If the Vice Chairperson is nominated for Chairperson and does not decline the nomination, then, he should immediately step down from the chair and the election of County Board Chairperson shall be further conducted by the County Clerk.

The election of the Chairperson shall be in the same manner as is conducted at the first meeting after the regular election at which County Board members are elected for full terms. After nominations are closed, if there is only one person nominated, the election may be

by voice vote.

If more than one person is nominated, the election shall be by written ballot. A sufficient number of tellers shall be appointed prior to voting on the first ballot. The person receiving a majority of the votes cast shall be declared the winner. If no person receives a majority of votes cast on the first ballot, a second ballot shall be required.

Prior to voting on the second ballot, the person, or persons in case of a tie, receiving the lowest number of votes on the first ballot shall be deleted as a candidate or candidates on subsequent ballots for Chairperson at this election. Additional written ballots, including the procedure for deletion of candidates, shall be taken

until a Chairperson is elected.

If a vacancy occurs in the position of Vice Chairperson, the procedure for election of a new Vice Chairperson shall be the same as that established herein for the election of the Chairperson.

RE: APPROVE AGENCY AGREEMENT GFOR AIP-03 PROJECT

The following Report No. 44-485 was presented: Your Aviation Committee submitted to the Winnebago County Board a request for approval for petitioning the State and Federal government for aid for the undertaking of certain construction and acquisition projects at Wittman Field Airport in February, 1985. Those items included construction of a parallel taxiway to Runway 13/31, constructing an addition to the airport equipment storage building, construct 50' wide paved shoulders for Runway 4 for transit aircraft parking during the EAA convention, and construct a taxiway for the EAA museum annex. The resolution for the petition for State and Federal aid was approved by the County Board in February. Normally, an agency agreement is subsequently approved following adoption of the petition for the

airport aid. However, this was not done in February because it was understood that the agency agreement passed in December of 1984 for the AIP-03 project, which at that time included snow removal vehicle, was sufficient to cover these new items that were petitioned for in February. However, the State Department of Transportation's Bureau of Aeronautics has informed your Aviation Committee that the items petitioned for in February cannot be undertaken or considered for the grant for which we have applied until the agency agreement designating the Secretary of Transportation as Winnebago County's Agent for those specific items of work has been adopted by the Winnebago County Board as Sponsor for Wittman Field Airport.

The following Resolution No. 44-485 was presented:
WHEREAS, the said County of Winnebago,
hereinafter referred to as the Sponsor, being a
municipal Body Corporate of the State of Wisconsin,

authorized by law (sec. 114.11, Wis. Stats.) to acquire, establish, construct, own, control, lease, equip, improve, maintain, and operate an airport, and

WHEREAS, the Sponsor desires to develop the Winnebago County Airport project to:

Construct and mark a partial parallel taxiway to Runway 13/31; construct an addition to the airport equipment storage building; construct 50' wide paved shoulders for Runway 4 for transit aircraft parking during the EAA Convention; Construct Taxiway for EAA Museum Annex

WHEREAS, it is recognized that the items listed above will be funded individually or collectively as

funds are available, with special project costs to be approved as work is authorized, the proportionate cost of the airport development projects described above which are to be paid to the Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as the Secretary, to be held in trust for the purposes of the project; any unneeded and unspent balance after the project is completed is to be returned to the Sponsor by the Secretary, the Sponsor will make available any additional monies that may be found necessary, upon request of the Secretary, to complete the project as described above; the Secretary shall have the right to suspend or discontinue the project at any time additional monies are found to be necessary by the Secretary, and the Sponsor does not provide the same: and

WHEREAS, the Sponsor is required by law (sec. 114.32 (5), Wis. Stats.) to designate the Secretary as its agent to accept, receive, receipt for and disburse any funds granted by the United States under the federal Airport and Airway Development Act, and is authorized by law to designate the Secretary as its

agent for other purposes,

AVIATION COMMITTEE REPORT TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

RE: Approval of Reimbursement Contract for Special Construction Project For The EAA Convention.

The County Board petitioned the State Bureau of Aeronautics and Federal Aviation Administration recently for aid for certain airport development projects for Wittman Field. Included in this petition was a request for funds for the paved shoulder area for Warbird parking and to accommodate the Concorde during the 1985 convention. There is no State or Federal aid available for this particular project item in the form of a grant. However, Winnebago County had available \$20,000 in its EAA Convention fund for construction and improvements on the airport in support of the convention for 1985. In addition, the Experimental Aircraft Association Board of Directors approved the allocation of \$10,000 to be used toward the paved shoulders for the Warbird and Concorde parking off the cdges of Runway 4. This provided \$30,000 to do the construction for this particular project on a scaled down basis. The Wisconsin Bureau of Aeronautics has subsequently agreed to reimburse Winnebago County in the amount of up to \$20,000 for construction of the

paved shoulders on Runway 4 for the EAA Convention. Since these funds cannot be received in the form of a grant due to the time element involved to get this project completed, the Bureau of Aeronautics agreed to provide the reimbursement up to the \$20,000 amount for funds expended by Winnebago County on this project. Therefore, in order to get the most utilization out of the available funds, your Aviation Committee agreed to enter into a forced account work agreement with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation Bureau of Aeronautics for the reimbursement of the \$20,000 worth of construction subject to the approval of the Winnebago County Board. The reimbursed funds for the construction to include excavation, base course and paving of the runway area would then be utilized in the same project to give a total of \$50,000 of construction funds for the paved shoulders for Runway 4. Therefore, a total of \$50,000 would be made available for the improvements for the EAA Convention with \$20,000 being utilized from Winnebago County's convention fund, \$10,000 from the EAA, and \$20,000 as reimbursement from the Wisconsin Bureau of Aeronautics.

SPECIAL COUNTY BOARD SESSION Tuesday, June 4, 1985

The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors was called to order by the Chairman Ralph R. Nielsen at 6:00 p.m., in the Supervisors' Room, Courthouse, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

Roll call showed full board present with the exception of the following excused supervisors: Maehl, Hemes, Kearney, Steber, Wagner.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and Invocation by Supervisor Daggett.

The Closed Session of the County Board scheduled for 7:00 p.m. was cancelled as the county's insurance carriers were unable to appear at this time. The Corporation Counsel announced that the representatives would appear at the June 18th meeting at a time decided by the board members. The Chair announced that this special order would be scheduled for the early part of the evening.

Supervisor Luebke reported on the status of the improvements at the fair grounds. Lights are being installed at the horse ring. The committee would like to demolish the education building and put an addition on the Maxwell building. Many of these projects are

proposed for 1985. The grounds will be feasible for a baseball diamond should the Committee and the County wish to do so.

Supervisor Kampo told the Winnebago County board members that the Tri-County Expressway was started in 1963. Winnebago County first appropriated money in 1970 for the Little Lake Butte des Morts bridge. In 1980, a bond issue was approved to buy right-of-ways for the expressway. It is anticipated that all right-of-ways will be cleared by August of this year. The Tri-County Expressway will be completed by the year 2000.

Supervisor Luebke introduced Gloria Wienke, Public Relations Director of the Fox Valley Water Quality Board, regarding the Groundwater resource in Winnebago County. The Agency undertook the study last year in cooperation with the Land and Water Conservation Department. It was the 2nd Agency to take an in-dept. look at the groundwater resource in the Fox Valley Watershed. The study approach was three-tiered: First, to define the physical nature of the resource; Second, to define potential sources of contamination, based on permeability of the soils and the depth to the bedrock surface; Third, to define preventative measures for protecting the resource.

Supervisor Broas reported that her committee has had staff meetings with the various departments as to their goals for 1986. It is her understanding that no new programs or personnel will be needed. The State will be investigating Winnebago County in regard to its Child Abuse Program. Supervisor Broas submitted a chart showing the Public Assistance amounts for various size families.

Supervisor O'Brien reported that the Airport Restaurant will be open very shortly. An invitation has been extended to the supervisors to visit the restaurant. A report has been received from the FHA regarding the shooting range for Winnebago County.

Supervisor Young reported that the Neenah office has completed their security system. Bids will be received for elevator maintenance. Sealed bids will be received from the water main replacement at Park View Health Center. The County Board will be receiving a report on the parking lot for the Courthouse in July. The committee is currently looking at projects for 1986 which will be included in their budget.

Supervisor King reported that the Personnel & Finance Committee will be updating the Personnel Manual. Negotiations are being considered for 1986. The Affirmative Action Plan will be updated.

Supervisor M. Utech reported that the Judiciary Committee is studying committee structure and their functions. A per diem and mileage policy will be established. The committee will review grant track and mandatory wage assignments. The Judiciary Committee will also present ambulance paramedic resolution to the board in October.

WORKSHOP

The directors of the cities of Menasha, Neenah and Oshkosh appeared before the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors in defense of their formula for their budgets. Mr. Nichols told the board members that East Central Regional Planning Commission aided in determining the formula rate. Supervisor M. Utech expressed the idea to have the libraries collect directly from the municipalities instead of the County levying a tax. Mr. Frey from the city of Menasha told the board members that their budget will be increased approximately 3½% for 1986.

COUNTY PARKS SYSTEM

Mr. Tim Anderson a member of the Schriber & Anderson Associates before the Winnebago County on their Master Plan Report for Winnebago Community Park. The Community Park has been implemented through two phases of a three-phase master plan prepared in 1968. Phase III with the exception of the road system and associated lighting has yet to be implemented. As part of a new master plan, the Parks Committee further resolved to investigate potential uses for existing park land and County-owned properties located in close proximity to the Community Park, which included Sunnyview Property with 155 acres, Asylum Point Park with 56.5 acres, existing County Landfill Site with 185 acres and proposed county landfill site (Bartlett farm) with 311 acres. The total package would cost approximately 2.5 million dollars.

AMBULANCE SERVICE

Supervisor M. Utech, Chairman of the Judiciary & Public Safety Committee, reported on the County's ambulance service. The cost for county-wide ambulance service is currently \$1.77 per person. Under the system, the larger cities are served by paramedic, while the more rural areas are served by emergency medical technicans. The committee has the option of upgrading the level of service or of canceling the current contracts between the providers. Winnebago County will continue to provide ambulance service to their residents. Winnebago County's contract with providers includes a ninty day notice of non-renewal.

METHANE GAS

Supervisor Landwehr introduced members of ECS Engineers and Foth & Van Dyke who were instrumental in the survey of the Winnebago County Landfill Site.

Winnebago County Solid Waste Management Board recognized landfill gas as a potential energy resource. The board retained Foth & Van Dyke Industrial, Inc. with SCS engineers to investigate the technical and economic feasibility of landfill gas recovery and utilization at the Winnebago County Sanitary Landfill. The first step was to design and operate a landfill gas test program. The test program included both static and dynamic testing. Monitoring data recorded during these tests included extraction flow rates, well head pressures, gas composition and subsurface pressure. The results were as follows: the landfill is currently exhibiting an average gas generation rate of 0.144 cubic feet of LFG per pound of refuse per year (0.144 ft.3/lb-yr.) Under existing conditions, gas production is calculated at 2 million cubic feet per day. Future gas production is calculated at 2.8 million cubic feet per day based on anticipated refuse to be in place. Landfill gas production is estimated to continue at this rate for a range of 10 to 20 vears.

The proposed gas recovery system is designed for

future expansion.

2. That the location deemed most suitable is generally described as Wittman Field, Winnebago County, Wisconsin.

3. That the character, extent and kind of improvements desired under the project are as follows:

(a) Update Airport Master Plan

(b) Construct East-West taxiway extension to terminal building.

(c)Replace lighting regulator in electrical vault for

runway lighting.

4. That the airport project which your petitioner desires to sponsor is necessary for the following reasons:

(a) The original Master Plan which was completed in 1979 should be updated to take into consideration all the changes that have occured. i.e., changes in airline service, declining passenger traffic, increase in EAA activities and also to incorpoorate Part 150 Noise Study results which will be concluded in the spring of 1986. This Master Plan should be updated every five to six years to reflect ongoing and projected future activities at the Airport as well as needed improvements.

(b) The extension of the East-West Runway will allow for a more efficient flow of traffic to and from the Terminal Building and the Basler apron ramp. This extension would help alleviate the bottleneck which occurs in having to stop one flow of traffic in order to allow another flow of traffic to make turns on the ramp. Also, this extension would ultimately tie into the North-South parallel and would permit two-way taxiing between the terminal ramp and the North-South taxiway.

(c) One of the lighting regulators in the electrical vault for the runway lighting is an old type regulator full of PCB's and is beginning to leak PCB's are considered toxic, hazardous material. The new regulators do not include PCB's. Replacement of the lighting regulator should be made before a major leak and contamination problems occur.

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held prior to the adoption of this petition in accordance with sec.

114.33(2), Wis. Stats., and a transcript of the hearing is transmitted with this petition.

THEREFORE, you are requested to take such action as may be deemed necessary by the facts presented.

STATE REPRESENTATIVES

State Representative Esther Walling and Carol Buettner were present at the Workshop Meeting. The supervisors questioned the state representatives on state-mandated programs. The representatives voiced their appreciation at being present at this meeting and hoped to be invited again. Both representatives related to the board members impending legislation and the affect it would have on county government.

TELECOMMUNICATION SYSTEM

Mr. Patrick Monahan from Monahan Associates appeared before the County Board addressing the supervisors on the telecommunications study for Winnebago County. Mr. Monahan informed the supervisors that the telephone system at Park View Health Center is very out-dated and if repairs are needed it is questionable whether parts could be secured. Based on their analysis of existing telecommunications services and procedures, they have identified eight major issues to be addressed in this analysis: NETWORK COMPLEXITY, HIGH COST OF LONG DISTANCE SERVICE. EQUIPMENT PROBLEMS, SYSTEM MANAGE-MENT, DEPARTMENT BILLING, IN-HOUSE SYSTEM CHANGES, DATA COMMUNICATION. 911 OPERATIONAL PROBLEMS. Based on the issues identified they have established the following objectives for improving telecommunication services at

Winnebago County as follows: 1) Design a costeffective, county-wide network which will improve utilization of facilities and intra-county communications; 2) Identify a plan for equipment consolidation, improved feature capabilities and cost stabilization; 3) Determine feasibility of a STS as costeffective long distance calling service; 4) Develop a system management structure; 5) Streamline the departmental billing function; 6) Determine feasibility of performing in-house equipment hardware and software changes; 7) Address integrated voice/data considerations; 8) Recommend plan for solution of 911 operational problems.

The County Board Supervisors discussed what route the board should proceed with this program. Supervisor Grundman suggested that Supervisor Bahr should be more active in this program. Supervisor M. Utech told the board members that the Buildings & Grounds Committee will present the package when they have thoroughly discussed this matter.

- 1) Zoning base maps adopted February 6, 1979.
- 2) U.S.G.S. quadrangle maps for Winnebago County revised 1980.
- 17.20(2) PRINCIPAL USES. According to underlying districts, except that uses in shoreland wetlands shall be consistent with Section 17.22 of this Ordinance.

17.20(3)(a) The standards of the underlying district shall apply. However, compliance with Chapter NR 115 requires that no new lot shall have less than:

- 1) Lot (sewered).
 - (a) Area—Minimum—10,000 sq. ft.
 - (b) Width—Minimum Average—65 ft.
- 2) Building Structure Setback (sewered).
- (a) From Ordinary High Water Mark of Navigable Waters—Minimum—75 ft.
- 3) Lot (unsewered).
 - (a) Area—Minimum—20,000 sq. ft.
 - (b) Width—Minimum Average—100 ft.
- 4) Building Structure Setback (unsewered).
- (a) From Ordinary High Water Mark of Navigable Waters—Minimum—75 ft.

17.22(2) DESIGNATION. This district includes all

shorelands subject to regulation under Section 17.20 which are designated as wetlands on the official zoning maps initially adopted by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors on February 6, 1979, designating the wetland boundaries of the final "Wisconsin Wetland Inventory Maps" (dated April 13, 1983), adopted October 26, 1984, and made a part of this Ordinance. These maps are all filed in the Winnebago County Planning & Zoning Department.

17.22(5) REZONING. Rezoning of wetlands in the shoreland district shall be regulated by Section

17.32(11).

17.34(76) SHORELANDS. Lands within the following distance from the ordinary high-water mark of navigable waters: one thousand (1,000) feet from a lake, pond or flowage; and three hundred (300) feet from a river or stream or to the landward side of a floodplain, whichever distance is greater.

17.34(92) VARIANCE. authorization granted by the Board of Adjustment to construct, alter or use a building or structure in a manner that deviates from the

dimensional standards of this Ordinance.
