<u>FoxComm Report:</u> Tom Swadley reported his attendance at conferences and training sessions and what he's learned about the future communication. There is new legislation at the federal level for public safety broadband that we can see implemented within the next 10 years.

<u>Fire/EMS Subcommittee</u>: Ryan Krings has been working with Jim Austad on the Procedure <u>Dispatch of Air-Medical Helicopters</u>. Motion was made to accept draft by Matz and seconded by Krings; motion carried.

<u>Radio Infrastructure</u>: Sheriff Matz reported that the radio orders are in and expecting delivery in late March. Towers – in the search for land to build a new tower, an inexpensive piece of property was found. The tower will be built large enough to add more equipment when necessary. There was discussion about Communications having their own budget vs. being tied in the Sheriff's budget – it was agreed on.
