoing programing of activities designed to meet, in accordance with the comprehensive assessment, the interests, needs, abilities, limitations and preferences of each resident.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- Prepares, implements and attends resident structured activity programs. Provides leisure 1:1 programming with individualized residents based on their person-centered interests on the neighborhoods. Organizes Great Room activities, outdoor activities, seasonal/holiday event planning and participation with external activity related services/vendors.
- 2. Assesses and develops person-centered resident care plans including accurate and complete documentation to meet the physical, mental, cognitive, creative, social and

spiritual well-being of each resident. Participates in Resident Care Conferences/Multi-Disciplinary Team Meetings.

3. Assists volunteers with activity programming and assignments.

ADDITIONAL ESSENTIAL DUTIES:

- 1. Transports residents to and from activities.
- 2. Helps identify and accompanies residents on community outings and performs basic lifesaving (BLS), CPR, as needed.
- 3. Identifies, suggests and provides leisure supplies and equipment for resident use, individualized to specific residents' interests on the neighborhood.
- 4. Coordinates essential family visitation directly with the residents.
- 5. Performs other related duties as may be assigned.

WORK RELATIONSHIPS:

- 1. Reports to Social Wellness Supervisor.
- 2. Works with interdisciplinary staff from dietary, housekeeping, and nursing on the unit, and residents.

REQUIRED EDUCATION, EXPERIENCE, TRAINING, AND CERTIFICATION:

- 1. Certified occupational therapy assistant or bachelor's degree in music therapy, recreational therapy, occupational therapy, human services, or similar field.
- 2. Experience in long-term care preferred.
- 3. Current or ability to obtain BLS (CPR) for the Health Care Provider certification.
- 4. Current State of Wisconsin driver's license with ability to produce evidence of meeting or exceeding the minimum automobile liability insurance requirements set forth by Winnebago County.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

- 1. Knowledge and ability to provide person-centered resident care.
- 2. Knowledge of geriatrics, dementia and other related disorders, intellectual and mental health disabilities.
- 3. Strong written and verbal communication skills including listening skills.
- 4. Computer skills including facility with Microsoft Office applications and ability to learn and use ECS software. Ability to adapt to advancing technology communication and visitation platforms.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Ability to lift, push, pull and move residents and supplies weighing a minimum of 50 pounds.
- 2. Ability to perform work from a standing or walking position and to remain in sitting or standing position for extended periods of time.
- 3. Ability to use standard office equipment including telephone, computer, printer, photocopier, and scanner.
- 4. Ability to drive and operate facility cars and vans.
