#### AIRPORT ZONING ORDINANCE

The following Resolution No. 16 was presented: A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY CREATING AN AIRPORT APPROACH ZONE AND REGULATING AND LIMIT-ING THE HEIGHT AND BULK OF OBSTRUCTIONS TO AERIAL NAVIGATION THEREIN.

THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. DEFINITIONS. As used in this Ordinance unless the context otherwise requires:-

(1) "Airport" means the publically owned Airport of Winnebago County and includes the area owned at the time of the passage of this Ordinance as an Airport, and also includes such land as Winnebago County may from time to time acquire for Airport purposes.

(2). "Airport hazard" means any overhead power line, which interferes with radio communications between the Airport and Aircraft approaching or leaving same, or any structure or object of natural growth which obstructs the aerial approaches of the Airport, or is otherwise hazardous to its use for landing or taking-off.

(3) "Person" means any individual, firm, copartnership, corporation, company, association, joint stock association, or body politic, and includes any trustee, receiver, assignee or other similar representative, thereof.

(4) "Structure" means any object constructed or installed by man, including, but without limitation, buildings towers, smoke-stacks, and overhead transmission lines.

(5) "Tree" means any object of natural growth.

SECTION II. AIRPORT HAZARDS NOT IN PUBLIC INTEREST:

It is hereby found and declared that an airport hazard endangers the lives and property of users of the airport and of occupants of land in its vicinity, and also, if of the obstructive type, in effect reduces the size of the area available for the landing taking-off, and maneuvering of Alrcraft, thus tending to destroy or impair the utility of the airport, and the public investment therein, and is therefore not in the interest of the public health, public safety, or general welfare.

SECTION III. AIRPORT APPROACH ZONE:--Certain of the land adjacent to the Winnebago County Airport is hereby divided into eight zones, which zones are hereinafter more particularly described, except Numbers Five and Six, and are shown upon the map attached hereto and made a part of this ordinance, and being known as the Airport Zoning Map, and which said eight zones shall hereafter be known and referred to collectively as the AIRPORT APPROACH ZONE and the said map and all the notations, references, and other things shown thereon shall be as much a part of this ordinance as if the matters and things set forth by said map were all fully described herein and provided further, however, that if there be any variance between the metes and bounds descriptions breinafter set out and the zones as they shall appear upon said map, the metes and bounds descriptions shall govern. Said zones, comprising the Airport Approach Zone, are more fully and particularly described as follows:--

ZONE NUMBER ONE-GOING SOUTH FROM SOUTH END OF RUNWAY NO. 1. All that part of Sections Two (2) and Eleven (11). Township Seventeen (17) North, Range Sixteen (16) East in the Town of Nekimi, Winnebago County, State of Wisconsin, described as follows: Beginning at a point on the North line of Section Two (2) two thousand four hundrey forty feet (2,440) East of the Northwest corner of Section Two (2); running thence West along said line five hundred fifty feet (550')! thence South ten degrees (10°) West to the South line of Section Eleven (11); thence East along the South line of Section Eleven (11) two thousand five hundred feet (2,500'); thence Northwesterly to the Place of beginning.

ZONE NUMBER TWO-GOING SOUTHWESTERLY FROM SOUTH END OF RUNWAY NO. 3 All that part of Section Thirty-four (34) and Thirty-five (35), Township Eighteen (18) North, Range Sixteen (16) East in the Town of Algoma and Sections Three (3), Four (4) and Ten (10). Township Seventeen (17) North Range Sixteen (16) East in the Town of Nekimi, Winnebago County, State of Wisconsin, described as follows: Beginning at a point on the East line of the Northwest One Quarter (NW¼) of the Southwest One Quarter (SW¼) Four hundred thirty feet (430') North of the Southeast corner; running thence West three hundred feet (300'); thene North three hundred fifty feet (350'); then South Fifty Degrees (50°) West Two (2) miles: thence South Forty degrees (40°) East Twenty Five hundred feet (2,500'); thence Northeasterly to place of beginning.

ZONE NUMBER THREE-GOING WEST FROM THE WEST END OF RUNWAY NO. 2. All that part of Sections Thirty Three (33) and Thirty-four (34), Township Eighteen (18) North Range Sixteen (16) East in the Town of Algoma, Winnebago County, State of Wisconsin, described as follows: Beginning on the East line of Section Thirty-four (34) One thousand fifty feet (1.050') South of the Northwest corner, thence South one thousand fifty feet (1,050'); thence South eighty-two degrees (82°) West two (2) miles; thence North four thousand feet (4,000'); thence Southeasterly to the place of beginning.

ZONE NUMBER FOUR.-GOING NORTHWESTERLY FROM THE NORTH END OF RUNWAY NO. 4.

All that part of Section Twenty-six (26). Twenty-seven (27), Thirtyfour (34) and Thirty-five (35), Township Eighteen (18) North. Range Sixteen (16) East in the Town of Algoma, Winnebago County, State of Wisconsin, described as follows: Beginning at a point on the South line of the Northwest One Quarter (NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>) of the Northwest One Quarter (NW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>) of Section Thirty-five (33) Six hundred feet (600') East of the Southwest corner; runningthence West Eight hundred feet (800'): thence North Fifty-four degrees (54°) west two (2) miles; thence North Thirty-six degrees (36°) East Two thousand five hundred feet (2.50°) thence Southeasterly to the place of beginning.

ZONE NUMBER SEVEN-GOING EAST FROM THE EAST END OF RUNWAY NO. 2.

All that part of Sections Thirty-five (35) and Thirty-six (36), Township Eighteen (18) North, Range Sixteen (16) East in the Town of Algoma, Winnebago County, State of Wisconsin, described as follows: Beginning at a point on the East line of the Southwest One Quarter (SW<sup>4</sup>) of the Northeast One Quarter (NE<sup>4</sup>) of Section Thirty-five (35) Five hudred fifty feet (550') North of the Southeast corner; running thence North One thousand feet (1,000'); thence North Eightytwo degrees  $(82^\circ)$  East two (2) miles; thence South Four thousand feet (4,000'); thence Northwesterly to the place of beginning.

ZONE NUMBER EIGHT-GOING SOUTHEASTERLY FROM THE SOUTH END OF RUNWAY NO. 4.

All that part of Sections Thirty-Five (35) and Thirty-Six (36), Township Eighteen (18) North, Range Sixteen (16) East in the Town of Algoma, Winnebago County, and Sections One (1), Six (6), Seven (7) and Twelve (12) in the Town of Black Wolf and Section Two (2) in the Town of Nekimi, Winnebago County, State of Wisconsin, described as follows: Beginning at a point that is Two hundred feet (200') North and Four hundred fity feet (450') West of the Southeast corner of the Northwest One Quarter (N. W.  $\frac{1}{3}$ ) of the Southeast Corne Quarter (S. E.  $\frac{1}{3}$ ) of Section Thirty-five (35); running thence South Forty-Five degrees (35°) West Six hundred feet (600'); thence South Forty-Three degrees (43°) East Two (2) miles; thence North Forty-Seven degrees (47°) East Two thousand five hundred feet (2,500'); thence North-

### SECTION IV. REGULATIONS IN AIR PORT APPROACH ZONE:-

Any structure or object of natural growth within the Airport Approach Zone exceeding the limitations hereinafter set out is hereby declared to be unlawful and is punishable as hereinafter provided. Structures and objects of natural growth will be permitted as follows:-

No structure whatever, or tree, within forty feet of the outside limits of the Airport; at forty feet from said Airport, a structure or tree not to exceed one foot high schall be deemed lawful and thereafter for each additional forty feet measured horizontally from the outside limits of said Airport, one additional vertical foot of structure or natural growth shall be deemed lawful. (In order to provide for a forty to one glide ratio in the Airport Approach Zone.)

#### SECTION V. PERMITS AND VARIANCES.

(a) PERMITS FOR CONTINUANCE OF NON-CONFORMING USES

The owner of any structure or tree existing at the date of the adoption of this Ordinance which does not conform to the preceding paragraph of this Ordinance shall be granted a permit authorizing continuance of such non-conforming use upon application to be made by him to the Board of Appeal, which agency is hereinafter provided for; PROVIDED, that if such application is not made within ninety days after the effective date of the regulations in question, the Board of Appeal shall by appropriate action compel the owner of the nonconforming structure or tree, at his own expense, to lower, remove. reconstruct, or equip such object as may be necessary to conform to such regulation or regulations.

#### (b) PERMITS FOR CHANGE AND REPAIR OF NON-CONFORMING USES

Before any existing non-conforming structure or tree for which a permit has been issued in accordance with subsection (a) hereof, may be altered or repaired, re-built, allowed to grow higher, or re-planted a permit must be secured from the Board of Appeal, authorizing such change or repair. No such permit shall be granted that would permit the structure or tree in question to be made higher or become a greater was granted, under subsection (a) hereof, and where the structure or object of natural growth has been more than 50% forn down or de-Stroyed whether voluntarily, by act of God, or otherwise, or has become more than 50% deteriorated or decayed, no permit shall be granted that would permit such structure or tree to exceed the applicable hight limit or otherwise deviate from the ordinance. In all such cases of 50% destruction, deterioration, or decay, whether application is made for a permit for repair or not, the said Board shall, by appropriate ac-tion, compel the owner of the non-conforming structure or tree, at his own expense, to lower, remove, reconstruct, or equip such object as may be necessary to conform to the said ordinance. Except as indicated, all applications for permits for change or repair of non-conforming uses shall be granted.

#### (c) VARIANCES.

Any person desiring to erect any structure or increase the height. Any person desiring to erect any structure or increase the height. of any structure, or permit the growth of any tree, or otherwise use his property in violation of this ordinance or regulations adopted there-under, may apply to the Board of Appeal under Section VI, for a vari-ance from the zoning regulations in question. Such variances shall be allowed where a literal application or enforcement of the regulations would result in practical difficulty or unnecessary hardship, and relief granted would not be contrary to the public interest, but do sub-tantial justice and be in accordance with the regulations and this ordinance

(d) OBSTRUCTION MARKING AND LIGHTING. In granting any permit or variance under this Act, the Board of Appeal may, if it deems such action advisable to effectuate the purposes of this ordinance and reasonable in the circumstances, so condition such permit or variances as to require the owner of the structure or tree in question to permit the County, at its own expense, to install, operate, and maintain suitable obstruction markers, and obstruction lights thereon.

#### SECTION VI. BOARD OF APPEAL.

A BOARD OF APPEAL IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED. (1) The word "Board" when used in this Ordinance shall be construed to mean the Board of Appeal.

(2) The Board shall consist of three members appointed by the Chairman of the County Board, for one, two, and three years, respectively, in the first instance, and terms thereafter to be for three years each.

#### (3) MEETINGS.

Meetings of the Board shall be held four times a year at regular intervals, and at such other times as the Board may determine. There shall be a fixed place of meeting, and all meetings shall be open to the public. The Board shall adopt its rules of procedure, and keep a record of its proceedings, showing the action of the Board, and the vote of each member upon each question considered. The presence of two members shall be necessary to constitute a quorum.

#### (4) POWERS.

The Board of Appeal shall have and exercise the following powers:-(a) To hear and decide appeals from any order, requirement, or determination made by the proper county administrative agency or officer or officers, in the enforcement of this Ordinance.

(b) To hear and decide special execptions to the terms of this Ordinance

(c) To hear and decide specific variances under Section V. (c).

(d) Appeal from the ruling of the administrative agency concerning the enforcement of the provisions of this Ordinance. may be made to the Board of Appeal not later than sixty days after such ruling shall

have been made. The appellant shall file with the Secretary of the Board a notice of appeal, stating the grounds thereof, and the administrative agency shall forthwith transmit to the Board all papers and documents constituting the record upon which the action appealed from was taken. The final disposition of any such appeal shall be in the form of a resolution, either reversing, modifying, or affirming, wholly or parily the decision or determination appealed from. An appeal shall stay all proceedings in furtherance of the action appealed from, unless the agency from which the appeal is taken, certifies to the Board, after the notice of appeal has been filed with it. that by reason of the facts stated in the certificate a stay would, in its opinion, cause imminent peril of life and property. In such case proceedings shall not be stayed otherwise than by a restraining order which may be granted by the Board or by a Circuit Court. or notice to the said agency from which the appeal is taken and on due cause shown.

(5) The Board shall fix a reasonable time for the hearing of the appeal, give public notice, and due notice to the parties in interest, and decide the same within a reasonable time. Upon the hearing any person may appear in person or by agent or by agent or by attorney.

(6) ADDITIONAL POWERS OF BOARD.

The Board may, in conformity with the provisions of this Ordinance, reverse, or affirm, wholly or partly, or modify the order, requirement, decision, or determination appealed from and may make such order. requirement, decision, or determination as ought to be made. The concurring vote of the majority of the members of the Board shall be sufficient for a decision.

#### SECTION VII. JUDICIAL REVIEW.

(1). APPEAL TO CIRCUIT COURT. Any person aggrieved by any decision of the Board of Appeal or any officer, department, or Board of Winnebago County or municipality therein may present to the Circuit Court of Winnebago County a verified petition setting forth that the decision of the Board is Illegal in whole or part, and specifying the grounds of the illegality. Such petition may be presented to the Court within thirty days after decision is filed with the office of the Board of Appeal.

(2) CERTIORAL Upon presentation of such petition, the Court may allow a writ of certiorari directed to the Board of Appeal, to review such decision of the Board. The allowance of the writ shall not stay proceedings upon the decision appealed from, but the Court may, on application or notice to the Board of Appeal, and on due cause shown grant a restraining order. In addition to the original papers acted upon by the Board, or sworn copies thereof, the return shall concisely set forth such other facts as may be pertinent and material to show the grounds of the decision appealed from, and shall be verified.

(3) POWERS OF COURT UNDER ORDINANCE. The court shall have exclusive jurisdiction to examine, modify. or set aside the decision brought up for review in whole or in part, and if need be, to order further proceedings by the Board of Appeal. The Findings of Fact by the Board if supported by substantial evidence, shall be accepted by the court as conclusive, and no objection to a decision of the Board shall have been urged before the Board or if not so urged, unless there were reasonable grounds for failure to do so. Costs shall not be allowed against the Board of Appeal unless it appears to the court that it acted with gross negligence, in bad faith. or with malice in making the decision appealed from.

#### SECTION VIII. TURNING ZONES.

All that portion of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, lying within two miles of the limits of the Winnebago County Airport, and lying in-between and not being a part of the Airport Approach Zones, hereinbefore described in Section III of this Ordinance, shall be classified, for purposes of this Ordinance, as "Turning Zone Areas" In said Turning Zone Areas no structure whatever, or tree, shall be permitted to protrude above the following limits:--From the boundary of the Airport, for a distance of one-half mile away, there shall be no obstruction, structure, or tree above 75 feet in height; from one-half mile away to two miles away, no obstructon, structure, or tree shall protrude above a 30:1 slope line up from the 75 foot height limitation heretofore prescribed

for the distance from the limits of the Airport to one-half mile away any structure, tree, or obstruction protruding above the limits prescribed in the previous paragraph shall be deemed unlawful, and shall be in the previous paragraph shall be deemed unlawill, and shall be punished, and have the same consequences as are provided for in Sec-tion IV and succeeding sections of the within Ordinance. PROVIDED FURTHER that the provisions of Section V, VI, and VII of this Ordinance shall apply to structures and trees unlawful under the section, as well as under other sections of this Ordinance. SECTION IX. ENFORCEMENT The Aviation Committee of the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County shall be the administrative agency responsible for the enforcement of this Ordinance. The said Committee shall have power to make such rules and resulations as may be necessary for

power to make such rules and regulations as may be necessary for administering this Ordinance.

SECTION X. REMEDIES Any violation of this Ordinance may be restrained by any court of competent jurisdiction, in a suit by the administrative agency and charged with the enforcement of this Ordinance or any county officer of Winnebago County; in such action, the court shall adjudge to the plaintiff such relief by way of (injunction which may be mandatory) or otherwise as may be proper under the facts and circumstances of the case in order to fully effectuate the purposes of this Ordinance.

SECTION XI. ACQUISITION OF AIR RIGHTS

In any case in which it is desired to remove, lower or otherwise terminate a nonconforming use, or whenever it appears advisable that the necessary approach protection be provided by acquisition of prop-erty rights rather than by airport zoning regulations, the County of Winnebago may acquire by purchase, grant, or condemnation and in the manner provided by law, such air right, easement, or other estate or interest in the property or nonconforming use in question as may be necessary to effectuate the purposes of this ordinance.

SECTION XII. PENALTIES

Any person found guilty of a violation of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not to exceed \$500.00, or by imprisonment in the County Jail of Winnebago County for a period of not to exceed six months. Each and every day that an unlawful obstruction or object of natural growth shall exist shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION XIII. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the Ordinance, which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable.

## SECTION XIV. APPROVAL BY TOWNSHIPS AND TIME OF TAKING EFFECT.

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the time that it shall have been duly approved by the townships of Winnebago County in which there is situated lands affected by this Ordinance, and after this Ordinance shall have been duly passed by the County Board of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, and after its date of publication of publication.

WHEREAS, the Sheriff and Coroner's Committee believes that ambulance service for Winnebago County is essential for highway safety. transportation of indigent persons to hospitals, and other institutions for the county, and that the service as heretofore rendered should be maintained and continued.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, that the Sheriff and Coroner's Committee is hereby authorized and directed to make ar-rangements with Art Miller for the services of an ambulance in Winne-bago County for the purposes of rendering efficient service to persons injured in highway accidents, transportation of the indigent sick and disabled, and such other service as said ambulance can perform par-ticularly for the benefit of persons being injured beyond the corporate ticitiarly for the benefit of persons being infined beyond the corporate timits of municipalities in said county, but said service not to be un-necessarily limited to the territory exclusive of the municipalities, and the Commttee be authorized to enter into a contract with Art Miller providing for said services, the terms and condition of said contract to be agreed upon by the said Committee and the said Art Miller, and entersting County the said committee and the said Art Miller, and to be arreed upon by the said committee and the said Art Miller, and wherein Winnebago County shall not be called upon to pay more than \$1,000.00 per year for said service; the said Committee is authorized to provide in said contract that the said Art Miller shall be permitted to house the ambulance at the Court House Garage, without charge during the term of the said contract and providing, further, that the said Art Miller should be entitled to retain such fees for his services from private individuals and insurance companies and otherwise as said Art Miller should be entitled to retain such fees for his services from private individuals and insurance companies, and otherwise, as he might be able to collect for his services. Said contract shall further provide that the said Art Miller shall efficiently perform all service reasonably requested of him by the duly authorized heads of the de-partments of Winnebago County, and said contract shall further re-quire the said Art Miller to fully insure said ambulance and persons operating the same against liability; said contracts of insurance to likewise adequately protect the county from liability from any opera-tion of said ambulance. tion of said ambulance.

#### BLACK-OUT ORDINANCE

A GENERAL ORDINANCE OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY REGULATING BLACK-OUTS AND PROVIDING FOR AUXILIARY POLICEMEN AND OTHER EMERGENCY MATTERS RELATING TO BLACK-OUTS AND AIR RAIDS.

The following Resolution No. 5 was presented:

WHEREAS, a state of war exists between the United States of America and Japan, Germany, Italy, and other nations, and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States has proclaimed that an invasion or predatory incursion is threatened by the empire of Japan, by Germany, and Italy; and

WHEREAS, in the event of an emergency attack or invasion upon the United States, the State of Wisocnsin and the County of Winnebago may be threatened with danger to the lives and property of the inhabitants of said county:

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN, DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

An air raid warning signal shall consist of a series of short blasts from sirens, whistles or other noise making devices continuing for approximately two minutes, or by word of mouth from an auxiliary police-man, or other person duly authorized by the Winnebago County Coun-cil of defense, or Sheriff's Department of said county.

The "all-clear" signal shall consist of one long blast, continuing

for approximately two minutes, or by like verbal warning.

п.

In the event of an air raid warning:

(a). The drivers of all automobiles, buses, trucks, and other motor vehicles of all kinds, without discrimination because of enumeration, including motorcycles and bicycles:

(1). Shall immediately pull over to the curb or roadside, turn off the engines or motors, and leave such vehicles stand until the "allclear" signal is given; provided that emergency vehicles readily identifiable as such, such as fire engines, ambulances, and governmental or public utility operated trucks, or police cars, physicians' automobiles, and other vehicles carrying insignia, or vehicles operated by drivers wearing insignia approved and issued by the Winnebago County Council of Defense, shall not be required to stop when engaged in emergency operations.

(2). Shall, if the air raid warning is given between sunset and sunrise, immediately turn off all lights and keep them turned off until the "all-clear" signal is given; provided that the emergency vehicles as hereinbefore defined shall not be required to turn off their lights if they are dimmed, hooded or masked in a manner approved by the Winnebago County Council of Defense. In the case of an announced test or trial blackout such emergency vehicles may proceed with lights on without being dimmed, hooded or masked.

(3). Shall not park in front of any fire exit, fire plug, fire engine house, hospital entrance or at a street intersection.

(4). Shall not block the center of any street, or stop opposite to or so close to a bus or emergency vehicle as to impede the free flow of traffic engaged in emergency operations.
(b). The operators of all buses and of such railroad trains or loco-

(1). The operators of all buses and of such railroad trains or locomotives as are being operated upon or along the streets or highways of Winnebago County shall immediately bring them to a stop and shall not proceed until the "all-clear" signal is given. If an air-raid warning is given between sunset and sunrise such operators shall also immediately put out all lights and keep them out until the "all-clear" signal is given. No stop shall be made so as to block any street intersection of the entrance to any fire engine house.

#### III.

Whenever an air raid warning is given between sunset and sunrise: (a). All lights outside or visible from the outside of any building,

(a). All lights outside or visible from the outside of any building, either through doors, windows, skylights or otherwise, shall be immediately put out and kept out until the "all-clear" signal is given Lights inside any building may be kept on or turned on only where through the use of shades, blinds, curtains, blankets, screens, paint, paper, cardboard or otherwise no lighting is visible from the outside. This rule shall apply to all buildings of every kind and description including, but not limited to, dwellings, residences, apartments, apartment houses, houses, boarding houses, lodging houses, stores, office buildings, warehouses, manufacturing establishments, industrial plants, railroad stations, schools, churches, hospitals and other institutions. The occupant of any portion of a building shall be responsible for the observance of this rule as to such portion thereof as he may occupy. If one occupies to which the public is permitted or invited or as to any portion of which there is a common use by the occupants thereof, the owner, lessee, or the person or persons in charge of the operation thereof. In the case of vacant buildings or vacant portions of buildings or vacant portions of buildings or vacant portions of the sons in charge to responsible for the owner, lessee of vacant buildings or vacant portions of hereof, as the case may be, as he shall be responsible for the observance of the observance of the original buildings or vacant portions of buildings, the owner, lessee or the person or persons in charge thereof shall be responsible for the observance of the original buildings or vacant portions of buildings or vacant

(b). No door, window or other exit shall be opened if the opening of the same will allow light to be visible from the outside.

(c). All lights on any sign, bill-board, pier or other similar structure shall be immediately put out and kept out until the "all-clear" signal is given. The owner, the lessee or the persons in charge

signal is given. The owner, the ressee of the person or persons in charge of the operation of such sign, bill-board, pier or other similar structure, as the case may be, shall be responsible for the observance of this rule. (d). All street, traffic and beacon lights and other public lights on and in the streets, lanes, alleys, squares, parks and bridges of Winne-bago County (except those which are dimmed or hooded in a manner ourproved by the Winnebage County council about the light being approved by the Winnebago County Council of Defense) shall be im-mediately put out and kept out until the "all-clear" signal is given; such extinguishment to be made in accordance with plans adopted by the Winnebago County Council of Defense.

(e). All other lights, including warning or danger signals, shall be immediately put out and kept out until the "all-clear" signal is given; immediately put out and kept out until the "all-clear" signal is given provided, however, that warning or danger signals may remain lighted in such manner as may be approved by the Winnebago County Council of Defense. The owner, the lessee or the person or persons in charge of the operation of such lights, as the case may be, shall be responsible for the observance of this rule. In the case of an announced test or the labelout morning and danger size area more around lighted without trial blackout, warning and danger signals may remain lighted without being dimmed, hooded or otherwise masked.

#### IV.

In order to carry cut effectively the provisions of the foregoing rules (a). No occupant of any building or of any portion thereof shall permit such building or such portion thereof as he may occupy to be lighted or illuminated (either on the outside, or on the inside in such

way that such lighting or illumination is visible from the outside) between sunset and sunrise unless while so lighted or illuminated there is tween sunset and sunrise unless while so lighted or illuminated there is stationed in such building or such portion thereof, as the case may be, a person or persons capable of and responsible for putting out the lights or making them invisible from the outside in the event an air raid warning or signal for a blackout is given. This rule shall apply to every occupant of any building whatsoever, including but not limited to dwellings, residences, apartments, apartment houses, hotels, boarding houses, todging houses, stores, office buildings, warehouses, manufac-turing establishments, industrial plants, railroad stations, schools, churches, hospitals and other institutions. In the case of hotels, office buildings, apartment houses, lodging houses, and other buildings, apartment houses, lodging houses, boarding houses and other buildings to which the public is permitted or invited or as to any portion of which there is a common use by the occupants thereof, the owner, lessee, or the person or persons in charge of the operation there-of, as the case may be, shall be responsible for the observance of this rule as to all portions of the building to which the public is permitted or invited or as to which there is a common use by the occupants thereof. In the case of vacant buildings or vacant portions of buildings, the owner, the lessee or the person or persons in charge thereof shall be responsible for the observance of this rule with respect to such vacant buildings or vacant portions thereof, as the case may be, as he shall own, lease or have in his charge.

(b). No owner, lessee or person or persons in charge of the opera-tion, as the case may be, of any sign, bill-board, pier or similar struc-ture, street, traffic or beacon light or other public light on and in the streets, lanes, alleys, squares, parks or bridges of Winnebago County, or of any other light, including a warning or danger signal, shall permit the same to be illuminated or lighted between sunset and sunrise unless such owner, lessee or person in charge has made adequate arrangements for immediately putting out the same in the event of an air raid or blackout signal or alarm; provided, however, that street lights, traffic signals, beacon lights, warning or danger signals may remain lighted Signais, beacon lights, warning or tanger signals may remain lights during a blackout if they are dimmed, hooded or masked in a manner approved by the Winnebago County Council of Defense. Until a plan for the extinguishment, dimming or hooding of such street lights, traffic lights, beacon lights and warning or danger signals has been adopted by the Winnebago County Council of Defense, they may remain lighted between sunset and sunrise.

v.

Any light displayed contrary to the provisions of this ordinance

constitutes a public nuisance, and when deemed necessary, in order to protect life or property during a blackout or air raid, either the sheriff, undersheriff, members of the Winnebago County Highway police force, or duly appointed auxiliary policemen of Winnebago County, are au-thorized and directed to enter upon any premises, using reasonable force, and extinguish lights, and take other necessary action to make effective any and all of the provisions of this ordinance.

The Sheriff of Winnebago County may appoint, for a specified time, as many auxiliary policemen, without pay, from among Winnebago County residents as may be deemed advisable for service in connection with any blackout or air-raid protection measure, and he may also appoint a requisite number of such auxiliary police to act as traffic officers to enforce the provisions of this ordinance. During the term of service of such auxiliary police, and during any air-raid blackout or while otherwise acting under the direction of the Sheriff they shall have the powers, privileges, and duties of Sheriff's deputies. They must wear the prescribed identifying emblem, and it shall be unlawful for any such auxiliary police of filter to attempt to carry out any order, rule. or regulation when he is without such identifying emblem. The Sheriff of Winnebago County may appoint, for a specified time, rule or regulation when he is without such identifying emblem.

#### VIT

No person shall wear, exhibit, display, or use for any purposé any arm band, badge, emblem, uniform, insignia, or other indentification or credential issued, approved, or authorized by the Winnebago County Council of Defense unless he shall be entitled to wear, exhibit, display, or use the same under the rules and regulations of such Council, nor shall any person falsely personate any auxiliary policeman or member of said Council or other assistant, aide, or helper appointed by the said Council.

#### VIII.

It shall be the duty of the auxiliary police to enforce the provisions of this ordinance. It shall be unlawful for any person to refuse or fail to comply with any lawful order, signal, or direction of such an auxiliary policeman appointed as hereinbefore prescribed.

#### TX

No person shall utter, publish sound, or otherwise simulate any warning of an enemy attack, any warning of a test or trial blackout, any signal of the end of an attack or blackout, or any other official signal, unless authorized to do so by the Winnebago County Council of Defense, and anybody who shall perform any of said acts, unless authorized by the Winnebago County Council of Defense, shall be deemed guilty of a violation of this ordinance, and shall be subject to the penalties hereinafter prescribed.

#### X.

This ordinance shall apply to all that part of Winnebago County, and all persons found therein without and beyond the corporate limits of the Cities of Oshkosh, Neenah, and Menasha, and the incorporated Villages of Omro and Winneconne.

#### XI

Neither the County of Winnebago, nor its agents, representatives, officers, or auxiliary police, who, in good faith, carry out, comply with, or attempt to comply with any provision hereof, shall be liable for any damage sustained by either persons or property as the result of said activity.

#### XII.

This ordinance shall not be construed so as to conflict with any State or Federal Statute, nor with any military or naval rule or reg-ulation. ulation.

XIII. It is the intention of the County Board of Supervisors of Winne-bago County that each separate provision of this ordinance shall be deemed independent of all other provisions herein, and it is further the intention of such County Board that if any provision of this ord-inance shall be declared to be invalid that all other provisions thereof shall remain valid and enforceable.

PENALTIES. Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misde-meanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500,000, or by imprisonment for not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

In case of an announced test or trial blackout, industries or plants producing for the way effort shall turn out unnecessary lights, but shall not be required to black out or suspend operation.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and date of publication.

#### PRELIMINARY COUNTY FAIR REPORT-1942

The following Report No. 8 was read:

To the Honorable, the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin:

Gentlemen

Herewith follows my 24th Annual Preliminary Report of the Winnebago County Fair and Exposition. The final report will be the Auditor's Report, which will be filed as usual in the County Clerk's office, when completed later in the year.

The 1942 Winnebago County Fair was built almost entirely around the war effort. When it was suggested last June that the 1942 fairs might be called off on account of the war, there was a large state-wide might be called off on account of the war, there was a large state-whee massmeeting called at the stock pavilion at the College of Agriculture in Madison to discuss the subject from the viewpoint of the entire state. In 25 years of active fair work, I have always realized the good benefits derived from fairs, but never before this massmeeting did I realize that the people of the state of Wisconsin regarded their fairs so highly as they do. It was the unanimous opinion of this massmeeting that the 1942 fairs should be held, and that the fairs could be of great benefit in the war effort. war effort.

The officers, directors and superintendents of the Winnebago County Pair immediately began to build our 1942 Fair around the war effort, and I will leave it to your judgment as to the job that they accomplished. The following objectives were first set up: 1. Stimulate food production through the arbitist of livestock and

1. Stimulate food production through the exhibits of livestock and farm crop exhibits.

2. Exhibit booths on National Defense and promote sale of war stamps and war bonds.

3. Promote large health exhibits and show how important is health in winning any war.

4. Exhibit booths on Red Cross.

5. Booths and exhibits on nutrition, which has recently been recognized by our entire nation as of vital importance in winning the war.

All of these objectives were carried out with excellent cooperation at our 1942 Fair, and I wish to especially praise the 4-H Club booth on nutrition and the national defense exhibits. Our Fair this year experienced considerable of rain and cold weather, which of course had a tondard to exclude a public action.

weather, which of course had a tendency to reduce receipts on both ad-missions and midway rides and shows. Col. Schneiler of Neenah, who had charge of midway rides and shows. Col. Schneiler of Neenah, dehad charge of midway attractions, reported over \$1,200.00 from that dehad charge of midway attractions, reported over \$1,200.00 from that up partment. Carl Fugleberg, Treas., reported over \$12,000.00 in ticket sales. Geo. Ryf, Asst. Sec'y., reported \$359.40 on stall and pen rent and H. J. Glass, Supt. of Speed, reported \$420.00 on race entries, these entries all being added to the race purses. The major item of expenditures was \$5,027.39 for premiums paid. All items of expense coming under the headings of judges, police, superintendents, ticket sellers, ticket takers, electrical, race purses, attractions, music, advertising, printing and maintenance, will be classified by the auditor in his final report and be filed with you as well as the state department, as has been the usual custom, later in the year. Any further information on any detail may be had from your Secretary, who maintains records in detail, and will be glad at any time to go over these records with any County Board member or fair patron.

The maintenance of buildings and grounds has year-around atten-tion. Three buildings were given a coat of paint and repair during 1942. Substantial repairs amounting to over \$1,000.00 were made on the grandstand. Our fair plant is safe for our patrons and is an outstanding credit to Winnebago County.

In mentioning the fair's contribution to the war effort, we must mention that \$2,540.00 of the \$5,000.00 paid out for premiums, was invested by exhibitors in war stamps and bonds; and also a check for \$1,542.71 was sent by the Fair Association to the U.S. Government for tax on admissions.

Our 1941 Fair, with excellent weather, showed a profit, according to the auditor, of \$3,633.55. It therefore was not necessary to ask the County Board for any maintenance money whatsoever at the last No-vember session. This year, with rainy and cold weather, I predict that the auditor will show us around even. For this reason, it was voted by our Fair Board at its last meeting that we ask for \$2,500.00 maintenance

in your coming budget. The County Fair Committee of the County Board of Supervisors attended all the Fair Board Meetings and rendered valuable assistance. Much credit is due all the individuals and organizations that have given most excellent cooperation in making our 1942 Fair function with the war effort. Trusting that this fine spirit of cooperation may continue in the future, I respectfully submit this preliminary report. TAYLOR G. BROWN, Secretary of Fair.

# WINNEBAGO COUNTY SALVAGE DRIVE

Mr. Robert C. Heffernan.

Winnebago County Agricultural Agent, Oshkosh, Wisconsin. Dear Sir:

Inasmuch as you are in very close contact with the County Board during its current session, I am taking the liberty of asking you to make the following report to the Board on behalf of the Salvage Committee concerning the recent Winnebago County Scrap Drive. If there are any questions concerning this report, I trust that you will feel free to con-tact me and, of course, if it is necessary I will be only too glad to ap-pear before the County Board myself. As I reported to you in our preliminary report dated Nov 18 the

As I reported to you in our preliminary report dated Nov. 18, the drive netted 166 tons of scrap. While this figure does not represent by any means what can be collected in the rural areas, it is in itself a handthe interests of the activities of the American Red Cross. As I have stated before, the quality of the scrap was not up to our

excectations, but even so we realized in the 166 tons—39% of so-called heavy scrap and 61% of light—composed of wire, sheet tin, etc. On this basis we collected 100 tons of light scrap and 66 tons of heavy scrap, and in accordance with the agreed terms of sale we were paid \$5.00 a ton for the light and \$10.00 a ton for the heavy, making a breakdown of \$500.00 received for the light scrap and \$660.00 received for the heavy craps which are a crapt total acousts \$1 15000

Scrap, which as a grand total equals \$1,160.00. As you know, the Salvage Committee incurred certain necessary out-of-pocket expenses in connection with the publicizing of this cam-paign. These were kept at a minimum and are made up entirely of printing bills and paper. The advertising consisted of posters and bills that were distributed to every farm home in the county and flyers distributed throughout the schools. The breakdown for this expense is \$79.75 for the printing of above material, and the cost of the paper stock as billed to us is \$44.00, making a total of \$123.75 for expenses.

Deducting from the principal sum of \$1,160.00 the expense item of \$123.75, leaves a net proceed figure of \$1.036.25, which sum of money has been turned over to Mr. Earl Fuller, County Treasurer.

In conclusion, I would like to convey through you to the members of the County Board the appreciation of the Salvage Committee for the to the control board the appreciation of the Salvage committee for the cooperation of the Board, not only as a unit, but as individual members in their participation in this recent scrap drive. I would also like to bring to the attention of the Board the splendid cooperation rendered the drive by the County Highway Department and by yourself, the County Agricultural Agent.

In these foreclosure actions the Committee has had a meeting, to obtain all facts pertaining to said actions, viewed the property being foreclosed, and filed Findings and Recommendations with the Clerk of Court wherein such action is pending. In a few instances we have been able to affect an amicable settlement of the differences be-tween the parties to the action, and have thus avoided immediate fore-closure of the property.

The number of miles traveled during the year 1942 was 45, and the expenses of said committee have been very small during the year, to wit, the sum of \$47.74.

The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors met pursuant to ad-journment and was called to order by Chairman J. F. Shea. Full board present with the exception of Supervisors Crowley,

### SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON COMMITTEES

#### The following Report No. 1 was read:

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

Gentlemen:

Your committee, consisting of the undersigned Chairman of the County Board, County Clerk, and District Attorney, begs leave to re-port that they have considered the resolution adopted at the November session resolution the attorney. session, requesting that they prepare a set of rules to govern the varicus committees of the County Board, and requesting that the undersigned committee makes recommendations.

Your committee further reports that after giving the matter study, the members feel that they could not wisely discharge all their obl-gations at the present time, without further discussion of this matter with the County View with the County Board.

Your committee feels it advisable to consolidate the committees of the Winnebago County Board and re-assign the duties, to the end that there be fewer committees, the undersigned feeling that there is a good deal of duplication of the functions at the present time, and that the Winnebago County Board and the time the present time, the present Winnebago County Board could function with fewer than the present number of committees.

The committees. The committee also feels, on the other hand, that the members of the County Board might not agree, and therefore the committee herein makes certain recommendations for discussion. Your committee fur-there reports that after the Board has indicated what the consensus of opinion of the Board is on the metter herein emerged on that they opinion of the Board is on the matters herein reported on, that they will draft mile and is on the matters herein reported on, that they will draft rules for the committees that the Board feels are essential, that the same will be ready for presentation at the May re-organiza-tion session of the Board.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

1. It is suggested that the Abstracter and Register of Deeds' Committee be abolished, and such functions as it has exercised in the past be exercised by some other committee.

2. That the Aviation Committee be continued, and that its duties consist in the development of the Winnebago County municipally-owned Airport, subject to such regulations as the County Board shall, from time to time, impose, and using such funds as from time to time shall be made available by the County Board. As long as the Airport is under development at least the committee feels that there should be a sep-arate committee to look atte arate committee to look after it.

3. The committee feels that the following standing committees could be consolidated into one or two standing committees:-Bonds and Sal-aries Bladget into one or two standing committees:-Bonds and sand aries, Budget, Finance, General Accounts, Insane, and Per Diem and Mileage. We feel that the functions of the afore-mentioned committees are similar. Heretofica the are similar. Heretofore the Budget Committee has a more or less routine function of mine the Budget Committee has a more or less routine function of going through the mechanics of setting up the budget. They use little or no dimensional the mechanics of setting up the budget. use little or no discretion in this matter, and include in the tentative budget all budget requests. The Bonds and Salaries Committee, as a matter of practice, assume matter of practice, assumes the responsibility for making recommenda-tions to the Board on matters affecting salary. Alhough this could be a separate function, there is no reason why one or two committees, who have financial problems of the county in general under their jurisdiction, could not assume this.

The Finance Committee, at the present time, busies itself with the dog claims, and with the promulgation of the recommended final budget, which is also a strictly financial matter, and there is no reason why this committee, for instance, could not assume the functions heretofore exercised by the Budget Committee.

The General Accounts Committee has the usual function of auditing claims against the county, which are not disposed of by some other committee, such as the Insane Accounts Committee. The functions of both General Accounts and Insane Committees are identical, except that the Insane Accounts and Healte Committee handles one particular type of claim, whereas the General Accounts Committee handles a dozen or more different types. There is no reason why the General Accounts Committee couldn't handle insane, as well as other accounts.

The Per Diem and Mileage Committee goes over the bills of the su-pervisors for their own per diem and mileage, and there is no reason why General Accounts Committee couldn't handle this, too.

It is possible that the work of this group of committees could be delegated to one committee, or perhaps two, but it seems hardy neces-sary to have as many as we have. 4. We recommend the continuation of the Education Committee. 5. We recommend the continuation of the Equalization Committee.

but recommend that it be consolidated with the Tax Deed Committee. There is no reason why the Tax Deed Committee could not handle the few duties which are imposed upon the Equalization Committee. 6. We recommend the continuation of the Winnebago County Fair

c. We recommend the considuation of the winner age coulty Fair Committee, as that committee has the important duty of examining the business of the Winnebago County Fair, and the manner of ex-penditures of the annual appropriation which the County Board always has made, and probably will, in the future make, in support of the Winnebago County Fair. There doesn't seem to be other particular com-pittee to excessive it with We had considered consolidation with the mittee to associate it with. We had considered consolidation with the Agricultural Committee, but feel that the latter is an entirely separate committee, having several members who are not necessarily members of the County Board.

7. With regard to the Illegal Assessment Committee, it seems this committee could also be consolidated with the Tax Deed Committee and Equalization Committee. All three of these committees work more or less with the County Treasurer. He is familiar with their duties, and there appears no reason why all functions could not be consolidated under one committee. This would not mean the lapse of any of the governmental duties imposed upon any of these committees, but would merely mean that one body of men, constituting one committee, could handle all of them.

8. We recommend the consolidation of the Insurance and Investments Committees. The Investment Committee has certain statutory ments Committees. The investment Committee has certain statutory duties in regard to the investment of county monies, under which the committee advises with the County Treasurer. The Insurance Commit-tee performs substantially the same functions with regard to seeing to it that there is adequate insurance on county property. Both commit-tees have, in the past, acted more or less as advisors to the County Treasurer. Ordinarily, except when a particular problem arises, the two existing committees are not particularly busy, but if the work were con-solidated, and the two committees emerge as one, to be known as the solidated, and the two committees emerge as one, to be known as the Insurance and Investment Committee, an improvement would be effected,

9. With regard to the Judiciary and Legislative Committee, we do not recommend any change for the present. Although we note that several of the counties get along without this committee, it, nevertheless, has performed functions in the past which it seems logically should be delegated to it, and its duties have been those which one committee could more or less specialize in.

10. The Justices and Constable Committee could be consolidated with the Sheriff's and Coroner's Committee. The functions of the for-mer have been to allow the accounts of the several Justices of the Peace and Constables in the County for work performed on behalf of the state and county. The Sheriff's and Coroner's Committee has a similar function, in auditing bills coming in from the Sheriff's Department, and there is no reason, if the Board wishes, why the two could not be consolidated. On the other hand, they do not have to be, as the work of the two committees is sharply differentiated. It would merely mean additional duties on the larger committee as consolidated. We have not come to any definite conclusion on this, but suggest it to the Board for consideration.

11. With regard to the Poor and County Home, it is suggested that the poor bills should be audited by the Social Security Committee. We feel that the County Home Committee could be consolidated with the Sanatorium Committee and the Insane Committee, to the end that one committee could function and oversee the county-owned Asylum, Home, and Sanatorium. The functions of overseeing the three institutions have been somewhat similar, and the committee would have an opportunity to specialize in this type of service.

12. We recommend the consolidation of the Rules and Printing Committees. The committees heretofore have been inactive the greater part of the year each year, and there is no reason why they couldn't be consolidated.

13. We recommend the continuance of the Public Buildings Committee, with substantially the same functions as they have performed in the past.

In the past. 14. We feel, with regard to the Seed Loan Committee, that the same ought to be abolished, if it can be done. We understand that only two seed loans went through last year, and probably the rate will not increase much this year. Under Federal regulations loans of this character apparently have to have the approval of a responsible committee in the county. This is a Federal matter, however, and if the Agricultural Committee could assume this obligation it wouldn't be a major increase in its duties, and it doesn't seem that the continuance of the Seed Loan Committee, as a standing committee, is justified, with only two seed loans going through in an entire year.

15. We feel that the Sherift's and Coroner's Committee should be continued, as its functions are important, and are sufficient to occupy the full attention of one committee. There could be added to it the duties heretofore performed by the Justices' and Constables' Committee, if the County Board wants to add them.

16. We feel that the Social Security Committee should be consolidated with the Insane and County Home Committees, as hereinbefore suggested.

17. We feel that a study indicates the duties of the Agricultural Committee, and we do not care to add to its duties, except as we have suggested, that they might be able to assume the seed loan approval functions, if the Agricultural Committee elected to do so.

18. With regard to the County Highway Committee, its duties are set out in the Statutes, and we feel that it should continue to perform the duties that it has in the past, and that its work should not be consolidated at the present time with any other committee.

For the information of this County Board, we wish to report that we have examined the committee set-ups of several other counties, and, in the first place, most of them have far less committees than we have. Winnebago County has 30 committees, Outagamie County appears to have 26, and some of the counties have less than one-third the number of committees that Winnebago County has, and for your further information, official directories of the other counties indicate that the committees of some other counties excise the functions that various committees exercise here, and in some cases they have two or three committees to handle a responsibility, where Winnebago County has, in the past, had one committee do the work.

There is not a great deal to be learned from these other committees, as each county seems to have its own problems, and seems to have different aspects of county government and public service which it likes to stress.

This report is made with the hope that the Board, through discussion, again indicates a plan which it would like to follow, and a comprehensive set of duties can be prepared for the May session, if and when the Board indicates what committees it wants to create, and the duties that it wishes to assign to each of those committees.
