Supervisor Martin moved that the rules be suspended and that the clerk cast the unanimous ballot of the Board-for George A. Loescher.

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The ballot was cast and Mr. Loescher declared elected.

RULES.

Supervisor Fernandez moved that the rules of the last Board as follows be adopted. Carried.

RULES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY. Adopted May 6, 1918.

1. The meetings of this Board shall be held in the Supervisors' room, and the hour for daily meetings shall be 9 a. m., providing that on the first meeting in each week the hour of meeting shall be 10 a. m.

And the County Board shall continue in continuous session from day to

ay until adjourned, unless to a dy certain or sine die. II. At the first meeting of the Board it shall be the duty of the Chairman, or in the case of his absence the Vice-Chairman, or in their absence, the Clerk, to call to order.

The Clerk shall then call the roll of Members.

A quorum being present, the Board shall proceed to the election of a, Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

(Amended to provide for Vice-Chairman as authorized by Ch. 110, of 1903.)

III. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to appoint the following standing committees, each to consist of the number of members as set after the name of each committee, viz:

Equalization, 9;

F nance, 8;

General Accounts, 7:

Illegal Assessments, 5;

Justices' and Constables' Accounts, 7:

Sheriff's and Coroner's Accounts, 7;

Insane, 3; Poor and Poor Farm. ?.

Workhouse, 3;

Corporations, 3;

Public Buildings, 5;

Roads and Bridges, 5;

Per Diem and Mileage, 5,

Printing, 3;

Bonds and Salaries, 5;

County Abstract and Tract Index System. 3:

Rules. 3:

Education, 3;

Sanatorium, 5.

IV. The Board may adjourn for such time as shall be necessary for the Chairman to prepare the list of committees and no business can be done until the same shall be announced.

V. The Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, shall take the chair at the hour to which the Board may from time to time stand adjourned, call the Board to order and direct the calling of the roll of members by the Clerk.

VI. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the Clerk, and any mistake therein shall be corrected by the Board; provided, that upon the last day of the session the journal for that day will be read and, before the final adjournment, corrected.

VII. After the reading and correction of the journal, the order of business shall be as follows:

1. Reception of Petitions, Memorials, Accounts, etc.

2. Presentation of Resolutions and disposition of same.

3. Reports of Standing Committees.

Reports of Select Committees.

5. Consideration of Miscellaneous Business. VIII. The Chairman shall preserve order and decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Board; and shall clearly and distinctly state every motion or question before debate.

IX. The Chairman shall be entitled to vote on all questions taken by ayes and noes, and his name shall be called last; when the vote on any question is a tie it shall be deemed to have been lost.

X. Every motion or amendment shall be reduced to writing when a request therefor shall be made by any member; and all petitions, memorials and substitutes shall be reduced to writing and read before they shall be considered by the Board.

XI. Every written resolution shall have attached thereto the name of the person introducing it; and when referred to a committee, the names of such committee shall be endorsed thereon.

XII. Every member, previous to speaking, shall rise and address the Chair.

XIII. When two or more members rise at once, the Chair shall designate the member who is to speak first; but in all cases the member who shall first rise and address the Chair shall speak first.

XIV. No member shall speak more than twice upon the same question without leave; and when called to order by the Chairman shall take his seat, and shall not be allowed to proceed without leave of the Board. XV. A vote on any question shall be taken by ayes and nays when

XV. A vote on any question shall be taken by ayes and nays when called for by any member; and SHALL be so taken on all questions involving the expenditure of money; and whenever a vote is so ordered and taken, the members voting in the affirmative and negative, as well as those absent or not voting, shall be recorded at length in the records of the proceedings of the County Board.

(Amended to conform to Sec. 709, Stat. of 1898.)

XVI. No account or claim against the County shall be audited unless it be made out in items and duly verified and be filed with the Clerk of the Board, except as otherwise provided by law.

XVII. When a motion is under consideration, no motion shall be entertained except:

1. To adjourn.

2. To lay on the table.

3. For the previous question.

4. To postpone to a day certain.

5. To commit to a committee.

6. To amend or to substitute.

7. To postpone indefinitely.

These several motions shall take precedence in the order in which they stand in this rule.

XVIII. A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, and for the previous question, shall be decided without debate, except as hereinafter provided.

XIX. A motion to postpone indefinitely or to a day certain or to commit shall not be again entertained on the same day or in the same stage of the proposition.

XX. A substitute shall be open to amendment the same as the original proposition; but when adopted, shall not be subject to amendment. If an amendment or substitute is lost, another substantially the same shall not be entertained.

XXI. When a motion or question has once been determined, any member voting with the majority may move a reconsideration of the vote, but such motion shall be made and acted on at the same or next succeeding meeting, and shall not thereafter be made except by unanimous consent.

XXII. The previous question may be moved by any member, and the Chairman shall then say: "It requiring five members to second this motion, those in favor of sustaining the motion will rise." If five or more members then rise, the previous question shall thereby be seconded and an opportunity then be given to any two members opposed thereto to briefly state their objections. The question shall then be: "Shall the question be now put?" which, if carried by a vote of two-thirds of the members present upon a call of the ayes and nays, the Board shall immediately proceed to vote upon the pending amendment, if any, and upon the main question.

XXIII. In filling blanks, the largest sum and the longest time shall be first put.

XXIV. These rules shall not be changed, amended or repealed, unless the proposition or amendment is introduced in writing and the same laid over to some subsequent meeting of the Board, not less than five days intervening, and then only with the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

XXV. Any of these rules may be suspended upon any pending measure by unanimous consent or by two-thirds of the members present.

XXVI. These rules and all amendments or additions thereto which may hereafter he made shall govern the Board until altered or repealed, as herein provided.

XXVII. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in "Jefferson's Manual." so far as they remain in common use and are practicable and applicable and not inconsistent herewith, shall govern the Board.

XXVIII. Whenever the Board shall have gone into a committee of the whole and shall have arisen, the Board shall at once be in session for the receiving and acting upon the report of the committee of the whole, and for the transaction of any and all other business of every kind. XXIX. No resolution for the appropriation for money shall le in order until the day after its presentation and reference, except upon the consent of two-thirds of the members of the County Board present.

COUNTY ABSTRACTER.

The Clerk read a proposal from E. W. Thomas as follows: Oshkosh, Wis., May 2, 1918.

Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County,

Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

Gentlemen:—The undersigned, E. W. Thomas, hereby makes to your Honorable body the following proposal to take charge of and operate the Abstract Department of Winnebago County:

I. The Board of Supervisors to elect E. W. Thomas as County Abstracter.

II. Upon such election, E. W. Thomas agrees to accept such office, and take over such Abstract Department and operate the same in a first class, reliable manner by keeping all tract indices, and other records and files written up to date in a first class reliable manner, and to furnish abstracts of title to all persons requesting same, written up in a first class up-to-date manner for the rates hereinafter specified.

III. The said E. W. Thomas upon such election to furnish to Winnebago County a Bond in the penal sum of \$5,000.00 for faithful performance of his duties of such abstracter, with sureties satisfactory to the Board of Supervisors.

IV. During the continuance of his term as such abstracter, the Board of Supervisors is to fix the charges of such Abstract Department for furnishing abstracts at a sum noi lower than the following rates, to-wit: Twenty-five cents for each ordinary conveyance on each abstract, not exceeding two folios in length, and 25 cents for each additional folio when such conveyance exceeds two folios; one dollar for each certificate attached to abstract; 25 cents for each estate and guardianship appearing on such abstract where same does not exceed three folios; and 25 cents for each additional folic; 25 cents per folio for all corporation records, certificates of heirship. affidavits, and all other miscellaneous records. V. The said E. W. Thomas to keep a complete day book or record of

V. The said E. W. Thomas to keep a complete day book or record of all abstracts sold, ordered or received for extension, together with the name of the purchaser and the amount collected for same, which book shall be kept in the office of the County Abstracter, in the courthouse, and be open to inspection by any member of the Abstract Committee of the Board of Supervisors at any time during office hours.

VI. Winnebago County to furnish at its own expense proper blank books, and loose leaves for same to keep the tract indices and other permanent records of the office, which books so furnished are to become the absolute property of Winnebago County. E. W. Thomas to furnish at his own expense all other supplies, stationery, paper, etc., to carry on such abstract business and make abstracts of title, and employ at his own expense all necessary clerks and clerical help to properly conduct said business.

VII. E. W. Thomas to have the use of all typewriters, supplies, and other paraphernalia now in use in the County Abstract office, repairs, etc., on such typewriters to be made by E. W. Thomas; the understanding being, that the County of Winnebago shall be put to no expense of any kind in running said abstract business other than giving the said E. W. Thomas the use of the typewriters now in use and supplies on hand.

VIII. E. W. Thomas to pay to the County Treasurer on the first day of each and every month all moneys collected by him for abstracts sold during the preceding month.

IX. In consideration of such services as aforesaid the said E. W. Thomas to receive for his compensation from the County of Winnebago 75 per cent of all sums received by it for abstracts sold. Said sum to be paid by the county to E. W. Thomas on the first day of each month for all moneys received for abstracts during the preceding month.

ball by the county for abstracts during the preceding month. X. The said E. W. Thomas agrees, however, that the County's share of the funds received for such abstracts shall in no year be less than \$500.00, and promises and agrees that if at the end of any year the County's share shall be less than \$500.00, that he will at such time pay to the County the difference between \$500.00 and what said County actually received. It being the intention that the County shall receive at least \$500.00 net from such business each year.

XI. The Abstract Committee of the Board of Supervisors to have general supervision of the making of all abstracts and general supervision of the running of such office.

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XII. E. W. Thomas hereby agrees that such Abstract Department shall use the form adopted by the Abstract Committee of the County Board in showing probate proceedings, guardian's sales and other miscellaneous instruments of record and on file in the Public Offices of Winnebago County relating to Land Title.

In common with most rural schools in the state the textbooks in use in Winnebago county in years past have been decidedly unsatisfactorily. Many of them were out of date and not only contained obsolete subject matter, but followed methods of teaching which have been condemned by most educators for years. Realizing these facts, the school officers of the county at the last School Board convention almost unanimously voted to discard these old books and provided a committee to select new text books. These new books have been in use since the beginning of school in September and are proving a valuable aid to pupils and teachers in making the work of the schools more effective.

In order to familiarize the teachers with the new text books, a four days institute was held the last week of August. A number of the authors of the textbooks were present to explain the plans of their books. Other recognized educators discussed subjects of vital interest to teachers.

It is when a teacher gets into her own schoolroom and meets real problems that she begins to appreciate the value of definite and approved methods of teaching. Each teacher in Winnebago county is required to read and report on two professional books each year. Last year the books selected were Kirkpatrick's, "Rural School From Within," and Wilkinson's, "Rural School Management" both of which had been off the press but a few weeks and contain the best educational thought of today.

The improvement in writing by both pupils and teachers has been noticeable the past year. A year ago twenty teachers had earned muscular movement writing diplomas. At this time fifty-four teachers have secured such diplomas. Teachers who are themselves taking a course in writing prove much more effective teachers of the subject. The examination papers show a marked improvement in this respect.

Patron's Day, at which time all parents are specially invited to visit the schools, has become an annual event. The number of visitors increased last year from 1,000 to 1,400.

At the close of the last school year forty-seven teachers of the county received special state aid of 1.445.88 for having taught successfully in the same school district for more than one year, the amount of aid depending upon the length of service. I feel that this aid has been helpful in retaining teachers in the same district and inspiring them to better work.

School contests in the various subjects, if not overdone, are very helpful in stimulating the interest of the pupils. Such contests have been held the past year in writing, spelling and arithmetic. At the time of the county commencement exercises, final county contests were held. The winner of our county contest last June won first place in all subjects among the representatives of about fifty counties at the state fair at Milwaukee in September.

Last year many war activities called upon the schools for assistance. In nearly all cases this meant much additional work for the already overburdened teacher in presenting the various matters to the school and then getting favorable action. A new plan has been worked out for this year. In each school of the county a school society has been organized with the usual officers. Special committees have been appointed to present each special activity to the school and to carry on the work. In this way the pupils are acquiring the experience of doing this work and of conducting parliamentary meetings. Special activities carried on under the direction of the school society are the Junior Red Cross work, War Savings, saving of plits and shells for masks, growing of sugar beets, taking of the hog and cattle census and current matters which come up from time to time. During the spring months of this year the schools raised about \$2,000 for the Red Cross besides assisting the local chapters in knitting and sewing. It is a matter of common knowledge that many adults as well as children

It is a matter of common knowledge that many adults as well as children are almot totally ignorant of the exact nature of the industries of the county. At the children's program of the grain show given by the banks of Oshkosh last year the one thousand children and teachers in attendance were given an opportunity to visit the plants of the Deltox Grass Matting Company and the Gunz-Durler Candy Company. This year visits will be made to the Oshkosh Overall factory, Gould toy factory, the Court House and Daily Northwestern. Discussions by leaders of the State Boys' and Girls' Clubs, community singing and educational pictures at a local theatre will form part of the days' program. This annual event is looked forward to with keen anticipation by many of the pupils of the rural schools. A year ago this board indorsed the idea of uniform diploma examinations conducted at central points in the county by examiners who were not the pupils' teachers. This method was given a trial last spring. The results not only substantiated the predictions from other counties, but proved very helpful in judging of the effectiveness of the teaching. Probably two dozen or more pupils who might otherwise have graduated and gone on to do still less satisfactory work at high school were not allowed to graduate, and are now doing another year's work in the rural schools. When they do go to high school a year later they will be much more likely to do satisfactory work and to complete their courses. I recommend that provision be made for the continuance of this method of conducting the diploma examinations for the ensuing year.

In spite of the fact that farmers' bulletins, farmers' institutes, and papers and magazines in general have during the last few decades emphasized the importance of better methods of farming, there are still an appreciable number of farmers who follow wasteful, discredited farming methods. They do not know whether their cows are profitable or not; they pay little attention to the selection of sires or of pure bred seeds; they waste much feed through the lack of balanced rations and allow the most valuable part of their fertilizers to escape through the ditches. The teachers of this county, have been urged to emphasize these facts and the better methods of farming in the agriculture classes, and to draw attention to the progressive farms to be found in all parts of the county.

About ten years ago the legislature provided special state 'aid of fifty dollars a year for three years to all schools which made certain improvements in buildings and equipment. This law proved very effective in securing badly needed improvements. The last legislature enacted a new law providing continual state aid of fifty dollars a year to each rural school which meets certain requirements concerning the school building, equipment, length of the school year and success of the teaching. Just before the annual school meeting in July a letter was written to each school clerk listing the definite improvements to be made in 'each school should the district desire to come within the provisions of the law. Sixty-one district decided to meet the requirements and more improvements were made the past year than were made in any recent year.

The events of the past few months have awakened us rather abruptly to the falsity of many things which we have taken for granted for years. For instance, the physical examinations of drafted men have shown conclusively that young men who have grown up in the country are as a class in poorer physical condition than those from the city. Thousands of boys from the farms have been found to be suffering from physical defects which they did not know they had. Army physicians have been appalled by the numerous cases of preventable defects which the examinations revealed. All communities have recognized their responsibility for the proper education of children, but as a rule only the cities have recognized their responsibility for a reasonable amount of supervision of the health of children without which education is of absolutely no value.

We are apt to think that unhygienic conditions exist only among the poor of the cities. There are a lot of fairly intelligent people in the country who are just as indifferent. With plenty of milk and cream available many children early learn to drink tea and coffee. No relation of cause and effect is seen between head-aches of children and excessive amounts of fried foods; frightful colds making children miserable for days and constipation; drowsy, dull minds, and lack of fresh air in the sleeping room; cold feet and hands and tight garters or wrist bands. There are people who purposely expose children to contagious diseases in order that they may have it and be done with it, little realizing that even such common diseases as measles and mumps may permanently injure the hearing, sight or general health of a child.

From a study which was made of the pupils of the rural schools of this county a year ago it was found that a considerable number are overage. Among the several causes which contribute to this result are irregular attendance, absence from school, physical defects of pupils, short school years and in some cases unsatisfactory work on the part of the teacher. In Winnebago county 17 per cent of the pupils were found to be underage or in advance of the grade where they would naturally be classed, 34 per cent are normal and 49 per cent are below grade. It is surprising to notice in how many schools one finds children in a defective physical condition. In many cases all that is needed is the calling of the attention of the parents to the need of different food or clothing, proper care of the eyes, teeth or body in general, more hours of sleep or under more favorable conditions, or the attention of a dentist or physician. Even a limited amount of effort, in such matters is reasonably sure to correct undesirable habits or conditions which would later become quite serious. The teachers have done considerable good work in bringing these matters to the attention of parents, but too often parents have felt that the teachers were only guessing and that the conditions were not really serious. A trained nurse would in most cases be given much more consideration because she would be known to have had practical experience in such matters.

Winnebago county spends over \$50,000 each year for the care of tuberculosis patients, the poor and the insane. No effort is lacking to provide for those who have become public charges. It is a well known fact among physicians that many of these cases might have been detected before they had really developed and have been prevented by proper attention in time. In spite of this fact, no effort is made in this direction at present outside the cities of Neenah, Menasha and Oshkosh.

The trend of public opinion and activity today is for prevention and justice rather than charity when it is too late. Why should not Winnebago county follow the example of her cities and spend a relatively small amount for this humane purpose as well as the much larger amounts for charity? Is it not better to save a life for usefulness than to furnish it needed assistance later? Is it not sound business sense to remove some of the causes of public charges as well as to care for those we already have? Respectfully submitted.

TRAVELING LIBRARIES REPORT-NO. 27.

Miss Van Eman, Librarian offered the following:

Report of the Libraries of Winnebago County, Wis., October 1, 1917-October 1, 1918. To the Board of Supervisors: The annual visits to the county library

To the Board of Supervisors: The annual visits to the county library stations this fall showed that members of communities where stations were placed were eager to benefit by further library privileges and that many other groups of people were interested in obtaining a library for the first time.

Unfortunately the time of the visits coincided with the period of the influenza epidemic so that many stations placed in schools were closed and while it was possible to leave the new collections of books with some Board member who offered to be responsible for it, it was not possible to return the old collections and check the records at once. For that reason, that is, that not all the records of circulation are obtainable, the figures do not indicate the full use of the libraries this year. The circulation for the year was 5,027 which is a dercease of 327 from the issue of the previous year.

A selection of 103 attractive new titles were added to the collection, including books for children, and interesting fiction and non-fiction for adults. Personal narrative accounts of the war have been found to interest many readers of the traveling libraries and have increased this issue of books of non-fiction. Thirty-five worn-out books were replaced by new copies. The collection at the end of the year numbers 2,915 volumes. There are at present fifty-three libraries, and when the regular requests are filled only five will remain for the purpose of exchanging collections during the year. This is scarcely enough to answer the purpose satisfactorily, and there yet remain several requests from communities not served hitherto, which it will not be possible to fill. It is encouraging to note the continued interest of our readers and to realize that the organization so well justifies its existence. We hope that it will be the usual appropriation so that it will be possible to make still further additions to the collection during the year, so that our field of usefulness may be extended.

Whereas, chapter 556 of the laws of 1917, requires that fifty per cent (50%) of the foregoing sum, amounting to eight thousand four hundred eighty-seven dollars and seventy cents (\$8,487,70), together with at least one and one-half times this amount of county funds must be expended on the state trunk highway system, lying within the county,

There is hereby appropriated under the provisions of sections 1317m-1 to 1317m-15, inclusive, the sum of \$12,731.55, to meet the first 50% of the state aid allotment to be placed on the State Trunk Highway System, thus making available for this purpose the sum of \$21,219.25 to be expended as follows:

The sum of \$650.00 to be used in completing the construction of the State Trunk Highway System on the Oshkosh-Neenah road, between Gillingham's Corners and the Wooden Shoe Alley road.

The sum of \$20,569.25 for the improvement by building a roadway of concrete on the State Trunk Highway System on the Oshkosh-Fond du Lac State Trunk Highway, beginning at station 430 on the said highway and extending north to the macadam road. And the County Board does hereby determine that the following municipalities will be benefited by the construction of the State Trunk Highway System planned for 1919 under the provisions of chapter 175 and chapter 556, laws of 1917:

This agreement made and entered into this 7th day of January, A. D. 1919, by and between the County of Winnebago, State of Wisconsin, and Peter Carlson, Sheriff-elect, Witnesseth as follows:

That the said Peter Carlson, in the consideration of the payments of money herein provided for, agrees to board all prisoners who may be confined in the County Jall of Winnebago County, except those prisoners confined at hard labor out of doors; to wash their clothes and mend the same and to furnish wholesome, well cooked food in sufficient quant-ties for their proper feeding and maintaining such prisoners at a price of two fur fur on the feeding and maintaining such prisoners at a price of twenty-five cents (25c) for each meal so furnished such prisoners at a pile of twenty-five cents (25c) for each meal so furnished such prisoners with no extra charge for washing or mending the clothing of the same before trial; after trial, he should receive \$4.20 per week. It is understood that said amount is to be paid for all meals so ac-tually furnished said prisoners and the said Sheriff agrees to keep the County full Bedicate so as to show the head of the same state and the said amount is to be said the said sheriff agrees to keep the

County Jail Register so as to show the hour of receiving and discharging such prisoners and the exact number of meals furnished to each.

The said Sheriff further agrees to board all prisoners who may be confined in the County Jail of Winnebago County at hard labor out of doors for an agreed price of thirty-five cents (35c), for each meal so furnished such prisoners while they are performing such labor, with no extra charge for washing and mending; where necessary said meals are to be put up to be carried by said prisoners to their work, and furnished

at suitable times, so that said prisoners can go to their work. It is further agreed, that no bills shall be presented to the said County or any charge made for any services rendered in connection with the preparation of food for said prisoners nor in doing the washing and

mending herein provided for, of furnishing any materials or articles used in the way for the preparations of said food, and that the County of Winnebago shall properly heat and light said jail and the sheriff's residence and shall furnish fuel for cooking purposes and for said jail and sheriff's residence.

In consideration of the faithful performance of the above agreement by said Sheriff, the County of Winnebago agrees to cause to be paid to him the sum of twenty-five cents (25c) for each meal for regular pris-oners before trial and \$4.20 per week after trial, and the sum of thirty-five cents (35c) for each meal for prisoners confined to hard labor out of doors while performing such labor. OPINION OF DISTRICT ATTORNEY ON WINNECONNE BRIDGE.

District Attorney D. K. Allen offered the following report No. 17½: To the Honorable County Board of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen:—Since the November, 1918, session of your honorable body, at which session you appropriated money to aid in repairing the bridge over the Wolf river in the village of Winneconne, the question has arisen whether you could properly appropriate money for that purpose and cause that money to be raised by levying a tax against the entire county, including the cities of the county which maintain their own bridges.

A part of Section 1317 M-5-I-A reads as follows: "The County Boards are given authority to construct or improve or aid in constructing or improving any road or bridge within the county." * * This language was placed in the Statutes in 1911 and has been there at all times since and has frequently been passed upon by the Attorney General.

In Vol. IV, Opinions of Attorney General, page 680, the question is asked: "Whether this language must be construed with the rest of the Highway Commmission Act in order to give the County Board power to carry out the provisions of that act?"

The reply uses this language: "Section 1317 M-5 authorizes County Boards to construct or improve, or aid in constructing or improving any road of bridge within the county. Under this section, the County Board can do just exactly what the section says. It can construct, or improve, or aid in constructing or improving any bridge or road in the county."

In Vol. IV, page 485, the same sentence is held to empower the County Board to appropriate money to improve any road in the county, whether such road was made prior to 1912 under the county aid system or since that time under the state aid system.

In Vol. V, on page 771, where the question is: "How can the village of

Cazenovia raise money enough to pay its share of the cost of building a bridge on the county system of prospective state highways?" the opinion directs attention to this same sentence as a possible source of relief again on page 849.

In Vol. V, page 1135, it is stated that where two provisions of a statute are in conflict, the latter governs, and that it is the duty of the County Highway Committee to let all contracts for bridges made under section 1319, costing over \$500. In Vol. VI, on page 422, the opinion mentions this sentence as a source

of relief where the town has no money with which to build a bridge.

In Vol. VI, page 624, it is said that the County Board cannot be compelled to act under 1317 M-5-1 as under 1319. Expenditures thereunder are purely voluntary and 1319 does not in any way limit the acts of the board under 1317 M-5.

In Vol. VI, page 762, it is said: "It is true that in conferring most general powers upon the County Board, the statute says: 'The County Boards are given authority to construct, or improve, or aid in constructing or improving and road or bridge within the county, 1317 M-5-I-A.' But this grant of power applies to all highways and bridges whether on the trunk system or any other system. This provision of statute might as well have been placed in any one of a dozen other places in the statutes.

In Opinions for May, 1913, on page 272, it is said in construing section 1317 M-5-I-A: "The County Board may improve any road or bridge and it may aid in improving any road or bridge, and it may construct or aid in constructing either. The, tendency of recent highway legislation has been to greatly extend the power of County Boards. I find nothing in the statutes which in any way limits the power in question. The language is so plain that it does not admit of construction or interpretation."

I therefore conclude that the language in question applies to any road or bridge in the county; that being a atter enactment than section 1319 it is not limited in any way by that section: that the board may give to the bridge in question such aid as it sees fit, and levy a tax against the entire taxable property of the county to pay for the improvement in question.
