42	COMMITTEE REPORTS
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44	Supervisor Rankin gave a third quarter report on the Public Health Department. He reported that they
45	have 658 clients, 2,019 people that receive home care and the number of clinic visits were 2,538. Supervisor
46	Rankin reminded the Board that this does not include the Cities of Oshkosh, Menasha and Neenah, but is the
47	only the rural areas, the City of Omro and the Village of Winneconne.
48	Supervisor Rankin reported that the Health Department conducted a very successful county-wide
49	collection of hazard materials. He explained that there was an exchange room where people brought various
50	chemicals (garden, household, etc.) that other people could come and take for their use. This eliminated the
51	need to dispose of these chemicals.
52	Supervisor Rengstorf asked the Board to look at the brochure he placed on their desks from the
53	Winneconne Area Education Foundation, Inc. He explained that this foundation, as described in the brochure,
54	"will support and assist educational programs that are not ordinarily funded through the regular budget."
55	

Supervisor Wagner thanked County Executive Van De Hey and Chuck Orenstein, Finance Director, for their hard work in putting together the 1999 Budget. She also thanked the department heads for their cooperation.

COUNTY BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Chairman Maehl corrected a newspaper article that reported the 1999 tax rate was higher than the tax rate in 1998. Chairman Maehl stated that the 1999 tax rate is lower than 1998; and is in fact, lower than in 1973.

PUBLIC HEARING

Tom Baker, CEO of C.D. Smith Construction Co., spoke in support of his company's proposal for the new law enforcement center/jail. He disagreed with the editorial in Sunday's newspaper that stated it was a, "recipe for disaster". He asked that the politics of the issue, "be put away" and that the county move on with the project. Russell Meerdink, 1555 South Park Avenue, Neenah, spoke in support of the request for rezoning from

Amos and Carol Idhe, Report No. 001, Amendatory Ordinance No. 11-01-98. Richard Metzig, spoke in support of his request for rezoning from A-1 (Farmland Preservation) to A-2 (General Farming), Report No. 002, Amendatory Ordinance No. 11-02-98.

Mark Krings, Town of Omro, asked that the Board not delay any longer on the law enforcement center/jail project. He expressed concern over the inability of the committees to come to a consensus.

Harrison Sturgis, spoke in support of the request for rezoning by Amos and Carol Idhe, Report No.

001, Amendatory Ordinance No. 11-01-98, and Richard Metzig, Report No. 002, Amendatory Ordinance No. 11-02-98.

Rodney Scholz, 229 Webster, Neenah, spoke in support of the rezoning request of Richard Metzig, Report No. 002, Amendatory Ordinance No. 11-02-98.

Philip Twohig, of PTD, Inc., asked that the County Board follow the procedures that they established to select the contractors for the law enforcement center/jail. He explained that the two-phase evaluation process of selecting the contractors was explained in the request for proposal, and that the Boldt Construction Company/PTD, Inc. team ranked first in both evaluations. He questioned the county not adhering to this ranking procedure, but stated that their team is still confident that they can meet the county's "objective" with regards to this facility.

AEGIS CORPORATION - ANNUAL CHECK PRESENTATION

Bob Wurtz, Aegis Corporation, presented Chairman Maehl with a check for \$56,853.00. Mr. Wurtz told the Board that this check is the final payment to Winnebago County for the capital contribution made when Wisconsin County Mutual Insurance Corporation was created.

Mr. Wurtz distributed information to the Board on the history and growth of the Wisconsin County Mutuzl Insurance Corporation. He told the Board that they can still expect dividend checks in the future, however, they won't be out of the County's capital, but will be coming from the corporation.

Chairman Maehl announced that because of the lateness in receiving Executive Van De Hey's veto message, this will be held over until the December 15, 1998, County Board Meeting.

In addition to the foregoing, the new agreement text has been reformatted with resulting minor changes made to all articles. In addition, the new agreement contains minor revisions to the articles covering scope and duration, holidays, sick leave, unpaid leaves of absence, hours of work, maternity leave, grievance procedure and call-in pay. Attached to the agreement is a newly negotiated Letter of Understanding that covers the employment of a temporary dispatcher.

RESOLUTION NO. 137-1198: Authority to Execute the 1999-2000 Labor Agreement with the Winnebago County Courthouse Employees Association

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the County Executive and the County Clerk be, and they hereby are authorized to execute a two-year Agreement on behalf of Winnebago County and the Winnebago County Courthouse Employees' Association for the years 1999 and 2000, effective January 1, 1999, which Agreement will provide the following major changes from the previous agreement:

1) <u>TERM</u>

Two years.

2) <u>WAGES</u>

\$0.30 per hour (2.75%) across-the-board effective January 1, 1999 \$0.30 per hour (2.75%) across-the-board effective January 1, 2000

3) ARTICLE X – LONGEVITY PAY

This article will be abolished and the average amount of longevity pay that is currently provided (\$0.12 per hour) will be added to the maximum step in each pay range to create a new top step (Step H), payable upon the completion of twelve years of service.

4) **ARTICLE XVI – VACATIONS**

Effective January 1, 1999, employees with six years of service will be eligible for three weeks of vacation. (Previously, employees were eligible for three weeks of vacation after seven years of service).

5) **NEW ARTICLE – STAND-BY PAY**

This new article, which applies only to one group of personnel in the Maintenance Department, provides for the equivalent of three hours of straight time premium pay for personnel who carry a pager and are available for call-in responsibilities for all off-duty hours in a given assigned week. (These personnel will no longer be eligible for the special minimum call-in premium pay (3 hours) when they respond to off-duty emergencies. They will, however, be eligible for normal pay for the time actually involved in the response plus minimal travel time.)

6) **NEW ARTICLE – LONG TERM DISABILITY INSURANCE**

Effective January 1, 1999 the County will provide group Long Term Disability Insurance at County expense on essentially the same basis as is in effect for a number of other County employee groups.
