1. <u>Call to order.</u>

Chairman Stafford called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and it was verified that the meeting was properly noticed.

 <u>Consideration of Minutes of August 8, 2022, and September 12, 2022 meetings.</u> A motion to approve the August 8th, 2022 minutes was made by Chairman Stafford, seconded by Supervisor Hanson. Carried 4-0.

A motion to approve the September 12th, 2022 minutes was made by Chairman Stafford, seconded by Supervisor Hanson. Carried 4-0.

Supervisor Floam arrived at this time, 6:02pm.

3. <u>Chair comments on meeting and agenda organization by Supervisor Stafford.</u>

Chairman Stafford encouraged discussion on the agenda items but due to the size of tonight's agenda and the contents being discussed, he will be keeping it to a tight time limit.

4. <u>Public comments on agenda items.</u> None

5. <u>Communications shared by Committee Members</u>

Supervisor Defferding spoke about his attendance at the Wisconsin Counties Association Annual Conference and discussed the mental health presentation. He thought bringing on a social worker would be beneficial for Winnebago County. Supervisor Defferding consulted with Bill Topel at Human Services and Bill Topel indicated the Oshkosh Police Department is bringing on a social worker soon and will be the pilot program of having that member under their department.

Supervisor Eisen discussed his opposition of the September 27th, 2022 Wisconsin ARPA Commission meeting. After a 7-2 vote, a decision was made to allocate all 33 million for lost revenue to Parkview and Highway Department. He stated other departments also have a large need for the use of those funds and they need to be considered for their department projects that fall under the ARPA funds.

Supervisor Floam thanked Sheriff Matz for allowing him to do a ride along last month with Deputy Bauer in Patrol. He provided his perspective and experience with the ride along.

16. Sheriff's Report and Budget Discussion (if needed)

Sheriff Matz gave a boat house update with a completion expectation date of Spring 2023.

Sheriff Matz stated the jail count is at 223.

Sheriff Matz stated there is a radio replacement project, jail cell COVID mesh replacement and jail camera software that are all upcoming or currently taking place. These are all ARPA fund eligible projects.

Sheriff Matz discussed the Sheriff's Office looking into a paid Internship Program to help recruit deputies just coming out of college. University of Wisconsin Oshkosh and Fox Valley Technical College will assist with the internship program.

17. Coroner's Office Update - Cheryl Brehmer

Cheryl Brehmer discussed the current overdose numbers. There are 27 confirmed overdose deaths and 5 more possible overdose deaths pending toxicology results. All but one pending overdose are highly probable they will be confirmed overdoses.

Cheryl Brehmer gave an update on the morgue building. She stated the preliminary meetings with the City of Oshkosh went well but they are still discussing some storm and sewer issues. Chairman Stafford asked her to come back in a couple of months to give another update.

Cheryl Brehmer stated there could be budget issues as far as pathology, etc. Cheryl doesn't exactly know where the numbers will be. The average number of autopsy's used to be 8 to 10 a month but now it's double that so billing has become an issue for the budget.

Cheryl Brehmer discussed a partnership with the Health Department and Human Services with the Overdose Fatality Review committee to provide additional services for families who have experienced an overdose loss. There will now be a 3-year pilot Bereavement program and it will be run out of the Coroner's Office to provide family and friends during the grieving process. That program will begin in February.

18. Discussion: Committee meeting organization going forward

Chairman Stafford thanked everyone for their participation and will bring forward the topics for discussion that would have been on tonight's agenda to next month's meeting. He wanted to give all of the departments heads the opportunity to present their budgets at tonight's meeting.
