ORGANIZATION MEETING April 18, 1972

The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order at 10:00 a.m., in the Supervisors' Room, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin by the County Clerk Dorothy L. Propp.

By virtue of Chapter 59.04 B of the Wisconsin Statutes the April Session of the Winnebago County Board is called to order for the purpose of organization and doing any and all regular business which according to law may come before the Board.

The Honorable Judge Herbert J. Mueller, County Court Branch I, administered the Oath of Office to the Supervisors.

The members of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors were formally introduced.

Roll call showed full board present.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag and invocation by Supervisor Daggett.

ELECTION OF BOARD CHAIRMAN

The first order of business was the election of a Chairman of the Board for the term of two years.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that nominations shall be made from the floor, that nominating speeches, if any, shall not exceed two minutes, that the nominee shall rise for the purpose of identification when nominated, that no more than two persons shall be allowed to second a nomination; but that no seconding speech shall be permitted; if there are two or more candidates, a secret ballot be used to elect for a majority. Carried by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Neely and seconded that Orrin H. King be nominated as Chairman. The Chair asked for any more nominations. There being none, Supervisor Neely moved and it was seconded that nominations be closed and Orrin H. King was elected as Chairman of the Winnebago County Board



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for the term of two years beginning April 18, 1972.

ELECTION OF BOARD VICE CHAIRMAN

The next order of business was the election of a Vice Chairman of the Board for the term of two years.

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Motion made by Supervisor Putzer and seconded that James P. Coughlin be nominated as Vice Chairman. Motion made by Supervisor Goff that Laurel Heaney be nominated as Vice Chairman. Motion made by Supervisor Christoph and seconded that nominations be closed. Carried by Voice Vote.

The Chair appointed Supervisors Becher and Meyer as election tellers.

The votes were cast and counted: Coughlin 36; Heaney 9. The Chair declared James P. Coughlin elected as Vice Chairman of the Winnebago County Board for the term of two years beginning April 18, 1972.

ORIENTATION

Chairman Orrin H. King addressed the board members outlining the duties of the supervisors, their responsibilities. The Chairman also gave a resume of the various departments, their functions and locations.

Supervisor Neely presented an over-all view of the 1972 Budget, with a break-down of expenditure and revenues for each department of the county.

The Corporation Counsel welcomed the new members and invited the board to seek his counsel.

Supervisor Pitz addressed the board regarding the changes in committee structure, procedure for reimbursement on committee work, the rules which would govern the board's operation.

Supervisor Daggett commended the Chairman for the Orientation Session and requested that a copy be prepared for each supervisor. Request will be granted. * * * *

ORDER OF ROLL CALL

Supervisor Putzer moved and it was seconded that roll call on an issue will be alphabetically, but a supervisor may decide to pass his turn to vote until later. Ayes 34, Nayes 12 – Ales, Brandt, Farrell, Greiner, Holverson, Jacobson, Johnson, Kampo, Neely, J. C. Pawlowski, W. C. Pawlowski and Shurbert. CARRIED.

* * * * Motion made by Supervisor J. C. Pawlowski to adjourn until 1:30 p.m. Carried by Voice Vote.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order by the Chairman Orrin H. King.

Roll call showed full board present.

Tuesday, April 18th, was designated as Winnebago County Government Day, sponsored by the Cook-Fuller Legion Post No. 70.



The Chairman welcomed the visiting students. Supervisor Daggett introduced the AFS representative from Omro, Wis.

Supervisor Pitz asked that the board consider the rules at this time requesting that the clerk read each rule.

RULES OF BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY

Adopted April 18, 1972

TIME AND PLACE OF MEETING. (Newly adopted rule) RULE NO. 1: The meetings of the County Board shall be

held in the Board of Supervisors' Room and the hour for daily meetings shall be 6:00 P.M., except that the annual meeting shall be held at 9:30 A.M. and continue during consideration of the annual budget. The public hearing as required by law on the proposed annual budget shall be held at 7:00 P.M. on the date selected. The Board shall be in continuous session from day to day until adjournment to a day certain or sine die. The meetings are open to the public and are held every third Tuesday in every month unless changed by majority vote of the Board.

Motion made by Supervisor Becher and seconded to amend as follows: "The daily meeting shall begin at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday. Roll call vote: Ayes 19 – Becher, Brandt, Christoph, Coughlin, Daggett, Farrell, Greiner, Holverson, Jacobson, Kampo, Loehning, Meyer, Neely, Nolan, J. C. Pawlowski, Putzer, Shurbert, Sitter and Zingsheim. Nayes 27. Motion LOST.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded to amend Rule No. 1 as follows: "No meeting shall continue for more than four hours except by consent of two-thirds of those voting at the termination of said four hours.

A recess may be declared near the midpoint of any meeting, and a second roll call called at the resumption of the meeting. If a county board member answers only one of such roll call, that is to say, attends one half or less of a given county board meeting, he ought to submit a bill for committee work only and not for a whole county board day."

Motion made by Supervisor Seefeld to delete the second paragraph. Motion made by Supervisor Neely and seconded to postpone indefinitely the amendment. Ayes 26 - Nayes 20 - Ales, Apell, Brandt, Christenson, Collins, Fara, Gischia, Gundlach, Heaney, Hinderaker, Ilk, Johnson, Kaeding, Loy, Olson, Parker, W. C. Pawlowski, Pitz, Schott and Singstock. Motion to postpone CARRIED.

Motion made by Supervisor Kampo and seconded that every other meeting, except the budget session, be a night meeting. (Motion withdrawn.)



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Supervisor Gischia expressed the request for the meeting to be held on April 25, 1972 be a day meeting. (No action)

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded to adopt Rule No. 1. Carried by Voice Vote. Supervisor Daggett requested a roll call vote. Ayes 31 – Nayes 15 – Becher, Christoph, Daggett, Farrell, Greiner, Holverson, Jacobson, Kampo, Loehning, Meyer, Neely, J. C. Pawlowski, Shurbert, Sitter and Zingsheim. CAR-RIED.

* * * *

Motion made by Supervisor Seefeld and seconded to waive reading of the rules. LOST by Voice Vote.

ORGANIZATION MEETING. (Same as adopted by County Board on March 21, 1972.)

RULE NO. 2: At the Organization Meeting, it shall be the

duty of the County Clerk to call the County Board to order. The Clerk shall call the roll and establish presence of a quorum and proceed with the preliminary ceremonies.

A quorum being present, the Board shall proceed to the election of a Chairman and Vice-Chairman. The Chairman shall then call for election by ballot of five members of the Board to serve on the Highway Committee. He shall appoint three supervisors as tellers, and in the event one or more of the tellers are nominated, a different teller shall be appointed. The presiding officer shall first call for nominations from the floor, and the nominee's name shall be posted on the blackboard. A nominating speech shall be limited to two minutes. The, nominee shall stand to be recognized.

The Chairman shall then declare the Board to be acting as a Committee of the Whole, and while it is acting as such Committee of the Whole, he shall arrange for the orientation of the members by making an explanation of the work of the Board and the manner in which it functions, the projects of various departments, long range planning and the status of the various projects of the Board. He may ask for the help of committee chairmen or department heads in making such explanations.

The County Clerk shall also make an explanation of procedure and the manner in which votes are taken.

There shall be an explanation of the rules by the person who was Chairman of the Judiciary Committee prior to the Organization Meeting. The Corporation Counsel shall also address the Board.

An explanation shall be made by the Chair-



man as to the appointment of committees and that a Committee on Committees will be announced during the day to assist in the selection of committee members. Such committee as appointed shall consist of the Chairman, the Vice-Chairman and five County Board members. The Committee of the Whole shall then be declared dissolved and the proposed rules of the Board presented and rules adopted, this to include a determination of the time and place of meeting and consideration of the duties of committees.

After the announcement of the members of the Committee on Committees which shall be selected by the Chairman and Vice-Chairman from Board Members, the Board shall adjourn the Organization Meeting to the following Tuesday.

The Committee on Committees shall advise, by mail, all members of the Board their recommendations for committee membership. All proposed members of a committee shall meet at a place to be designated in such letter one-half hour prior to the adjourned Organization Meeting of the County Board to select a chairman of each committee and each committee shall then report to the Chairman immediately after the opening of the said meeting who has been selected as such chairman.

Approved as read. **POWERS OF CHAIRMAN. BULE NO.** 3: The B

RULE NO. 3: The Board Chairman may call one to five Board members to attend any meeting pertaining to County affairs which may arise between regularly scheduled Board meetings. The members so attending shall be paid their actual and necessary expenses in addition to their per diem for attendance at such meeting.

> The Chairman of the County Board shall act as an ex officio member of any committee of the County Board, but shall have the power to vote on such committee only in the absence of one or more committee members.

Approved as read.

RULE NO. 4: The County Highway Committee shall be elected annually by the Board on the first day of its Organization Meeting. A vacancy



in the Highway Committee shall be filled at the next regular meeting of the County Board. All elective officers who are elected by the County Board shall be elected on the first day of the annual meeting of the Board following the public hearing on the proposed budget.

Approved as read.

RULE NO. 5: The Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, shall take the chair at the hour to which the Board may from time to time stand adjourned, call the Board to order and direct the calling of the roll of members by the Clerk. In the absence of both the Chairman and Vice-Chairman, the County Clerk shall preside until a Chairman Pro-tem is elected.

Approved as read ORDER OF BUSINESS.

RULE NO. 6: Upon the establishment of a quorum, after roll call, and preliminary exercises (pledge of allegiance to the flag, prayer), the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the Clerk, and any mistake therein shall be corrected by the Board, provided, that upon the last day of the Session, the journal for that day will be read, and before the final adjournment, corrected.

After the reading and correction of the journal, the order of business shall be as follows:

- 1. Communications, petitions, memorials, accounts, etc.
- 2. Reports of Standing Committees.
- 3. Presentation of resolutions and disposition of same.
- 4. Consideration of miscellaneous business.

Approved as read.

RULE NO. 7: Every subject matter that shall come before the Board shall be referred to the appropriate committee by the Chairman without motion.

* * * *

Approved as read.

RULE NO. 8: The Chairman shall preserve order and decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Board and shall clearly and distinctly state every motion or question before debate.

Approved as read. HANDLING OF RESOLUTIONS.

RULE NO. 9: Every written resolution shall be prepared in block form and be as concise as possible and shall have attached thereto the name of the person introducing it; when such resolution is referred to a Committee, such Committee shall report their findings with their names endorsed thereon. When a resolution is entered in the publication of official proceedings, such resolution shall bear only the name of the Committee, not names of individual members or date. The membership of each committee shall be published in the County Board proceedings for the session in which the appointments were made.

Approved as read. MUST REDUCE TO WRITING.

> **RULE NO. 10:** Every motion or amendment shall be reduced to writing when a request therefor shall be made by any member; and all petitions, memorials and substitutes shall be reduced to writing and read before they shall be considered by the Board.

Approved as read. **RIGHT TO VOTE.**

RULE NO. 11: The Chairman shall be entitled to vote on all questions taken by ayes, nays and abstain, and his name shall be called last; when the vote on any question is tie, it shall be deemed to have been lost, but any member voting on either side of the question may present the same question again at such time as provided in Rule 22.

Approved as read. FORM OF RESOLUTION.

RULE NO. 12: All reports, resolutions and petitions must be presented to the County Clerk in type-written form and be read and preserved by the Clerk.

Approved as read. BUDGET RESOLUTIONS.

RULE NO. 13: All resolutions calling for an appropriation of money, and all resolutions, the adoption of which will require an ultimate expenditure of money or an appropriation by the County Board, shall be presented to the County Clerk of Winnebago County, ex officio member of the Finance Committee, ten days before the Annual Meeting and no bill or resolution calling for an appropriation of money shall be received by the Board without the majority consent of the Board after that time.

Motion made by Supervisor Kampo and seconded to adopt the rule. Supervisor Loy requested the following change: "Ten days before the Annual Meeting and no bill or resolution calling for an appropriation of money shall be received by the Board without the consent of the absolute majority of the Board after that time." CARRIED.

FINANCE AND COORDINATING RESOLUTIONS.

RULE NO. 14: Requests from County Board Committees or members which require action of Coordinating or Finance Committee shall be submitted to the County Clerk's office to be assigned to the aforementioned Committee without prior reading to the County Board. A report to reject or adopt must be brought back to the County Board.

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Approved as read. **PRIVILEGE OF SPEAKING.**

RULE NO. 15: Every member previous to speaking, shall rise and address the chair, and be recognized by the chair.

When two or more members rise at once, the chair shall designate the member who is to speak first.

No member shall speak more than twice upon the same question without leave; and when called to order by the Chairman, shall take his seat and shall not be allowed to proceed without leave of the Board.

Approved as read. VOTING AND ROLL CALL.

RULE NO. 16: A vote on any question shall be taken by ayes and nays, but members may vote to abstain when polled. A roll call shall be taken on all questions involving the expenditure of money; and whenever a vote is so ordered and taken, members voting the affirmative, negative, and those who abstain, as well as those absent, shall be recorded at length in the records of the proceedings of the County Board.

A unanimous oral vote shall be considered

Approved as read. ACCOUNTS

RULE NO. 17: No account or claim against the County shall



be audited unless it be made out in items and is duly verified and filed with the Clerk of the Board, except as otherwise provided by law.

* * * *

Approved as read. PRECEDENCE OF MOTION.

RULE NO. 18: When a motion is under consideration, no other motion shall be entertained except:

1. To adjourn.

2. To lay on the table.

3. For the previous question.

4. To postpone to a day certain.

5. To commit to a committee.

6. To amend or to substitute.

7. To postpone indefinitely.

These several motions shall take precedence in the order in which they stand in this rule.

* * * *

Approved as read. NON-DEBATABLE MOTIONS.

RULE NO. 19: A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, and for the previous question shall be decided without debate, except as hereinafter provided. It shall not, however, be in order to move to table a motion or resolution, until after the author of the motion or resolution has been given an opportunity to speak on his motion or resolution.

Approved as read. MOTION OR POSTPONE.

RULE NO. 20: A motion to postpone indefinitely or to a day certain or to commit shall not again be entertained on the same day or in the same stage of the proposition.

Approved as read. SUBSTITUTE PROPOSAL.

RULE NO. 21: A substitute shall be open to amendment the same as the original proposition, but when adopted, shall not be subject to amendment. If an amendment or substitute is lost, another substantially the same shall not be entertained.

Approved as read. **RECONSIDERATION.**

RULE NO. 22: When a motion or question has once been determined, any member voting with the majority may move a reconsideration of the vote, but such motion shall be made and

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acted on at the same or next succeeding meeting, and shall not thereafter be made except by unanimous consent.

Approved as read. **PREVIOUS QUESTION. BULE NO. 23:** The provide

RULE NO. 23: The previous question may be moved by any member, and the Chairman shall then say: "It requiring five members to second this motion, those in favor of sustaining the motion will rise." If five or more members then rise, the previous question shall thereby be seconded and an opportunity then be given to any two members opposed thereto to briefly state their objections. The question shall then be: "Shall the question be now put," which, if carried by a vote of two-thirds of the members present upon a call of ayes and nays, the Board shall immediately proceed to vote upon the pending amendment, if any, and upon the main question.

Approved as read.

SUSPENSION OF RULES.

RULE NO. 24: Any of these rules, except Rule No. 16 and No. 22, may be suspended by two-thirds vote of the members present. A motion to suspend appropriate rules shall be in order.

* * * *

Approved as read. **ROBERTS RULES.**

> **RULE NO. 25:** The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in "Roberts Rules of Order", so far as they remain in common use and are practicable and applicable and not inconsistent herewith, shall govern the Board.

Approved as read. COMMITTEE OF A WHOLE.

> **RULE NO. 26:** Whenever the Board shall have been in committee of the whole and is again seated in regular session, the Board shall at once take up and act upon the report of the committee of the whole and before the transaction of any other business.

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Approved as read. EQUIPMENT AND FURNITURE.

RULE NO. 27: The purchase, transfer or sale of office equipment and furniture used in all County owned or leased buildings shall be the re-



sponsibility of the Buildings and Grounds Committee. At budget time a written request from the department head, with endorsement by committee of jurisdiction, must be submitted to the County Auditor setting forth the description of each item of office equipment or furniture needed. A resolution will be prepared and submitted by the Building and Grounds Committee based on the County Auditor's tabulation of such requests and shall constitute the office equipment and furniture outlay fund.

Approved as read. INSPECTION BY COUNTY BOARD.

RULE NO. 28: The members of the County Board as a whole, shall make an annual inspection of county-owned properties and facilities on a day designated by the Chairman at the meeting preceding the annual meeting. Amended to read as follows:

The members of the County Board as a whole, shall make an annual inspection of county-owned properties and facilities on a day and hour designated by the Chairman at the meeting preceding the annual meeting. CARRIED.

PUBLICATION OF REPORTS.

RULE NO. 29: Reports presented to the County Board shall be mentioned in the Board proceedings for reference purposes but not published in the official proceedings unless specifically directed by the County Board.

Approved as read. WRITTEN AGENDA.

RULE NO. 30: The County Clerk is hereby authorized and instructed to prepare a written agenda before each meeting and mail said agenda, at least four days prior to such meeting to each supervisor and the press. All members and Committees of the County Board, or others, shall cooperate with the County Clerk by having reports, resolutions or other matters to be placed on the agenda, or an explanatory notice thereof, in the office of the County Clerk at least seven days prior to such meeting.

> Any matters not appearing in the agenda shall be out of order and shall not be considered by the Board unless by consent of two-thirds vote of the members present. To add the following paragraph:

The County Board should be given 60 days advance notice by the County Clerk of any vacancy to occur on the Board of Trustees of the County Hospital; on the lay members of the Board of Directors of the Winnebago County Guidance Center. CAR-RIED.

ANNUAL MEETING.

RULE NO. 31: The Annual Meeting of the Winnebago County Board shall commence on the fourth Tuesday in October.

Changed to:

The Annual Meeting of the Winnebago County Board shall commence on the last Monday in October. Carried.

NOTICES OF COMMITTEE MEETINGS.

RULE NO. 32: A bulletin board in the lobby of the Courthouse shall display a list of all Committees of the County Board and the time and place of all Committee meetings shall be shown thereon. This shall be the duty of the County Clerk. The Trustees of the several institutions under the jurisdiction of the County Board are encouraged to use the same bulletin board for giving notice of their meetings.

> Public notice of such meetings shall be given as soon as the members of the Committee are notified of such meeting and not less than twenty-four hours before the Committee meeting, except as hereinafter provided.

> Any Committee meeting announcement made at a Board meeting shall satisfy the minimum notice requirements. In emergencies, when a Committee meeting must be held with less than twenty-four hours notice, then, when notice of such meeting is given to Committee members, the County Clerk shall also give the press and radio the same or similar notice, such emergency meetings to be called only as special meetings with notice of each emergency item to be considered.

> Any adjournment of a committee to a day and time certain shall be noticed in the same manner as a regular committee meeting, including the provisions for an emergency meeting.

> All Committee meetings shall be held in the Courthouse or on public property.

Minutes of Committee meetings, except as to Executive Sessions, should be filed with

the County Clerk within seven days of the holding of such meetings.

No committee meetings shall be held during any sitting of the Board unless authorized by a majority vote of members present.

The following changes were made:

A bulletin board in the lobby of the Courthouse shall display a list of all Committees of the County Board and the Board of Trustees and the time and place of Committee and Trustees meetings shall be shown thereon.

Minutes of Committee and Trustee meetings shall be filed with the County Clerk within seven days of the holding of such meeting, CARRIED.

ADOPTION AND AMENDMENT OF RULES.

RULE NO. 33: All resolutions and reports to be acted upon by the County Board which have been submitted to the County Board members at least twenty-four hours prior to the County Board meeting at which such resolution or report is to be considered may be referred to by title and number and need not be read unless requested by a supervisor.

Approved as read.

RULE NO. 34: Any part-time professional person attending any committee, directors, trustees or County Board meeting shall be compensated for attendance at no more than the same per diem basis as a county board supervisor for attendance at such meeting.

Approved as read.

RULE NO. 35: Rules of the County Board shall be adopted at the Organization Meeting of the Board by a majority vote of those present and shall only be amended during the year by a three-fourths vote of those present at a meeting, and such rule shall govern the Board until altered or repealed. All prior rules inconsistent herewith are, to the extent of such inconsistency, repealed.

Approved as read. QUORUM AND VOTE REQUIRED ON BUDGET TRANSFERS.

Sec. 59.02(3) gives the general rule requiring a majority of supervisors to be present in order to have a quorum for the transaction of business. Under the same Statute,

all questions before the Board are determined by a majority of the supervisors present unless otherwise provided.

Sec. 65.90(5) has some additional requirements for changes in the budget after it has once been adopted. Changes in the amounts appropriated and changes in the purposes for which amounts are apporpriated may not be made after adoption of the budget except by a two-thirds vote of the membership of the Board. There is an exception, however, within this Statute, towit: the County Board may authorize its standing Finance Committee to transfer funds between items within a department or office if these items are separately appropriated, and may further authorize the Finance Committee to supplement appropriations for a particular office, department or activity by a transfer from the contingency fund. * *

ROLL CALL VOTES.

On roll call votes you are recorded absent unless excused.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded to adopt the Rules of the County Board as amended. CARRIED by Voice Vote.

GENERAL DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Insofar as possible and feasible, all committee meetings are to be held in the Courthouse Building, or other County property, and are open to the public, with certain exceptions. Accurate minutes are to be kept of all proceedings, indicating as a matter of record all discussions made in Committees. All such minutes are to be kept in a suitable office in the Courthouse, accessible to the County Clerk. All committees are responsible to the County Board and are to make periodic reports to the Board. The County Board may assign additional responsibilities to committees from time to time.

All elected, appointed and special County Committees and all elected and appointed Boards of Directors, Boards of Trustees, under whose jurisdiction employee units operate, shall have the responsibility for the direction of the work force in their areas, as well as the specific responsibility for establishing duties and responsibilities for such employees. All actions taken in the performance of directing the work force shall be in compliance with the policies and procedures established by the Labor Relations Committee and approved by the County Board of Supervisors.

AGRICULTURE, EDUCATION AND ZONING COMMITTEE

The Agriculture, Education and Zoning Committee shall consist of five members with combined responsibilities in the following areas:



- 1. Agriculture and extension education as outlined in Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.87.
- 2. Zoning and Board of Adjustment as outlined in Wis. Stats., Sec. 59.97 and Sec. 59.99.
- 2. Trustees of University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, Fox Valley Campus.
- 4. County Library.
- 5. Winnebago County Fairgrounds.
- 6. Supervision of Winnebago County Soil Conservation District.
- 7. Solid waste disposal, metropolitan sewage disposal and matters relating thereto.

It shall be responsible for county extension service programs, the employment of professional extension service personnel, public policy, determination of basic problems and periodic evaluation of extension service in Winnebago County. This Committee shall function in cooperation with the District Extension Leader, University of Wisconsin, in matters of program planning, public policy and contracting for services of extension agents.

It is to supervise the Winnebago County Fairgrounds, audit and examine all expenditures made by the Winnebago County Fair Association as relates to the operation of the Winnebago County Fairgrounds and especially such appropriations as Winnebago County shall make from time to time for the maintenance and improvement of the Winnebago County Fairgrounds. It shall be the duty of this Committee to advise and meet with the Winnebago County Fair Association in matters pertaining to the Winnebago County Fairgrounds.

It shall meet regularly to discuss, consider and evaluate soil and water conservation practices established under the technical aid of the Winnebago County Soil Conservationist.

Three members of this Committee shall function as the Winnebago County Zoning Committee and Winnebago County Board of Adjustment, and their responsibilities shall include the consideration of all matters pertaining to County zoning and the powers and duties relating to Zoning and the Board of Adjustment are to be performed according to the requirements of Wisconsin Statutes.

The Zoning Committee and Board of Adjustment shall keep separate minutes of proceedings under its jurisdiction, which minutes shall indicate whether such proceedings are that of the County Zoning Committee or of the Board of Adjustment. Nothing contained herein shall be construed to prevent the Zoning Committee and Board of Adjustment from holding successive meetings on the same day. Committee minutes shall also show the vote of each member upon each question, or if absent or failing to vote, indicating such fact. Records of examinations made or conducted by the Zoning Committee and the Board of Adjustment, as well as any other official action, shall be filed in the Winnebago County Courthouse at the earliest opportunity and shall be a public record.

Two members of this Committee shall function as Winnebago County Trustees for the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay, Fox

Valley Campus.

Supervisor Heaney informed the board members that it is a statutory requirement to have one citizen member on the Zoning Committee. Motion made by Supervisor Kampo and seconded to amend the duties of Agriculture, Education and Zoning Committee that two county board members and one citizen member be on the Zoning Committee. Supervisor Kampo requested a roll call vote. Ayes 11 – Christenson, Daggett, Greiner, Heaney, Hunter, Kampo, Loehning, J.C. Pawlowski, Priem, Shurbert and King. Nayes 33. Abstain 1 – Arne. Absent 1 – Seefeld. Motion LOST. Approved as read.

AVIATION COMMITTEE

This Committee shall consist of five members who shall have responsibility for the supervision, maintenance, operation and development of Wittman Field, the Winnebago County owned airport, and all other aviation matters of appropriate concern to Winnebago County.

Approved as read.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS COMMITTEE

The Buildings and Grounds Committee shall consist of five members who shall be responsible for the care and upkeep of the Winnebago County Courthouse building and grounds, including the County Jail, Department of Social Services and provisions for the Winnebago County Courthouse parking lot. It shall be responsible for the upkeep and repair of equipment, furniture and fixtures used in the Courthouse or in any of the aforementioned locations on the Courthouse property.

It shall be responsible for the maintenance, operation and development of all Winnebago County Parks. It shall give due consideration to wild life conservation in Winnebago County and make appropriate recommendations to the County Board on such matters. It shall recommend to the County Board from time to time for its action the necessary rules and regulations for all Winnebago County owned recreational areas.

It shall be the committee of jurisdiction for the purchase, sale, lease or rental of all real properties by any department of Winnebago County government except the purchase, sale or lease of real properties by the Highway Department pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes.

It shall also be responsible for the purchase, transfer or sale of office equipment and furniture used in all County owned or leased buildings as indicated in Rule 28 of the Rules of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

The duties of this Committee shall include the expenditure of County funds to obtain surveys, options and appraisals relating to property under consideration for purchase, sale or lease by said Committee. It shall be designated as the Special Building Committee on all construction projects authorized by the County Board.

It shall develop policies relating to the acquisition of property by Winnebago County and report such recommendations to the County Board from time to time. It shall advise with the various



departments of Winnebago County government concerning present and future plans for property acquisition and shall report to the County Board from time to time, and at least annually at the annual session of the County Board, such present and future property needs.

Change Rule No. 28 to Rule No. 27, otherwise approved as read.

COORDINATING COMMITTEE

The Coordinating Committee shall consist of ten members who shall be selected as follows: the Chairman of the County Board and one representative to be selected by each of the nine standing committees and to be designated as that Committee's representative to the Coordinating Committee. The Chairman of the committee shall be the Chairman of the County Board.

It shall receive all requests and communications not specifically addressed to any committee or official of the County and refer such matters to the appropriate committees or officials, and, where applicable, include its recommendations with such referral. The Committee shall receive copies of all minutes of other committees and boards and review the implementation of the decisions of such committees and boards. The Committee shall apprise the County Board of all legislative matters affecting County government, supervise codification of County Board ordinances and resolutions, and shall make recommendations as to County planning.

It shall report to the County Board all action taken by the Committee since its previous report, including a reference to the vote of the Committee on such action. The Committee shall prepare the Agenda for County Board meetings.

Except where provided otherwise by the County Board, it shall function as the Committee on Committees. It shall recommend membership on any special committee, commission or board created by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. In the event of a vacancy on any committee other than the Highway Committee and the Coordinating Committee, this Committee shall make a recommendation to the County Board for filling such vacancy.

It shall recommend rules of the County Board. Such rules must be submitted at the organization meeting of the County Board and changes in rules may be submitted at other times of the year subject to Rule 36 of the Rules of the County Board.

It shall prepare rules for its own operation which shall be presented to the County Board for its approval; any amendments thereto, shall be subject to County Board approval.

It shall be responsible for the recommendation and implementation of an effective program of emergency government consistent with the State of Wisconsin plans of emergency government and more particularly as outlined in Wis. Stats., Sec. 22.16. The Chairman of this Committee shall function as the head of emergency government services in Winnebago County.

Change Rule No. 36 to Rule No. 35. In last paragraph, "The

Chairman of the County Board (instead of Committee) shall function as the head of emergency government services in Winnebago County.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Finance Committee shall consist of five County Board members and shall be the committee of jurisdiction for the County Clerk, County Treasurer and County Auditor.

It shall develop the procedure for the preparation of an annual County budget and notify department heads, committees, and other officials, of the procedures to be followed in the development of the necessary financial data for their segment of the said budget. It shall review the budgets as submitted with the department heads, committees and officials and shall make such adjustments in the proposed budgets as it deems appropriate.

It shall prepare and recommend a budget to be submitted to the annual session of the County Board for its consideration, revision and adoption and it shall publish its recommended budget in accordance with requirements of Wisconsin Statutes and shall include appropriate notations to show any changes in said published budget from the budget proposal initially prepared by the various departments for examination by the Finance Committee.

After adoption, it shall have authority to make budgetary alterations as permitted by Wis. Stats., Sec. 65.90(5) (b) where such alterations are either of the following:

- A transfer of funds between budgeted items of an individual County Department if such budgeted items have been separately appropriated; and
- 2. Supplementation of appropriations for a particular office or department by transfer from the Contingency Fund.

The limitation on the dollar amount of such budgetary alteration shall be the amount set aside in the Contingency Fund or the sum of \$3000.00, whichever is the lesser sum. In addition, the Finance Committee may refuse to grant any budgetary alteration in whole or in part or may grant any such request conditionally on such conditions as it deems appropriate. It shall notify the County Board each month of any such budgetary alterations it has authorized.

Except where Wisconsin Statutes provide for settlement and allowance of current accounts by other specific committees or officials, it shall be the duty of the Finance Committee to examine accounts monthly, and, in its discretion, settle and allow all current accounts against the County, not in excess of \$3000.00 on any one such account and, when allowed, to authorize the issuance of County orders therefor.

It shall be empowered to authorize expenditures not to exceed \$1000.00 for any one item in an emergency request between County Board sessions.

It shall also audit and allow mileage and per diem for County Board and committee meetings and audit, adjust and allow or disallow all dog claims and assessors' claims.

It shall advise with the County Treasurer in the matter of in-

vestment of County funds. It shall advise with County Board Committees, Trustees, Agencies and the County Treasurer from time to time regarding County finances.

It shall have the duty and power of equalizing the value of all taxable properties in Winnebago County in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes. It shall have the duty to examine all claims filed against the County for illegal taxes of any kind and shall make a report and recommend to the County Board on all matters pertaining to illegal taxes.

It shall manage and attend to the sale of all properties taken by Winnebago County on tax deeds.

It shall negotiate for the insurance of Winnebago County in accordance with the statutes and resolutions adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. It shall be the duty of this Committee to establish insurance coverage requirements for all lessees and sub-lessees of property in which Winnebago County has an insurable interest. It shall make an annual report to the County Board of all such insurance carried by Winnebago County.

Motion made by Supervisor Kampo and seconded that the Finance Committee be denied the authority to transfer funds from the Contingency Fund without coming to the board for approval. LOST by Voice Vote. Supervisor Pitz requested roll call vote. Ayes 11 – Apell, Brandt, Christenson, Daggett, Greiner, Hunter, Johnson, Kampo, Pitz, Schott and Sitter. Abstain 1 – Neely. Nayes 34. Motion LOST.

HIGHWAY COMMITTEE

The Highway Committee shall consist of five members who shall be elected by the County Board at the organization meeting in accordance with Wis. Stats., Sec. 83.015.

It shall have those duties as are set out in Wisconsin Statutes, including but not limited to the following:

- 1. Purchase and sale of County road machinery as authorized by the County Board.
- 2. Determine whether each piece of County aid construction shall be let by contract or otherwise.
- 3. Enter into contracts in the name of Winnebago County relating to the construction and maintenance of highways.
- 4. Enter private lands with their employees to remove woods and brush and to erect or remove fences to keep highways open for travel.
- 5. Direct the expenditure of highway maintenance funds received from the State or provided by County taxes.
- 6. Audit all payrolls, material claims and vouchers resulting from the construction and maintenance of highways.

Approved as read.

INSTITUTIONS COMMITTEE

The Institutions Committee shall consist of nine members, not more than five of whom shall be County Board Supervisors. All the members of this Committee shall be persons of recognized ability and demonstrated interest in the problems of community mental health.

It is the intention of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that there shall be one nine-member committee which shall be called the Institutions Committee and which Committee shall function as a nine member Board of Directors of the Winnebago County Guidance Center and further intending that three of the non-County Board members of said Committee shall be designated as the Board of Trustees of the Winnebago County Hospital and Pleasant Acres Home. Appointments to this Committee, as well as the duties and responsibilities of committee members, shall be in accordance with Wis. Stats., Sec. 51.36(6). The three members of this Committee designated as the Board of Trustees of the County Hospital and Home shall have those additional duties and responsibilities as are indicated in Wis. Stats., Sec. 46.18.

This Committee shall make an annual inspection of the County Hospital, Pleasant Acres Home and the Guidance Center and make a report at the annual session of the County Board.

It shall have the duty of examining, auditing, allowing or disallowing, all claims in relation to the Winnebago County Guidance Center. It shall examine, audit and recommend for allowance or disallowance all claims from other municipalities for commitment and care pertaining to the County Hospital and Home.

Approved as read.

JUDICIARY AND PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

The Judiciary and Public Safety Committee shall consist of five members.

It shall be the committee of jurisdiction for the Circuit Courts, County Courts, Sheriff's Department, District Attorney, Coroner, Corporation Counsel, Family Court Commissioner, Veterans'Service Officer, Register of Deeds and County Law Library.

It shall assist in the preparation of the budgets for the foregoing department and shall examine, audit and recommend for approval or disapproval all claims pertaining to such departments.

It shall have the duty of arranging for the appropriate publication and printing of the proceedings of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

It shall advise with the Sheriff on matters relating to law enforcement in Winnebago County and handle all matters pertaining to public safety, including provisions for ambulance service and rescue work on waters bordering on or within Winnebago County.





LABOR RELATIONS COMMITTEE

The Labor Relations Committee shall consist of five County Board members.

The duties of this Committee shall include the receipt of all personnel requests from all Committees or Departments for study and recommendation. It shall negotiate on behalf of Winnebago County with authorized representatives of County employees, and meet from time to time with County employees, or their representatives, with respect to grievances, salaries, classification or reclassification, and other benefits.

It shall recommend to the County Board a salary schedule for elected officers and officials of Winnebago County, in accordance with the requirements of Wisconsin Statutes, and a salary schedule for all appointed officials and other employees of Winnebago County, unless otherwise determined by agreement or Statute.

No member of this Committee shall be a member of any other committee except the Coordinating Committee.

Approved as read.

SOCIAL SERVICES BOARD

The Social Services Board shall consist of five members and it shall have the duty of examining, auditing and recommending to the Finance Committee for allowance or disallowance, all claims which have been filed by municipalities against the County for various types of poor relief and such other duties as are contained in Wis. Stats., Sec. 46.22.

It shall supervise the activities of the Department of Social Services and confer with the Director thereof on matters presented to his office.

It shall audit and recommend for allowance or disallowance all medical, dental and hospital bills as well as all other bills coming to the Department.

The Social Services Board shall also function as the County Health Committee and is responsible for those duties relating to the County Public Health Nurses and the County Health Department as are contained in Wis. Stats., Sec. 141.06

When the Board is functioning as the County Health Committee, then, a representative of the State Health Department as appointed by the State Health Officer shall participate in decisions and matters pertaining to this subject. The duties of the Board of Social Services as relates to health shall be to conduct a generalized public health nursing program in cooperation with the State Board of Health.

Approved as read.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that all special committees be abolished and all committees to turn over reports, minutes, etc to the new committees handling the duties now. CARRIED by Voice Vote.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded that the duties of the Committees be adopted as amended. Carried by Voice Vote.



ELECTION OF HIGHWAY COMMITTEE

The next order of business was the election of members to the Highway Committee.

Supervisor Fara nominated John C. Pawlowski. Supervisor Kampo nominated James P. Coughlin. Supervisor Ales nominated Clarence E. Loehning. Supervisor Putzer nominated Donald Arne. Supervisor Pitz nominated Robert C. Johnson. Supervisor Daggett nominated Floyd E. Shurbert.

Supervisor Ilk nominated Earl M. Holverson.

Supervisor Schott nominated George Singstock.

Motion made by Supervisor Neely and seconded that nominations be closed. CARRIED by Voice Vote.

The Chair announced that the five candidates receiving the highest number of votes would be elected to the Highway Committee.

ORDINANCE: RELATING TO ABANDONED VEHICLES

The following Ordinance No. 1 was presented: The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. AUTHORITY

Wis. Stats., Sec. 342.40 enables counties to enact ordinances governing the removal and disposal of abandoned vehicles and provide a forfeiture in addition to providing for the recovery by the county of the cost of impounding and disposing of the vehicle.

SECTION 2. JURISDICTION

The jurisdiction of this Ordinance shall apply in the unincorporated areas of Winnebago County.

SECTION 3. VEHICLE ABANDONMENT PROHIBITED

No person shall leave unattended any motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer or mobile home on any public street or highway or public or private property in the unincorporated areas of Winnebago County, for such time and under such circumstances as to cause the vehicle to reasonably appear to have been abandoned. When any such vehicle has been left unattended on any road or highway or on any public or private property within the said area without the permission of the owner for more than seventy-two (72) hours, the vehicle is deemed abandoned and constitutes a public nuisance.



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SECTION 4. REMOVAL AND IMPOUNDMENT OF ABAN DONED VEHICLES

Any vehicle in violation of this Ordinance shall be impounded until lawfully claimed or disposed of under Section 5, except that if the Sheriff of Winnebago County, or his duly authorized representative, determines that the cost of towing and storage charges for the impoundment would exceed the value of the vehicle, the vehicle may be junked by Winnebago County prior to expiration of the impoundment period upon determination by the Sheriff, or his duly authorized representative, that the vehicle is not wanted for evidence or other reason.

SECTION 5. DISPOSAL OF ABANDONED VEHICLES

(A) 1. If the Sheriff, or his duly authorized representative, determines that the value of the abandoned vehicle exceeds \$100.00, he shall notify the owner and lienholders of record by certified mail that the vehicle has been deemed abandoned and impounded by Winnebago County and may be reclaimed within fifteen (15) days upon payment of accrued towing, storage and notice charges, and if not so reclaimed, shall be sold.

2. In the event an abandoned vehicle determined to exceed \$100.00 in value is not reclaimed within the period and under the conditions as provided above, it may be sold at private sale, by auction, or by sealed bids. The description of the vehicle and the terms of sale shall be published as a class I notice and posted not less than five (5) days before the sale.

3. After deducting the expense of impoundment and sale, the balance of the proceeds, if any, shall be paid into the County Treasury.

(B) Any abandoned vehicle which is determined by the Sheriff, or his duly authorized representative, to have a value of less than \$100.00 may be disposed of by direct sale to a licensed salvage dealer upon determination that the vehicle is not reported stolen.

SECTION 6. OWNER RESPONSIBLE FOR IMPOUND-MENT AND SALE COSTS

The owner of any abandoned vehicle, except a stolen vehicle, is responsible for the abandonment and all costs of impounding and disposing of the vehicle. Costs not recovered for the sale of the vehicle may be recovered in a civil action by Winnebago County against the owner.

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SECTION 7. NOTICE OF SALE OR DISPOSITION

Within five (5) days after the sale or disposal of a vehicle as provided in Sections 5 (A) or 5 (B), the Sheriff, or his duly authorized representative, shall advise the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Division of Motor Vehicles, of such sale or disposition on a form supplied by the Division. A copy of such form shall also be given to the Purchaser of the vehicle. A copy shall also be retained on file in the Winnebago County Sheriff's Department.

SECTION 8. PENALTY

Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than \$10.00 or more than \$200.00, together with taxable costs, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, shall be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid, but not to exceed thirty (30) days.

SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

SOCIAL SERVICES BOARD

Chairman Putzer reported that the Multiphasic Screening Program is winding up in industry in the Neenah-Menasha area and will open in centers in the rural areas, on June 5th. The department is moving rapidly in separating financial aid programs from social services program and should near completion about July 1, 1972. The State and Federal Governments are requiring completion of separation by January 1, 1973, so we should be well ahead at the county level.

LABOR RELATIONS COMMITTEE

Chairman Farrell reported on negotiations with the Department of Social Services. The results of the meeting have gone to fact finding session.

JUDICIARY

Chairman Pitz reported on the meeting with the Sheriff's department as to the patrolling of Belle Park in the City of Neenah, which is being done by Winnebago County. The chairman has requested the Buildings, Grounds and Parks committee to consider the undertaking of maintenance work for the sheriff's department along with the courthouse. A set of qualifications for wrecker services is being completed. Rules for the sheriff department will be available in the clerk's office and also in the sheriff's department. No copy will be submitted to the supervisors. The committee also discussed support arrearages with the Assistant Corporation Counsel.

BUILDING, GROUNDS & PARKS

Chairman Becher reported on the tour of the parks, on April 29th. A tour of the Guidance Center Clinic on May 11th. An inspection was made of the Social Services Building, Courthouse Annex and the Courthouse. The conclusion of the committees' inspection was a shortage of space throughout their tour.

HIGHWAY COMMITTEE

DESIGNATING ADVOCAP, INC. AS THE COMMUNITY ACTION PROGRAM TO SERVE WINNEBAGO COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States has enacted the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 to enable communities to mobilize human and financial resources to combat poverty; and

WHEREAS, Title II of the Economic Opportunity Act provides for the establishment and funding of community action agencies and programs "to stimulate a better focusing of all available local, State, private, and Federal resources upon the goal of enabling low-income families, and low-income individuals of all ages, in rural and urban areas, to attain the skills, knowledge and motivations and secure the opportunities needed for them to become self-sufficient"; and

WHEREAS, Section 210 of the Economic Opportunity Act, as amended, gives local governing officials the authority to select and designate the Community Action Agency which will serve a given community; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Economic Opportunity will consider new geographic service areas only if they occur as expansion of currently operating Community Action Agencies; and

WHEREAS, Advocap, Inc., the Community Action Agency serving Fond du Lac County since 1965, has presented the opportunity for Community Action Programs to be jointly implemented on a two-county basis; and

WHEREAS, before a political subdivision makes a designation, the governing officials are required to conduct a public hearing in the community at which interested persons and organizations are given a reasonable opportunity to express publicly their views on the question and to submit written comments; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing as required by law was held on April 26, 1972, at which citizens have recommended that this action be taken.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that Advocap, Inc., a non-profit corporation, organized and existing under the laws of the State of Wisconsin be designated as the Official Community Action Agency serving the citizens of Winnebago County through Community Action Programs, pursuant to the Federal Economic Opportunity Act.

AGRICULTURE, EDUCATION & ZONING COMMITTEE

Chairman Daggett reported on the activities of the Agriculture Committee meeting held recently in which the staff members outlined their various projects. The committee also discussed the funds retained by the Winnebago Fair Association. Chairman Daggett reported on the conference at Stevens Point.

HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICE

Chairman Putzer reported on a meeting with Dr. Shinners regarding the statutes concerning the operation of the Homes for the Aged; proposed legislation designed to make possible the creation of a County Health Department. Such a department would take over the duties of most of the local Health Departments. The committee also discussed property which is being considered for a foster home for teenage girls. The committee is considering service for alcoholism, and investigating state teletype service.

LABOR RELATIONS

Chairman Farrell reported on a joint meeting with the Institutions Union. Received proposals from the Institutions and Highway Employees. The Social Service requests have gone to Fact Finding. At present there seems to be no problems. Questioned by Supervisor Loy on the progress of hiring a Personnel Director, the Chairman reported that they have received applications but none seemed qualified for the position.

BUILDINGS, GROUNDS — PARKS

Chairman Becher reported that the Community Park was opened on June 10, but due to the weather conditions activity is slow. A dedication service will be held on Friday, June 23rd at Boom bay. Shelving has been installed in the Social Service Building and also the committee is experimenting with wall covering for better accoustics. According to information received there are over 5000 snowmobiles registered.

PUBLIC HEARING-RE: ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY FOR RECREATIONAL PURPOSES

Motion made by Supervisor Becher and seconded that board go into a committee of a whole for the purpose of a hearing on the investigation of the possible acquisition of property from Winneconne through Omro to Rush Lake. Upon rising the board was ready to act as a committee.

Mr. Thomas Williams, attorney, appeared as a citizen favoring the railroad's abandonment and acquisition of the property. Mr. Williams also discussed the legality of the easements.

Mr. Jerry Reickhoff, from the Department of Natural Resources, showed slides of the area involved. He told the board members that the project would be a cost sharing project with the state's participation.

Mrs. Lillian Jero, a citizen, who is co-ordinator for the snowmobilers favored the acquisition claiming that the economy of the County would benefit from the users.

Kent Kruse, from the City of Oshkosh, who works with the Boy Scouts of Oshkosh informed the board members that the acquisition of this property would be once-in-a-life-time opportunity as there is only one other nature trail. The only other nature trail in existence is in Portage County.

Kenneth Wolff, Director of the Winnebago Conservation Club, reported that the Conservation Club members adopted a resolution that this property should be acquired, as it could be made available for a variety of uses.

Mr. Williams told the board members that at the present time, the only requirement of Winnebago County would be a letter to the railroad informing them that the county is interested in the acquisition.

IN OPPOSITION OF ACQUISITION

Mr. John A. Moore, attorney, representing David A. Wesner, a property owner, told the board members that he has a petition signed by interested property owners opposing the abandonment of the railroad. In his opinion, to petition the railroad would be premature, because of abandonment the property would revert back to the original owners.

Mr. Minor Harris, Town Chairman of Nepeuskun, opposed the petition on the grounds that it would cost the county more money in policing the area and if the railroad did abandon the right of way it would revert back to the owners of the property.

Mr. David Wesner, Rt. 2, Omro, told the board members that if the snowmobilers would seek permission from the farmers they would be allowed to use their farms for this purpose but the majority of the people do not ask permission. He told of problems that he had encountered with bow hunters. In their abstract, the railroad must keep up the condition of the fences and when requested to do so the property owners were informed that the railroad would like to abandon the property and it would revert back to the property owner.

Supervisor Daggett informed the board that in his opinion no request for a petition has been filed and he thought that this hearing premature. He requested that the board does not express an opinion on the matter at this time.

Kenneth Krings, Chairman of the Town of Winneconne, voiced his disapproval of the acquisition.

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Motion made by Supervisor J. C. Pawlowski that the board go into regular session to discuss routine matters. Upon rising the board was ready for regular board session.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

JUDICIARY & PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

Chairman Pitz reported on two meetings held by his committee. One meeting was routine business. The Town of Oshkosh will be connected with the Sheriff's department telephone service for fire protection. Transfer of funds was necessary because of the abandoned vehicle law. A petition signed by approximately 400 signees requesting the County Board to give consideration to additional ambulance service was presented. A meeting will be held on June 27th to attempt to solve this problem before a new contract is signed. The committee also met on reapportionment of the assembly districts. Involved are supervisory districts 42, 43, 44 and 45. The committee's decision is that it would be impossible to change the assembly districts at this time. Bids were received for gasoline for the sheriff's department, but due to the request of premium gasoline instead of regular, they were tabled and new bids will be asked for.

INSTITUTIONS & GUIDANCE BOARD

Chairman Gischia reported his committee heard reports from the sub-committees on attendance at Madison, Wisconsin,



regarding pending legislation which would affect the Institutions. Discussed also was the possible increase in fees. The Chairman informed the board that their long range plans would be incorporated in the 1973 budget.

HIGHWAY COMMITTEE

Chairman Loehning reported that bids were opened for motor graders, but by committee action were laid over for the future. Discussed at the Summer Road School at Hudson was the financial status of the State Highway Department is in a precarious condition; studded tires and billboards. Approval was given on the appraisal of thirteen parcels of land. The State Highway Department has deleted three projects due Winnebago County to the lack of funds.

FINANCE

Chairman Neely reported on the operating cost of Winnebago County 1971 compared to 1972. He presented an overall picture of the operating expense in the various departments. Chairman Neely expressed the opinion for the need of a Personnel Director. He would like to see a job evaluation of all department heads and elected officials.

RULES OF THE COORDINATING COMMITTEE

The rules for the Coordinating Committee were presented. Motion made by Supervisor Holverson and seconded to adopt the rules. Motion made by Supervisor Arne and seconded to amend the rules as follows: eliminate 10 - D, I and the last sentence in K. The Corporation Counsel ruled that the rules of the Coordinating were interwoven with the duties of the County board and should be separated. Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded to refer back to the committee for consolidation. CARRIED by Voice Vote.

AMENDMENT TO LEASE AGREEMENT: WINNEBAGO COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS

SECTION — **GENERAL** — Adhering to the principle of representation based on population, the membership of the commission shall be created pursuant to the provisions of s. 66.945 (3) 3. (b) of the Wisconsin Statutes determined and allocated among participating counties as follows:

A. Two elected officials from each member county which comprises the commission.

B. One person, who may be an elected official from each participating county, selected by the Governor.

C. One (1) additional elected official for each 50,000 unit of population residing within a member county as determined by the last federal decennial census. No additional representation hereunder shall be granted for any fractional part of the required population unit.

SECTION 2 — **SELECTION OF MEMBERSHIP** — The commission membership as set forth in the preceding Section 1 shall consist of members to include the following:

A. The chairman of the county board of each participating county and the county executive, if any, of each participating county shall be members of said commission.

B. One member from each participating county shall be appointed by the Governor from a list of six or more persons nominated by the respective county boards, of which at least four shall be private citizens. In nominating private citizens, the county board shall give preference to those persons having experience in multi-jurisdictional efforts in one or more of the following areas: land use planning, transportation, law, finance, engineering, recreation and natural resources development, social or economic planning.

C. The remaining elected officials comprising the representation allocated to each participating county under Section 1, Paragraph A, shall be appointed by the chairman of the county board or by the county executive as the Wisconsin Statutes so provide and subject to confirmation by the county board. In those counties having additional representation as specified in Section I,. Paragraph C, the first such representative be the mayor, or council president in cities with a council-manager plan, of the largest city in the county. All additional representatives shall be either county supervisors, city mayors, aldermen or councilmen, village presidents, town board chairmen or town board supervisors residing within the respective county.

Regarding the Guidance Center, the committee is involved in re-vamping the board structure. Mrs. Gilbert Pitz acquired three new air conditioners for the center. The case load is slightly higher. Also discussed the status of hiring a medical director and also a pyschiatrist.

HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES

Chairman Putzer reported on changes in personnel. Teletype service is not in use at the present time. Chairman Putzer reported on the closing of the receiving home in Neenah. The County Health has taken over the care of TB clinics. Also discussed was the purchase of care services and the budget and expenditures of the department for the first six months of 1972.

Motion made by Supervisor Kampo and seconded that no new programs be implemented by any department unless previously presented to the county board for approval. Carried by Voice Vote.

COORDINATING COMMITTEE

As the minutes of the Coordinating Committee were mailed with the agenda no oral report was given.

LABOR RELATIONS

Chairman Farrell reported that the committee reviewed their budget and as a result of the review \$5,500 was turned back to the General Salary Fund. Also discussed was the hiring of a Personnel Director. Mr. Carl Geisler has been consulted to assist in the hiring. Otherside of this, routine business was conducted.

JUDICIARY & PUBLIC SAFETY

Chairman Pitz reported on meetings held by the committee concerning the petitions filed on Moore Ambulance service. Bids were accepted on gasoline to be furnished to the Sheriff's department for a six month period. The City of Neenah Ambulance Service were of the opinion that some arrangement should be made with the city on their services.

The Chairman appointed Supervisor Pitz as a member of the Criminal Planning Committee.

BUILDINGS, GROUNDS & PARKS

Chairman Becher reported that the sound problem at the Social Service Building has been solved by putting carpeting on the wall. Teletype service will be in use very shortly. The roof of the courthouse was checked and is in need of repairs. Specifications will be drawn up for the demolition of the Dake house. Chairman Becher reported on the use of the community park. No report has been received from the Coroner on the drowning at the Community Lake.

FINANCE

Chairman Putzer reported that some requests for attendance at conferences have been granted and some disallowed. The committee heard a report on the Boys' Group Home which is to be opened in Neenah. A group of public-spirited citizens have formed a non-profit organization to purchase the home. A recent state law requires that the state skilled care rate in a Medical Assistance nursing home shall be 95% of the base medical assistance rate. This rate is payable through categorical aid grants to the individuals affected. The new state skilled rate will be effective August 1, 1972.

INSTITUTIONS

Chiarman Gischia reported on the directive from the Department of Health & Social Services the rates at Pleasant Acres Skilled Nursing Home will be effective as of January 1, 1972; Minimum - \$17.42; Moderate \$18.42 and Maximum \$19.42. There will be three types of care implemented at the county institutions – social care (custodial) chronic elderly and patients responsibe to intensive psychiatric treatment. The committee has been invited to attend a meeting with the State in setting up the 1973 budget. The chairman has invited the auditor, corporation counsel and the chairman of the board to participate at this meeting. At the present time there are 216 residents at Pleasant Acres with a total capacity of 218 residents.

JUDICIARY & PUBLIC SAFETY

Chairman Pitz reported that the prime concern of this com-

mittee is the ambulance service question. The average bill is \$42.00. Between 70% and 80% of the bills are collectible. The committee is considering charging an administrative fee for non residents. The chairman reported on meeting with city officials.

LABOR RELATIONS

Chairman Farrell reported on a joint meeting with the Institutions Committee. The committee also met with the Finance Committee as to whether or not a consultant should be hired to discuss salaries of administrative offices. The Labor Relations Committee will also very shortly interview applicants for the position of Personnel Director.

HIGHWAY

Chairman Loehning reported on the meeting held by the Highway Committee. The Wisconsin Power & Light Company has requested that the Highway Department pay them the sum of \$19,000 for lowering gas line pipes in the highway right-of-ways on private land by easement. A meeting was held on the Little Lake Butte des Morts bridge project. No conclusion has been reached on the 1/3 distribution for the bridge. Mr. Mertens of the Wisconsin Division of Highways is to check with the state if bids can be accepted on the first three parts of the contracts by February of 1973, instead of at three different times in order to have a more accurate cost of the bridge. No conclusion has been reached regarding bicycle trails. A request has been received from the City of Menasha for aid in the construction of the River Street bridge. A tour was made of the Oshkosh Motor Truck Corporation. Supervisor Kampo read a communication he had received from a bidder of highway equipment.

ESTABLISH SALARY AND FRINGE BENEFIT PROGRAM FOR SOCIAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES FOR 1972

The following Resolution No. 2 was presented:

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the following salary and fringe benefit program is hereby established for the year 1972 or as otherwise provided for the Winnebago County Department of Social Services employees in the professional and clerical units:

1. HOLIDAYS:

Full Days: New Year's Day Memorial Day Independence Day Labor Day Thanksgiving Day Christmas Day

Half Days: Good Friday Christmas Eve New Year's Eve

2. VACATION SCHEDULE:

Employee hired prior to September 15, 1972:

- 2 weeks time off with pay after 1 year of continuous service;
- 3 weeks time off with pay after 5 years of continuous service; and
- 4 weeks time off with pay after 10 years of continuous service.

Employee hired on or after September 15, 1972:

- 1 week time off with pay after 1 year of continuous service;
- 2 weeks time off with pay after 3 years of continuous service;
- 3 weeks time off with pay after 8 years of continuous service; and
- 4 weeks time off with pay after 15 years of continuous service.

3. SICK LEAVE:

One day per month of completed service with a maximum accumulation of ninety (90) days.

4. FUNERAL LEAVE:

Maximum of three (3) days to attend the funeral of a member of immediate family.

5. HEALTH INSURANCE:

County to pay cost of single plan coverage as its share of that premium payable by employees electing to participate



in County Hospitalization Insurance plan.

6. LIFE INSURANCE:

County to participate in cost of life insurance as provided by Wisconsin Statutes.

7. HOURS OF WORK:

8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. during time of year when County is under Central Time.

8:00 A.M. to 4:30 P.M. during time of year when County is under Central Daylight Savings Time.

8. PAY-STEP PLAN:

The County is recommending a pay-step plan which provides a minimum or entry rate and a percentage advance in the minimum or entry rate under certain circumstances. The minimum rate payable for any position in the bargaining units shall be the minimum rate established by the Wisconsin Department of Health and Social Services Division of Family Assistance, County Merit System Pay Minimums - 1972, a copy of which is attached hereto. Any new employee hired by the County shall be hired at the minimum rate payable for the position hired. After completion of a satisfactory probationary period of six months, the new employee shall receive a four percent increase in salary effective as of the completion of the said probationary period. In addition, any new employee after completion of the satisfactory probationary period may also be eligible for any increases in salary or fringe benefits as are reached between the County and the Union as a result of any subsequent negotiations.

Except as hereinafter provided, any of the present employees in the units who, as a result of the job posting procedure indicated in Article 9 of County Exhibit #8, are promoted to a new job classification, shall receive the minimum pay for said position unless the employee's present salary exceeds the minimum pay for the new position, in which case, the employee shall receive a four percent increase in his present salary as the salary payable to him in his new position. If, however, the total salary payable to said employee, which salary is computed on the basis of the employee's present salary plus four percent, exceeds the maximum salary payable for said new position, then, the salary payable to said employee shall be limited to the maximum salary payable for said position. This employee may be entitled to any increases in salary which may be negotiated between the County and the Union in subsequent labor negotiations. If, as a result of job posting, an employee is promoted to another job classification and is to receive the minimum salary payable for said position as the entry salary, said employee will then receive a four percent increase in the minimum salary payable for said position after completion of a six months period of employment in said position.

If, as a result of job posting, an employee obtains a lower paying job position, then, said employee shall receive a four percent reduction in his or her present salary unless the newly adjusted salary exceeds the maximum payable for the new position, in which case, the employee's salary shall be
reduced to the maximum for the new position. If the employee's adjusted salary, which is computed by taking his or her present salary and reducing it by four percent, is less than the minimum for the new position, then, the said employee's salary shall be established as the minimum salary for the new position.

9. SALARY INCREASE:

\$39.00 per month for professional employees;

\$22.00 per month for clerical employees.

Only employees who have completed the probationary period as of January 1, 1972, are eligible for the negotiated increase.

10. RETROACTIVITY:

The benefits to be effective January 1, 1972, except as provided in the County's vacation provision.

11. HEALTH INSURANCE OPTION:

If the employees elect to receive \$10.00 per month additional cost pick up by Winnebago County on the cost of the family plan hospitalization insurance, then, the sum of \$2.80 is to be deducted from all increases provided in Paragraph 9 of this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Board Chairman and the County Clerk are hereby authorized to execute on behalf of Winnebago County an agreement which provides the foregoing benefits and such other provisions as determined by the Labor Relations Committee to be in the best interests of Winnebago County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if an agreement is executed by Winnebago County and the Winnebago County Department of Social Services employees for the year 1972, then, a copy thereof shall be submitted to the County Board for its information.

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Authority

This Ordinance is adopted under the authority granted by Sec. 59.02, Wis. Stats. (1969) and Sec. 349.06, Wis. Stats. (1969), as amended by Chapter 278, Laws of Wisconsin, 1971.

1.2 Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances

All prior Winnebago County Ordinances, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance insofar as they regulate traffic on highways in Winnebago County, except those Ordinances adopted pursuant to authority granted in Sec. 349.11, Wis. Stats. (1969), as amended by Chapter 38, Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, are hereby repealed.

1.3 Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County would have passed the other provisions of the Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one of more provisions may be declared invalid, and if any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

1.4 Title

This Ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as, Winnebago County Vehicle Ordinance.

1.5 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect on October 1, 1972, upon passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 2.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

2.1 Jurisdiction

The Winnebago County Vehicle Ordinance shall regulate traffic on any highway in Winnebago County except those highways exclusively within the jurisdiction of towns, cities and villages which are regulated by similar traffic ordinances.

2.2 Wisconsin Vehicle Code Adopted

Pursuant to the authority granted to local authorities in Sec. 349.06, Wis. Stats. (1969), as amended by Chapter 278, Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, Winnebago County does hereby adopt the provisions of



Chapters 341 to 348, Wis. Stats. (1969), as amended by the Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, inclusive, and the same are by reference made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein with the following exceptions, to-wit:

Those provisions which are excepted in Sec. 349.03 and Sec. 349.06, Wis. Stats. (1969), as amended by the Laws of Wisconsin, 1971.

Those provisions in Chapters 341 to 348, Wis. Stats. (1969), as amended by the Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, which are included in the definition of crimes in Sec. 939.12, Wis. Stats. (1969).

Each chapter and section thereof of Wisconsin Statutes adopted by this Ordinance shall bear the same number in this Ordinance as it has in the Wisconsin Statutes.

2.3 Words and Phrases Defined

The provisions of Sec. 340.01, Wis. Stats. (1969), as amended by the Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, are hereby adopted and by reference are made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein. This section of Wisconsin Statutes adopted by this Ordinance shall bear the same number in this Ordinance as it has in the Wisconsin Statutes.

2.4 Penalties

Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit a dollar amount not to exceed the maximum dollar amount of the forfeiture provided in the section of Wisconsin Statutes which coincides with the section of this Ordinance which is violated, together with taxable costs, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, may be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid but not to exceed thirty (30) days.

2.5 Stipulation of Guilt or No Contest; Deposits

Stipulations of guilt or no contest may be made by persons arrested for violations of this Ordinance whenever the provisions of Sec. 345.27, Wis. Stats. as created by Chapter 278, Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, are inapplicable to such violations. Stiuplations shall conform to the form contained on the uniform traffic citation and complaint and may be accepted within the number of days from the date of the alleged violation as appears on the uniform traffic citation and complaint issued to the alleged traffic offender.

Any person stipulating guilt or no contest as hereinbefore provided must make the deposit required under Sec. 345.26, Wis. Stats. as created by Chapter 278, Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, which deposit has been fixed by the State Board of County Judges. A copy of the State of Wisconsin Uniform State Traffic Deposit and Bond Schedule effective October 1, 1972, as adopted by the State Board of County Judges is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Chairman Becher reported on the activities of his committee. The City Fire Inspector requested updating the wire on the outside fire escape. Vandalism at the Nurses Home. Wiring of the jail has been completed. Quotes have been received for the balance of the re-wiring for the courthouse. This will be a two year project. Further study will be made for additional room at the Guidance Clinic. Quotes have also been received for the remodeling of offices for the County Board Chairman and County Executive. LAWCON and ORAP federal funds have been approved. The parks have been closed for the season.

WINNEBAGO COUNTY BAR ASSOCIATION

Mr. Thomas Woodrow, President of the Winnebago County Bar Association, appeared before the board members regarding the judicial supplement paid to the Winnebago County Judges, asking for an increase in the amount.

Mr. Robert Jansen, also a member of the Bar Association, compared the supplement paid to judges of counties of comparable size. According to figures presented Winnebago County is the lowest. It was his recommendation that the supplement be increased to \$5,000.00.

Mr. George Curtis, also a member of the Bar Association, urged the supervisors to give favorable consideration to an increase in the judicial supplement.

COORDINATING COMMITTEE

The minutes for the Coordinating Committee were mailed to each supervisors. No oral report was given.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

Chairman Neely reported on convention requests that had been received by the Finance Committee.

The Committee had also received a request from interested merchants from the City of Oshkosh to have Winnebago County participate in a brochure to attract tourists to Winnebago County.

Also received was a request from a Convention Center Group to have Winnebago County participate in the funding. No Action was taken on either of the requests.

SEWAGE STUDY SUB-COMMITTEE INSTITUTIONS

Supervisor Sitter introduced Mr. William McEnroe, Chairman of the Town of Oshkosh Sanitary Sewage Commission, requesting that the board give consideration to enter with the City of Oshkosh for the handling of sewage from the Institutions. At the present time it is being handled by a pump station at the State Hospital. The cost would be relatively the same. Construction would start about the middle of 1973. Later a users fee would be initiated.

CREATE WINNEBAGO COUNTY COMMUNITY DAY CARE BOARD

The following Resolution No. 2 was presented:

TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS: WHEREAS, the present Community Day Care Board was not appointed by the County Board; and

WHEREAS, there must be a Community Day Care Board appointed by the County Board no later than December 1, 1972 to assure continuity of purchase of service programs for the mentally and physically handicapped; and

WHEREAS, your Social Services Board and Institutions and Guidance Center Board has met with representatives of the present Day Care Board and have agreed upon the following.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the Winnebago County Community Day Care Board is hereby created pursuant to Section 51.38 Wisconsin Statutes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Winnebago County Community Day Care Board consist of nine (9) members, five (5) of whom shall be members of the Winnebago County Board of Social Services. Four (4) members shall be appointed by the County Board Chairman and approved by the County Board from a list of nominees submitted by the present Day Care Board.



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the term of office for the non-County Board members appointed by the County Board Chairman shall be for three (3) years, except that of the members first appointed, one (1) member shall be for one (1) year, two (2) members for two (2) years, and one (1) member for three (3) years. Vacancies shall be filled for unexpired terms by appointment of the County Board Chairman and approved by the County Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the duties of the Community Day Care Board shall be to:

- A. Review and evaluate the services of the various Day Care Programs to insure conformance with the basic plan and budget, including periodic reporting to the director, local public officials and the public, and when indicated, make recommendations for changes in program and services.
- B. Assist in arranging and promoting local financial support for the program from private and public sources.
- C. Assist in arranging cooperative working agreements with other health, vocational and welfare agency services, public and private, and with other related agencies.
- D. Review the fiscal practices, the annual plan and budget and make recommendations concerning day care programs for the mentally and physically handicapped in Winnebago County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Winnebago County Community Day Care Board shall hereby be authorized to make application for State grant-in-aid in accordance with Section 51.38 Wisconsin Statutes 1961, and the rules and regulations of the State Department of Health and Social Services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that with the passage of this resolution, the Day Care Board that has existed in the past is hereby relieved of all responsibility effective forthwith.

Roll call showed full board present with the exception of Supervisor Putzer who asked to be excused.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag and invocation by Supervisor Daggett.

Motion made by Supervisor Nolan and seconded that the minutes for the October meeting be approved as printed. Carried by Voice Vote.

Supervisor Farrell, Chairman of the Labor Relations Committee, introduced Mr. Gerald Lang, Winnebago County's Personnel Director.

A communication from the Chief Equipment, Inc., W. J. Hay, President, emphasizing the importance of consolidating the ag-related offices and services under one roof was read. Referred to the Agriculture, Education and Zoning Committee.

A communication from Mr. Chester Becker, Secretary of Winnebago County Pomona Grange, recommending a permanent central location for the County Extension Offices, Conservation offices was read. Referred to the Agriculture Education and Zoning Committee.

A communication from the Custom Tree Surgery Co. supporting a permanent building for the Agriculture office in Winnebago County was read. Referred to the Agriculture, Education and Zoning Committee. A communication from the Town of Algoma recommending that the Winnebago County Board adopt a "hold-the-line" attitude when preparing the budget for the coming year. Referred to the Finance Committee.

BUILDINGS, GROUNDS & PARKS' REPORT

Chairman Becher's committee inspected the rooms at the Guidance Center noting that there is approximately 6200 sq. ft. of area available for rooms to be used by the Agricultural & Soil Conservation offices. The trees on the Dake property have been removed. Gischia called the Buildings Chairman's attention to the need for future expansion at the Guidance Center namely a TB outpatient dispensory.

HIGHWAY COMMITTEE REPORT

Chairman Loehning reported the Highway Committee made an inspection tour of Winnebago County. Bridges on Ct E; abandonment of the cul du sacs in the Town of Clayton; CT "II"; overhead on CT P; inspected railroad crossings for signals. The Committee hosted the District 3 conference at Germania Hall on October 19th. The Commissioner reported on Ct E. A study on winter maintenance of town roads. A settlement has been reached on the employees 1973 salary agreement.

AGRICULTURE, EDUCATION & ZONING REPORT

Chairman Daggett reported routine business. The County Agent and Farm Management Agent are attending a National Convention.

INSTITUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

Chairman Gischia reported a study is being made of the Health Committee structure. Also worked on their budget.

JUDICIARY & PUBLIC SAFETY REPORT

Supervisor Greiner reported on the negotiation of the Sheriff Department. Routine business. The Chairman was absent at the time of report, but would have additional information later.

LABOR RELATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

Chairman Farrell reported on completed negotiations with the Highway Department and the Courthouse Employees Association.

SOCIAL SERVICES REPORT

Vice Chairman Christoph reported on the organization of the Day Care Board. This board will handle the purchase of services. More information will be available at a later date. Meeting was held to work on their budget.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Chairman Neely reported on the proposed 1973 budget. He told the board members it will be the last time the Finance Committee presents the budget to the board. In 1974, it will be the newly elected County Executive. Supervisor Neely discussed the federal revenue shared tax. Also the various reductions in the budget by the Finance Committee will be discussed more thoroughly when the department budgets are reviewed. There will be no increase in the tax rate, but due to the increased assessed valuation the tax bill to the taxpayers will be higher. Motion made by Supervisor J. C. Pawlowski that the board go into a committee of a whole for the purpose of a public hearing on the budget. Upon rising the board could act as a committee of the whole.

The Chair informed interested persons that whoever wished to speak on the budget could now do so.

PUBLIC HEARING ON 1973 PROPOSED BUDGET

Mr. Robert Troyer, representing the City of Neenah and also an alderman appeared before the board favoring the \$6,000.00 appropriation for ADVOCAP. In his opinion it is a worth-while project and should carry a high priority with the board members.

Mrs. Catherine Kiedrowski, Coordinator of ADVOCAP asked for the board's support in the appropriation. Mrs. Kiedrowski showed placards of the group's activities. The services rendered to the elderly, child care and housing.

Mr. L. T. Brooks, a resident of the Town of Algoma, represented the Oshkosh Taxpayers Alliance in requesting the tax rate be reduced six cents per thousand. In his opinion the general form of the budget was commendable to the Finance Committee and Auditor. It is hoped that the money received from the Federal Shared Taxes will be used for tax relief for the taxpayers.

Mr. Don Kutchera, 154 Anchorage Ct., Oshkosh, urged the board to use the tax shared money to reduce the budget and suggested cuts from certain areas. He would like to see the County Executive's salary set at \$25,000.00 in order to attract qualified candidates for the position.

Mr. Eugene Lind, Chairman of the Town of Rushford, objected to the tax rate as misleading. He quoted the 1970-1971 tax levy increased 53% while the 1971-72 tax levy increased 18%. He stated that the government is costing the people too much money. He would not like to see an appropriation for ADVOCAP.

* * *

Mr. Robert Horne, a resident of the Town of Utica, told the board members that the government should be managed as you would your own business or home. Mr. Horne objected to the Regional Planning Commission and a County Assessor. The only way to curb spending is to cut the budget.

Supervisor Daggett commended the people who appeared at the public hearing.

Motion made by Supervisor Meyer and seconded that the board go out of the committee of whole and into regular session. Upon rising the board was ready for routine business. A special order of business was the discussion of the need for centrally located building to house the various agricultural services.

REQUESTS FOR CENTRALLY LOCATED BUILDING TO HOUSE AGRICULTURAL SERVICES

Mr. Fred Kasten, appeared as a farmer and representing agriculture would like an extension service building. He told the board members that farming represents a large business. Three out of every ten jobs are connected with farming. It is not only the economy of this county but also that of the state. He suggested a committee be appointed to study a land site and a building to contain all conservation services. Perhaps federal funds could be secured.

* * *

Mr. George Williams, Secretary representing the Winnebago County Holstein Association on the need for a center because of the numerous requests for meetings it is necessary to have a suitable space.

Mr. Lester Angell, Adult 4-H Leader proposed that the building be centrally located for all 4-H clubs.

Cindy Worth, representing the 4-H Junior leaders told of the problems with the availability and cost of meeting rooms.

Mr. Ray Kempf, President of the Dairy Herd Association would like to have the various associations be assured of space for their meetings and perhaps the center could be used for a resource center.

Mr. Kent Dusso, Agriculture teacher from Winneconne en-

Mrs. Wilma Rosenthal, Secretary of the Winnebago County Homemakers serving both rural and urban people asked the board to consider an appropriate service center for their meetings.

* * * *

Mr. Charles Foote, Guernsey Breeders Association, favored a permanent and adequate facility.

Mr. Jack Rasmussen, a citizen representing individuals interested in Horticulture, stressed the need of an adequate meeting room.

* * * *

Mr. Ralph Bufano, Director of the Paine Arboretum and Art Center, told the board members that the request for a new facility is very reasonable and would be a benefit to the whole county.

* * *

Mr. John Wiley, Neenah Chamber of Commerce, offered use of the Kimberly Clark Building in cooperation with the



City Hall. The only cost connected would be the operating expense.

* * * *

Supervisor Arne expressed the opinion that perhaps the various associations would sponsor the building and the county would pay their share as rent.

Supervisor Brandt suggested that perhaps a Butler type building would be suitable if the county would see fit to have a facility for the Agriculture Department.

Motion made by Supervisor Christoph and seconded that the Agriculture Committee make a thorough study of need and report back to the county board when guidelines have been established. Carried by Voice Vote.

WINNEBAGO COUNTY SNOWMOBILE ORDINANCE

The following Resolution No. 23 was presented:

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Authority

This Ordinance is adopted under the authority granted by Sec. 59.02, Wis. Stats. (1969), and Sec. 349.06, Wis. Stats. (1969) as amended by



Chapter 277, Laws of Wisconsin, 1971.

1.2 Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County would have passed the other provisions of the Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid, and if any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

1.3 Title

This ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as Winnebago County Snowmobile Ordinance.

1.4 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 2.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

2.1 Jurisdiction

The Winnebago County Snowmobile Ordinance shall regulate the operation of any snowmobile in Winnebago County on any "snowmobile trail" as defined in Sec. 350.01 (19), Wis. Stats., as created by Chapter 277, Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, and "snowmobile route" as defined in Sec. 350.01 (20), Wis. Stats., as created by Chapter 277, Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, except where such snowmobile trails and routes are located in towns, cities and villages which have provided for the regulation of snowmobile operation by a similar snowmobile ordinance.

2.2 Wis. Stats., Chapter 350, entitled

"Snowmobiles," Adopted

Pursuant to the authority granted to local authorities in Sec. 349.06, Wis. Stats. (1969), as amended by Chapter 277, Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, Winnebago County does hereby adopt the provisions of Chapter 350, Wis. Stats. (1969), as amended by the Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, and the same are by reference made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

Each section of Wisconsin Statutes adopted by this Ordinance shall bear the same number in this Ordinance as it has in the Wisconsin Statutes.

2.3 Words and Phrases Defined

The provisions of Sec. 350.01, Wis. Stats. (1969), as amended by the Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, are



hereby adopted and by reference are made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein. This section of Wisconsin Statutes adopted by this Ordinance shall bear the same number in this Ordinance as it has in the Wisconsin Statutes.

2.4 Penalties

Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit a dollar amount not to exceed the maximum dollar amount of the forfeiture provided in the section of Wisconsin Statutes which coincides with the section of this Ordinance which is violated, together with taxable costs, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, may be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid but not to exceed thirty (30) days.

2.5 Stipulation of Guilt or No Contest

Stipulations of guilt or no contest may be made by persons issued a citation for violation of this Ordinance. Stipulations shall conform to the requirements of Wis. Stats., Sec. 345.11, (1969), as amended by the Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, and may be accepted together with the required forfeiture within the number of days from the date of the alleged violation as appears on the uniform traffic citation and complaint issued to the alleged offender. The stipulation of guilt shall be in a form approved by the Judge of County Court, Branch 3, of Winnebago County, and the forfeiture shall be as provided in a schedule of penalties established by the Judge of said County Court, Branch 3.

Motion made by Supervisor Pitz and seconded to adopt the ordinance. Carried by Voice Vote.

A REQUEST FOR PRIORITY USE OF REVENUE SHARING FUNDS

WHEREAS, Congress has passed a five-year revenue sharing bill designed to help local governments to carry on needed programs which they felt they could not adequately finance at the present time; and

Mrs. Norma Edinger, Route No. 2, Omro appeared before the board members concerned over the lack of interest by the Winnebago County Board in promoting the attractions of Winnebago County to the recreational public. Mr. James Fitzgerald, Chairman of the Comprehensive Mental Planning Group, addressed outlining the program for 1973. The group has been served by volunteers since 1970. The group is comprised of eight counties: Fond du Lac, Calumet, Waupaca, Waushara, Green Lake, Marquette, Outagamie and Winnebago. The budget for 1973 is set at approximately \$54,000.00. Supervisor Neely requested an organizational chart and projection for five years.

ORDINANCE: COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH MENTAL RETARDATION, ALCOHOLISM AND DRUG ABUSE

ORDINANCE NO. 1. An ordinance to establish a community mental health mental retardation, alcoholism and drug abuse program for Winnebago County was presented. Motion made by Supervisor Goff and seconded to adopt the ordinance. Dr. Kenneth Rusch, a member of the Board of Menatal Hygiene, Madison, Wisconsin discussed Section 51.42. Aid will be available January 1, 1973. Motion made by Supervisor Christoph and seconded to refer the resolution to the Institutions Committee for study of the program and the committee to report back to the County Board either in January or February, 1973 how this bill will effect Winnebago County and what changes will be necessary if the ordinance is adopted. The following Resolution No. 2 was presented:

The County Board of supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Authority

This Ordinance is adopted under the authority granted by Sec. 59.02, Wis. Stats. (1969), and Sec. 349.06, Wis. Stats. (1969) as amended by Chapter 277, Laws of Wisconsin, 1971.

1.2 Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances

All prior Winnebago County Ordinance, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance insofar as they regulate the operation of snowmobiles in the unincorporated areas in Winnebago County, are hereby re-
pealed and rescinded effective with the effective date of this Ordinance.

1.3 Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County would have passed the other provisions of the Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid, and if any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

1.4 Title

This Ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as Winnebago County Snowmobile Ordinance.

1.5 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 2.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

2.1 Jurisdiction

The Winnebago County Snowmobile Ordinance shall regulate the operation of all snowmobiles in the unincorporated area in Winnebago County.

2.2 Wis. Stats., Chapter 350, entitled "Snowmobiles", Adopted

Pursuant to the authority granted to local authorities in Sec. 349.06, Wis. Stats. (1969), as amended by Chapter 277, Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, Winnebago County does hereby adopt the provisions of Chapter 350, Wis. Stats. (1969), as amended by the Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, and the same are by reference made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

Each section of Wisconsin Statutes adopted by this Ordinance shall bear the same number in this Ordinance as it has in the Wisconsin Statutes.

2.3 Words and Prases Defined

The provisions of Sec. 350.01, Wis. Stats. (1969), as amended by the Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, are hereby adopted and by reference are made a part of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein. This section of Wisconsin Statutes adopted by this Ordinance shall bear the same number in this Ordinance as it has in the Wisconsin Statutes.

2.4 Penalties

Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit a dollar amount not to exceed the maximum dollar amount of the forfeiture provided in the section of Wisconsin Statutes which coincides with the section of this Ordinance which is violated, together with taxable costs, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, may be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid but not to exceed thirty (30) days.

2.5 Stipulation of Guilt or No Contest

Stipulations of guilt or no contest may be made by persons issued a citation for violation of this Ordinance. Stipulations shall conform to the requirements of Wis. Stats., Sec. 345.11, (1969), as amended by the Laws of Wisconsin, 1971, and may be accepted together with the required forfeiture within the number of days from the date of the alleged violation as appears on the uniform traffic citation and complaint issued to the alleged offender. The stipulation of guilt shall be in a form approved by the Judge of County Court, Branch 3, of Winnebago County, and the forfeiture shall be as provided in a schedule of penalties established by the Judge of said County Court. Branch 3.

PROVIDING FOR ATTENDANCE AT MEETINGS OR SCHOOLS AND EXPENSE

REIMBURSEMENT WHILE IN SUCH ATTENDANCE The following Ordinance No. 2 was presented:

The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION I. PURPOSE.

The purpose of this Ordinance is to establish an orderly procedure for the authorization of travel or attendance at meetings or schools on behalf of Winnebago County and for reimbursement for expenses incurred as a result of such attendance.

SECTION II.

INTENT.

The intent of this Ordinance is that no expense reimbursement shall be made to anyone hereunder by Winnebago County unless proper authorization as hereinafter set forth shall be secured.

SECTION III. PROCEDURE.

A. Meetings:

Meetings must be budgeted for prior to the beginning of the fiscal year. The budget must be detailed, insofar as possible, with the names of persons planning to attend, the location of the meeting, the date or dates of the meeting, and approximate costs. If information as to place and date cannot be specifically identified, there must be at least a close approximation.

B. Schools:

Schools must be budgeted for prior to the beginning of the fiscal year, including a list of persons planning to attend schools, along with their length of employment, current salary status, amount of tuition to be paid, workdays involved, if any, and credits to be earned. Also, there should be included a reference to the statute or regulation requiring the participation at County's expense.

SECTION IV. APPROVAL PROCEDURE.

- A. The County Board, after consideration of the proposed budget for these purposes, will determine the amount of money to be used by each department making such a request.
- **B.** It will then be the responsibility of the operating manager of the departments to administer the expenditures of monies budgeted



for these purposes with the approval of the Committee to which they are responsible.

SECTION V. EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT. A. Automobile Mileage Expense:

- 1. Rates established by statute or County Ordinance shall be paid for travel by the most direct route with an allowance to be made for reasonable variations due to route conditions. Such mileage shall be paid to the person whose private automobile is used. Where a number of persons are making the same trip, travel should be in the least number of cars.
- 2. Mileage shall not be paid to department heads and employees to or from their place of employment for their normal work.

B. Hotel Expense:

1. A maximum of Sixteen Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$16.50) per day for single rate lodging will be allowed for 1973 with a receipted bill required. This rate subject to change on an annual basis as deemed necessary by the Finance Committee.

C. Meal Expense (including tips):

Breakfast.	 \$2.00
Lunch	 \$2.50
Dinner	 \$5.50
	allowance —

\$10.00 — which includes tips.

These rates are established for 1973 and are subject to change on an annual basis as deemed necessary by the Finance Committee.

D. General Items of Expense:

1. Public Transportation:

Travel by plane or train shall be at coach rates.

2. Advances:

The Finance Committee may, at its discretion, grant an advance for travel expenses. Requests for an advance should be made to the County Auditor.

3. Registration or Conference Fees:

Registration or conference fees are reimbursable by Winnebago County upon proof of payment.

SECTION VI. ENFORCEMENT.

The Finance Committee of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors shall be the Committee responsible for the enforcement of and compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION VII. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be effective upon its adoption by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. None of the provisions herein shall apply to any conference dates or expenses incurred thereat prior to the passage date of this Ordinance. All Ordinances or resolutions on the subject matter contained herein dated prior to the passage date of this Ordinance to the extent such ordinances or resolutions apply to conferences dated after the passage date of this Ordinance are hereby rescinded and repealed.

FINANCE

Supervisor Neely reported on the year end budget transfers. Supervisor Neely requested that he opposed Winnebago County spending additional monies for the dehypenation of the Oshkosh Outagamie Airport Case. The Finance Committee will disapprove of any money allowed for secretarial work on the typing of committee minutes.

HIGHWAY

Supervisor Loehning reported that the Highway Committee approved appraisals for parcel of lands on CT E. Twelve bids were sent out for fuel quotes. One received for gas and two for diesel fuel. A new snow plow has been received and put into use. Discussed was the Little Lake Butte des Morts bridge and land needed for roadway to the east of Highway P. The Highway Commissioner asked permission to use the garage at Sunny View Sanatorium for storage of salt.

PUBLIC HEARING

LABOR RELATIONS

at the point of, and prior to, and throughout, the final passenger screening process prior to boarding, for each flight conducted by a certificate holder required to have a security program under Paragraph 121.538 of this Chapter, and by each foreign air carrier that requests such law enforcement support;

- (b) The law enforcement officer is present continuously until all doors on the aircraft being boarded are closed and the aircraft has taxied away from the boarding area; and
- (c) The requirements of Paragraph (a) and (b) of this section are complied with in the event that the aircraft returns to the boarding area before take-off; and

WHEREAS, because of the uncertainty of the duration of this requirement, it is felt that these requirements can be met best by employing deputy sheriffs; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that it will require approximately seventy-five (75) hours per week to meet this requirement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the Aviation Committee be and it hereby is authorized to employ, at the rate of \$2.50 per hour, such deputy sheriffs as are necessary to meet this requirement.

Chairman Daggett reported routine business. The committee met with the Fox Valley Campus. Enrollment has increased ten per cent. The Agricultural participated in an ETN meeting on Solid Waste Disposal, in which the DNR anticipates changes in the solid waste disposal. The committee is waiting to hear from the DNR before any action is taken. Supervisor Brandt expressed his opinion that he would like the Highway Department to assume the responsibility on the same basis as snow removal.

AVIATION

Chairman Schott reported that Wittman Field has had a security guard since February 6th. Air traffic has increased for the month of January 1973 over January of 1972. North



Central Airline will celebrate twenty-five years of service. The board discussed the status of the fire station and the possible closing of a fire station in the City of Oshkosh.

BUILDINGS, GROUNDS & PARKS

Chairman Becher reported the committee met with the E. C. Merrill Co. regarding the heating plant at the Social Service Building. The present service contract for this building will terminate as of March 1, 1973. The County Maintenance Department will service the building. The Probation Dept's rent will be increased ten per cent. The committee purchased a tractor and truck for park use. Applications have been filed for federal aid for snowmobile trails and breakwater at Boom Bay. The furniture from Sunny View Sanatorium will be auctioned early in spring. A subcommittee visited the Outagamie County Courthouse to study their method of voting. Supervisor Pitz questioned his request for additional help in cleaning the offices of the Sheriff's Department. The request has been tabled for the present time.

FINANCE

Chairman Neely asked that any attachment to minutes be included in copies that are typed by the clerk's office. Expense vouchers are due by the seventh of each month. Those supervisors who do not wish to be reimbursed for per diem are to notify the Dept. of Audit. The committee anticipates a change in approving voucher for payment after the County Executive takes office. The chairman also discussed the report of John E. Lenahan's Workmen's Compensation Insurance and the Contingent Fund Report for 1972 and 1973.

EAST CENTRAL REGIONAL PLANNING REPORT

Mr. Roy C. Willey, Jr., representing the East Central Regional Planning Commission, appeared before the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors. East Central Regional Planning is the successor to the Fox Valley Council of Government and the Northeastern Regional Planning Commission. The agency projects overall planning of transportation and land use planning. Mr. Willey informed the board that it will be necessary for HUD to certify the agency to secure state and federal aid. The East Central Regional Planning Commission will work closely with the individual communities, answer their questions as to whether federal funds are available for their use.

HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES

Chairman Putzer reported on the activities of the Health & Social Services Committee. The Citizen Advisory Committee of the Winnebago County Health Nursing Services will hold a meeting on Tuesday, March 13th, 1973 to discuss the current status of the city-county health department with Mr. Richard Siesen, Acting Director, Bureau of State & Local Relations. The public is invited to attend. A pamphlet was distributed to the board informing them of the services available to the residents of Winnebago County. The branch office of the Dept. of Social Services located at Neenah will be transferred to the City Hall, Neenah, Wisconsin.



Supervisor Nolan, a member of the sub-committee for AD-VOCAP reported on the meetings attended, where the housing contracts were approved. Home owners for people in the lowincome bracket are anxious to have their homes approved for these people. Mrs. Nolan discussed the centers for the elderly whereby they can buy a hot meal very reasonably and also provides a social center. ADVOCAP would like to participate in a dental program.

HIGHWAY

Chairman Loehning reported on the various meetings of the Highway Committee. The committee met with officials from the state, City of Menasha and Town of Menasha on the storm sewer on "P" from Ninth Street to the bridge. The commissioner met with the City of Oshkosh, Town of Oshkosh and Winnebago County on Vinland Street from the new Oshkosh High School to Murdock Avenue. Also studied was the storm sewer on CTH "E" in the Town of Algoma. A petition has been received from property owners living on Murdock for the rebuilding of Murdock Avenue from Algoma to Jackson Drive. This project is not scheduled until 1975. The Chairman was questioned about the condition of the black-top on 116. An agreement will be signed for the rebuilding road from Green Bay Road to N. Lake Street on "II". A summary of the Winter Conference held in Milwaukee on January 21-24, 1973 was given.

INSTITUTIONS & GUIDANCE CENTER

Chairman Gischia reported on a meeting held with the Building Committee to discuss the elevator service at the Institutions. The censuses for the County Hospital, Pleasant Acres and for Family Care was projected. New Family Care rates were approved by the committee. There are about twenty patients at various outside hospitals. The cost for these patients are higher than if they were cared for at a home institution.

ACADEMY OF MODEL AERONAUTICS ANNUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The following Resolution No. 2 was presented: TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, your Aviation Committee has presented certain information concerning the Academy of Model Aeronautics; and

The subject of transferring the Juvenile Court Social Worker to Social Services Department for payroll procedure was denied. A transfer of Social Service workers to the Institutions was discussed. A study has been completed on office which shall be open during the noon hour. Additional offices are now open. The Committee has completed negotiations with the Department of Social Services and are now bargaining with the Professional Police Association.

COORDINATING COMMITTEE

Vice Chairman Holverson reported on the minutes of the Coordinating Committee. Copies were mailed to each supervisor with the agenda.

Supervisor Kampo appeared before the board regarding pending legislation, stating the position of the Coordinating Committee, which was as follows:

ORDINANCE: ESTABLISHING AN AIRPORT USE FEE AT WITTMAN FIELD, WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN

The following Resolution No. 11 was presented: The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Winnebago do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Authority

This Ordinance is adopted under the authority granted by Sec. 114.14(1), Wis. Stats. (1971).

1.2 Severability

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County would have passed the other provisions of the Ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid, and if any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the Ordinance and the application of such provisions to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

1.3 Title

This Ordinance shall be known as, referred to, or cited as Winnebago County Airport Use Fee Ordinance.

1.4 Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect April 1, 1973, after its passage and publication as provided by law.

SECTION 2.0 GENERAL PROVISIONS

2.1 Establishment of Fee

There is hereby fixed, created and established an Airport Use Fee of One Dollar (\$1.00) on each passenger enplaning on any flight of a scheduled or non-scheduled air carrier at Wittman Field, Winnebago County, Wisconsin, except as hereinafter provided.

2.2 Collection of Fee from Air Passengers: Issuance of Boarding Pass

Each scheduled or non-scheduled air carrier operating from Wittman Field is hereby charged, together with its various agents, travel agencies, servants, employees and representatives, with the responsibility of collecting said Airport Use Fee from its passengers to be enplaned on its aircraft at Wittman Field and to issue a Boarding Pass to be furnished by Winnebago County to the passenger upon the payment of said Airport Use Fee.

2.3 Enplaning Passengers:

Surrender of Boarding Pass

Each enplaning passenger shall have purchased for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) from the scheduled or non-scheduled air carrier a Boarding Pass provided by Winnebago County, which Pass shall entitle the enplaning passenger to pass through the boarding gate at Wittman Field provided said enplaning passenger surrenders the Boarding Pass at the boarding gate prior to entry by the passenger upon the airport boarding apron.

2.4 Definitions

(a) "Passenger on any flight of a scheduled or non-scheduled air carrier at Wittman Field" shall mean every passenger intending to board any commercial aircraft, including but not limited to air carrier, local service carrier, trunk line carrier, commuter airline or taxi, or charter carrier, but shall not include the following:

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- (1) Passengers whose point of origin is from an airport facility other than Wittman Field and whose flight requires an intermediate or temporary stop at Wittman Field for the purpose of changing planes in the execution of a continuous journey; and
- (2) Non-fare paying passengers.
- (b) "Boarding Pass" is a written instrument issued by Winnebago County entitling its holder to exit a boarding gate at Wittman Field onto the boarding apron for eventual boarding of an aircraft.
- (c) "Boarding Gate" means an exit at Wittman Field through which passengers go to board an aircraft.
- (d) "Boarding Apron" means an area between the boarding gate and the aircraft for which the enplaning passenger holds a valid ticket for air passage.
- (e) "Non-Scheduled Air Carrier" means a certified air carrier which contracts for individual flights and operates on no fixed schedule and includes a charter air carrier.
- (f) "Scheduled Air Carrier" means a certificated airline operating under authority of the Civil Aeronautics Board on a regular schedule between fixed termini.
- (g) "Non-Fare Paying Passenger" means a passenger not required to pay a fare to board an aircraft, including but not limited to airline employees, children age two or under and certain FAA employees.

2.5 Remittance by Airlines to County

All scheduled and non-scheduled air carriers who are required to collect the Airport Use Fees provided by this Ordinance shall remit such fees so collected to Winnebago County through its Airport Manager in the following manner:

(a) Scheduled Air Carriers:

Scheduled air carriers shall remit such fees on a calendar quarterly basis not later than the last day of the month following the end of each quarter. Such remittances to be an amount equal to the number of enplaning passengers at Wittman Field covered by this Ordinance 'times' the Airport Use Fee of One Dollar (\$1.00), less six per cent (6%) of the amount so collected, which percentage is hereby allocated and allowed to said air carriers for the purpose of defraying the ad-

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ministrative costs of collecting and remitting said Airport Use Fee.

(b) Non-Scheduled Air Carriers:

All non-scheduled air carriers shall remit, prior to the departure of each flight, a sum equal to the number of enplaning passengers on such flight covered by this Ordinance 'times' the Airport Use Fee of One Dollar (\$1.00).

2.6 Disposition and Use of Airport Use Fees

All revenues collected as Airport Use Fees pursuant to this Ordinance shall be used for the purpose of defraying expenses incurred or to be incurred by Winnebago County for the construction, improvement, equipment, operations and maintenance of said airport and its facilities for the continued use and enjoyment of all users thereof.

2.7 Unlawful Conduct

It shall be unlawful for any enplaning passenger required to have a Boarding Pass under the terms of this Ordinance to enter on the boarding apron at Wittman Field without first having obtained a Boarding Pass and having surrendered the appropriate portion of said Boarding Pass at or in the vicinity of the boarding gate to the personnel designated by Winnebago County to collect such Boarding Passes.

2.8 Penalty

Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) or more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), together with taxable costs, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, may be imprisoned in the Winnebago County Jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid but not to exceed thirty (30) days.

Bids will be taken for re-wiring of two floors in the courthouse; repair of the courthouse roof. The committee also met with the DNR regarding snowmobile trails. A meeting will be held with the Chicago, Northwestern Railroad on the purchase of property.

HEALTH & SOCIAL SERVICES

There was no report from the Health & Social Service Committee available.

Supervisor Christoph reported for the Comprehensive Health & Planning Commission. It is anticipated that there will be a larger number of nursing homes planned and constructed which will result in an over supply of homes. There will be a meeting of the Comprehensive Health & Planning Group on Thursday, March 22nd at 7:30 p.m. in the Courthouse Lounge Room in which the supervisors are urged to attend.

Supervisor Nolan reported on ADVOCAP. The grant will be extended for a six months period. The nutrition project is moving ahead and at the end of the six month period will be transferred to another organization. Fond du Lac County is presently on a pre-school dental program.

PUBLIC HEARING

Mrs. Dorothy Schwartz, a member of the League of Women Voters for the Oshkosh Area, appeared before the board urging the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors to endorse the Equal Rights Amendment referendum.

HIGHWAY

Chairman Loehning reported on meetings held by the Winnebago County Highway Committee. A discussion was held on the Fourth Street overpass on Highway 41. Bids will be received for six trucks. Bids were opened on the Holz property. Purchase has been made for tree replacement on County Trunk "E". The Highway Report will be given at the April Board meeting instead of the March meeting. Due to technicalities the bid opening for the Little Lake Butte des Morts bridge has been delayed for four months.

INSTITUTIONS

Chairman Gischia reported that the sub-committee has been studying the various pieces of legislation that affect the operation of the Institutions. A report was made on the census of the Mental Hospital and Pleasant Acres. Under consideration is a change of name Institutions. Dr. Treffert will assume temporary position of Medical Director for the Guidance Center Clinic.

JUDICIARY

Chairman Pitz reported to the board that due to the work of the Assistant to the Corporation Counsel support payments are increasing. The committee also discussed ambulance service and microfilming work to be done in the Sheriff's Department. Bids were opened for the printing of the board proceedings and TV console. The committee is still faced with the problem of a juvenile detention facility.

LABOR RELATIONS

Chairman Farrell reported that the Wisconsin Retirement Fund held a meeting in the Courthouse Lounge Room for all county employees to discuss and ask questions concerning their retirement fund. The Wisconsin Physicians Service met with the various bargaining units to discuss hospitalization insurance. The committee is presently negiotating with the employees of the Sheriff's department. A policy has been established for retiring employees with twenty years or more of service.

COORDINATING

Vice Chairman Holverson reported that the minutes had been received by the supervisors in their agenda packet. The committee discussed rules changes. No action has been taken regarding the rules. Another meeting will be held on March 28th and then the board members will be advised of the contemplated changes. Also discussed was a uniform numbering system for Winnebago County.

Mr. Holverson presented Charles Lange of the A. C. Lange Co., Oconomowoc, Wisconsin. Mr. Lange told the board that it will take approximately six months to map Winnebago County for a uniform numbering system, and this system can be used by the fire stations and post offices. There would be a large master map of the Winnebago County. As the individual towns participated in the system, maps would be available of the towns. Towns which presently are adequately numbered are not compelled to change their system at the present, but when the system is inadequate, it will be advisable for the town to come under the uniform system adopted by the County.
