

Supervisors' Room, Oshkosh, Wis. November 9, 1909, 10 a. m.

The County Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County convened in Annual Session at the Court House, in the City of Oshkosh, on the 9th day of November, A. D. 1909, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, and was called to order by Chairman Thompson.

On call of the roll the following supervisors of said county responded. The members after subscribing to the oath of office were duly sworn as such supervisors, by C. D. Cleveland, County Judge:

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

Supervisor Gustavus nominated John C. Thompson for Chairman and moved, as there were no other nominations that the rules be suspended and the Clerk cast the unanimous ballot of the Board for Mr. Thompson.

The Clerk put the motion which was carried unanimously. The ballot was cast and John C. Thompson declared elected.

Chairman Thompson thanked the members of the Board for the honor conferred.

ELECTION OF VICE-CHAIRMAN.

Supervisor Ehrgott nominated H. F. Gustavus for Vice-Chairman and moved, as there were no other nominations, that the rules be suspended and the Clerk cast the unanimous ballot of the Board for Mr. Gustavus.

The Chairman put the motion which was carried unanimously. The ballot was cast and H. F. Gustavus declared elected.

RULES.

Supervisor Arnemann moved that the rules of the last supervisor year be adopted. Carried.

RULES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, ADOPTED NOVEMBER 9, 1909.

I. The meetings of this Board shall be held in the Supervisors' room, and

the hour for the daily meetings shall be 9 a. m., providing that on the first meeting in each week the hour of meeting shall be 10 a. m.

And the County Board shall continue in continuous session from day to day until adjourned, unless adjourned to a day certain or sine die.

man, or in the case of his absence the Vice-Chairman, or in their absence. II. At the first meeting of the Board it shall be the duty of the Chair-

the Clerk, to call to order.

The Clerk shall then call the roll of Members.

A quorum being present, the Board shall proceed to the election of a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

(Amended to provide for Vice-Chairmen as authorized by Ch. 110, of 1903.)

III. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to appoint the following standing committees, each to consist of the number of members as set after the name of each committee, viz:

Equalization, 13: Finance, 9; General Accounts, 9: Illegal Assessments, 5; Justices and Constables' Accounts, 9: Sheriff's and Coroner's Accounts, 9; Insane. 5: Poor and Poor Farm, 5; Workhouse, 3: Corporations, 5: Public Buildings, 5: Roads and Bridges, 5: Per Diem and Mileage, 5; Printing, 5: Bonds and Salaries, 6: County Abstract and Tract Index System, 5;

County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy, 5.

IV. The Board may adjourn for such time as shall be necessary for the Chairman to prepare the list of committees and no business can be done until the same shall be announced.

V. The Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, shall take the chair at the hour to which the Board may from time to time stand adjourned, call the Board to order and direct the calling of the roll of members by the Clerk.

VI. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the Clerk, and any mistake therein shall be corrected by the Board; provided, that upon the last day of the session the journal for that day will be read and, before the final adjournment, corrected.

VII. After the reading and correction of the journal, the order of business shall be as follows:

- 1. Reception of Petitions, Memorials, Accounts, etc.
- 2. Presentation of Resolutions and disposition of same.
- 3. Reports of Standing Committees.
- 4. Reports of Select Committees.
- 5. Consideration of Miscellaneous Business.

VIII. The Chairman shall preserve order and decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Board; and shall clearly and distinctly state every motion or question before debate.

IX. The Chairman shall be entitled to vote on all questions taken by

ayes and noes, and his name shall be called last; when the vote on any question is a tie it shall be deemed to have been lost.

- X. Every motion or amendment shall be reduced to writing when a request therefor shall be made by any member; and all petitions, memorials and substitutes shall be reduced to writing and read before they shall be considered by the Board.
- XI. Every written resolution shall have attached thereto the name of the person introducing it; and when referred to a committee, the names of such committee shall be endorsed thereon.
- XII. Every member, previous to speaking, shall rise and address the
- XIII. When two or more members rise at once, the Chair shall designate the member who is to speak first; but in all cases the member who shall first rise and address the Chair shall speak first.

XIV. No member shall speak more than twice upon the same queston without leave; and when called to order by the Chairman shall take his seat, and shall not be allowed to proceed without leave of the Board.

XV. A vote on any question shall be taken by ayes and nays when called for by any member; and SHALL be so taken on all questions involving the expenditure of money; and whenever a vote is so ordered and taken, the members voting in the affirmative and negative, as well as those absent or not voting, shall be recorded at length in the records of the proceedings of the County Board.

(Amended to conform to Sec. 709, Stat. of 1898.)

XVI. No account or claim against the County shall be audited unless it be made out in items and duly verified and be filed with the Clerk of the Board, except as otherwise provided by law.

XVII. When a motion is under consideration, no motion shall be entertained except:

- 1. To adjourn.
- 2. To lay on the table.
- 3. For the previous question.
- 4. To postpone to a day certain.
- 5. To commit to a committee.
- 6. To amend or to substitute.
- 7. To postpone indefinitely.

These several motions shall take precedence in the order in which they stand in this rule.

XVIII. A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, and for the previous question, shall be decided without debate, except as hereinafter provided.

- XIX. A motion to postpone indefinitely or to a day certain or to commit shall not be again entertained on the same day or in the same stage of the proposition.
- XX. A substitute shall be open to amendment the same as the original proposition; but when adopted, shall not be subject to amendment. If an amendment or substitute is lost, another substantially the same shall not be entertained.
- XXI. When a motion or question has once been determined, any member voting with the majority may move a reconsideration of the vote, but such motion shall be made and acted on at the same or next succeeding meeting, and shall not thereafter be made except by unanimous consent.
- XXII. The previous question may be moved by any member, and the Chairman shall then say: "It requiring five members to second this motion,

those in favor of sustaining the motion will rise." If five or more members then rise, the previous question shall thereby be seconded and an opportunity then be given to any two members opposed thereto to briefly state their objections. The question shall then be: "Shall the question be now put?" which, if carried by a vote of two-thirds of the members present upon a call of the ayes and nays, the Board shall immediately proceed to vote upon the pending amendment, if any, and upon the main question.

XXIII. In filling blanks, the largest sum and the longest time shall be first put.

XXIV. These rules shall not be changed, amended, or repealed, unless the proposition or amendment is introduced in writing and the same laid over to some subsequent meeting of the Board, not less than five days intervening, and then only with the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

XXV. Any of these rules may be suspended upon any pending measure by unanimous consent or by two-thirds of the members present.

XXVI. These rules and all amendments or additions thereto which may hereafter be made shall govern the Board until aftered or repealed, as herein provided.

XVIII. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in "Jefferson's Manual," so far as they remain in common use and are practicable and applicable and not inconsistent herewith, shall govern the Board.

XXVIII. Whenever the Board shall have gone into a committee of the whole and shall have arisen, the Board shall at once be in session for the receiving and acting upon the report of the committee of the whole, and for the transaction of any and all other business of every kind.

Supervisor Gustavus moved to adjourn. Carried. Adjourned.

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: Whereas, the practice in the past, of members of the County Board of Winnebago County, who sought office, either elective or appointive at the hands of the members of this County Board, has proven to be undesirable and one tending to create discord and strife among this bedy, and

Whereas, such practice referred to in the above preamble has excited comment on the part of the public at large to the extent of making such practice questionable.

Therefore, Be it Resolved, by the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County and each member thereof, that any member of this County Board desiring to become a candidate for any office, either elective or appointive at the hands of this Board, before announcing his candidacy for any such office, resign forthwith as a member of this Board.

DR. GORDON'S REPORT.

Supervisor Loope offered Resolution No. 2, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County:

Whereas, The late lamented Dr. W. A. Gordon was for several years elected to the office of County Physician, and during his term of office made Annual reports which were noteworthy for their elegant diction, for their concise, crisp, epigramatic force, for their caustic criticism of existing evils, for tender, touching pathos in his description of the ills of our unfortunate fellow beings, whether in jail, poorhouse or asylum, and the broad, comprehensive, humanity which ran through the whole report; and whereas he died during the fulfillment of the humane work he had foreshadowed in these fervid powerful essays.

Therefore be it resolved, That Winnebago County, as a mark of respect to his memory, cause to be collected and printed in pamphlet form, 1,000 copies of W. A. Gordon's report to the County Board during the time he was County Physician.

Resolved, That each member of the County Board be entitled to five copies; that a copy be furnished the Governor, the State Historical Society, each member of the Board of Control, each Superintendent of all Charitable and Insane institutions, County and State, and that the balance of the edition be sold at 25 cents per copy.

Resolved, That a sum sufficient to defray this expense be and is hereby appropriated and placed in general budget.

Resolved, That the Chair appoint a committee of three of whom he shall be one, to place the report in form and find the cost, they to report during this session.

COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT.

Superintendent Patch read his Report No. 5, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County. Gentlemen:—The following report upon the schools under my super-

vision is respectfully submitted:

During the past year the work of the schools has been, in general, very satisfactory. The teachers were, most of them, well qualified, industrious and enthusiastic. There were some cases, however, where teachers were found to be incompetent, either from lack of educational qualifieations, from lack of interest in their work, or from lack of natural ability as teachers. In every case, these teachers have been dropped from the list, and are not teaching this year. Not every person, even though he or she possesses the necessary educational qualifications, can teach school. When a person not naturally adapted to the work is found, the kindest thing to do is to refuse him or her a position. To grant a position to an incompetent teacher is to injure all children who come in contact with her, and at the same time it is an injury to the teacher, as it prevents her securing employment in a work which she can do successfully. School officers should exercise great care in securing teachers for their schools.

Another point on which I have made a ruling which will, I believe, be upheld by this body, is in the matter of the transfer of certificates. Hereafter I shall refuse to transfer certificates from any county unless the applicant can furnish absolute proof of having taught school successfully for at least one year. We have been used as a training ground for the inexperienced teachers of other counties for years, and, as we have an almost unlimited supply of teachers of our own, it is an injustice to our people to take inexperienced teachers from other counties.

EQUIPMENT AND ORGANIZATION.

The equipment of nearly all the schools is very good. All but a very few are supplied with adequate systems for heating and ventilation and have secured more or less additional apparatus for the use of the schools. The trend in this matter is in the right direction and I have no fault to find in this matter.

I am pleased to report, at this time, that every school in Winnebago county is now thoroughly organized and following the course of study outlined by the state department. This is a problem which the superintendents and teachers of this county have been working for ten years. It was very largely due to the action of this board at the last November session, which enabled me to supply to all schools necessary materials for graduation and classification which is uniform throughout the county, it is largely due to this that we have finally been able to classify the work, so that we know just where the pupils in every school are working at all times. You will notice a marked improvement in results.

In addition to this, the system of awards for perfect attendance and the system of certificates for the reading of library books have added greatly in the conduct of our schools.

LIBRARIES.

Another matter that we tried last year with such pronounced success that it will be carried on more extensively this year, is that of putting

free traveling libraries in the schools. We tried two or three schools last year in isolated districts where it was impossible for the people or pupils to have access to a library of any kind, except the school library. The pupils and people were very much interested and read nearly every book in the library before it was returned. The library board has been very helpful in this matter and a great many communities will be supplied with interesting and instructive reading material this year. The habit of reading good books is an education in itself.

TEACHERS' INSTITUTES.

There was no teachers' institute held this year, as the state department has decided to hold institutes in the future only in those counties in which there is no normal school summer session held. We will have our institutes, however, during the year. They will be held in Neenah, Winchester, Winneconne, Waukau, Pickett and Oshkosh.

I have divided the county into six districts for institute purposes, and four meetings will be held in each district. One will be under the leadership of a regular institute conductor and myself, and the other three under a local leader appointed in each district. These meetings are to be held on Saturdays at the various places named and a regular course of study is outlined for the work.

PLANS FOR THE NEXT YEAR.
At the last session of the legislature a number of laws were enacted relative to schools, especially in regard to the certification of teachers, and the power of school boards. In 1907, also, a great number of school laws were passed. I have found that many school officers and teachers find difficulty in acquainting themselves with these laws. I have also many instructions to give school officers and teachers that should be in a permanent form. In order to supply this information I have decided to publish this year an annual for Winnebago county, containing all matter pertaining to school interests. I have also planned to hold this year a county graduating exercise for the common school pupils of the county. This class of pupils have always been neglected. There are a great number of them, from one to two hundred each year, coming from every district in the county. Many of them never attend a higher school and many never finish the district school. I believe such a system of county graduating exercises will build up an interest in the common school and prove a great benefit. I would, therefore, ask that a sum of \$225.00 be appropriated for the purposes of publishing an annual, purchasing needed supplies, and holding county graduating exercises. Respectfully, H. B. On November 19, 1908, we met a loss by fire on the laundry building of \$1,392.35, and on clothing of \$344.44. Since that time the clothing has been replaced, and the building rebuilt and made better and more convenient than before the fire, and done largely by our own help.

We have contracted for 1,500 tons of screened Red Jacket coal F.O.B. State Hospital, at \$3.98 per ton, which will supply the asylum and poor house until July 1, 1910.

Some of the most important improvements made the last year were the building of 8,000 feet of cement sidewalks, and four hydrant houses fitted complete with hose and nozzles ready for instant use, thereby greatly improving our fire protection.

The Board of Trustees, as well as the Superintendent and Matron, have been unanimous in a determination to keep the institution up to the highest standard posible. In this we feel that we have the united support of the entire membership of the County Board.

Referring to the recommendation of our board a year and two years ago for a cold storage building, we would again urgently recommend to

your honorable board that the necessary appropriation be made to pro-

vide our institution with such a building, as under present conditions it is impossible to keep vegetables in good condition through the winter, thereby causing a loss to the county of a considerable part of the vegetables—the products of our farm, which must be replaced from the market at added expense to the county, which would be unnecessary if proper storage facilities were provided.

The State Board of Control has repeatedly called the attention of the trustees to our present objectionable system of storing vegetables in the basement of the institution, and strongly recommended a separate building be provided for this purpose.

The past year has been one of the most successful in the history of our county institutions, the cause for which we believe is largely due to the intelligent and efficient efforts of our superintendent and matron, Mr. and Mrs. Manuel, and the careful medical attention given by Dr. Brockway.

COUNTY PHYSICIAN'S REPORT.

County Physician Brockway read his Report No. 8, as follows:

To the Board of Trustees of the County Asylum, and Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen:—I herewith respectfully submit my report as County Physician for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1909.

COUNTY ASYLUM:

I have made regular semi-weekly visits to the county asylum as usual during the year, and a number of special visits when called. There were eight deaths during the year, four less than last year. Of these deaths, four were males and four females. One death occurred in July, cause, dementia; two in September, one of anaemia due to dementia, and one of valvular heart disease and dropsy; one in December, of valvular heart trouble and old age; one in March, of paresis; two in April, one cause by Bright's disease, and the other heart disease, and one in June, of dementia. There were no deaths in the months of August, October, November, January, February and May. There were no accidental injuries except the minor sprains and bruises which occasionally occur among the inmates.

There was very little acute illness, and while there have been several severe ilnesses, they were caused by attacks of epilepsy or paralysis due to a chronic condition.

The sanitary conditions have been as good as usual, but could be improved, I think, by making some provision for storing vegetables outside of the main building. The odor of vegetables stored in the basement, especially when the odor is due to vegetable decay, sometimes gets all through the building and is, of course, somewhat unsanitary. I would respectfully recommend that a root cellar be provided outside the main building.

The superintendent and matron, with their assistants, have taken excellent care of the inmates, looking after their welfare constantly, both in sickness and health. Good food and clothing have been provided and all inmates made as comfortable as their condition would permit.

COUNTY POOR HOUSE.

I have made the usual twice a week visits to the poor house and have visited there at other times when called. There were eight deaths during the year, five males and three females. Two of these deaths were caused by paralysis, two by tuberculosis, one by Bright's disease, one by anaemia, and two by senile decay, they both being over ninety years of age.

There were two babies born there during this year, one male and one female. They were both taken away and cared for by their mothers.

In July, 1908, the first month of the fiscal year, an inmate received some bruises and minor injuries at the hands of the overseer. He made a

full recovery in a short time and has remained well during the year. The report of the committee regarding this case will be found on pages 57 and 58 of the Proceedings of the County Board at last November's session.

The inmates of this institution have been cared for and the sanitary conditions have been very good.

THE COUNTY JAIL

There have been about the usual number of calls to the jail this year, but there has been no serious illness and no deaths. The prisoners have been given good care and the building kept clean and sanitary.

THE WORK HOUSE.

There have been several sick calls to the work house this year, but there was no illness that proved to be very serious and there were no deaths. On my visits to this institution I have always found the quarters clean and sanitary, the food plentiful and wholesome, and the prisoners humanely treated.

In closing my report, I wish to compliment the trustees and committees of the different institutions on their evident desire to do everything possible to improve the condition of the inmates.

I wish to again thank the Board of Supervisors, the Asylum Trustees, and the management of the county institutions for their generous assistance to me in my work.



The condition of the school in regard to equipment is good. Cement walks have been built around the building and grounds and the latter.

beautified by flowers and shrubs artistically arranged. On the farm belonging to the school various varieties of grain and plants have been grown; especial attention having been given to those of immediate interest to the farmers of this county. A nursery of several hundred shrubs for decorative purposes has been started and these are in a flourishing condition. When the same are large enough for transplanting they will be used for decorating rural school grounds throughout the county.

During the year several meetings in different parts of the county were held for the purpose of interesting the people in the school; these were fairly well attended and served the purpose of familiarizing the people with the work of the school.

The attendance, however, is not what it should be. Some plan must be devised which will remedy this defect. It would perhaps be wise to lower the requirements for entrance to the school, put in more of the academical branches and then reach a class of students who need the work of the school, but who, at present, are unable to gain admittance.

This would necessitate the securing of one additional teacher for the common branches and this, the board would advise, should be done.

The farmers' course held under the auspices of the Wisconsin College of Agriculture, was well attended, 1,600 being regularly enrolled. It was a pronounced success.

During the past year the schools publications were admitted to the second class mailing privilege by the government postal authorities securing rates of 1 cent per pound on all quarterly bulletins of the school.

In this county a great deal of attention is paid by farmers to the growing of small fruits. This being the case, a nursery for raising small fruits, should be established, as this is an industry in which the students of the school need training.

There is also no fire protection for the building and something of this nature should be provided:

In order to secure state aid to the amount of \$4,000.00, the county must raise a sum of \$2,000.00 for the maintenance of the school, i. e., the state pays 2-3 of the cost of maintenance up to \$6,000.00.

For the school year ending June 30, 1909, the cost of maintenance was \$6,711.49. This was due to two large bills, one for lumber and one for hardware, being paid in 1909. The material paid for was used, part of it in 1908, and part in 1909, for fitting up the school and for the supplies for the manual training work and were running accounts.

The Board would advise that the amount of \$700.00 be appropriated and used to secure the services of an additional teacher for English branches in the school, and the establishment of a new course.

In addition to this the school needs the sum of \$200.00 for the establishment of a nursery for raising small fruit and \$100.00 for putting in

an adequate system of fire protection. A total of \$1,000.00 in addition to the \$2,000.00 above mentioned.

ANNUAL REPORT OF SUPERVISOR OF ASSESSMENT.

Supervisor of Assessment Shea read his Report No. 10, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin:

Gentlemen: In compliance with the statutes I hereby present my annual report for the year 1909.

There are two methods which are used to arrive at the true value of the real property of the county: the sale and the inspection method. The sale method is recommended by the State Tax Commission as being the most correct method. After a careful study of the two methods, and contrary to my opinion for the past seven years, I have come to the conclusion that the sales method, after a careful examination as to what sales should be used, is the proper method to use, and, therefore, it is the one I have used in making my report this year.

"Special Form B" will show the number of transfers in each district, the total consideration, the assessment of the same, as fixed by the local assessor, and the ratio of assessment to true value.

Table 9 will show the result of the calculation as applied to the entire real estate.

Tables 1 to 8, inclusive, show the assessment, also all changes made by the Supervisor in the different kinds and classes of personal property.

Table 10 will show the total assessment of real, the total of personal, and also the total of all property.

The columns designated "True Value" will show the true value of real, of personal, and also of all property as fixed by the Supervisor.





Your committee would recommend that said taxes be charged back to the above named towns and cities.

Your committee on Illegal Assessments further beg leave to report that they have had under consideration the following petition for the cancellation of tax certificate as follows: The petition of William F. Gruenwald to cancel tax certificate No. 143, sale of 1908, amount \$173.51, affecting a piece of land in front of lots 10, 11, and 12, block "B", Smith & Center's addition, lying and being between Main street and south line of Little Lake Butte des Morts, being a part of block 22, according to Palmer's map, city of Neenah, Second ward.

The petitioner represents that said certificate is illegal and void for the reason that the tract above described is included in the lands owned by the Bergstrom Paper Company and that the tax roll shows that said Bergstrom Paper Company paid the taxes for the year covered by the tax certificate and that the said tax certificate is not only indefinite but also a double assessment. Your committee would recommend said petition be denied.

Your committee further beg leave to report that they have had under consideration the following petition for cancellation of tax certificate as follows: The petition of William F. Gruenwald for the cancellation of tax certificate No. 334 for the sale of lands for taxes for the yellow of tax certificate No. 334 for the sale of lands for taxes for the yellow, of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, being the south 50 feet of north 400 feet of lots four and five, block 128, in the Twelfth ward, city of Osh kosh, per Leach's map, amount \$3.97.

The petition represents that said tax certificate is illegal and void for the reason that the tract of land above described was used at that time, viz., at the time of the assessment and was owned and used by the Evangelical Bethlehem Lutheran church of the city of Oshkosh, Wisconsin and was used exclusively by said church society for the purpose of said society and was not leased or otherwise used for pecuniary profit at the time said assessments were made; that said Evangelical Bethlehem Church Society is a religious society, located in the city of Oshkosh. Wisconsin and that said tax certificate is illegal under section 1038 of the Revised Statutes of Wisconsin for the year 1898 and the acts amendatory thereof. Your committee would recommend that said tax certificate be cancelled and that the amount so paid for such certificate be refunded to William F. Gruenwald, the owner of said tax certificate, with interest thereon at the rate of seven per cent per annum from the date thereof and that the same be charged back to the city of Oshkosh as follows: Certificate 334, Sale 1905, Tax \$3.97, Interest \$1.24. Total \$5.21.

Your committee further beg leave to report that they have had under consideration the petition of Olive Babbits for the cancellation of certificate No. 102, sale of 1904, amount \$10.40 affecting the following described premises, to wit: Beginning at the NE corner of lot 27, Darling's Addition, Second ward, city of Menasha, running thence S 75 feet, W 125 feet, N 75 feet, E 125 feet, in the city of Menasha, Second ward. The petition represents that said tax certificate was illegal and void for the reason that the above described land was double assessed and that the taxes thereon had been paid and that the taxes on the above described land was returned delinquent to the county and therefore void.

Your committee would recommend that said certificate be cancelled and that the amount so paid for such certificate be refunded to Olive Babbits, the owner of said tax certificate, with interest thereon at the rate of seven per cent per annum from the date thereof, certificate 192, Sale 1904, Tax \$10.40, Interest \$4.00. Total \$14.40, and that the same be charged back to the city of Menasha.




