By virtue of Chapter 59.04 of the Wisconsin Statute this April Session of the Winnebago County Board is called to order for the purpose of organization and doing any and all regular business which according to law may come before the Board.

Meeting was called to order by Dorothy L. Propp, County Clerk.

New members were introduced to the Board.

Roll call showed all present with the exception of Virginia Nolan.

The first order of business will be the election of a Chairman for the ensuing year.

It was the wish of the board to vote by ballot with the first ballot being informal. Redlin and Sweet were appointed tellers.

Election of a chairman, Drexler 40, Thompson 1, Heigl 2, Hanson 1, Heaney 4. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Drexler elected chairman.

Election of a vice-chairman. Heigl 39, Heaney 9, Miracle 1, King 1, Jackson 1. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Heigl elected vice-chairman.

A communication was read in regard to County Council Government Day. Mr. Jankowski addressed the board regarding the same.

Election of a member of the Welfare Board to succeed Supv. Rahr. Informal ballot Rahr 41, Nolan 3, Sweet 2, Armstrong 1, Pawlowski 2, Kohler 1. Motion made and seconded that the informal ballot be made formal. Carried. Rahr elected for one year.

The ballot clerks were thanked for their services.

Prayer leaders Supv. Hanson and Daggett were unanimously elected.

Rules of the Board were read.

Motion made the seconded to include the University Extension Committee along with other standing committees. Carried.

Motion made and seconded rule 34 should read that "no major committee accept two members for any one municipality." Motion made and seconded to table. Ayes 21, Nays 30. Absent 1. Lost. Discussion followed. Motion made and seconded to amend "to refer to the Judiciary Committee" and report back to the Board.

Motion made and seconded to adjourn until 1:30 P.M. Carried.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Meeting called to order by Chairman Joseph F. Drexler.

Roll call showed all members present with the exception of Supv. Nolan.

Motion made and seconded that the amendment read "to refer to the Judiciary Committee." Carried. Motion made and seconded to adopt the rule as amended. Ayes 27. Nays 24. Absent 1. Carried.

Motion made and seconded that the third Tuesday in October shall be the first day of Annual Board Session. Discussion followed. Motion made and seconded to amend to read the "fourth Tuesday in October." Carried. Amendment adopted.

Rule 34 be changed to rule 35 and rule 34 should be the annual inspection of all county-owned properties and facilities at the next regular board meeting before the annual meeting. Discussion followed. Rules adopted. Ayes 34, Nays 17. Absent 1.

Rule No. 1 pertaining to the time of adjournment was discussed.

Motion made and seconded that all standing committees and elective committees with the exception of the Personnel Committee be designated as major committees. Carried.

Motion made and seconded to accept the rules as amended. Carried.

Motion made and seconded to defer George Framberger's report until the June meeting.

Duties of the Board were read.

Motion made and seconded to delete from the Agricultural and Education Committee "shall pass upon applications for Seed Loans." Carried.

Motion made and seconded to add to the County Fair, Conservation and Park Committee "Said Committee shall also consider all matters pertaining to Conservation and recreation." Carried.

Discussion followed on the recommendation of the budget. Motion made and seconded to let the rules pertaining to the budget stand as is. Carried.

Motion made and seconded to add "It shall be the duty of Finance Committee to advise with the County treasurer, and other County Board Committee and the Board of Trustees regarding finances." Carried.

Motion made and seconded that all departmental budgets be filed with the Finance Committee by September 15, 1963. Carried.

Motion made and seconded that the Personnel Committee to meet with the executive committee of the Courthouse Association and any other recognized bargaining unit when requested. Discussion followed. Carried.

Motion made and seconded that the rules of the committees be adopted as amended. Carried.

Communication of Supv. Jackson in regard to the University Extension trustee with the recommendation that Supv. King act as

trustee and member of the building committee. Motion made and seconded that special dispensation be made to waiver the rules on major committees. Carried.

Supv. Kohler addressed the board in regard to the expenditures of the Wolf River Basin.

Motion made and seconded to adjourn until 9:30 A.M. Wednesday. Carried.

SUPPORT BILLS 442A AND 361S—WOLF RIVER DAM

WHEREAS, one of the purposes of the Wolf River Planning Commission and the Park, Fair and Conservation Committee of Winnebago County is to preserve the scenic beauty and maintain the natural wild-life habitat of the Wolf River; and

WHEREAS, a proposed dam on the Wolf River in Langlade County, near the Town of Pearson, will adversely affect the scenic beauty and natural wild-life habitat of the Wolf River; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly Committee on Conservation is presently conducting hearings in the Assembly Chambers, Madison, Wisconsin, on two bills directly affecting the Wolf River, to-wit: Bill 442-A which would prohibit the construction of a dam on the Wolf River in Langlade County, Wisconsin, and Bill 361-S which would prohibit any development affecting the natural status of the Wolf River.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, that the County Board support the passage of Bill 442-A and Bill 361-S presently before the Assembly Committee on Conservation, and the County Clerk is hereby authorized to notify the Assembly Committee on Conservation of our support.

GENERAL CHANGE TO ZONING ORDINANCE

An Ordinance amending the Winnebago County Zoning Ordinance

The Winnebago County Board of Supervisors do Ordain that the County Zoning Ordinance be amended in the following respects:

Section XIII County Zoning Committee and Board of Adjustments

Under the heading APPEALS and as to subsection (g) — entire paragraph under subsection (g) to be rewritten as follows:

(g) After a public hearing by the town board and after obtaining a special permit for Public Dumping Grounds from the town board of the town wherein the land to be affected is located to designate areas in Agricultural and Commercial "B" and Industrial Districts to be used for public dumping grounds. The boundaries of such areas shall be defined and the location of such public dumping grounds may be changed from time to time by the same method by which they were originally established.

After obtaining a special permit for automobile wrecking yards from the town board of the town wherein in the land to be affected is located and after a public hearing by the County Zoning Committee to designate areas in the Commercial "B" District to be used for automobile wrecking yards. The boundaries of such automobile wrecking yards shall be defined and they shall be located not less than 750 feet from any Federal, State, County Trunk Highway or Town Road.

**RULES FOR THE PLEASANT ACRES HOME OF
THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY INSTITUTIONS**

The following Resolution No. 11 was presented:
TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN:

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin revise the admission requirements for accepting persons to be residents of Pleasant Acres, authorize a committee or board to act on admission applications for said institution, and establish the rates to be paid for residency in said institution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin, that the following regulations be established as necessary requirements for admission as a resident of Pleasant Acres.

ARTICLE I

a. To be a resident of Pleasant Acres, one must be of an acceptable age or must be limited by a physical disability. Acceptable age shall be determined and established by the Admittance Board.

b. One must make application on the forms provided.

c. The application must be accompanied by a physical examination form filled out by a physician chosen by the applicant.

d. If the applicant is on a full or partial pay basis, the application must be accompanied by a financial responsibility form, signed and guaranteed by the person or persons responsible for payments.

e. The application must be subscribed and sworn to before a notary public by the applicant or by his or her agent.

f. Medical reports, application form, financial responsibility forms, etc., are to be sent to the Superintendent of the institution.

ARTICLE II

a. Admission to Pleasant Acres can be denied by the Board if, in its opinion, the physical or mental condition of the applicant is such that the applying person could not be adequately cared for due to physical limitations of the institutions, personnel limitations, or other reasons which in the Board's judgment would deny admission. If, in the Board's opinion, admission of an applicant would be prejudicial to the other residents due to alcoholism or other factors, admission can be denied.

b. No person shall be admitted without their application being processed by the Admittance Board, classified and filed according to date.

c. In case of extreme emergency, one or more of the Admittance Board may admit a person from Winnebago County temporarily, but not without a medical examination conducted by a physician of the person's own choosing. The report of the medical examination must be presented on the prepared forms furnished by Pleasant Acres. The application must be processed by the Admittance Board at its next regularly scheduled meeting. The Medical Director must approve all admissions prior to entrance to Pleasant Acres.

d. If space becomes available in a particular care category and persons desiring this space are temporarily prevented by physical condition or other reason from entering the institution at the time the space is available, consideration will be given to offering the space to others who have indicated a recent desire to enter Pleasant Acres. This will be done subject to the provisions in Article II, b. and c. The medical director must give his prior approval in such cases.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of Winnebago County, Wisconsin does hereby create and establish a group of four persons to be known as the Pleasant Acres Admittance Board in the following manner:

a. One member of the Winnebago County Board Institutions Committee, to be appointed by the Chairman of said Committee.

b. One member of the Winnebago County Board Welfare Committee, to be appointed by the Chairman of said Committee. These appointments are to be made at the organization meeting of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors, after the committee chairmen are named.

c. One member of the Board of Trustees of the Winnebago County Institutions, appointed by the President of said Board. This appointment is to be made at the organization meeting of said Trustees.

d. The medical director of Pleasant Acres to serve in an advisory capacity subject to the provisions as outlined in the "Standards for Maintenance and Operation of County Homes" as approved by the State of Wisconsin, State Board of Public Welfare as adopted in April 1961.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that per diem mileage will be allowed to members of the Pleasant Acres Admittance Board at the same rate of pay as is paid to the Supervisors of the Winnebago County Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the rates payable for all residents at Pleasant Acres will be established by the Winnebago

County Board of Supervisors upon recommendation of the Trustees of the Winnebago County Institutions.

All rate classifications will include board, room, laundry, nursing service, and the services of the medical director on his regular visiting days. Clothing and medication requiring prescriptions will be in addition to established rates. Services provided in addition such as hospitalization at a community hospital, special physician services, etc., will be in addition to the established rates.

No refund of charges will be made for the first thirty-two days of residence at Pleasant Acres or any portion thereof. Refunds will be made only on the basis of time in residence at Pleasant Acres after thirty-two days.

One month payment of the established rate for the resident's care at Pleasant Acres shall be payable in advance upon approval of the applicant's entrance by the Admission Board.

The provisions of this resolution shall take effect upon adoption of this resolution.

The adoption of this resolution will nullify all existing resolutions of the Winnebago County Board pertaining to the rules, regulations and rates of the Winnebago County Home.

Meeting called to order by Chairman Joseph F. Drexler.

Roll call showed all present with the exception of Supervisors Pitz and Ryan. Soukup excused. Supervisors King and Steinhilber met the board at the Airport.

The meeting was opened by saluting the flag and prayer by Supervisor Hanson.

According to Rule 34, this date has been set aside for a tour of all county owned properties and facilities. Arrangement for the bus was made by Mr. Leon Morrissey, Highway Commissioner, who explained to the Board the route to be taken and the stops made.

AIRPORT ZONING ORDINANCE

The following ORDINANCE No. 1 was presented:

REGULATING THE HEIGHT OF STRUCTURES AND TREES AND THE USE OF PROPERTY IN THE VICINITY OF THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY AIRPORT, OSHKOSH, WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN.

The Board of Supervisors, Winnebago County, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

SECTION I. Definitions. As used in this ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires:

(a) "Airport" means the Winnebago County Airport located in Sections 34 and 35, Town 18N, Range 16E, Winnebago County, Wisconsin.

(b) "Airport Hazard" means any structure, object of natural growth, or use of land which obstructs the air space required for the flight of aircraft in landing or taking off at an airport or is otherwise hazardous to such landing or taking off.

(c) "Non-conforming use" means any structure, tree or use of land which does not conform to a regulation prescribed in this ordinance or an amendment thereto, as of the effective date of such regulation.

(d) "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, corporation, company, association, joint stock association, or body politic, and includes any trustee, receiver, assignee, or other similar representative thereof.

(e) "Structure" means any object constructed or installed by man.

(f) "Tree" means any object of natural growth, except farm crops which are cut at least once a year, and except shrubs, bushes or plants which do not grow to a height of more than five feet.

(g) "Runway" means a level portion of an airport having a surface specially developed and maintained for the landing and take-off of aircraft.

SECTION II. Zones. All zones established by this section are as shown on Maps A & B entitled "Zoning map for Winnebago County Airport, Winnebago County, Wisconsin," dated 1963, which are attached hereto and adopted as part of this ordinance.

SECTION III. Height Zones. Except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, no structure shall be constructed, altered, located or permitted to remain after such construction, alteration or location, and no trees shall be allowed to grow, to a height in excess of the height limit indicated on the maps referred to in Section II hereof.

SECTION IV. Use Restrictions. (a) Activities. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section III of this ordinance, no use may be made of land in any zone in such a manner as to create electrical interference with radio communication between the airport and aircraft, or make it difficult for pilots to distinguish between airport lights and others, or result in glare in the eyes of pilots using the airport, or impair visibility, in the vicinity of the airport or otherwise endanger the landing, taking off or maneuvering of aircraft.

(b) Exceptions. The restrictions contained in Section III shall not apply to legal fences or to farm crops which are cut at least once each year.

SECTION V. Non-conforming Uses. (a) Not Retroactive. The regulations prescribed in Sections II and III of this ordinance shall not be construed to require the removal, lowering or other change

or alteration of any non-conforming use, or otherwise interfere with the continuance of any non-conforming use, except as otherwise provided by Section VII (b), however, non-conforming objects existing at the time of adoption of this ordinance which violated the preceding Winnebago County Airport Zoning Ordinance adopted November 21, 1945, and subsequent amendments to date and were not exempt from the requirements of said preceding ordinance shall be subject to the requirements of this ordinance.

(b) Changes. Nothing herein contained shall require any change in the construction, alteration, or intended use of any structure, if the construction or alteration of such was begun prior to the effective date of this ordinance, and if such is diligently prosecuted.

(c) Removal. This section shall not interfere with the removal of non-conforming uses by purchase or the use of eminent domain.

SECTION VI. Administration. It shall be the duty of the County Zoning Officer to administer and enforce the regulations prescribed herein. Applications for permits and variances shall be made to the County Zoning Officer upon a form furnished by him. Applications which are by this ordinance to be decided by the County Zoning Officer shall be promptly considered and granted or denied by him. Applications for action by the Board of Adjustments shall be forthwith transmitted by the County Zoning Officer to the Board for hearing and decision.

SECTION VII. Permits. (a) Future uses. No structure shall hereafter be constructed, erected or installed, or be permitted to remain in the permit zone created by Section II of this ordinance until the owner or his agent shall have applied in writing for a permit therefore and obtained such permit from the County Zoning Officer, except structures more than one-half mile from the nearest airport boundary and less than 50 ft. maximum height above ground level at building site. Said permit shall be posted in a prominent place on the premises prior to and during the period of construction, erection, installation or establishment. No tree may be planted within the tree planting permit zone created by Section II of this ordinance, without a permit, and any tree planted without a permit or permitted to grow without planting may be ordered removed at any time by the County Zoning Officer upon his finding that such a tree violates or is about to violate the height restricting for the zone. Application for such permit shall indicate the use for which the permit is desired, and shall describe and locate the use with sufficient particularity to permit the County Zoning Officer to determine whether such use would conform to the regulations herein prescribed. If such determination is in the affirmative, the County Zoning Officer shall issue the permit applied for.

(b) Existing Uses. Before any non-conforming structure may be altered, repaired, or rebuilt, a permit shall be applied for and secured in the manner prescribed by paragraph (a) authorizing such change or repair. No such permit shall be granted that would allow the structure to become a greater hazard to air navigation than it was on the effective date of this ordinance, or than it is when the application for permit is made. No tree shall be allowed to grow so as to become a greater hazard to air navigation than it was at the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION VIII. Hazard Marking and Lighting. Any permit or variance granted under Section VII or IX, may, if such action is deemed advisable by the County Zoning Officer to effectuate the purpose of this ordinance and if such is reasonable in the circumstances, be so conditioned as to require the owner of the structure or trees in question to permit the owner of the airport, at its own expense, to install, operate, and maintain thereon such marker and

lights as may be necessary to indicate to the flyers the presence of an airport hazard.

SECTION IX. Winnebago County Board of Adjustments shall have jurisdiction over all appeals and review under this ordinance.

SECTION X. Appeals and Review. (a) Variances. Upon appeal in special cases the Board of Adjustments may, after investigation and public hearing, grant such variance from the terms of this ordinance as will not be contrary to the public interest, where owing to special conditions, a literal enforcement of this ordinance would result in unnecessary hardship, and such relief will do substantial justice and be in accord with the spirit of this ordinance, and does not create a hazard to the safe, normal operation of aircraft.

(b) Aggrieved Person. Any person aggrieved or affected by any decision or action of the County Zoning Officer made in his administration of this ordinance may appeal such decision or action to the Board of Adjustments.

(c) Procedure. Any appeal taken pursuant to this section shall be in conformity with the procedure established by Section 59.99 of the Statutes.

SECTION XI. Penalties. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than ten dollars nor more than two hundred dollars for such offense, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs of prosecution, shall be imprisoned in the county jail until said forfeiture and costs are paid, but not to exceed thirty days for each violation. Each day that a violation continues to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION XII. Severability. If any of the provisions of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION XIII. Repeal of Prior Ordinances. The Airport Zoning Ordinance dated November 21, 1945 and all subsequent amendments thereof, are hereby repealed.

SECTION XIV. Effect. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon passage and publication.

Motion made by Staffeld and seconded to adopt the Ordinance. This motion was withdrawn and Staffeld moved to refer to the Zoning Committee. Discussion followed and the District Attorney explained the ordinance. Motion carried to refer to the Zoning Committee.

Supervisor Staffeld gave an oral report on the airport hearings at Wausau. The District Attorney also addressed the board on the hearings at Wausau and answered the questions of the board.

WELFARE REPORT ON GEER-MURRAY PROPERTY

The following Report No. 1 was read:

TO: THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, WINNEBAGO COUNTY

The County Board of Supervisors in an assembled meeting on July 9, 1963 adopted a motion requesting that the Winnebago County Welfare Board "look into the adequacy" of the "Geer-Murray" building for housing of the Welfare Department. The Welfare Board was to report at the next meeting of the County Board on September 3, 1963.

It has been reported that the Wisconsin State Building Code would prohibit use of the third floor of the "Geer-Murray" building for office space. The Wisconsin Industrial Commission was contacted to determine the accuracy of this report. A letter was received on 8-26-63 from Mr. C. J. Caddell of the Wisconsin Industrial Commission, advising that the third floor cannot be used.

Elimination of the third floor cuts out 519 sq. ft. of floor space, leaving a total of 2806 sq. ft. in the "Geer-Murray" building. The Welfare Department presently utilizes 3017 sq. ft., or 211 more sq. ft. than would be available in the "Geer-Murray" building. It must also be kept in mind that the present area utilized by the Welfare Department is insufficient.

Therefore, we must conclude that the "Geer-Murray" building is not an adequate facility for housing of the Welfare Department.

AIRPORT ZONING ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE HEIGHT OF STRUCTURES AND TREES AND THE USE OF PROPERTY IN THE VICINITY OF THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY AIRPORT, WINNEBAGO COUNTY, WISCONSIN.

The Board of Supervisors, Winnebago County, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

SECTION I. Definitions. As used in this ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires:

(a) "Airport" means the Winnebago County Airport located in Sections 34 and 35, Town 18N, Range 16E, Winnebago County, Wisconsin.

(b) "Airport hazard" means any structure, object of natural growth, or use of land which obstructs the air space required for the flight of aircraft in landing or taking off at an airport or is otherwise hazardous to such landing or taking off.

(c) "Non-conforming use" means any structure, tree or use of land which does not conform to a regulation prescribed in this ordinance or an amendment thereto, as of the effective date of such regulation.

(d) "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, corporation, company, association, joint stock association, or body politic, and includes any trustee, receiver, assignee or other similar representative thereof.

(e) "Structure" means any object constructed or installed by man.

(f) "Tree" means any object of natural growth, except farm crops which are cut at least once a year, and except shrubs, bushes, or plants which do not grow to a height of more than five feet.

(g) "Runway" means a level portion of an airport having a surface specially developed and maintained for the landing and take-off of aircraft.

SECTION II. Zones. There are hereby established airport approach and navigation zones within a three-mile distance from the boundaries of the Winnebago County Airport as shown on official Zoning Map 'A' and official Zoning Map 'B,' Winnebago County Airport, Winnebago County, Wisconsin, dated October, 1963, which are attached hereto and adopted as part of this ordinance.

SECTION III. (a) Height Zones. Except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, no structure shall be constructed, altered, located or permitted to remain after such construction, alteration or location, and no trees shall be allowed to grow, to a height in excess of the height limit indicated within the zones of the maps referred to in Section II hereof.

(B) Exceptions. The restrictions contained in Section III (a) shall not apply to legal fences or to farm crops which are cut at least once each year.

SECTION IV. Use Restrictions. Activities. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section III of this ordinance, no use may be made of land in any zone in such a manner as to create electrical interference with radio communication between the airport and aircraft, or make it difficult for pilots to distinguish between airport lights and others or result in glare in the eyes of pilots using the airport, or impair visibility, in the vicinity of the airport or otherwise endanger the landing, taking off or maneuvering of aircraft.

SECTION V. Non-conforming Uses. (a) Not Retroactive. The regulations prescribed in Sections II and III of this ordinance shall not be construed to require the removal, lowering or other change or alteration of any non-conforming use, or otherwise interfere with the continuance of any non-conforming use, except as otherwise provided by Section VII (b), however, non-conforming objects existing at the time of adoption of this ordinance which violated the preceding Winnebago County Airport Zoning Ordinance adopted March 12, 1946, and subsequent amendments to date and were not exempt from the requirements of said preceding ordinance shall be subject to the requirements of this ordinance.

(b) Changes. Nothing herein contained shall require any changes in the construction, alteration, or intended use of any structure, if the construction or alteration of such was begun prior to the effective date of this ordinance, and if such is diligently prosecuted.

(c) Removal. This section shall not interfere with the removal of non-conforming uses by purchase or the use of eminent domain.

SECTION VI. Administration. It shall be the duty of the County Zoning Officer to administer and enforce the regulations prescribed herein. Applications for permits and variances shall be made to the County Zoning Officer or his designated agent upon a form furnished by him. Applications which are by this ordinance to be decided by the County Zoning Officer shall be promptly considered and granted or denied by him. Applications for action by the Board of Adjustments shall be forthwith transmitted by the County Zoning Officer to the Board for hearing and decision.

SECTION VII. Permits. (a) Future uses. No structure shall hereafter be constructed, erected or installed, or be permitted to remain in any zone created by Section II of this ordinance until the owner or his agent shall have applied in writing for a permit therefor and obtained such permit from the County Zoning Officer or his design-

nated agent, except structures more than one-half mile from the nearest airport boundary and less than fifty feet maximum height above ground level at building site. Said permit shall be posted in a prominent place on the premises prior to and during the period of construction, erection, installation or establishment. No tree may be planted within the tree planting permit zone created by Section II of this ordinance and shown on official Zoning Map 'A,' without a permit, and any tree planted without a permit or permitted to grow without planting may be ordered removed at any time by the County Zoning Officer or his designated agent upon his finding that such tree violates or is about to violate the height restriction for the zone. Application for such permit shall indicate the use for which the permit is desired, and shall describe and locate the use with sufficient particularity to permit the County Zoning Officer to determine whether such use would conform to the regulations herein prescribed. If such determination is in the affirmative, the County Zoning Officer shall issue the permit applied for.

(b) Existing Uses. Before any non-conforming structure may be altered, repaired, or rebuilt, a permit shall be applied for and secured in the manner prescribed by paragraph (a) authorizing such change or repair, except that a non-conforming use other than utility poles destroyed, to the extent of seventy-five (75) per cent or more of its assessed valuation, according to the assessment for the fiscal year in which such destruction occurs, shall, from and after the date of such destruction, conform to the regulation of this ordinance. No such permit shall be granted that would allow the structure to become a greater hazard to air navigation than it was on the effective date of this ordinance, or than it is when the application for permit is made. No tree shall be allowed to grow so as to become a greater hazard to air navigation than it was at the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION VIII. Hazard Marking and Lighting. Any variance granted under Sections IX and X may, if such action is deemed advisable by the County Board of Adjustments to effectuate the purpose of this ordinance and if such is reasonable in the circumstances, be so conditioned as to require the owner of the structure or trees in question to permit the owner of the airport, at its own expense, to install, operate, and maintain thereon such marker and lights as may be necessary to indicate to the flyers the presence of an airport hazard.

SECTION IX. Winnebago County Board of Adjustments shall have jurisdiction over all appeals and review under this ordinance.

SECTION X. Appeals and Review. (a) Variances. Upon appeal in special cases the Board of Adjustments may, after investigation and public hearing, grant such variance from the terms of this ordinance as will not be contrary to the public interest, where owing to special conditions, a literal enforcement of this ordinance would result in unnecessary hardship, and such relief will do substantial justice and be in accord with the spirit of this ordinance, and does not create a hazard to the safe, normal operation of aircraft.

(b) Aggrieved Person. Any person aggrieved or affected by any decision or action of the County Zoning Officer made in his administration of this ordinance may appeal such decision or action to the Board of Adjustments.

(c) Procedure. Any appeal taken pursuant to this section shall be in conformity with the procedure established by Section 59.99 of the Statutes.

SECTION XI. Penalties. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than ten dollars nor more than two hundred dollars for such offense, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs of prosecution, shall be imprisoned in the county jail until said forfeiture and costs are paid, but not to exceed thirty days for each violation. Each day that a violation continues to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION XII. Severability. If any of the provisions of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable.

SECTION XIII. Repeal of Prior Ordinances. The Airport Zoning Ordinance dated November 21, 1945 and adopted March 12, 1946, and all subsequent amendments thereof, are hereby repealed.

SECTION XIV. Effect. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon passage and publication.

SECTION XV. Filing. This ordinance shall be filed in the office of the County Clerk, but shall not be recorded by the Register of Deeds. The Clerk shall notify the Register of Deeds of such filing, and such notice shall be recorded.

Roll call showed all present with the exception of Supervisors Mueller and Soukup.

The meeting was opened by saluting the flag and prayer by Supervisor Daggett.

A communication from the Common Council of the City of Oshkosh was read stating that the City of Oshkosh is interested in purchasing the fair ground site. General discussion by the board members. Supervisor Kohler moved to refer the communication to the Fair, Park, Conservation and Recreation Committee. Carried.

WOLF RIVER ZONING PETITION

PETITION NO. 1. A petition to amend the Winnebago County Zoning Ordinance as it relates to the Town of Wolf River. Referred to the Zoning Committee.

COWLING ZONING PETITION

PETITION NO. 2. A petition from Joseph H. Cowling in the Town of Vinland for re-zoning. Referred to the Zoning Committee

GALLIGAN ZONING PETITION

PETITION NO. 3. A petition from Harry E. Galligan in the Town of Neenah for re-zoning. Referred to the Zoning Committee.

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A CLASSIFICATION AND COMPENSATION PLAN FOR WINNEBAGO COUNTY HOSPITAL AND PLEASANT ACRES

The following Resolution No. 1 was presented:

WHEREAS, your Personnel Committee and a subcommittee thereof, together with representatives of the Winnebago County Hospital and Pleasant Acres Employees Union, Local 1280, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, have thoroughly discussed, studied, and considered the classification and compensation plan submitted by the State Bureau of Personnel for the County Hospital and Pleasant Acres, as well as alternative proposals and counter-proposals during several negotiating meetings; and

WHEREAS, the said Union and Personnel Committee have reached agreement relating to wages, and hours, as set forth hereafter, and therefore jointly recommend rejection of the plan sub-

mitted by the Bureau of Personnel and adoption of the Classification and Compensation Plan herein, which is hereby presented to the Board of Supervisors for acceptance in its entirety or rejection without amendments which would necessitate further negotiations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that the "Winnebago County Hospital and Home Classification and Compensation Plan" of the Wisconsin Bureau of Personnel dated September 17, 1963 is hereby rejected, and the retroactive features mentioned in Resolution No. 52 dated November 8, 1962, presented by the Personnel Committee are therefore null and void;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the following be adopted as the Classification and Compensation Plan for Winnebago County Hospital and Pleasant Acres:

(1) An eight hour day shall be established for all personnel involved in food service and patient care, as required by the State Department of Public Welfare;

(2) All employees shall be paid in accordance with the salary schedule which is attached hereto and is made a part hereof, and this shall be interpreted to mean that beginning on January 1, 1964, each employee shall be compensated within the range for his classification at a step which corresponds to his length of service at the institution and shall automatically advance to the next step on the first of the month following his anniversary date during 1964, but no employee shall be compensated in excess of the range in his classification. All salary increases within any classification beginning January 1, 1965 shall be on an annual calendar year basis only, except for probationary employees.

(3) The Superintendent is hereby authorized to establish the rate of overtime pay for any employee, but such rate of pay shall not exceed the employee's regular hourly wage.

(4) Authorization is hereby granted for check-off of union dues by agreement with the Superintendent and the Board of Trustees.

(5) Vacations, Sick Leave, Holidays, Holiday Pay, Military Leave, Pregnancy Leave, and Funeral Leave shall be as presently established, as in the Agreement dated 12-2-63 between Local 1280 and the Board of Trustees and the Superintendent, but any changes in such matters shall require the prior approval of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

(6) The Board of Trustees of the County Hospital and Pleasant Acres is hereby authorized to enter into such agreements and arrangements with the employees' union as are in conformity with the Wisconsin Statutes and this resolution, and are not in conflict with any other resolution or ordinance of the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors.

(7) This compensation plan shall be effective beginning January 1, 1964 and shall remain in effect throughout the calendar year 1964. It shall continue in effect thereafter beyond 1964, unless amended or superseded by a later resolution or agreement.

(8) All employees shall be classified according to their work assignment, and shall be paid in accordance with the rates established for such classifications, except that if recruitment difficulties exist or if a potential appointee possesses unusual qualifications directly related to the requirements of the position, the Board of Trustees may permit recruitment at any step in the pay range. The Union shall be notified of any such hire within its bargaining unit.

(9) Any employee hired on or after January 1, 1964, shall be eligible for a step increase in pay into Step A following satisfactory completion of a six (6) month's probationary period, providing the probationary period does not terminate in the month of December, and such employee shall remain in Step A for at least one (1) full year and shall not be considered eligible for Step B until the following January 1st.

(10) All-monthly rates including the intermediate steps prescribed in the pay ranges are the rates authorized for full time employment for the regularly established work-week for the classification unless otherwise specified. When employment is on a parttime basis, only the proportionate part of the rate for the time actually worked shall be paid. The applicable standard work-week shall apply in interpreting this provision.

(11) When an employee is promoted to a position in a higher pay class, his pay shall be increased to the minimum rate for the higher class. If his present rate is equal to or exceeds this minimum, his pay shall be increased to the next higher rate of pay in the new class above his present rate.

(12) When an employee is transferred to a position in a lower pay class, he shall be paid at a rate which is within the range for the lower class position. The rate of pay for the position shall be recommended by the Superintendent and approved by the Board of Trustees. Employees demoted for disciplinary reasons shall not be governed by the above, but the rate of pay established for disciplinary reasons shall be subject to grievance action.

(13) All hours of work performed in excess of the normal hours within the classification of the employee shall be compensated for at the employee's regular rate of pay; however, the Superintendent may allow employees compensatory time off in lieu of additional compensation for occasional overtime. Overtime pay shall be computed for 40 hour employees by dividing the employee's monthly salary by 174 hours, and for employees working a four (4) days on and four (4) days off schedule by dividing the employee's monthly salary by 159¼ hours. For extra work outside of the employee's classification, the Superintendent shall have the authority to compensate employees up to but not in excess of the employee's regular rate of pay.
