

On motion the rules of the last Supervisor year were adopted.

Chairman Parker read the call for the special meeting.

Remarks on highway matters were made by Supervisors Heffron and Raddatz.

Petitions from three blind persons were referred to Committee on Poor and Poor Farm. Remarks by Supervisor Larrabee.

The petition of Philip Schaub, Poor Commissioner of Menasha, was introduced.

Remarks by Supervisors Larrabee, Loescher, Appley, Raddatz, Christoph, White, Parker, Ryckman, Arnemann, Meeleus, Howlett and District Attorney.

Supervisor Larrabee moved to adjourn to 1:30 p. m. to give the chairman opportunity to select his committees. Carried. Adjourned.

Remarks by Supervisors Grimes, Raddatz, and District Attorney.

Supervisor Grimes moved that the call be amended so that the Board could consider any questions that came up, and asked for unanimous consent.

Gentlemen: Be It Resolved, That the Committee on Equalization is hereby authorized to meet at the court house in the City of Oshkosh, not to exceed six days, for the purpose of familiarizing themselves with the assessment of the several towns and wards in said county, at such time as may be fixed by the chairman of said committee.

Be It Further Resolved, That the said members of the said Equalization Committee shall be allowed and paid the sum of \$3.00 per day for every day that each of them is in actual attendance upon said meeting, and the per diem

as allowed for meetings of the County Board, not to exceed six days for such meeting.

And Be It Further Resolved, That the Supervisors of towns, cities and villages be authorized and directed to attend said committee meeting, not to exceed one day, upon notice from the chairman of said committee and that they be paid at the same rate when in attendance.

Gentlemen: Whereas, the Town of Menasha, having deposited in the County Treasury \$2,500, the same to be applied under Resolution No. 13, adopted at last session of this Board, and whereas the Town of Nekimi has deposited \$833.33 in the County Treasury to apply under similar conditions, the amount appropriated by said resolution is insufficient to enable both towns to participate in state and county aid, to the extent desired.

Now, therefore, In view of the loss to Winnebago county of an absolutely necessary and mutually beneficial improvement, resulting from failure of Town of Menasha to receive the full amount asked,

Be It Resolved, That the sum of \$833.33 be and the same is hereby appropriated from the general fund of Winnebago County, to the experimental road fund to be used in accord with the provisions of the above mentioned Resolution No. 13, in Town of Nekimi.



Invitation from the School Board to visit the Agricultural School the 19th, received and on motion accepted.

Supervisor Christoph moved that Supervisor White arrange for transportation. Carried.

Remarks by Supervisors White and Howlett.

Tuberculosis Sanitorium.

Chairman Parker offered Report No. 5, as follows:

To The Honorable, The Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: Your special committee appointed to investigate the Anti-Tuberculosis situation, beg leave to report as follows:

The committee on Oct. 24 and 25 visited the Milwaukee institutions. Dr. Dearholt, executive secretary Wisconsin Anti-Tuberculosis association, accompanied us, which assisted us greatly. We were impressed with the appearance of the patients. They looked healthy which is due to the fresh air treatment and proper diet. The Greenfield or county institution is a brick building which the committee believes is not necessary. A frame structure such as Wisconsin Anti-Tuberculosis association suggests, is much better.

The location of the Greenfield sanitorium fronting east is not right. We learned from Dr. Dearholt that they intend building a new sanitorium on land belonging to Milwaukee county near the County Asylum, and other county institutions. He informed us that their object in locating there was to secure light and water from the other institutions which would save them considerable expense.

The Blue Mound or city institution is arranged on the cottage order. They have separate buildings for male and female patients, they also separate the younger patients from the older. The committee liked this arrangement, but it is more expensive in maintaining same as it would require more help. We visited the children's hospital in Milwaukee. Dr. Dearholt informed us the little ones suffering with hip diseases and other deformities came from tubercular conditions. They are treated with the fresh air treatment same as at the sanitoriums. We were told that the children were cured. They have to lie in bed in some cases two years or more in certain positions. It was not a pleasant sight to see the little ones lying there. They ranged in age from one to twelve years, yet in appearance most of them looked healthy.

In connection with our report we have statistics showing the percentage of cures and where the patients are able to go home and

support themselves or their families, and where the disease is arrested permitting the patient to go home and do light work; also a percentage of those which are improved in health by this treatment which we submit as part of our report. On Nov. 8th and 9th we visited Manitowoc and accompanied by Mr. Rauber, the architect and superintendent, we visited the sanatorium which is nearly completed. They are building on plans suggested by Wisconsin Anti-Tuberculosis association. They are building the administration building and one wing which will care for twelve patients. This building will cost completed about \$14,000. Mr. Rauber informed us it would cost about \$18,000 to erect a twenty-four bed institution or administration building and two wings complete, according to plans suggested by the Wisconsin Anti-Tuberculosis association. The committee endeavored to get all the information possible and to get the opinions of citizens and tax payers upon whom the burden rests in counties where the sanatoriums exist, and we found nearly every one we asked in sympathy with the movement.

In submitting this report we have endeavored to make it plain, showing the methods we pursued in getting the information and the benefits derived from the institutions.

Report of the Special Tuberculosis Committee.

Chairman Parker offered Report and Resolution No. 4, as follows.

To the Honorable, The Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: Whereas, At the petition of the State Board of Control and the Wisconsin Anti-Tuberculosis Association, that a special committee be appointed to consider a county sanitarium for Winnebago County; and,

Whereas, The undersigned committee, having duly investigated the tuberculosis situation in this county, finds that in the past three and one-half years there have been 236 deaths in the county from tuberculosis, that statistics show that tuberculosis is on the increase in this county and will continue unless some special means are taken to stop the death rate; and,

Whereas, Expert advice from physicians tells us that the only way to gain control of the white plague is by placing those cases that are in the advanced or contagious stage in a hospital and thus save the other members of the family from contracting the disease; and,

Whereas, We are constantly called upon to send patients to the state institution, which is an expense to the county, as we must pay the transportation and \$5.00 a week to the state for their care; be it

Resolved, That, since the county sanitarium is not an experiment, and by the erection of such a building we shall save the lives of many people in the county, and further save money for the county, there be and hereby is appro-

priated the sum of \$20,000 out of any money not otherwise appropriated for the erection of said sanitorium.

The work of the schools of the county has been uniformly successful during the past year. They are all thoroughly graded and classified and are all following the course of study for the schools of the state of Wisconsin strictly.

The rural schools of this state have been criticised during the past several years for not giving sufficient training in the common branches, especially in arithmetic and spelling. It is a fact that pupils now are not as good spellers or as good in addition as were pupils in the same class of schools several years ago. This is due to the additional number of subjects taught under the present system.

Rural school children are also found to be deficient in the ability to address an audience, and in the more common phases of parliamentary practice.

The course of study is so much overcrowded that it is impossible to give pupils extra training, along these various lines, in their regular school work. So that, in order to remedy the defect in their training and give pupils needed training, the following contests have been held, first in the local school, then in the county as a whole.

SPELLING CONTEST.

Local spelling contests were held in the different schools of the county during the year and in these contests a representative was selected, who represented the home school in a county contest held in Oshkosh on May 24, 1912. Sixty-three schools of the county had a representative in this contest. These contests have been held for the past two years and the pupils show a marked improvement in spelling.

ADDING CONTEST.

Local adding contests were also held in the different schools and the pupil doing the best work was permitted to represent his or her school in the county adding contest held in Oshkosh on the same date as the spelling contest. Forty-seven schools were represented in this contest. It is giving excellent training in addition.

DECLAMATORY CONTEST.

A declamatory contest was held on the same date and in the same place as the adding and spelling contests. In this event each town was entitled to a representative, who was chosen by local contests held first in the district school, then in the town. This work furnishes training in public speaking.

The bread making and corn growing contests are proving successful and the pupils of the schools and the people of the different districts show great interest in the same.

Last year also, a number of Farmers' Clubs were organized in different parts of the county in which debates and discussions were held upon interesting questions.

This supplementary work is without question of as much importance as the regular work of the school and will be kept up during the coming year.



Annual Report of the Trustees of the County Poor Farm and Insane Asylum.

Mr. Pinkerton read Trustees' Report No. 9, as follows:

The Board of Trustees of the Asylum for the Chronic Insane of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, respectfully submit herewith their report of the institution, covering the year ending June 30, 1912.

We would report regarding the new well which was being sunk a year ago, a preliminary report of which we made a year ago, that the same is now complete and giving satisfactory results. This well was sunk to a depth of 673 feet, at a total cost of \$1,346, of which sum \$1,000 was paid from your special appropriation made for the purpose, and the balance, \$346, was paid out of the Asylum Fund. The well has produced an abundant supply of water for the institution at all times since completion.

The railroad side track for the institution, which was arranged for during your March session of this year, the completion of details being left with the Poor Farm Committee and Board of Trustees, has been satisfactorily installed, connecting the coal shed in the rear of the institution buildings with the main line of the Soo Railroad, enabling us to put in coal, as well put in and ship out any produce wanted in carload lots at reduced expense as well as great convenience. We raised and turned the coal shed to make convenient connection with the side track, and put in a cement floor in the same,

so we are now equipped to take care of a large part of our winter's need of coal during the fall before bad weather sets in.

On account of the advanced age of some of our work horses we have added to our equipment three good young work horses.

We have contracted for 1,500 tons of screened lump Youghio-gheny coal at \$385 per ton F. O. B. Winnebago Station, which will, we expect, supply the Asylum and Poor Farm until July 1, 1913.

In spite of the severe winter our coal consumption for last year shows a saving of \$108.43. This we account for by reduced amount of pumping required on account of abundant supply of water from the new well.

The State Board of Control have for some time been urging us to make such additions to our institution as will enable us to provide more single rooms for unruly and noisy patients. We recently requested the State Board to meet with us to consider the matter more definitely, but as only one member of the Board responded and the requirements of the Board as to light and air are such as to make such an addition a very expensive proposition, we have decided to give the matter further consideration before recommending any definite action to your honorable body.

From comparing the above figures with those of last year, you will note that the total earnings of the institution show a gain of \$2,127.78, with a very slight increase in cost of \$137.48, making the financial showing \$1,990.30 better than last year.

Under the plan adopted by you last year of giving the Asylum credit for the legitimate earnings for Winnebago county patients, we are pleased to call the attention of your honorable body to the fact that the Asylum fund does not show an overdraft on November 1, and under this plan we expect next year to make an even better showing.

County Physician's Report.

Dr. Bath read Report No. 10, as follows:

To the Honorable Board of Trustees of the Winnebago County Insane Asylum, and the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County.

Gentlemen: The following is my official report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1912:

COUNTY ASYLUM

The bi-weekly visits and special visits have been regularly made during the year made by the Superintendent and Matron comfortable; they have been kept clean and food in abundance supplied them. The sanitary conditions equal those of a perfect, up-to-date hospital, and nothing left undone to make the patients as happy and contented as circumstances would allow.

During the year we have had one case of infectious disease, diphtheria, in an attendant, with recovery.

There have been eight deaths at the County Asylum during the year, with causes as follows: Two chronic melancholia, two arterio-sclerosis, one chronic bronchitis, one inflamed hernia, one carcinoma of stomach, one erysipelas. There has been no serious injury during the year.

COUNTY POOR FARM.

Here also the semi-weekly visits and numerous special visits have been regularly made during the year. Ten deaths have occurred during the year, with causes as follows:

One accident, two tuberculosis, one infantile atrophy, one apoplexy, one fractured femur, one arterio-sclerosis, two chronic endocarditis. There was one birth during the year. The inmates have been kept clean by those in charge, and the buildings clean, warm, and well ventilated.

COUNTY JAIL.

Calls to the County Jail have been numerous, but the only serious illness here was a case of smallpox, developing in a woman, who was removed from the building, isolated, recovery following. The sanitary conditions have been good and the prisoners well cared for.

COUNTY WORK HOUSE.

There has been no serious sickness at the the year. The prisoners have been treated kindly kept clean and sanitary.

Again, in closing, to the members of the Board of Trustees the Asylum, and the heads of the various institutions, especially to Mr. and Mrs. Manlel, I extend my thanks for their earnest assistance and co-operation.



Tuberculosis Sanatorium.

Supervisor Grimes offered Resolution No. 20, as follows:

To the Honorable, the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County,

Gentlemen: Whereas, There has been introduced at this session of our County Board two opposing resolutions in reference to the building of a County Tuberculosis Sanatorium, neither of which, although feasible and meritorious, is not entirely satisfactory to a large number of the Board members; and,

Whereas, The writer is unable to find any provision in chapter 457, Laws of 1911, prohibiting county boards from establishing county sanatoriums in any suitable unoccupied section of a county building; and,

Whereas, Winnebago County has but recently completed a modern, substantial and comfortable County Home, and the same is accommodating fifty-three inmates at date of last report, which is but one-half its capacity; and,

Whereas, The County Physician's report discloses the fact that two inmates have succumbed to tuberculosis during the last year and said physician's answers to questions by members of this Board discloses the fact, further, that no extra precaution is taken to prevent the infection of the county's helpless poor who through age, accident or misfortune are compelled to remain inmates of said county institution; and,

Whereas, In the event of the adoption of either of the above mentioned resolutions a year and perhaps two must elapse before the proposed structure will be ready for occupancy; therefore, and in view of these facts, be it

Resolved, by the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, That a committee of three members who favor the project be appointed to draft a petition fully describing the situation, which shall be laid before the State Board of Control at the earliest possible moment, praying that the unused portion of Winnebago County Poor House under the supervision of the present trustees be fitted up or converted, used and known as the Winnebago County Tuberculosis Sanitorium until such time as the space occupied thereby shall be necessary for the accommodation of the county poor, or until the County Board shall erect a sanitorium; and, be it further

Resolved, That, in the event of the petition being granted, then and in that case the Trustees of Winnebago County Asylum and Poor Farm shall proceed in accordance with the provisions of chapter 457, Laws of 1911, to establish said sanitorium within said County House and shall be empowered and authorized to draw upon the treasury of Winnebago County, as provided in said chapter for the equipment of sanitoriums, to the extent of One Thousand Dollars.



Miss Julia Rupp read her Report No. 22, as follows:

To the Board of Libraries of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, for the period Oct. 1, 1911, to Oct. 1, 1912.

Gentlemen: In order to keep up the interest at the stations in

the traveling libraries and to see that the libraries are properly placed, it is necessary to make an annual visit. This was done most successfully this fall, when 23 stations were visited in two days. Everywhere a hearty feeling of co-operation was met with.

There are now 37 stations, of which six are new; several which had been discontinued have been revived again.

One hundred and seventy-seven books have been purchased, 123 received by gift from Mrs. Morris Jones of Oshkosh, and six magazines have been bound, making a total of 396 new books; 37 books were withdrawn on account of their worn condition, and 11 on account of being unsuitable, leaving a net total of 348 additions to the libraries.

The circulation was 2,464, a small increase over the preceding year. The largest circulation was 296, at Winchester.

The work of making over the libraries was carried on vigorously during the summer and all stations have been most emphatic in their praise over the revised collections. In order to continue this work of revision it will be necessary to again have the full appropriation of \$200.00, which I most earnestly recommend for the coming year.





Gentlemen: Your chairman of the Roads and Bridge Committee, to

whom was referred the question of settling the dispute between the town of Harrison and the town of Menasha, on the drainage proposition, beg leave to report that he has investigated the matter and has tried to get the parties together, and finds that several old drainage courses have been blocked by the Appleton Interurban line, leaving the water for over one and one-half miles directly south to a point called the Manitowoc road, then the water flowing upon the farms where it could be let into Lake Winnebago by the opening of a ditch of about ten rods in length.

The town board of the town of Harrison refuses absolutely to open same, and it appearing that said end of the road, the town of Harrison, has charge of and it is impossible for the county to do anything other than to get the State to put said road on the prospective county highway system.

I have taken the matter up with the State engineers of the Highway commission and they have agreed to investigate the matter and place the same on the prospective highway map and that when that is done, the State will have charge of the drainage. That is the only feasible way that I know of.

Both towns are willing that this be done so that the money spent in lawsuits might be put upon the roads.



RULES OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, ADOPTED APRIL 29, 1912

I. The meetings of this Board shall be held in the Supervisors' room, and the hour for the daily meetings shall be 9 a. m., providing that on the first meeting in each week the hour of meeting shall be 10 a. m.

And the County Board shall continue in continuous session from day to day until adjourned, unless adjourned to a day certain or sine die.

II. At the first meeting of the Board it shall be the duty of the Chairman, or in the case of his absence the Vice-Chairman, or in their absence, the Clerk, to call to order.

The Clerk shall then call the roll of Members.

A quorum being present, the Board shall proceed to the election of a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

(Amended to provide for Vice-Chairmen as authorized by Ch. 110, of 1903.)

III. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to appoint the following standing committees, each to consist of the number of members as set after the name of each committee, viz:

- Equalization, 13;
- Finance, 9;
- General Accounts, 9;
- Illegal Assessments, 5;
- Justices and Constables' Accounts, 9;
- Sheriff's and Coroner's Accounts, 9;
- Insane, 5;
- Poor and Poor Farm, 5;
- Workhouse, 3;
- Corporations, 5;
- Public Buildings, 5;
- Roads and Bridges, 5;
- Per Diem and Mileage, 5;
- Printing, 5;
- Bonds and Salaries, 6;
- County Abstract and Tract Index System, 5;
- Rules, 3;
- County School of Agriculture and Domestic Economy, 5.

IV. The Board may adjourn for such time as shall be necessary for the Chairman to prepare the list of committees and no business can be done until the same shall be announced.

V. The Chairman, or in his absence, the Vice-Chairman, shall take the chair at the hour to which the Board may from time to time stand adjourned, call the Board to order and direct the calling of the roll of members by the Clerk.

VI. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the Clerk, and any mistake therein shall be corrected by the Board; provided, that upon the last day of the session the journal for that day will be read and, before the final adjournment, corrected.

VII. After the reading and correction of the journal, the order of business shall be as follows:

1. Reception of Petitions, Memorials, Accounts, etc.
2. Presentation of Resolutions and disposition of same.

3. Reports of Standing Committees.
4. Reports of Select Committees.
5. Consideration of Miscellaneous Business.

VIII. The Chairman shall preserve order and decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Board; and shall clearly and distinctly state every motion or question before debate.

IX. The Chairman shall be entitled to vote on all questions taken by ayes and noes, and his name shall be called last; when the vote on any question is a tie it shall be deemed to have been lost.

X. Every motion or amendment shall be reduced to writing when a request therefor shall be made by any member; and all petitions, memorials and substitutes shall be reduced to writing and read before they shall be considered by the Board.

XI. Every written resolution shall have attached thereto the name of the person introducing it; and when referred to a committee, the names of such committee shall be endorsed thereon.

XII. Every member, previous to speaking, shall rise and address the Chair.

XIII. When two or more members rise at once, the Chair shall designate the member who is to speak first; but in all cases the member who shall first rise and address the Chair shall speak first.

XIV. No member shall speak more than twice upon the same question without leave; and when called to order by the Chairman shall take his seat, and shall not be allowed to proceed without leave of the Board.

XV. A vote on any question shall be taken by ayes and nays when called for by any member; and SHALL be so taken on all questions involving the expenditure of money; and whenever a vote is so ordered and taken, the members voting in the affirmative and negative, as well as those absent or not voting, shall be recorded at length in the records of the proceedings of the County Board.

(Amended to conform to Sec. 709, Stat. of 1898.)

XVI. No account or claim against the County shall be audited unless it be made out in items and duly verified and be filed with the Clerk of the Board, except as otherwise provided by law.

XVII. When a motion is under consideration, no motion shall be entertained except:

1. To adjourn.
2. To lay on the table.
3. For the previous question.
4. To postpone to a day certain.
5. To commit to a committee.
6. To amend or to substitute.
7. To postpone indefinitely.

These several motions shall take precedence in the order in which they stand in this rule.

XVIII. A motion to adjourn, to lay on the table, and for the previous question, shall be decided without debate, except as hereinafter provided.

XIX. A motion to postpone indefinitely or to a day certain or to commit shall not be again entertained on the same day or in the same stage of the proposition.

XX. A substitute shall be open to amendment the same as the original proposition; but when adopted, shall not be subject to amendment. If an amendment or substitute is lost, another substantially the same shall not be entertained.

XXI. When a motion or question has once been determined, any member voting with the majority may move a reconsideration of the vote, but such motion shall be made and acted on at the same or next succeeding meeting, and shall not thereafter be made except by unanimous consent.

XXII. The previous question may be moved by any member, and the Chairman shall then say: "It requiring five members to second this motion, those in favor of sustaining the motion will rise." If five or more members then rise, the previous question shall thereby be seconded and an opportunity then be given to any two members opposed thereto to briefly state their objections. The question shall then be: "Shall the question be now put?" which, if carried by a vote of two-thirds of the members present upon a call of the ayes and nays, the Board shall immediately proceed to vote upon the pending amendment, if any, and upon the main question.

XXIII. In filling blanks, the largest sum and the longest time shall be first put.

XXIV. These rules shall not be changed, amended, or repealed, unless the proposition or amendment is introduced in writing and the same laid over to some subsequent meeting of the Board, not less than five days intervening, and then only with the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

XXV. Any of these rules may be suspended upon any pending measure by unanimous consent or by two-thirds of the members present.

XXVI. These rules and all amendments or additions thereto which may hereafter be made shall govern the Board until altered or repealed, as herein provided.

XXVII. The rules of parliamentary practice comprised in "Jefferson's Manual," so far as they remain in common use and are practicable and applicable and not inconsistent herewith, shall govern the Board.

XXVIII. Whenever the Board shall have gone into a committee of the whole and shall have arisen, the Board shall at once be in session for the receiving and acting upon the report of the committee of the whole, and for the transaction of any and all other business of every kind.
