RESOLUTION NO. 084-112018: Authorize Five (5)-Year Cooperative Service Agreement Between Winnebago County and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and the United States Department of Agriculture, Animal Plant Health Inspection Service, Wildlife Services

WHEREAS, the black bear, Canada goose, white-tailed deer, and wild turkey populations in portions of Winnebago County are at levels that may cause damage to agricultural and forest crops; and

WHEREAS, the producers' costs of production of agricultural and forest crops have increased substantially over time; and

WHEREAS, §29.889, Wis Stats, and NR12, Wis Admin Code, provide for a state-funded Wildlife Damage Abatement and Claims Program (WDACP) to reimburse participating producers for crop losses caused by certain wildlife; and

WHEREAS, administrative participation is required of Winnebago County to make its land eligible for the WDACP; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County will be reimbursed by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) for all associated costs incurred in the administration and implementation of the WDACP; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County may, through formal agreement, cooperate with the Animal Plant Health Inspection Service, Wildlife Services (APHIS WS) and WDNR to make the WDACP available to eligible producers.

RESOLUTION NO. 085-112018: Authorize Winnebago County to Request Increased Funding and Oversight Reforms for Wisconsin's Child Protective Services System

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin child welfare system is county-operated and state-supervised, except Milwaukee County, where the system is administered by the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families (DCF), Division of Milwaukee Child Protective Services (DMCPS); and

WHEREAS, DCF provides insufficient funding to counties for the provision of child abuse and neglect services including prevention, investigation, treatment, and out-of-home placement costs, though the state has primary responsibility for compliance with federal requirements and shares liability for ensuring the system is meeting its obligations to children and families in all 72 counties; and

WHEREAS, in recent years, the State of Wisconsin added numerous mandates and practice expectations which increased county child protective services (CPS) workload and costs; and

WHEREAS, the opioid and methamphetamine epidemics have brought Wisconsin's child welfare system to a point of crisis, with increasing concern about the system's ability to meet its obligations to children and families; and

WHEREAS, the capacity for counties to continue to bear the lion's share of financial responsibility to address this crisis has been exhausted, as rising county contributions to the CPS system have far outpaced increases to the DCF Children and Family Aids allocation, and counties have used reserve funding to cover CPS expenses and increase staffing; and

WHEREAS, maintaining sufficient resources for Wisconsin's child welfare system is critical to secure the safety and future of our most vulnerable children; and

WHEREAS, without a proportional increase in the DCF Children and Family Services allocation, the CPS system has been stressed for over a decade causing caseloads for CPS workers to grow to unreasonable levels, and contributing to high levels of staff turnover in some counties and an overrun of out-of-home care costs above what counties can sustain within available resources; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's CPS system leaves significant gaps in state-level oversight for all counties except Milwaukee County, including the absence of caseload standards, no process for regular legislative evaluation and prioritization of CPS needs, and the absence of a legislative committee that provides regular policy guidance concerning CPS system issues such as adequate funding, performance, cost sharing, and long-term stability; and

WHEREAS, along with DMCPS; all eleven of Wisconsin's peer states with county-administered CPS systems have either adopted caseload standards for CPS caseworkers, completed thorough workload studies as a basis of determining funding needs, or otherwise made significant recommendations for keeping CPS workloads manageable; and

WHEREAS, the children within Wisconsin's CPS system are too important to allow the current level of under resourcing, oversight gaps, and disparity of attention while shifting the burden to property taxpayers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby requests that the State of Wisconsin increase the Children and Family Aids Allocation to counties in the 2019-2021 state biennial budget by \$30 million annually in order to cover a greater share of out-of-home care costs and increase staffing levels based on the caseload standards developed by the Wisconsin County Human Services Association (WCHSA) so Wisconsin's CPS system can meet its obligations.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that the Wisconsin Counties Association urges the State of Wisconsin to close critical oversight gaps by creating legislative mechanisms to review the CPS resource needs of all counties as part of the biennial budget process and ensure an appropriate committee provide ongoing policy guidance to respond to emerging CPS trends and ongoing system needs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that a copy of this Resolution be sent to the Office of the Governor for the State of Wisconsin, Department of Children and Families Secretary Eloise Anderson, Department of Administration Secretary Ellen Nowak, and all state legislators and assembly members representing Winnebago County constituents.

WHEREAS, HR Bill 6986 has been introduced in the House of Representatives to modify the mandatory CNA "training lockout" penalty mandated by OBRA by giving the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) and the states the discretion to impose a lockout under certain conditions. Any lockout imposed would end once the deficiencies cited were corrected; and

WHEREAS, because nursing homes and other long-term care providers are dealing with a severe workforce shortage, the ability to train CNAs is crucial to building and maintaining qualified staff, and with the modification, CMS and the states would have greater flexibility in reinstating providers' valuable CNA training programs, according to Katie Smith Sloan, president of LeadingAge, a charitable organization focused on education, advocacy, and applied research; and

WHEREAS, with this legislation, allowing nursing homes to regain their CNA training authority as soon as deficiencies have been corrected, the quality of our nation's nursing homes and other long-term care facilities will be greatly improved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby supports HR Bill 6986, the Nursing Home Workforce Quality Act, which is intended to modify the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1987's (OBRA) mandate of strict penalties assessed against nursing homes and long-term care facilities by automatically suspending their authority to train certified nursing assistants (CNAs) for a two years, by allowing facilities to reinstate CNA training once the deficiencies are corrected.

RE: Requested Change to Compensation Schedule

I am requesting that the Committee submit a resolution increasing the target minimums, control points, and maximums for each pay grade in the Winnebago County Employees Compensation Plan by 1.5 %, effective January 1, 2019.

The 2019 budget was built using the assumption that the pay schedule would be increased by 1.5%. An increase to the schedule is not the same as an across-the-board increase, and the requested resolution will not result directly in 1.5% pay raises. Pay raises will be determined primarily by the merit pay system. Catch-up raises awarded to those whose pay remains below the target minimums will be affected slightly by changing the target minimums.

It is important to adjust the pay schedule periodically, in order to keep the schedule in line with the labor market. However, it is important that merit pay increases remain larger than adjustments to the schedule, so that pay for new employees who started at the minimum can move toward the control point as they gain experience. Average merit pay increases of 2.5% were included in the 2019 budget.

For your reference, the CPI rate that would be applicable to labor contracts for general employees starting January 1, 2019 is 2.25%. The most recent annual CPI-U, as calculated by the federal Department of Labor, showed an overall 2.50% increase for the year ending October 31,2018. I have also attached part of a recent survey report from Carlson Dettman, who surveyed over 300 Wisconsin public employers, and found the average compensation structure increases to be 1.88% for 2018 and projected 1.97% for 2019.
