November 15, 1892, 10 o'clock A. M.

Board met pursuant to the provisions of Sec. 664, Revised Statutes, and was called to order by C. W. Davis, Chairman.

The members took and subscribed the oath of office before C. D. Cleveland, County Judge.

Supervisor Schoetz moved that the rules of March 8, 1886, be adopted.

Supervisor Krueger moved to amend by prohibiting smoking during the session of the Board.

Amendment accepted and rules adopted.

On motion the Board proceeded to the election of a Chairman.

The Chairman appointed Supervisors Daly and Orchard as tellers.

On informal ballot the whole number of votes was 32, of which Supervisor Dichmann received 16 and Supervisor Davis 16.

Supervisor Krueger moved to adjourn to 9 A. M.

Motion lost by 16 yeas to 14 yeas.

On first formal ballot the number of votes cast was 30, of which Supervisor Dichmann received 14, Supervisor Davis 15, and Supervisor Schultz 1.

On second formal ballot the whole number of votes cast was 30, of which Supervisor Dichmann received 15, and Supervisor Davis 15.

Supervisor Schoetz moved to adjourn until 10 A. M.

Motion lost by 15 yeas to 15 yeas.

On third ballot the whole number of votes was 30, of which Supervisor Dichmann received 14 and Supervisor Davis 16.

Supervisor Dichmann moved to make the election of Mr. Davis unanimous; the clerk put the motion which prevailed.

Supervisor Davis thanked the members for the honor conferred by re-electing him to the position of Chairman, and asked their hearty support in completing the business before the Board.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin.

Your petitioners, members of the Board of Supervisors of town of Rushford in Winnebago County, State of Wisconsin, respectfully represent that, the town aforesaid has voted to build an iron bridge and repair and raise the piers of the north and south approaches to the draw bridge across the Fox River at the village of Eureka in said town of Rushford. And that the town has provided (\$1800) Eighteen Hundred Dollars, one-half of the cost of said improvement and that the total cost thereof will be more than one-fourth of one per centum of all property in said town according to the last equalized valuation of said town.

November 18, 1892, 9 o'clock A. M.

Board met pursuant to adjournment.

Chairman Davis presiding.

Present—full Board.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Accounts presented and referred to appropriate committees.

On motion by Supervisor Huxley, the Board decided to have a purchasing agent.

Supervisor Schoetz offered the following resolution.

Be it Herely Resolved by the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

That the sum of Eight Hundred Dollars (\$800) per annum be and the same is hereby appropriated to the County Clerk as an allowance for pay of Deputy for the term commencing on the first Monday in January, 1893, be it further resolved that the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$150) per annum be and the same is hereby appropriated to the Purchasing Agent of this county for the term commencing on the first Monday in January 1893, be it further resolved that the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) per annum be and the same is hereby appropriated to the Register of Probate for Clerk hire or Assistant for the term commencing on the first Monday in January 1893, be it further resolved that the sum of Three Hundred Dollars, (\$300) per annum be and the same is hereby appropriated to the County Treasurer for Clerk hire or Assistant for the term commencing on the first Monday in January 1893, be it further resolved that the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) per annum be and the same is hereby appropriated to the District Attorney for Clerk hire, office rent hire, traveling and other incidentals for the term commencing on the first Monday in January 1893, and be it further resolved that the payment of the appropriations aforesaid be made as heretofore quarterly at the time and in the manner that salaries of county officers are now paid.

On motion by Supervisor Orchard the resolution was divided and each part thereof considered separately.

On call of ayes and noes the salary of Deputy County Clerk was fixed at Eight Hundred Dollars, (\$800) that of Purchasing Agent at One Hundred and Fifty Dollars, (\$150), that of Deputy Register of Probate at Three Hundred Dollars, (\$300).

Supervisor Daly moved to make the salary of Assistant to the County Treasurer Five Hundred Dollars, (\$500.)

On call of ayes and noes motion lost by 8 ayes to 24 noes.

Supervisor Schoetz moved to fix the amount at Four Hundred and Fifty Dollars, (\$450). Motion lost by 7 ayes to 25 noes.

Supervisor Orchard moved to fix the amount at Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars, (\$350), which motion on call of ayes and noes prevailed by 31 ayes to 2 noes.

On motion District Attorney was allowed Three Hundred Dollars, (\$300), for clerk hire, office rent and other incidentals.

On motion and call of ayes and noes the resolution was adopted as amended by 32 ayes to one no.

Supervisor Huxley introduced the following resolution.

Resolved by the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

That the Chairman and Clerk of this County Board be and they are hereby authorized and instructed to issue a county order for the sum of Three Hundred Dollars, (\$300) to O. F. Chase, Register of Probate for Clerk hire, for the year ending December 31, 1892. The same being the amount paid for said purpose for the previous year of 1891.

On call of ayes and noes, it was unanimously adopted.

APPROPRIATION TO SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 9.

Supervisor Brooks offered the following and moved its adoption, which motion, on call of ayes and noes, unanimously prevailed.

Whereas, School District No. 9 in the town of Oshkosh has had taken from its tax roll lands occupied by the Northern Hospital and County Farm amounting to 620 acres, all of which is exempt from taxation, and whereas children from the County Farm are from time to time receiving the benefit of said school,

Therefore it is hereby ordered and determined that there be appropriated out of any money not otherwise appropriated the sum of twenty five dollars (\$25) from the County treasury, and the Chairman and Clerk of this County Board are hereby authorized to issue a county order for such amount.

Supervisor Huxley moved to make the election of County Officers the special business for 9 A. M., November 23d.

Supervisor Loope moved that the annual visit to the County Farm take place on Tuesday next.

BRIDGE APPROPRIATION.

Supervisor Howlett from Committee on Roads and Bridges reported favorably on the petition for new bridge at Eureka.

On call of ayes and noes the report was unanimously adopted as follows:
To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin:

The undersigned Committee on Roads and Bridges to whom was referred the petition of the Board of Supervisors of the town of Rushford in said county of Winnebago and state of Wisconsin, respectfully represent that the town aforesaid has voted to build or repair a certain bridge in the village of Eureka, and that the town has provided eighteen hundred dollars (\$1800) one-half the cost of said improvement respectively reports:

That we find that the town of Rushford has complied with all the requirements as set forth in said petition, according to law, in providing for the cost of said bridge; that the cost of said bridge improvements or repairs exceeds one-fourth of one per centum of all the taxable property in said town according to the last equalized valuation thereof, and that the county is under legal obligation to provide for one-half of the costs of said improvements.

Your committee would therefore recommend that the sum of eighteen hundred dollars (\$1800) or so much thereof as shall be necessary to pay for one-half the cost of said improvements, be and the same is hereby appropriated for the building or repairing of said bridge, according to the prayer of said petitioners, and that the Chairman of this Board appoint two Commissioners from towns outside of the town of Rushford, subject to the payment of a portion of such appropriation, who shall act for and in behalf of the county in the construction of such improvements and the disbursement of such appropriation; and that the Clerk of this Board be authorized and instructed to apportion, according to law, the tax for this appropriation to the following towns, to-wit: Algoma, Black Wolf, Clayton, Menasha, Neenah, Nekimi, Nepeuskun, Omro and Village, Oshkosh, Poygan, Rushford, Utica, Vinland, Winchester, Winneconne, Winneconne Village, and Wolf River.

The cost per capita including all improvements and all other expenses of the institution for the year is \$1.478 per week exclusive of farm products.

The total cost of the institution for the year including salaries of Physician, Matron and Superintendent, and all improvements added is \$8,779.09. From this deduct \$7,652.05, the amount due the county leaves a deficiency of \$1,127.04.

The crops have been very poor this year. In fact the poorest that was ever known to be raised on the poor farm. The farm being a low black soil, and the continuous rains through May and June drowned all field grains out.

Our garden was very good as you will see by the amounts of vegetables that was raised. We raised only a few potatoes on account of the rains just in the growing time. Corn was very poor as we were unable to plant until about the 20th of June. The amount of produce raised is as follows:

Gentlemen: Your committee to whom was referred the matter of looking after the equalization of Winnebago County before the State Board of Assessment, in the city Madison, would respectfully report:

That on the 24th of August your Committee went to Madison and were very courteously received by the State Board of Assessment, who listened to the reasons why Winnebago county should not be raised in the equalization. And from figures given your Committee at that time on real estate for said county to-wit: \$14,723,774, we believe that we have been successful in having Winnebago county fixed at \$13,724,248 a reduction of \$999,526 from what the Board had previously decided upon. Personal property \$4,413,752, making a total for Winnebago county of \$18,133,000.

COMMITTEE ON STATE EQUALIZATION.

Supervisor Huxley offered the following resolution:

Whereas, this Board did last year appoint a committee to represent the interest of Winnebago Co. before the State Board of Equalization, and

Whereas, the report of said committee shows that the committee were influential in securing justice to the tax-payers of the county,

Therefore Resolved, that the old committee consisting of the Chairman of this Board—C. W. Davis, and H. E. Huxley be, and they are hereby appointed to represent the interest of the county of Winnebago before the State Board of Equalization the coming year.

The Clerk put the motion which was unanimously adopted.

APPROPRIATION TO MENASHA.

Supervisor Schoetz offered the following resolution:

Whereas, Jacob Rhyner was a soldier of the late war who enlisted in Co. "D" 21st Wis. Inf. Vol. January 4th, 1864, and was transferred to 3d Wis. Inf. Vol., June 8th, 1865, and honorably discharged July 24th, 1865.

And whereas the said Jacob Rhyner was injured and was in need of aid and was confined to the county hospital of Winnebago county, and same was charged to the city of Menasha;

And Whereas, the County Board of Supervisors raised and levied the sum of thirty-six hundred dollars in the November session of the County Board for the year 1891 to aid Indigent Soldiers,

Be it therefore resolved by the County Board of Winnebago County, That the Soldiers Indigent Commissioners of said county are and they are hereby requested to issue an order for the sum of thirty-one and 51-100 dollars to said city of Menasha to reimburse said city to pay for said Jacob Rhyner for his expenses in said hospital if found to be just. And that the Clerk of this Board is hereby instructed to notify said Indigent Soldiers' Commissioners of this resolution.

Supervisor Bushnell moved to refer the resolution to the Soldier Commission. Motion lost by 15 ayes to 17 noes.

On call of ayes and noes the resolution was adopted by 31 ayes to 1 no.

REPORT FROM INDIGENT SOLDIER COMMISSION.

General T. S. Allen President of the Indigent Soldier Commission read and submitted the following report, which was referred to the Finance Committee.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wis.

Gentlemen:—The undersigned constituting the County Soldier's Relief Commission, have the honor to report the proceeding of said Commission during the year beginning Dec. 18th, 1891, and ending Nov. 11th, 1892, being 12 months.

Twelve meetings have been held during the year, it having been determined that a less number of meetings would not suffice to carry out the object of the law, which is to protect both those demanding relief and the interest of the county.

The number of soldiers or of the families of soldiers receiving regular, or in many cases, temporary assistance is as follows:

In Oshkosh 46, Rushford 3, Neenah 8, Winchester 2, Menasha 13, Vinland 2, Omro 6, Clayton 1, Winneconne 7, and Poygan 1.

A total of 89 being ten less in number than the previous year as appears from the Secretary's report accompanying this. The total amount expended during the past year is as follows:

Estimated balance Jan. 1st, 1893 after making the necessary appropriation in December is \$600.

The number of cases demanding relief is not materially changed from last report, while a few have been dropped, their places have been filled by others, and the prospect for the coming year is not favorable for a reduction in the number, which is being constantly increased, by increased age and necessity. Without this aid from the county fund, the families now assisted must be thrown back on the charities of the people, or forced to apply for a place upon the pauper list, a result which the present was intended to prevent.

Out of the whole number assisted the past year 54 received no pension at all, thirty-three received pensions varying from \$2.00 to \$12.00 per month, only twelve received the latter rate and then almost totally disabled from helping themselves. The average amount of pension received by the thirty-three is less than two dollars per week, which in no case will supply a family with eatables, saying nothing as to clothing, rent and other necessary expenses.

In view therefore of the above facts, we respectfully ask that the appropriation for the coming year, be fixed at the same amount as for the past year.

We would further state, that we have induced several to enter the soldier's home at Waupaca, and have assisted them with the necessary funds. That institution is doing a noble work; but as it admits no children, nor widows of soldiers, it can only be relied on for comparatively few cases.

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS' REPORT.

To the Honorable County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen:—It gives me pleasure to report that the schools are in a reasonable prosperous and healthy condition. They are taught by a body of bright, capable and earnest teachers who have due respect for their profession and a willing spirit for their work. Their purpose is not merely to secure a position in some manner, fill out their time, and draw their salary; but rather to be worthy of a good position, obtain good wages, and render full value in return.

In the past year there was an increase in wages over the preceding year, of \$3.20 per month for male teachers and 50 cents per month for female teachers. I think the rate of wages is still somewhat too low to secure and retain a body of teachers as high-grade as we could desire. Many of our best teachers leave the county each year; called away to fill more desirable positions at a higher rate of wages than can be had at home.

The "Course of Study" is being gradually introduced into the schools, and is meeting with more favor as it becomes better understood. The Town Clerk's report for the past year give eighteen as the number of schools organized in accordance with the Course of Study, as against ten so reported the preceding year. Neither report is correct, for I find that in visiting the schools that about one half is so organized in some degree. But in many cases teachers fail to leave sufficient records of such organization to warrant school officers to report schools as organized.

There were graduated in four schools as against two the year before.

The schools having graduates from the "Course of Study" is as follows: District No. 8 Algoma; District No. 8, Clayton; District No. 4, Menasha; and District No. 12, Rushford. Three new school houses are reported as having been built the past year. This suggests a subject of much importance. In a number of districts in the county better buildings are needed, and will probably soon be supplied. Many children are attending the same school houses that their father and mother attended when they were children. Twenty-five to thirty years measures the period of usefulness of the average school building. The second series of building must soon take the place of the first. The people are more prosperous at the present than when the first buildings were erected, and it is probable that the buildings to be constructed in the future will be somewhat more elaborate, convenient and comfortable than their predecessors. Parents provide homes for their children that are comfortable, neat and attractive. They do not wish to send their children to a place where their feet are freezing while their face is toasting; where the foul air is kept in because it is not as cold as that out doors; where they will be compelled to sit on a flat board with their feet off the floor, as some of us have done in years gone by. I cannot go into details concerning the construction of buildings; but a few words of general application may not be amiss. The location should be on high rolling ground, in a grove if possible. The yard should be at least a half an acre in extent, an acre would be very much better. The building should be set well back, leaving the play ground in front unbroken. The building should not be less than 24x36 feet in size, of a proportional height of ceiling, and built on an air tight stone foundation, so as not to allow the wind to blow under the floor. The floor itself should be double and made of closely matched lumber. The walls should be substantially and warmly built; sheeted with matched lumber, and covered with building paper. All windows should be at the sides; none in the front or rear, and they should be hung with weights. This arrangement is better for the pupils eyes, and give more room for black-board. One front door is probably better than two. There should be an addition divided up into two cloak and hat rooms and a wood shed. A convenient and not expensive arrangement that I have seen is a lean-to addition at the rear of the building, connected with the main room by two doors, opening into hat and cloak rooms. In these rooms should be a wash basin, towels and soap. The remainder of the addition is to be used for a wood-shed. The time is now gone by when it would be necessary for teachers and children to go out and dig wood out of a snow bank. There should be from forty to sixty feet of blackboard, reaching within thirty inches of the floor. The stove should be at one end of the room; the rear end, next the wood-shed is preferable, the teachers table should be at the other end. This is important. There should be two or three long seats arranged in front of the pupils desks for recitation purposes. The pupils' seats should be factory made; comfortable, and adapted to the varying sizes of the pupils. These suggestions are probably sufficient. They are not intended to make buildings cost more than they would otherwise, nor to limit school boards in exercising their tastes or means in styles or cost; but rather to call attention to important points in which mistakes are often made, and to make every school building more convenient for its purpose, and more comfortable for the pupils. I need not speak of the necessity of a reasonable supply of wall maps and other apparatus. Maps should not have patent spring rollers, but should be hung on the walls above the blackboard, if necessary, and always spread out to view. Racks with one map hanging over another should be avoided.

I have serious doubts of the great value of high priced anatomical, geographical and historical charts. While they can be made of some value, the cost is usually too great in proportion. The industrious school-supply agent might well be discouraged without much injury to the schools. The only good purpose that they serve is to induce school boards to buy something at two prices; whereas in their absence, in too many cases, nothing would be purchased. After the necessary building with the reasonably necessary apparatus is provided, then an organ; singing books; pictures for the walls; some simple statuary and so on, may be added as the tastes and means of the people may dictate. The school should be a pleasant home to the children during the years that are spent there.

About three-fourths of the schools observed Arbor day in some manner. In the greater number the observance consisted of brief appropriate essays, recitations and songs together with the planting of a few trees or shrubs; in some cases of a few plants, or only a flower bed. In a number of cases as many as a dozen trees were planted. The best Arbor day work was done at the Thompson's Corners school, where upwards of sixty trees were planted, mached and protected by lattice work. In this case the greater part of the work was done by the school board. In a few years the school house will be surrounded by a beautiful grove—a source of delight to the pupils and of pride to the people. It is an example worthy of emulation by every school board in the county.

School libraries also appear to be growing in favor. The following towns and villages report having withheld money for the purchase of library books: Algoma, Omro village, Vinland, Winneconne, Winneconne village, Winchester and Wolf River, against three so reporting for the preceding year. It is probable that the courts would hold the township library law to be mandatory upon school officers. Such was the position taken by the State department under Supt. Thayer. The present administration, while not disagreeing with that view, yet acted upon the theory that the law was so wise and beneficial that it would commend itself to popular favor in a short time without any compulsion. It is possible that a more vigorous policy may be adopted in the future for the purpose of reaching those towns and school districts where no cent is ever expended except under legal compulsion.

The total number of applications for certificates the present year was 303, an increase of 19 over the preceding year. The total number of certificates granted was 212, an increase of 26 over the preceding year. Of these sixty-five were limited to six months; 18 were for two years or more; the remainder, 129 were the ordinary third grade certificates, good for one year.

The total number of those who failed to pass was 91. Of these the majority recognized the fact

that a little more study will bring them up to the required mark, and that in the end it will be better both for themselves and for the schools. But from a certain portion of those who fail to pass, the superintendent is called upon to withstand a certain amount of unpleasant pressure calculated to make the issuing of certificates a matter of favor rather than of educational merit.

PETITION FOR WINCHESTER ROAD.

Supervisor Brightman presented the following petition.

To the Honorable County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Whereas, it appears from the affidavits of James H. Jones and William Hall, of said County that they were present when the County Commissioners of said County were called by a petition to relay a road called the Hortonville and New London Road, running across Rat River and Marsh, in section one

(1) Town of Winchester, running and being in some places within 12 rods of the east line of said town of Winchester and twelve rods west of the Town line of the town of Clayton.

And it appearing to us from said affidavit, and resolution attached and made a part hereof, that the Town Board of Winchester prior to this time took up this road to have it relaid on the town line between the Towns of Winchester and Clayton, as the Town of Clayton was as much interested in keeping up a good road and in fact more so than the Town of Winchester.

And it appearing to us that said two witnesses were present when the commissioners came to said Towns to relay said road, as aforesaid, that they distinctly recollect that the County Commissioners made a proposition after having looked over the Town lines between said Towns, admitted that the road ought to be laid in justice to the Town of Winchester on the Town line, as the road bed of the old road by travel and labor, had become solid to a great extent, and the contemplated new road, a great deal of it was springy and miry, and was a road of great necessity for the public travel to the cities of Oshkosh, Neenah and Menasha and the villages of Winneconne and Omro. And it was the regular traveled route for the lumbermen of these places in conveying their supplies into the pineries, in the northern part of Wisconsin.

And it appearing to us, that on the contemplated new route, the Commissioners admitting the great necessity of said road, immediately appropriated nine hundred dollars (\$900.00) to be laid out on the approach to Rat River, and to bridge said Rat River.

And it appearing to us from testimony of said two persons at the time that the said County Commissioners stated then and there that they entertained no doubts, whatever, and that the county Board would occasionally make an appropriation to assist the town of Winchester in keeping said road in good repair.

And it appearing to us that on the strength of the proposition so advanced and stated to the Town of Winchester, by said County Commissioners, whom the Town Board of Supervisors of the Town of Winchester believed had authority to make said representation and proposition, that the County would from time to time appropriate money to assist in keeping said highway in repair, accepted such proposition, and agreed in consideration thereof, to-wit:—That in consideration that the County Board would assist them in keeping up said highway, agreed with said County Commissioners, to not appeal from the decision made by said Commissioners, leaving said highway where it was finally laid, and did not appeal from such decision.

And it further appearing that since said road was laid, the Town records show that the Town of Winchester has paid for work and repairing said Hortonville and New London Road, running through section one (1) Town of Winchester, fifteen hundred and twenty-seven dollars and twenty-seven cents [\$1527.27] outside of the general road tax, by appropriations made by the Town of Winchester.

Therefore, Be it Resolved that there is hereby appropriated to the Town of Winchester, the sum of five hundred dollars, [\$500.00] out of any moneys in the County Treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to be expended by the Town Board of Supervisors of the Town of Winchester, in repairing said highway. Said money to be expended under the supervision of the Town Board of Winchester, and the Chairman of this Board and the Clerk are hereby authorized to issue an order upon the Treasury for the payment of said sum.

That they were present when the Commissioners came to said town to relay said road, across Rat River and Marsh, as aforesaid, that they distinctly recollect that the County Commissioners made the proposition after looking over the Town lines between said towns, admitted that the road ought to be laid, in justice to the Town of Winchester, on the town line, as the road bed of the old road, by travel and labor, had become solid to a great extent; and the contemplated new road, a great deal of it was springy and miry, it being such a necessary road for public travel to the cities of Oshkosh, Neenah and Menasha, and the Villages of Winneconne and Omro, and that it was the regular traveled route for the lumbermen of these places, in conveying their supplies into the pineries in the northern part of the State. That on the contemplated new route it would take at least three years to form as solid a road bed as there was on the old road; and said that they would relay it on the old route and did then and there appropriate nine hundred dollars [\$900] to be laid out on the approach to the River and to bridge the River.

And said Commissioners further stated at said time and place that they had entertained no doubts whatever but that the County Board would occasionally make an appropriation to assist the Town in keeping the road in good repair. That on the strength of the proposition so advanced to them by said County Commissioners, the Town Board of the Town of Winchester did then and there accept the proposition so advanced to them by the said County Commissioners, as aforesaid. And the Town Board of said Town of Winchester, in consideration of said proposition so advanced to them, and the representation made to them at the time by said County Commissioners, agreed that they, as such Town Board would not appeal from such decision, so made by the County Commissioners as aforesaid.

PLANS FOR NEW INSANE ASYLUM.

The committee on Poor and Poor Farm offered the following resolution:

Resolved by the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

That a committee of three be appointed to have plans and specifications drawn up for a County Insane Asylum, to be built on the County Farm. The said plans to provide for a building large enough to accommodate 200 inmates, and at a cost of about \$50,000.

Said committee to ascertain all necessary information pertaining to the building, and report at the next January session of the Board.

On motion by Supervisor Loope the resolution was accepted. Supervisor Loope then moved to amend by the following substitute:

TRUSTEES REPORT.

Supervisor Orchard submitted the following report which was accepted and ordered printed in the proceedings:

To the Honorable County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

The Trustees of the county Asylum and Poor Farm of Winnebago county beg leave to report.

For the statistical report of the inmates of the Institution for the year ending Oct. 31, 1892, we refer you to the detailed report of the Superintendent which is correct.

We have audited and allowed accounts amounting to \$757.90 for supplies of various kinds as set forth in detail in the report of the Superintendent.

The annual reports of the Superintendent of the Poor Farm and Asylum for the last two or three years show an increase in the cost to the county of maintaining that institution. The reason therefor may be found in part by reference to the increasing numbers who find shelter and support in the poor department. The report of the Superintendent shows that the item of board in that branch of the institution amounted to 584 weeks more than in the year of 1891. To this add a proportionate sum for clothing, and the increased outlay is explained and ample reason furnished your Trustees to ask for a larger appropriation for the County Asylum and Poor Farm.

Your attention is respectfully called to a resolution unanimously adopted by the Board of Supervisors Nov. 18, 1891, looking to the use of water from the State Hospital for all purposes necessary at the county farm.

The necessity of the daily use of water for flushing privies and water closets as a sanitary measure needs no argument, and as it seems to us, no time for securing from the state such a concession will ever be more opportune than the time between now and your March session, we earnestly urge prompt action.

In our opinion there should be an appropriation made for the purchase of drain tile, and a system of underdrainage adopted and carried out from year to year until the whole farm is thoroughly underdrained.

Your visit to the county farm last Tuesday enabled you to see the general good order and condition existing there at that time and no words of commendation of Superintendent or Matron are needed from us, farther than that in our visits to the farm the past year we have always found the same order and regularity existing.

Be it further Resolved.—That the Chairman of this County Board and the County Treasurer are hereby authorized and instructed to execute notes in their official capacity for said loan and for the payment of such notes the county of Winnebago shall be responsible.

That the sum of Three Hundred dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated to the World's Fair auxiliary committee of Winnebago County, to be expended by them as they deem best, to further the interests of Winnebago County, and that the Chairman and Clerk of this Board are hereby authorized and instructed to draw an order for Three Hundred dollars (\$300 00) in favor of Mr. Milan Ford, Chairman of said World's Fair auxiliary committee of said Winnebago County.

On call of ayes and noes the resolution was adopted by 17 ayes to 16 noes.

NEW INSANE ASYLUM.

The special business set for this hour, the consideration of the substitute as offered by Supervisor Loope was taken up, and adopted as follows:

Resolved, That the question of the advisability of taking steps looking to the erection of a county Asylum for Insane, with such estimates of the probable cost of such building, as they may be able to secure without cost to the county, be referred to a committee of three to report at their earliest practicable convenience

The Chairman appointed as a committee for plans and estimates: Supervisors Loope, Krueger and Dichmann.

AGREEMENT WITH SHERIFF.

The special business set for this hour, the report on the agreement with the Sheriff-elect for the board of prisoners, was taken up.

On motion by Supervisor Orchard the matter was referred back to the committee with instruction to report at this day's session.

Supervisors Dichmann and Mathewson tendered their resignation as members of the committee to make agreement with the Sheriff.

On motion the resignation was accepted by a vote of 16 ayes to 13 noes.

The Chairman appointed Supervisors Bushnell and Moore in place of the members resigned from said committee.

DEPOSIT OF COUNTY FUNDS.

Supervisor Huxley offered the following resolution and moved its adoption:

Resolved by the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Resolved:—That to this end a committee of three be appointed to make a selection of bank or banks to the best interest of the county and report at the January session.

Whereas, the St. Mary's Hospital of the city of Oshkosh has from time to time cared for non-resident poor without any charges to this county and, Whereas, we deem it a charitable institution for mankind, Be it Therefore

Resolved, by the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, That the sum of Fifty dollars (\$50 00) be and the same is hereby appropriated to said St. Mary's Hospital as a donation for its charitable work.

COMMITTEE ON STATE EQUALIZATION.

Supervisor Lomas offered the following resolution and moved its adoption, which motion prevailed by 23 ayes to 10 noes:

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

REPORT ON OFFICIAL BONDS.

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen:—We, the committee, to whom was referred the bonds of the Sheriff, Treasurer, County Clerk, Clerk of Courts, District Attorney, Coroner, Register of Deeds, County Surveyor and Register of Probate of said county, hereby respectfully report, that we have examined the same, both as to their form and sufficiency of surities, and find that the bonds of said officers, together with the oaths of office have been made and filed in accordance with the laws of the state of Wisconsin, and are sufficient, both as to form and the sufficiency of the surities, each and all severally.

We do further respectfully report, that there has been some report current that the bond of the County Treasurer, together with his oath of office had not been taken, given and filed within the time prescribed by law. Section 707, S. & B. Ann. Statutes makes it the duty of every county officer, before entering upon the duties of his office, and within twenty days after receiving official notice of his election or appointment, or if not notified within twenty days after the commencement of the term for which he was elected or appointed to execute and deposit his official bond. We cannot find any evidence outside of the statement of the Clerk, that the Treasurer received any notice of his election. We claim that an ordinary certificate of election issued by the County Clerk, sent by mail, is no sufficient notice to the officer, of his election to any office. That due proof of the service of said notice on the alleged officer should be on file in the County Clerk's office, who claims that said notice was served according to law. That a certificate of election is not an official notice of an election to an office. That the County Treasurer, the moment he takes possession of the office of Treasurer is concluded by the recital of his bond, from alleging that his title is defective, and there being no sufficient evidence before us that said County Treasurer ever received any official notice by the County Clerk of this county, that he was elected to said office, we must hold that he has twenty days within which to qualify after the beginning of the term of office to which he was elected, to wit:—Twenty days from the first day of January, A. D. 1893; and that his said oath and bond and deposit of the same with the County Clerk of this county, and the recording of the same in the Register of Deeds office, and the return thereof to the County Clerk, after having been recorded, is legal.

CARE OF COUNTY POOR.

The committee on Poor and Poor Farm offered the following resolution and Supervisor Krueger moved its adoption.

Resolved by the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

That hereafter no person or persons shall be received in the county Poor House, who has a contagious or venereal disease, of whatsoever name or nature. That hereafter when it shall have been ascertained by the County Physician of this county that any person or persons have been committed to and received into the county Poor House of this county had, at the time he or she was so committed, a venereal or contagious disease, it shall be and is hereby made the duty of the county Superintendent of the Poor, to immediately return or cause to be returned such diseased person to the town, city or village who caused such person or persons to be so committed as aforesaid, and that all extra charges of caring for such sick person so committed including medical aid and attendance shall be charged up to and collected of the town, city or village to which such diseased person shall be legally chargeable. That in all cases where any person or persons shall hereafter be committed and received as an inmate of the county Poor House of this county, who shall at the time of his or her committal be sick, or in anywise disabled or injured from other cause or disease or diseases other than contagious disease, all of the extra charges, care, nursing, medicines and medical treatment shall be made a charge to and collected from the town, city or village committing such sick or injured person. And in all cases where such a person shall have been so committed and received as aforesaid, whose residence shall not be in any town, city or village in the county but who shall be chargeable to some other county, the county in which it shall have been ascertained that such inmate has a legal settlement, shall be chargeable with the payment of such extra charges nursing and caring for such injured or sick person, who was so sick and injured at the time he or she was so committed and received as aforesaid.

That hereafter all towns, cities or villages committing any persons who shall be received as an inmate of the county Poor House, shall be chargeable with the clothing furnished to such inmate while at the Poor House, and shall likewise be chargeable with all burial and funeral expenses of such inmate, who shall die while an inmate of same, to be charged to and collected of such town, city or village, as other charges are now collected by law.

That no person or persons hereafter committed or attempted to be committed by any Justice of the Peace or other magistrate of this county as a vagrant or otherwise shall be received as an inmate of the county Poor House of this county and the Superintendent is hereby instructed to not receive any such person from any policeman or other officer bringing such person on a commitment to said Poor House and Justices of the Peace of this county are hereby requested and instructed to not commit vagrants or others by any sentence to the county Poor House of this county.

On motion the further consideration of the resolution was postponed until 9:30 A. M.

NEW ASYLUM.

The special business for this hour, the consideration of plans and specifications for the new Asylum building, was taken up.

To the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen:—Your special committee appointed at the last session to procure plans and specifications for a new county asylum, would respectfully report that they have procured such plans and specifications, which we herewith present to the Board for further action.

APPROPRIATION TO JOHN HEIMER. X

Deeming it best for the county as well as an act of charity, there is hereby appropriated for the purchase of an artificial limb for said Heimer, a sum not exceeding the sum of One Hundred and Twenty Five dollars to be spent for that purpose under the supervision of the County Physician. And the Clerk and Chairman of this Board are hereby instructed to issue an order for that amount upon the furnishing and completion of said limb to said Heimer.

TO MEMORIALIZE THE LEGISLATURE

Your committee has also selected a site for said building, to wit: East of the county poor house about 10 rods, the south end to commence at a point about 100 feet north of the hay barn, thence extending north; the front of the building to face the west.

The plans and specifications are those prepared by Wm. Waters. On receiving proposals for the building of said Asylum we find that the appropriation of this Board at the January session is not sufficient to put up the building for the accommodation of 150 inmates, and would therefore recommend that an additional appropriation of ten thousand dollars be made, making the total appropriation not to exceed sixty thousand dollars.

Your committee find on investigation that we can get the money necessary to put up the building at 4 per cent., and on long time. Your committee would therefore recommend that we secure the loan payable in twenty years. The first payment to be made in five years and equal annual payments thereafter.

By taking this course your committee are satisfied that the institution will pay for itself; without calling on the taxpayers of the county, as we have already been assured that, as soon as practicable after the completion of the building it will be filled with inmates.

OPINION BY DISTRICT ATTORNEY.

To the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen:—The only statute under which the county may borrow money is section 658, S. & E. Ann. Statutes, page 405, which provides that any county may issue bonds in the manner herein provided, for the following purposes:

First:—To provide for County Buildings.

I further report that I find by an examination by like doings of other county Boards involving the large expenditure that this does, that they ask for special legislation, so as to put it beyond a cavil of a doubt that they are authorized to make the expenditure. I advise such special legislation in this case.

For one special instance I refer the Board to Chapter 314, laws of 1889, entitled "An act to authorize the county of Dunn to borrow money" and which was to build an insane asylum. And several other instances too numerous to mention.

BLACK WOLF ROAD APPROPRIATION.

REPORT ON BILL, TO LEGISLATURE.

Supervisor Huxley from committee to prepare bill to the legislature submitted their report as follows:

To the County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Gentlemen:—Your committee to whom was referred the matter of preparing a bill to present to the legislature to legalize the acts of this county Board in regard to the loaning of money for the purpose of building a county insane asylum have performed the duty assigned to them and would report the following:

‘An Act to authorize the county of Winnebago to build an insane asylum and to borrow money to pay for the same.’

The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

Sec. 1:—The county of Winnebago is hereby authorized and empowered to build a county insane Asylum in said county; at a cost not to exceed Sixty thousand dollars.

Sec. 2:—The said county of Winnebago is hereby authorized and empowered for the purpose of building said county insane asylum to borrow a sum of money not to exceed Sixty thousand dollars, at a rate of interest not to exceed 5 per cent. per annum and payable within 20 years from April 1st, 1893, as follows: Said bonds shall be conditioned so that \$3750 of the amount borrowed shall become due and payable on the first day of April, 1898, and the further sum of \$3750.00 shall become due and payable on the first day of April in each and every year thereafter; until the whole sum borrowed shall have been paid. The interest shall be payable April first annually and said bonds and interest thereon shall be payable at the office of the county Treasurer of said county of Winnebago.

Sec. 3:—And the said bonds and each of them so to be issued by said Winnebago county shall be negotiated by a committee of three members of the county Board of Supervisors of said Winnebago county.

Sec. 4:—The said county of Winnebago shall annually during the continuance of said loan, raise by tax a sum sufficient to pay the interest thereon; and shall also raise in the same manner annually, after the loan shall have been made, a sum sufficient to pay the principal then about to become due. And the county clerk shall insert said amount in the tax roll and the same shall be collected and when so collected the same shall be applied in payment on said loan and interest and for no other purpose.

The Chairman and County Clerk of this Board are hereby authorized to issue bonds for said loan and affix the seal of said Winnebago county to said bonds.

Sec. 5:—Every act done and every resolution passed, and all steps taken heretofore by the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago county in relation to the building of said county insane asylum, letting of the contracts for the building thereof and all other acts and things done by the said Board of Supervisors are hereby ratified and legalized.

Sec. 6:—This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

Said bonds shall be conditioned so that, Three thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars of the amount borrowed shall become due and payable on the first day of April, 1898; and the further sum of Three thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars shall become due and payable on the first day of April each and every year thereafter, till the whole sum borrowed shall have been paid.

Interest shall be payable on the first day of April annually. And said bonds and interest thereon shall be payable at the office of the county Treasurer of Winnebago county, and said bonds shall be signed by the Chairman and County Clerk of said county, in their official capacity, and under the seal of the said county.

And said bonds and each of them, so to be issued by said Winnebago county, shall be negotiated by a committee of three members of the county Board of Supervisors of said Winnebago county, to wit:

A. H. F. Krueger, E. L. Mathewson and C. W. Davis.

The said Winnebago county shall annually, during the continuance of said loan, raise by tax on the taxable property of Winnebago county, a sum sufficient to pay the interest thereon; and shall also raise in the same manner annually after the loan shall have been made, a sum sufficient to pay the principal then about to become due, and the county clerk shall insert said amount in the tax roll, and the same shall be collected; and when collected, the same shall be applied in payment of said loan and interest, and for no other purpose.

Resolved, that each and every act done, and every resolution passed by this board heretofore, relating to said county Insane Asylum, and all steps taken by said board, in relation to the building of the said county Insane Asylum, and the letting of the contract for the building thereof, and all other acts and things done by said Board of Supervisors in relation thereto, are hereby ratified and confirmed in every respect.
