ADJOURNED SESSION WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD MEETING TUESDAY, JUNE 19, 2007

Chairman David Albrecht called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the County Board Room, Fourth Floor, Courthouse, 415 Jackson Street, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance and an invocation by Supervisor Lennon.

COMMUNICATIONS, PETITIONS, ETC.

PRESENTATION OF THE 2007 COUNTY SCHOLARSHIPS

Supervisor Finch, Chairman of the Scholarship Committee, and the members of the Scholarship Committee presented checks, certificates and a county history book to each of the following graduating high school seniors: Dan Barker, Menasha High School; Jared Stroik, Neenah High School; Amber Remer, Omro High School; Maggie Janzen, Oshkosh North High School; Benjamin Heidke, Oshkosh West High School; Erica Ehlers, St. Mary Central High School; Logan Shea, Winneconne High School

EXECUTIVE MARK HARRIS - STATE OF THE COUNTY

Executive Harris explained to the Board that the county is responsible for completing the sound barrier at the Oshkosh Speedzone Raceway. Executive Harris spoke with Richard Wollangk, Oshkosh City Manager, and was told that the city may allow races to continue this year without the barrier being completed. However, the track would not be able to reopen after this season if the county didn't fulfill their promise to have that barrier completed by this year.

Executive Harris presented the Financial Review 2006 Audit and Projections. He explained that the county's reserve funds have been increasing, as has the reserves as a percentage of the county's budget. It is estimated that there will be a slight decrease in both the dollar amount and the percentage in 2007.

Executive Harris' report included the following information:

- Three major sources of revenue fees, fines and other; intergovernmental transfers; tax levy. The largest source of revenue is the intergovernmental transfers, followed by the tax levy.
- The percent of revenue from intergovernmental transfers and the tax levy are getting closer.
- Two-thirds of the county's gross expenditures come from just three departments--Human Services,
 Park View Health Center and the Sheriff's Department. 31% of the county's revenues are "ear marked" and come from the Human Services Department.
- Approximately 3/4's of the county's expenditures goes for wages, benefits and contracted services.
- The tax levy by major areas shows that 21% is applied to the Sheriff's Department, 27% to Human Services, 15% to Governmental Fund Dept (capital projects) and 12% to Park View Health Center.
- The maximum equalized operating tax rate that the state allows for Winnebago County is \$4.71. Since 2005, we have been reducing this tax rate from \$4.39 to \$4.21 and are not in any danger of getting to that maximum operating tax rate. Our debt service rate of \$1.17 is slightly higher than a couple of years ago and can be attributed to some of the county's current construction projects.
- Of the county's 1,047 employees, 310 are employed in the Human Services Department, 257 at Park View Health Center and 184 at the Sheriff's Department, 113 in administration & other, 80 at the Highway Department, 43 in the courts, 39 in the Facilities Department, 12 in the Parks Department and 9 at the airport. In the past two years, the number of employees has gone from 1,111 to 1,047 (-64 employees), which saves the county approximately \$3 Million.

Executive Harris took questions from the Board. A copy of his report is on file in the County Clerk's Office.

COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S APPOINTMENTS

Director of Child Support

Executive Harris asked for approval of his appointment of Kathleen M. Diedrich as the Director of the Child Support Agency effective July 1, 2007. Motion by Supervisor Robl and seconded to adopt. CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE.

Board of Adjustment

Executive Harris asked for approval of his appointment of Arden Schroeder and Greg Kargus to the Board of Adjustment. These are three (3) year terms, which will expire June 30, 2010. Motion by Supervisor Widener and seconded to adopt. CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE.

Board of Health

Executive Harris asked for approval of his re-appointment of Dr. Joseph Bachman and Jill Collier and the appointment of Margaret Larson to the Board of Health. Ms. Larson replaces Tom LaFuze whose term will expire on July 31, 2007. These are two (2) year terms, which will expire July 31, 2009. Motion by Robl and seconded to approve. CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE.

East Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission

Executive Harris asked for approval of his appointment of Jim Erdman to the East Central Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission. Mr. Erdman will complete Arden Schroeder's term on this commission, which will expire on April 15, 2008. Motion by Supervisor Lennon and seconded to approve. CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE.

Local Emergency Planning Commission

Executive Harris asked for approval of his appointment of Gordon Hintz to the Local Emergency Planning Commission. Mr. Hintz's term will expire on December 31, 2007. Motion by Supervisor Robl and seconded to approve. CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE.

Menasha Library Board

Executive Harris asked for approval of his appointment of Paul Eisen to the Menasha Library Board. Mr. Eisen will replace Colleen O'Brien, whose term has expired. Mr. Eisen's term will expire on June 30, 2010. Motion by Supervisor Pollnow and seconded to approve. CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE.

Solid Waste Management Board

Executive Harris asked for approval of his appointment of Jim Lauson to the Solid Waste Management Board. Mr. Lauson will replace John Wilke, whose term will expire on April 21, 2009. Motion by Supervisor Hotynski and seconded to approve. CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE.

REPORTS FROM COMMITTEES, COMMISSIONS AND BOARDS

Supervisor Barker reported that there will not be Legislative Committee meeting in June. Their next meeting will be held on July 23. She asked that other committees not schedule a meeting that morning so as to conflict with the Legislative Committee meeting.

Supervisor Koziczkowski stated that each board member had a pamphlet placed on their desks informing them of the Human Services Department's 2008 budget public hearings. The hearings will be held in Oshkosh on Wednesday, June 27 and Thursday, June 28 in Neenah. Everyone is invited to attend.

Supervisor Egan stated that he, Mike Elder and Supervisor Griesbach attended the UW-Fox Valley design project meeting. They will go out for bids in November. The roof is being put on and drywall is going up at the new Park View Health Center project. A revised Personnel Function Review Schedule was placed on all the supervisors' desks.

Supervisor Widener discussed Act 420, which allows libraries to bill adjacent counties for their residents using the libraries. Some of library systems in the counties surrounding Winnebago County have reached an agreement not to bill the other counties. The anticipated amount that Winnebago County will owe is approximately \$10,000. Supervisor Widener discussed the reduction in members of the Sheboygan County Board. The board voted to go from 35 to 24 members after the issue was studied by a committee with input from the public. Supervisor Widener stated that Winnebago County wasn't able to achieve this type of outcome because of negative input from the public. He feels that a committee that works well with the public needs to be formed to make this process go better.

COUNTY BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Chairman Albrecht reported that Supervisors Lohry, Hall and Farrey are excused from tonight's meeting. Chairman Albrecht welcomed Supervisor Maehl back after his absence while recovering from his fall.

Chairman Albrecht thanked Vice Chairman Schaidler for filling in for him while he was recuperating from his surgery.

COUNTY BOARD CHAIRMAN'S APPOINTMENT

Land Conservation Committee

Chairman Albrecht asked for the Board's approval of his appointment of Bruce Bohn, 8317 County Road E, Omro, to the Land Conservation Committee. He will complete the unexpired term of Jerry Schuster who passed away. Motion by Supervisor Egan and seconded to approve. CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE.

Motion by Supervisor Hotynski and seconded to approve the May 1 and May 15, 2007 board proceedings. CARRIED BY VOICE VOTE.

FAMILY CARE PRESENTATION KEN STOFFEL, DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT

Ken Stoffel, Deputy Director of the Human Services Department, explained that Family Care, also known as Long-term Care Redesign, is a model for managed care provided by Human Service Departments. If Winnebago County implements a Family Care Program, it would have a significant impact on the Human Services Department because it would change the way services are provided, funded and managed.

Mr. Stoffel described the four main types of services that his department provides:

- Behavioral Health--serves people with mental illness, chemical dependency
- Child Welfare--works with child protective services, juvenile justice
- Economic Support--W-2, food share
- Long-Term Care--services to the elderly, physically disabled, developmentally disabled

Mr. Stoffel explained that people receiving Long-term Care have to meet functional and financial eligibility to receive funding. Services they receive are:

- Residential--group homes, assisted living, supportive home care
- Vocational services--community employment, sheltered work
- Home modifications--ramps, bathroom modifications

On each day in 2007, approximately 1,500 people are receiving one of these services. The people on the waiting list to receive these services has dropped from approximately 200 to 69 as of June 14, 2007.

Mr. Stoffel stated that of the Human Services Department's \$65,135,659 budget, Long Term Care costs \$36,333,864.

Mr. Stoffel explained that the state is looking at redesigning Long Term Care because of increased costs in these services, as well as an increase in the number of people being served and on waiting lists. The state is conducting Family Care pilot programs in Fond du Lac, Portage, Richland, Milwaukee and LaCrosse Counties. Winnebago County has partnered with Fond du Lac and Manitowoc Counties to look at the possibility of expanding on Fond du Lac County's pilot program.

Mr. Stoffel explained that there are two main components of Family Care:

- Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC)--intake (eligibility is determined), information and assistance to everyone
- Care Management Organization (CMO)--assessment, develops service plans, authorizes payments for goods and services

If Winnebago County partnered with Fond du Lac and Manitowoc Counties and developed a CMO, they would contract with the state and the state would pay a "capitated" rate for each client. The CMO would be responsible for managing their costs within that averaged rate.

Requirements of the CMO:

- CMO is like a HMO
- CMO must serve people in multiple counties
- CMO can be a private organization, public-private partnership or a multi-county consortia

Mr. Stoffel explained that money is saved with a Family Care program because more emphasis is placed on preventive care; reduced hospital and nursing home use; risk is spread over more people; their focus is on needs vs wants. Based on the five pilot programs, approximately \$452 was saved monthly on each person served by Family Care.

There is risk for a CMO. They need to stay within their averaged capitated rate; they must have a risk reserve fund; they need to maintain a high number of members served; services become an entitlement (must be provided if person is eligible).

Mr. Stoffel explained the impacts of this program on Winnebago County:

- Less responsibility/less control
- Possibly tax levy buy out over 5 years
- Change in services needs vs wants
- Staff--county employees or employees of the CMO
- CMO becomes a vendor of the state--state can drop you if you don't do a good job
- Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) is available to all county residents

Impact on Providers:

- More business and no waiting lists
- More competition and more providers
- More competition and better prices

Impact on consumers:

- Entitlement, so there are no waiting lists
- Interdisciplinary Team prevention
- Provider network defined benefits
- Focus is on needs vs wants
- Provider choice is based on price and quality

Mr. Stoffel explained that the state has a very ambitious goal of implementing Family Care statewide by 2011. This can only happen if the state legislature budgets money for this program.

At some point in the future Family Care could include:

- Acute and primary health care
- Children
- Behavioral health
- Competition of CMO's

Mr. Stoffel explained that Family Care is not mandatory and Winnebago County has options:

- Make no changes continue to operate as they are currently doing
- Transition to a County-operated Care Management Organization

- Transition out of Long-term care services and transfer responsibility to a private organization
- Other options to be determine

Mr. Stoffel stated that there are many financial unknowns about getting Family Care started and sustained on a statewide basis.

The county does not need to make any decisions right now. However, they are gathering more information on Family Care and on a tentative agreement with Manitowoc and Fond du Lac Counties on forming a CMO.

Mr. Stoffel then took questions from the Board. A copy of his presentation is on file in the County Clerk's Office.

ORDINANCE NO 242-62007: Amend Section 9.14 General Code of Winnebago County (Smoking in County Buildings)

WHEREAS, a new Collective Bargaining Agreement was recently agreed to between Winnebago County and the bargaining representative for unionized employees at Park View Health Center wherein it was agreed that no smoking would be allowed on the campus of Park View Health Center; and

WHEREAS, in light of said Collective Bargaining Agreement, it is appropriate that Section 9.14 of the General Code of Winnebago County be amended so as to ban smoking at Park View Health Center.

NOW, THEREFORE, the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago does ordain as follows:

That portions of Section 9.14 of the General Code of Winnebago County be amended to read as follows:

9.14 SMOKING IN COUNTY BUILDINGS ...

(3) Smoking Prohibited.

- (a) No person shall smoke in any county-owned or county-leased building, office or vehicle at any time
- (b) That no person shall smoke within the building or the campus area of Park View Health Center.
 - (1) The "campus of Park View Health Center" shall be defined for the purpose of this ordinance as those areas, both indoors and outdoors, falling within the perimeter of the campus boundary surrounding the skilled nursing facility building at Park View Health Center, as is indicated in Exhibit "A", attached.

(4) Exceptions.

and

- (a) The prohibition in Subsection (3) shall not apply to the following structures or to the following areas:
 - (1) County-owned or county-leased community-based residential facilities.
 - (2) Facilities leased by the County to non-county entities and occupied by such entities, wherein such lease commences before July 1, 1996.
- (b) The County Department head who controls, governs, or directs any facilities which are listed as exceptions, above, shall be the "person in charge" of such facilities as defined in Section 101.123(1)(d), Statutes, and shall designate specific smoking areas in those structures or areas which are exceptions to this Ordinance, upon the advice and consent of the appropriate policy-making committee or board of jurisdiction, pursuant to that authority provided in Section 101.123(4), Wisconsin Statutes. ...

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago that this Ordinance shall become effective as of the first day of February, 2008.

RESOLUTION NO. 226-62007:

WHEREAS, the Town of Rushford desires commencement of an easement that addresses the Township's need to access and maintain a dry hydrant facility that would be located at the Eureka Boat Landing in the Village of Eureka; and

RESOLUTION NO. 235-62007: Oppose Proposed Amendments to Chapter NR 115

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter NR 115 regulates shoreland zoning within the State of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibillity of county zoning departments to enforce state shoreland zoning regulations; and

WHEREAS, the goal of the proposed amendments to NR 115 are to protect public rights to the navigable waters of the State of Wisconsin while allowing property owners the flexibility to make reasonable use of their property; and

WHEREAS, despite these goals, the new proposed rules are significantly more restrictive than the current rules in a number of significant ways, including the following:

- √ The prohibition of new boathouses larger than 250 square feet;
- ✓ The prohibition of the storing of boats, ice shanties or other similar structures within 75' of the water;
- ✓ The requirement that permits be issued for structures such as boats, playhouses, camping trailers, hot tubs, etc.;

- ✓ The requirement to issue permits for structures waterward of the ordinary high water mark such as piers, riprap, wharves, fish cribs, boat ramps, dams, bridges, etc.;
- ✓ Greater restrictions on the use of setback averaging resulting in virtually no averaging being allowed;
- ✓ The inclusion of impervious surface standards which result in increased costs to a permit applicant, increased county staff time, and in many cases prohibit any additional construction on property within 300' of the water;
- ✓ The addition of significant costs to homeowners in relationship to compliance with new revegetative requirements and impervious area standards;
- ✓ The requirement that counties adopt various standards with no guarantee as to what the Department of Natural Resources will consider acceptable in their review and approval of the ordinance;
- ✓ The requirement that counties include subdivision requirements in the zoning ordinances which contradict other statutory provisions; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Committee of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors believes that the proposed regulations are overly restrictive and any benefits gained from such requirements are minimally beneficial in nature; and

WHEREAS, the proposed zoning regulations will greatly increase the amount of work performed by the Planning and Zoning Department and the Office of Corporation Counsel in relationship to the issuance of permits and enforcement of such regulations; and

WHEREAS, said proposed regulations provide no provisions for additional funding to counties for staff additions to enforce said regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby goes on record as opposing the current proposed amendments to Chapter NR 115 which are presently being promoted by the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

ORDINANCE NO. 236-62007: Amend Section 8.05(9)(b)(1)(a) of the General Code of Winnebago County (Land Records Ordinance)

WHEREAS, at the present time, Chapter 8 of the General Code of Winnebago County (Land Records Ordinance) requires a certified survey map (CSM) for any land split with the exception of property acquired for County Highway purposes; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County acquires property at times via in rem foreclosure proceedings as a result of the failure of the owner of the property to pay real estate taxes. Disposition of that property must be in accordance with other County Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, there have been several situations where the County has come into possession of private roads as a result of in rem tax foreclosure proceedings; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the County's present Land Records Ordinance, Winnebago County would be required to perform a CSM if the County were to dispose of a private road obtained by tax foreclosure by deeding the roadway to adjacent owners and thus incurring a significant cost to Winnebago County; and

WHEREAS, an alternate method of disposition could occur by amending the present Land Records Ordinance so as to allow for an exemption to the CSM requirement for the disposition of property acquired by Winnebago County pursuant to in rem tax foreclosure proceedings; and

WHEREAS, amendment of the present Ordinance would allow for the sale and disposition of property acquired by Winnebago County as a result of in rem tax foreclosure proceedings without the County incurring excess costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago does ordain as follows:

That Section 8.05(9)(b)(1)(a) of the General Code of Winnebago County be amended to read as follows:

8.05 LAND RECORDS

(9) General Provisions...

- (b) Recordable Documents. In addition to state statutory requirements for certified survey maps, subdivision plats, replats, assessor's plats, condominium plats and other recordable documents, the following additional requirements shall be adhered to for the purposes of this ordinance:
 - 1. Combining and Dividing Parcels.
 - a. Upon the effective date of this ordinance a Certified Survey Map (CSM) shall be prepared and submitted for all parcel divisions and combinations, regardless of acreage. This shall include property transferred as a result of resolutions of property line disputes. A survey of the entire parent parcel shall be required only where the parent parcel is not presently described as part of a CSM or subdivision plat. The dedication or conveyance of public right-of-way for Winnebago County is exempt from CSM requirements of this ordinance provided that the property acquired is described on the recorded deed by a metes and bounds description prepared by a registered land surveyor. Any property obtained by Winnebago County as a result of in rem tax foreclosure proceedings shall also be exempt from CSM requirements of this Ordinance provided that the property acquired is described on the recorded deed by a metes and bounds description prepared by a registered land surveyor. In addition the following shall apply: ...

(Dark printing is the new language, which was added to the Ordinance)

WHEREAS, in order to take full advantage of this opportunity to build upon the initial success of having restored the Asylum Point Lighthouse it will be necessary to draw upon the generosity of parties throughout the area willing to donate funds towards completing the task of both preserving and enhancing the building; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County desires to create an endowment fund for the benefit of further protecting and refining the assets of the Asylum Point Lighthouse and to which donors may make gifts to benefit the facility; and

WHEREAS, the municipal representatives present favored the formation of a study group made up of members assigned from each participating governmental jurisdiction who will proceed to explore options for ownership and recreational usage of the Glatfelter property; and

WHEREAS, your Parks and Recreation Committee has elected to proceed in requesting the County Board's endorsement in having the County Executive assign representatives to fill positions on the aforementioned study group.
