PRESENTATION ON THE JAIL STUDY / JAIL POPULATION UPDATE

Sheriff John Matz and Chief Deputy Todd Christopherson presented to the board the possibility of the need for jail expansion or how to direct people to diversion programs to keep them from being incarcerated. Sheriff Matz touched on the personnel that is currently running the jail and the current design of the building. He explained the different classifications of the inmates that are incarcerated at the jail.

Sheriff Matz explained the capacity of the jail and provided graphs with information regarding admissions to the jail. He provided charts showing the different crimes that inmates were incarcerated for. He explained the different programs that are available for inmates such as: Huber, Electronic Monitoring, 24/7 Alcohol Monitoring and 24/7 Drug Monitoring. There are also diversion programs that are available instead of incarceration. Sheriff Matz explained the different contracted services and the correct care solutions that are available at the jail.

In 2011, a Kimme Study was done to determine the need and projected space that would be required for the jails population in the future. Sheriff Matz provided a graph to show how much space would be needed in the future. He touched on other related costs that would need to be considered as part of the expansion.

Sheriff Matz then took questions from the board. A copy of this presentation is available in the County Clerk's office.

RESOLUTION NO. 041-062018: Appropriate \$3,480,000 to a Capital Project to Construct a Sixteen (16) Bed Behavioral Health Adult Community-Based Residential Facility for the Winnebago County Department of Human Services

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County Department of Human Services currently rents two separate facilities to provide mental health crises services and to house mental health clients; and

WHEREAS, the landlords of these rental properties are increasing the annual rent for both facilities at rates that far exceed the new money Winnebago County can levy based on increases in net new construction; and

WHEREAS, the new facility would be a 16 bed facility owned by Winnebago County and staffed by County employees (current facilities are staffed by Winnebago County employees); and

WHEREAS, a cost benefit analysis was prepared and shows that the facility would pay for itself after 16 years (the savings over that period would equal the facility cost); and

WHEREAS, this information was presented to the Winnebago County Board at its November 15, 2016, and May 15, 2018, meetings; and

WHEREAS, estimated costs for construction and equipment for this facility is \$3,480,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby approves the appropriation of \$3,480,000 to a capital project fund to account for the costs of the project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that funds to pay for the project will be transferred from the General Fund and be reimbursed by subsequent bond issues.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article VI, Section 3, of the Wisconsin Constitution, the Legislature for the State of Wisconsin is directed to redistrict state legislative districts "according to the number of inhabitants" at its next session following the decennial federal census. The Wisconsin Legislature also reapportions congressional districts at the same interval pursuant to Federal Law; and

WHEREAS, because state and federal legislative redistricting is controlled by the majority party at the time of the redistricting, legislative and congressional plans in Wisconsin have been subject to partisan influence that places the desires of politicians ahead of the electoral prerogative of the people. Redistricting to achieve partisan gains is improper, whether it is done by a Republican-controlled or a Democratic-controlled legislature; and

WHEREAS, a panel of federal district court judges has ruled that redistricting in the State of Wisconsin in 2011 was unconstitutional. Legal costs in defense of redistricting in 2011 have already cost taxpayers in excess of \$2.1 million, and litigation is still ongoing; and

WHEREAS, the state and congressional districts belong to the citizens of Wisconsin and not to any legislator, interest group, or political party. The redistricting process should not be a tool used by those in power to protect and bolster their power, but should be designed with the best interests of Wisconsin's democracy and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, historically, Wisconsin's practice of redistricting by the majority party in each legislative chamber is an outdated practice that stifles political competition, discourages compromise, ensures continued control by the party in power, and lacks the transparency necessary to reinforce citizens' faith in the democratic process; and

WHEREAS, at this time, there is a critical need to restore trust, compromise, and fair competition to Wisconsin politics.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that before the start of the next redistricting process following the 2020 federal census, it hereby calls upon the Wisconsin State Legislature to pass legislation that creates a fair, nonpartisan procedure for the preparation of legislative and congressional redistricting plans, that promotes more accountability and transparency, prohibits the consideration of voting patterns, party information, and incumbents' residence information or demographic information in drawing the maps, except as necessary to ensure minority participation as required by the U.S. Constitution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby advocates for an amendment to the Wisconsin Constitution giving the responsibility of legislative redistricting to a nonpartisan commission.

WHEREAS, the Continental Congress provided that same day, by orders of their House, that their Declaration should be proclaimed aloud and published to the free citizens of the territories represented in their Congress; and

WHEREAS, the notification of the Declaration to responsible citizens was then done by sheriffs who proclaimed it on the courthouse steps, by clergymen who read it from their pulpits, and by printers who printed it in their gazettes; and

WHEREAS, the Continental Congress thus initiated a process that has created the constitutions and state governments of our Union including the Constitution and government of the State of Wisconsin.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby requests Sheriff John Matz to read the Declaration of Independence from the steps of the Courthouse at 8:00 a.m. on the morning of July 4, 2018, as this was the custom in the early history of our country.

WHEREAS, in a 2016 poll, 59 percent of Wisconsinites said that marijuana should be "fully legalized and regulated like alcohol," and recent polls show a majority of Americans favor legalization of adult recreational use of marijuana; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin State Legislature has failed to act on legislation to legalize and regulate marijuana, and has not allowed hearings on such legislation; and

WHEREAS, legalizing and taxing marijuana could significantly increase state and local revenues; and

WHEREAS, an estimate by the Congressional Research Service suggests that replacing marijuana prohibition with a system of taxation and regulation could yield \$6.8 billion in Federal excise taxes alone; and

WHEREAS, Alaska, California, Colorado, Maine, Massachusetts, Nevada, Oregon, and Washington have legalized adult personal use of marijuana, and regulate the production, distribution, and sale of marijuana, while Vermont and the District of Columbia have legalized limited personal possession and cultivation of marijuana by adults; and

WHEREAS, the time law enforcement spends enforcing existing marijuana laws and ordinances negatively impacts the time available to solve more serious crimes and apprehend more dangerous criminals; and

WHEREAS, marijuana prohibition makes product quality control and sales regulation impossible, leaving marijuana sellers free to target children as potential customers and to peddle potentially adulterated products.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby authorizes Winnebago County to conduct a county-wide advisory referendum to appear on ballots during the November 6, 2018, general election, and that a concise statement of the question be given and shall read as follows:

Question: Should the Wisconsin State Legislature enact proposed legislation that allows individuals 21 years of age and older to engage in the medical and recreational use of marijuana, while also regulating commercial marijuana-related activities including, but not limited to, imposing a tax on the sale of marijuana, and expunging marijuana-related crimes for those convicted in Wisconsin?

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby directs the Winnebago County Corporation Counsel to prepare a Notice of Referendum to be published by the Winnebago County Clerk in accordance with statutory requirements.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that this Resolution and the Referendum shall be filed with the Winnebago County Clerk no later than 70 days prior to the election. The question will appear on the ballot of the November 6, 2018, general election.

6. PUBLIC FORUM (*Opportunity to comment about an Agenda item or new business; say your name & address (no action taken by the Board)*)

Darlene Metz lives in Imperial Hills and says there is no mention of dog bites in the Ordinance, would like our Ordinance to include that. Has some examples of Ordinances from other towns. Attorney Blazel said our Ordinance mentions if a dog is off their property, a citation could be sent. A \$187 citation was sent to the dog owner with an April 17 court date, the cost includes \$100 for forfeiture and remaining is court costs. Attorney Blazel said the County has a "running at large" citation that the Sheriff's Dept can issue, typically don't issue on the first offense. Unless there was a serious offense, they may do something right away. The County does not have a vicious dog ordinance. If there is a repeated incident with the dog, we can go through a process to deem the dog as being vicious but depends on the Ordinance. Darlene Metz said it's hard to rely on people to do the right thing. The dog owner has a fence up now, but four people had to get hurt. Chairman Schmick said we can put this on the docket to look at our Ordinance to include dogs biting. Darlene Metz said she has 2 dogs, if her dog bit or hurt someone, she would put it down. Jay Janssen also lives in Imperial Hills, and was one of the four people bitten and also would like to have an Ordinance regarding dog bites. Constable Ralph Kalies said there was a lot of activity when this happened and the Sheriff's Dept was involved. The County does not have any authority to take the dog. The dog was quarantined and was negative for rabies. He worked with the owner on the seriousness of this situation. She said she would keep the dog tethered but yet another bite, so a citation was issued. The electric fence wasn't working and was supposed to get that fixed, a professional trainer was going to be involved, and then a fence was installed. There is action being taken but nothing we can issue, nor the County. Attorney Blazel said there is a State Statute that if a dog causes serious injury and that the owner knew about the first offense, and happened off the owner's property with no reason for the dog to attack, it is possible to petition the court to euthanize the dog. We prefer not to get to that point. We would need to evaluate this and prove there was serious injury. Chairman Schmick said we will start to work on this as this has not happened before. Eric Whiting said he appreciates the concern with this situation but if it's not reported, a law doesn't help. It's the owner's responsibility to take care of the dog. An insurance company could cancel your home insurance if the dog is not put down. Health Services must know about this because of the quarantine. To say we need a law for this, I get it, but there needs to be common sense. At what point is it a civil matter versus getting the Town involved? Tom Thiel said the owner must have quite a fence. Jay Janssen said it is a decent, wrought iron fence.

Art Rathjen from Greater Oshkosh – will be inviting the Board for a time to meet with the other Greater Oshkosh members.

Proposal Summary

1. Completeness of proposal and compliance with requirements

- Attended the pre-bid meeting and completed facility tour
- Met all deadlines for submission of proposal
- Provided a cover letter with their proposal listing past clients, experience of staff, and advised that they would be partnered with CRS Inc. for completion of the study and with Boldt for all construction cost budget work.
- Advised of their prior work for Winnebago County and familiarity with the building
- Overall, proposal was easy to read, understand, and mostly followed the chronological order of the RFP as written.

2. Responses to requirements in section 3 of the RFP (Deliverables)

- **PHASE 1**
- Venture project team would analyze inmate-specific information and data for at least the past three years (preferably 10 years or more) to identify inmate characteristics and associated trends. They will look at the criminal justice system through the inmate population to identify key characteristics of inmates and the reasons for which they are incarcerated. This detailed insight of the nature of the previous jail populations will be useful to:
 - i. Identify trends that might impact future Jail needs (beds and support)
 - ii. Understand the dynamics of the inmate population
 - iii. Analyze the range of options available to the stakeholders and the gaps by looking at the inmates who end up in jail
 - iv. Identify opportunities to safely divert inmates from confinement- pretrial and post-conviction
 - v. Estimate the impact of proposed programs and services on future jail needs (beds and support)
 - vi. Describe the types of jail beds that will be needed in terms of:
 - 1. Gender
 - 2. Status (pretrial/sentenced)
 - 3. Risk and security levels (minimum, medium, maximum)
 - 4. Special Needs (geriatric, bariatric, medical, mental health)
 - 5. Supervision
- Length of inmate stay will be evaluated to provide an analysis of the dynamics of admissions, releases and length of stay

6 **TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:**

7 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to Article VI, Section 3, of the Wisconsin Constitution, the Legislature for the State of
8 Wisconsin is directed to redistrict state legislative districts “according to the number of inhabitants” at its next session
9 following the decennial federal census. The Wisconsin Legislature also reapportions congressional districts at the
10 same interval pursuant to Federal Law; and

11 **WHEREAS**, because state and federal legislative redistricting is controlled by the majority party at the time of
12 the redistricting, legislative and congressional plans in Wisconsin have been subject to partisan influence that places
13 the desires of politicians ahead of the electoral prerogative of the people. Redistricting to achieve partisan gains is
14 improper, whether it is done by a Republican-controlled or a Democratic-controlled legislature; and

15 **WHEREAS**, a panel of federal district court judges has ruled that redistricting in the State of Wisconsin in
16 2011 was unconstitutional. Legal costs in defense of redistricting in 2011 have already cost taxpayers in excess of
17 \$2.1 million, and litigation is still ongoing; and

18 **WHEREAS**, the state and congressional districts belong to the citizens of Wisconsin and not to any
19 legislator, interest group, or political party. The redistricting process should not be a tool used by those in power to
20 protect and bolster their power, but should be designed with the best interests of Wisconsin’s democracy and its
21 citizens; and

22 **WHEREAS**, historically, Wisconsin’s practice of redistricting by the majority party in each legislative chamber
23 is an outdated practice that stifles political competition, discourages compromise, ensures continued control by the
24 party in power, and lacks the transparency necessary to reinforce citizens’ faith in the democratic process; and

25 **WHEREAS**, at this time, there is a critical need to restore trust, compromise, and fair competition to
26 Wisconsin politics.

28 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that before the
29 start of the next redistricting process following the 2020 federal census, it hereby calls upon the Wisconsin State
30 Legislature to pass legislation that creates a fair, nonpartisan procedure for the preparation of legislative and
31 congressional redistricting plans, that promotes more accountability and transparency, prohibits the consideration of
32 voting patterns, party information, and incumbents’ residence information or demographic information in drawing the
33 maps, except as necessary to ensure minority participation as required by the U.S. Constitution.

36 an amendment to the Wisconsin Constitution giving the responsibility of legislative redistricting to a nonpartisan

CONSORTIUM AGREEMENT FOR THE CHIEF ELECTED OFFICIALS OF THE FOX VALLEY WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT AREA

This Agreement is made and entered into by and between the Counties of Calumet, Fond du Lac, Green Lake, Waupaca, Waushara and Winnebago in the State of Wisconsin (hereinafter "the Counties).

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Sec. 66.0301(2) of the Wisconsin Statutes provides that "...any municipality may contract with other municipalities, for . . . the joint exercise of any power or duty required or authorized by law."

WHEREAS, Sec. 66.0301(2) of the Wisconsin Statutes titled "Intergovernmental Cooperation" authorizes counties to make the most efficient use of their power by cooperating with each other on the basis of mutual advantage and thereby provide job training and related services in the manner that will accord best with geographic, economic, population, and other factors influencing the needs and development of local communities;

WHEREAS, the Counties have a mutual interest in forming a single purpose Workforce Development Area (WDA), as defined in Public Law 113-128, of the Federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 (hereafter referred to as WIOA) to increase occupational skills, employment, job retention and earnings, and as a result, improve the quality, reduce welfare dependency and enhance the productivity and competitiveness of the workforce within the boundaries of the units of counties that are parties to this Agreement;

WHEREAS, the chief elected officials of the Counties participating in this Agreement have been previously authorized by their respective County Boards of Supervisors to create the Fox Valley Workforce Development Area under Sec. 66.0301(2), Wisconsin Statutes, and to participate as active partners, pursuant to Section 107(c)(1)(B), in the provisions of said Public Law 113-128;

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors of each of the aforementioned counties has adopted a resolution authorizing the County Board Chairperson or County Executive to sign this "Agreement of the Fox Valley Wisconsin Counties Consortium under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (Public Law 113-128)" (hereinafter, the "Agreement");

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the above premises and the mutual covenants of the parties hereinafter set forth, the Counties do hereby agree to the following Agreement:

AGREEMENT

That the Counties of Calumet, Fond du Lac, Green Lake, Waupaca, Waushara and Winnebago, under Sec. 66.0301(2) Wisconsin Statutes, do hereby constitute themselves to be a consortium for the purposes of Section 107 (c)(1)(B) of Public Law 113-128, the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act.

The Chief Elected Officials (the chairpersons of the County Board of Supervisors or County Executives) or the designees of said officials of the Counties in the above paragraph shall constitute the Workforce Development Area Consortium of Commissioners (hereinafter, the "Consortium") which shall appoint the Workforce Development Board under Section 107(c)(1)(A) of the Act.

I. PURPOSE: The Purpose of this Agreement shall be to:

- A. Enable the Counties to organize a Workforce Development Area (WDA) as described in Sec. 106 of Public Law 113-128, the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, which:
 - 1. is comprised of two or more units of local government
 - 2. will promote and coordinate effective delivery of job training services within the aforesaid Counties; and
 - 3. is consistent with labor market areas or areas in which related services are provided under other State and Federal Programs.
- B. Enable chief elected officials from the Counties entering into this Agreement to appoint members to a local Workforce Development Board (WDB) under Section 107(c)(1)(B)(i)(I) of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act; and
 - 1. determine procedures for the development of a Local Plan, pursuant to Section 107(d) of the WIOA, and interface with the WDA by such methods or institutions as may be provided in such agreement;
 - 2. select a grant recipient, if other than the Chief Elected Official as stated in Section 107(d)(12)(B)(i) of the WIOA, and/or an entity to administer the Local Plan; and
 - 3. other functions and tasks as appropriate.

II. ADMINISTRATION & GOVERNANCE

The Counties participating in this Agreement select the County Executives of Fond du Lac and Winnebago Counties and the County Board Chairpersons/Vice-Chairpersons of Calumet, Green Lake, Waupaca and Waushara Counties to be their authorized representatives, also referred to as Chief Elected Officials (CEOs), to serve as a CEO Consortium. The Consortium shall approve the Local Plan (or modifications); jointly submit such a plan (or modifications) along with the local WDB to the Governor for approval; and carry out other responsibilities for the Counties in accordance with their agreement with the local WDB.

- A. Meetings. The CEO Consortium shall establish the time, place and date of its meetings.
 - 1. Notices. All notices, requests, demands or other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given, if delivered electronically, faxed, or

mailed to the Counties at the following addresses, subject to the Wisconsin Open Meeting Law:

B. Officers: Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Secretary

Each County Executive or Chairperson, or their designees, will serve as officers of the Consortium. Rotation of officers will be based upon alphabetical order of the names of the Counties for two year terms. The first Chairperson shall be from Calumet County, the Vice-chairperson from Fond du Lac County and the Secretary from Green Lake County. The order of succession from thereon shall be that the Vice-Chairperson shall be elevated to Chairperson, the Secretary shall be elevated to the Vice-Chairperson, and the Secretary shall be appointed from the county which is next in the alphabetical order. After serving as Vice-Chairperson, if a County is unable or unwilling to serve as the Chairperson of the CEOs, that County may request that the Consortium appoint the current Secretary as Chairperson. The Vice-Chairperson and/or Secretary shall then be appointed from the Counties which are next in the alphabetical order. The Chairperson may appoint a staff person of one of the consortium member counties or the administrative entity to serve as board clerk. Vacancies shall be filled by election for the remainder of the unexpired term.

Officers of the CEO Consortium and their responsibilities are as follows:

1. The Chairperson of the Consortium will preside over all meetings and shall be the Chief Elected Official (CEO) for purposes of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act. This person shall have signatory authority and authority to speak for the consortium in all matters regarding the WIOA. The term of this designation shall be identified.
2. The Vice-Chairperson will preside over meetings in the absence of the Chairperson.
3. The Secretary will ensure proper notice of all meetings of the Consortium, the keeping of minutes for the Consortium meetings and circulate those minutes as directed by the Consortium. In the absence of the Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson, the Secretary shall perform the duties of the Chairperson.

4. The Chairperson may appoint a staff person of one of the consortium member counties, otherwise the administrative entity shall serve as clerk. In the absence of FVWDB staff, the clerk performs the duties of the secretary.
5. Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised, shall govern the procedures of the Consortium insofar as they do not conflict with applicable law or administrative rules or by-laws duly adopted by the Consortium.

III. TERM

This Agreement shall be reviewed annually and renewed unless the Counties choose to terminate pursuant to Section VII herein, or termination of Public Law 113-128, the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014.

IV. POWERS

The Counties participating in this Agreement shall have the power to:

- A. Appoint members to the Workforce Development Board (WDB) as prescribed under Section 107(c)(1)(B)(i)(I) of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act and as set forth in Attachment A to this Agreement, which is incorporated herein by reference.
- B. Select an individual or individuals as their Authorized Representative (CEO) to approve the Local Plan (or modifications) and jointly submit such plans (or modifications) to the Governor for approval as set forth in Section II of this Agreement.)
- C. Perform other powers assigned to chief elected officials authorized Sec. 66.0301(2) of the Wisconsin Statutes, or Public Law 113-128, the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014, as each now exists or is hereafter amended.
- D. The Consortium shall execute an agreement with the Workforce Development Board for the operation and functions of the Board under Section 107 of the WIOA, and shall approve all Local Plans under Section 108 of the WIOA.

V. FISCAL MANAGEMENT

The Counties consenting to this Agreement, along with the local WDB, will select the WIOA Grant Recipient and Administrative Entity. The WIOA Grant Recipient is responsible for the job training and related services. The Administrative Entity shall keep itemized and detailed records covering all expenditures under the budget incorporated in the jointly approved and submitted Local Plan from the Authorized Representative and the WDB. The local WDA Administrative Entity shall conform to all the fiscal requirements of all applicable laws.

VI. CONTRACTS AND CONTRACTUAL SERVICES

The WDA Grant Recipient and Administrative Entity may exclusively enter into contracts, concerning job training and related services authorized under WIOA, with the State or Federal governments, and may subcontract with any municipal, profit or non-profit corporation, or individual to provide job training and related programs and services for residents identified in the Local Plan.

TERMINATION

- A. Any county entering into this Agreement may withdraw from the Workforce Development Area pursuant to the relevant provisions in State and Federal laws.
- B. The Counties forming the Fox Valley Workforce Development Area may terminate this Agreement in the event expected or actual funding from the State, Federal governments, or other source is withdrawn or substantially reduced in such a fashion as to make the continued operation of the WDA unfeasible. In such case, termination of this Agreement shall be effective upon written notice of termination with receipt acknowledged by all Counties and the Governor.
- C. The Governor will re-designate a local Workforce Development Area under Section 106 of WIOA and thereby terminate this Agreement if the WDB and Chief Elected Officials fail to reach agreement on the development of the Local Plan, the choice of the Administrative Entity or Grant Recipient.
- D. The Consortium may be dissolved and this agreement may be rescinded only with the consent of all the Boards of Supervisors of the counties party hereto and the Governor.
- E. Any county that withdraws from the Consortium shall remain liable for its proportionate share of liabilities related to the period prior to its withdrawal, as determined by the CEO Consortium.

VII. ACQUISITION AND DISPOSAL OF PROPERTY

The Administrative Entity shall acquire, hold, and dispose of real and personal property in the same manner as counties within the State of Wisconsin, as provided for in Sections 59.06, 66.28 and 75.35 of the Wisconsin Statutes, as well as consistent with WIOA regulations and guidelines.

VIII. APPLICABLE LAW

The Counties agree that this Agreement shall be construed pursuant to and in accordance with the laws of the State of Wisconsin.

IX. AMENDMENT

The Consortium may adopt operational and procedural By-Laws consistent with this Agreement, applicable federal and state laws, and rules or regulations pursuant thereto, By-Laws or amendments thereto may be adopted by the affirmative vote of 2/3 of the entire membership of the Consortium at any regular meeting called for that purpose, provided that written copies thereof are delivered to each member 15 days prior to consideration.

X. IMPACT OF LEGISLATIVE CHANGES

Any terms and conditions which may be rendered inapplicable by a change in State, Federal or local laws shall not affect the validity of those portions of this Agreement not impacted by the change in legislation. It is further understood by the Counties that certain terminology in this Agreement may change as Federal and State laws governing this Agreement dictate.

XI. LIABILITY

To the extent permitted by law, liability which arises pursuant to this Agreement shall be apportioned as follows:

- A. Workforce programs in the Fox Valley Workforce Development Area shall be administered

prudently to minimize liability;

- B. Contracts for service delivery shall require indemnification by the contractor in the event that contractor errors or omissions result in disallowed costs or other liability;
- C. The FVWDB shall maintain adequate errors and omission insurance as described in the Joint Agreement, to cover CEOs and the FVWDB members;
- D. The Consortium is liable for any misuse of the grant funds allocated to the local area under sections 128 and 133 of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act.
- E. In the case of any misuse of grant funds allocated to the local area, the Consortium agrees to assume liability as follows (Section 20 CFR 683.710) Liability will be determined by the CEO Consortium based upon the particular facts of the situation as to the responsibility of individual Consortium members for the particular funds.
- F. Finally, after every possible method to reduce liability is exhausted, any remaining liability, as determined by the CEO Consortium shall be apportioned between the six counties in proportion to their respective percentage of the workforce allocation in the year the disallowed cost or other liability occurred. For example, if \$10,000 in liability remained and a given county received an allocation of 10% of the workforce funding in the year the \$10,000 was expended, that county would be liable for \$1000.

This Agreement shall be effective when executed by the authorized official of each county of the Consortium thereof and shall thereupon act to repeal and supersede any and all prior written or oral consortium agreements.

INWITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this Agreement to be executed by the Chairperson of the County Board of Supervisors or the County Executive of the aforementioned Counties.

ATTACHMENT A
(Described in Section IV. A. of the Consortium Agreement)

**SELECTION OF THE
WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT BOARD**

Appointment of the Workforce Development Board (WDB) shall be carried out as described in Section 107 of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014.

A. Members of the WDB shall consist of representatives of:

1. A majority of the members of each local board shall be representatives of business in the local area, who-

- (i) are owners of businesses, chief executives or operating officers of businesses, or other business executives or employers with optimum policymaking or hiring authority;

- (ii) represent businesses, including small businesses, or organizations representing businesses described in this clause, that provide employment opportunities that, at a minimum, include high-quality, work-relevant training and development in in-demand industry sectors or occupations in the local area; **and**

- (ii) are appointed from among individuals nominated by local business organizations and business trade associations.

2. Not less than 20 percent of the members of each local board shall be representatives of the workforce within the local area, who-

- (i) **shall** include representatives of labor organizations (for a local area in which employees are represented by labor organizations), who have been nominated by local labor federations, or (for a local area in which no employees are represented by such organizations) other representatives of employees;

- (ii) **shall** include a representative, who shall be a member of a labor organization or a training director, from a joint labor-management apprenticeship program, or if no such joint program exists in the area, such a representative of an apprenticeship program in the area, if such a program exists;

- (iii) **may** include representatives of community-based organizations that have demonstrated experience and expertise in addressing the employment needs of individuals with barriers to employment, including organizations that serve veterans or that provide or support competitive integrated employment for individuals with disabilities; **and**

- (iv) **may** include representatives of organizations that have demonstrated experience and expertise in addressing the employment, training, or education needs of eligible youth, including representatives of organizations that serve out-of-school youth;

3. Each local board shall include representatives of entities administering education and training activities in the local area, who—

(i) **shall** include a representative of eligible providers administering adult education and literacy activities under Title II;

(ii) **shall** include a representative of institutions of higher education providing workforce investment activities (including community colleges);

(iii) **may** include representatives of local educational agencies, and of community-based organizations with demonstrated experience and expertise in addressing the education or training needs of individuals with barriers to employment;

4. Each local board shall include representatives of governmental and economic and community development entities serving the local area, who—

(i) **shall** include a representative of economic and community development entities;

(ii) **shall** include an appropriate representative from the State employment service office under the Wagner-Peyser Act serving the local area;

(iii) **shall** include an appropriate representative of the programs carried out under Title I of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 serving the local area;

(iv) **may** include representatives of agencies or entities administering programs serving the local area relating to transportation, housing, and public assistance; and

(v) **may** include representatives of philanthropic organizations serving the local area; and

5. Each local board **may** include such other individuals or representatives of entities as the chief elected official in the local area may determine to be appropriate.

6. The State of Wisconsin has also directed that a representative from Unemployment Insurance be placed on each board.

B. All members will be appointed by the Counties based on the requirements of the law and other locally defined considerations with the exception of those positions appointed by DWD.

- D. The WDB will select its chairperson from the private sector business members.
- E. WDB members shall be appointed for fixed and staggered terms.
- F. Vacancies will be filled according to the established by-laws.
- G. The WDB must be comprised of at least 20% female members.
- H. One minority representative must be appointed to the WDB if there is at least 3% minority population in the WDA.

5 **TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:**

6 **WHEREAS**, the Human Rights Campaign has rated Oshkosh 29th out of 100 in its 2017 Municipal Equality
7 Index, which examines how inclusive state, county, and city laws, policies, and services are of the LGBTQ people
8 who live and work in Oshkosh.

9 **WHEREAS**, conversion therapy is a practice that is detrimental to the mental, emotional, and physical well-
10 being of LGBTQ individuals; and

11 **WHEREAS**, “conversion therapy” means any practice that seeks to change an individual's gender
12 expression, gender identity, or sexual orientation, including efforts to change behaviors or to eliminate or reduce
13 sexual or romantic attractions or feelings toward individuals of the same sex; and

14 **WHEREAS**, “conversion therapy” does not include counseling or therapy that provides acceptance, support,
15 and understanding of the individual or the facilitation of an individual's coping, social support, and identity exploration
16 and development, including sexual orientation-neutral interventions to prevent or address unlawful conduct or unsafe
17 sexual practices, or counseling for an individual seeking to transition from one gender to another.

18 **WHEREAS**, California, Connecticut, District of Columbia, Hawaii, Illinois, Maryland, Nevada, New

2. Except as amended herein, the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

INMATE TELEPHONE SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Inmate Telephone Services Agreement ("Agreement") is made by and between Inmate Calling Solutions, LLC, d/b/a ICSolutions ("ICS"), having its principal place of business at 2200 Danbury Street, San Antonio, TX 78217, and Winnebago County, WI (the "County") having its principal address as set forth on Exhibit A, attached hereto.

1. **Term of Contract.** This Agreement shall commence upon the date inmates within the County's control begin placing telephone calls from the Equipment, which has been estimated to be August 15, 2013 (the "Cutover Date") based on this Agreement being fully executed not less than 45 days prior to such date and shall remain in force and effect for five (5) years from the Cutover Date. This Agreement shall automatically renew for up to three (3) additional terms of one (1) year, each upon the same terms and conditions as set forth herein, unless either party otherwise provides written notice to the other party at least ninety (90) days prior to a scheduled renewal. Notwithstanding the foregoing, either party may terminate this Agreement, based on a material, adverse economic change beyond such party's reasonable control, with sixty (60) day's prior written notice. Upon termination of this Agreement, County shall immediately cease the use of any Equipment provided hereunder.
2. **Equipment.** This Agreement applies to the provision of Equipment by ICS within space provided by the County at each of the "Service Locations" listed on Exhibit A, attached hereto. The term "Equipment" is defined herein as telephone sets and computer systems and software, all as more fully described on Exhibit B, attached hereto. All Equipment shall be installed by properly trained personnel and in a good, workmanlike manner. Any Equipment of ICS installed upon the premises owned, leased or otherwise under the supervision of County, shall remain in all respects the property of ICS. ICS reserves the right to remove or relocate any Equipment that is subjected to recurring vandalism or insufficient usage. ICS shall not exercise such right of removal or relocation unreasonably and, in any case with at least thirty (30) days prior notice to County. Upon removal of Equipment by ICS, ICS shall restore the premise to its original condition, ordinary wear and tear excepted.
3. **Alteration and Attachments.** County shall not make alterations or place any attachments to Equipment and Equipment shall not be moved, removed, rendered inoperable or unusable, or made inaccessible to inmates or users by County without the express written permission of ICS.
4. **Training.** ICS shall provide on-site training plus internet-based training at no cost to County. Additional training may be provided upon County's request based on availability of ICS.
5. **Call Rates.** ICS shall provide collect calling services to End-Users, on both a pre-paid and postbilled basis, at the rates and charges set forth on Exhibit C, attached hereto. ICS reserves the right to establish thresholds for the level of collect call credit to be allowed by the billed consumer. Rates and charges may be subject to change based on an order or rule of a regulatory authority having applicable jurisdiction.
6. **Commissions to County.** ICS will install, operate and maintain Equipment at no charge to County. ICS will pay County the commission amounts set forth on Exhibit D, attached hereto (collectively the "Commissions"), in consideration of the County granting ICS exclusive rights for the installation and operation of Equipment servicing the Locations. No Commissions shall be paid to County on amounts relating to taxes, regulatory surcharges such as universal service fund, or other fees and charges not applicable to the billed calls.

ICS will pay Commissions to County on a monthly basis on or before the first business day occurring 45 days following the end of the month in which such Commissions are earned or accrued. Such Commissions shall be sent to the address designated by County or wired to an account designated in writing by County for such purpose.

County agrees that all Commissions are subject to change based on any changes that may be required by the applicable Public Service Commission or any policy, regulation or tariff of a regulatory body having jurisdiction over the public communications contemplated herein. In addition, Commission rates and the revenue MAG, as set forth in Exhibit D, are predicated on County maintaining an average daily inmate population consistent with the monthly average of the three month period preceding the Cutover Date with inmates having access to telephones materially consistent with industry practice.

7. County shall:

- a. Advise ICS of any Services Location or related premise that has been closed.
- b. Throughout the term of this Agreement, including any renewal terms, use ICS as its exclusive provider for all matters relating to inmate telephone services.
- c. Reasonably protect the Equipment against willful abuse and promptly report any damage, service failure or hazardous conditions to ICS.
- d. Provide necessary power and power source, at no cost to ICS, and an operating environment with reasonable cooling consistent with general office use.
- e. Provide suitable space and accessibility for inmates' use of telephone services.
- f. Permit ICS to display reasonable signs furnished by ICS and not affix or allow to be affixed any other signs, equipment or information to the Equipment.
- g. Permit reasonable access by ICS to County's Locations as reasonably necessary for ICS to install, support and maintain the Equipment.
- h. Comply with all federal, state and local statutes, rules, regulations, ordinances or codes governing or applicable to the telephone services offered by ICS.

8. Law and Venue. The domestic law of the State of Wisconsin shall govern the construction, interpretation and performance of this Agreement and all transactions hereunder. All disputes hereunder shall be resolved exclusively in state or federal jurisdictions located in Winnebago County of Wisconsin.

9. Notices. Any notice or demand required hereunder shall be given or made by mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the respective party at the address first set forth above unless otherwise communicated in writing.

10. Entire Agreement. This Agreement, together with the provisions of County's RFP# SH05-13 and ICS's response thereto which are incorporated herein by reference, constitute the entire Agreement

between the parties and may not be modified or amended other than by a written instrument executed by both parties. Any orders placed by County hereunder shall be incorporated herein by mutual consent of the parties and shall supplement but not supersede the provisions of this Agreement. The County represents and warrants that it has the legal authority to make decisions concerning the provisions of space for telephones placed by ICS at the Service Locations covered by this Agreement and that ICS may rely thereon. This Agreement supersedes any prior written or oral understanding between the parties.

11. **Risk of Loss.** ICS shall relieve County of all risk of loss or damage to Equipment during the periods of transportation and installation of the Equipment. However, County shall be responsible for any loss or damage to Equipment located on the premise caused by fault or negligence of County, its employees or others under County's supervision.
12. **Default.** In the event either party shall be in breach or default of any terms, conditions, or covenants of this Agreement and such breach or default shall continue for a period of thirty (30) days after the giving of written notice thereof by the other party, then, in addition to all other rights and remedies at law or in equity or otherwise, including recovering of attorney fees and court cost, the non-breaching party shall have the right to cancel this Agreement without charge or liability. The waiver of any default hereunder by either party shall not constitute, or be construed as, a waiver of any subsequent default.
13. **Assignment.** This Agreement may be transferred or assigned, in whole or in part, by ICS to any parent, successor, subsidiary, or affiliate of ICS. ICS may sub-contract any portion of its duties hereunder provided, however, it shall remain at all times responsible for such sub-contracted duties. This Agreement may otherwise only be transferred or assigned by a party with the written consent of the other party, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.
14. **Relationship.** The parties hereto are independent contractors and this Agreement shall not be construed as a contract of agency or employment. Each party shall be solely responsible for compliance with all laws, rules and regulations and payment of all wages, unemployment, social security and any taxes applicable to such party's employees. Each party represents and warrants that: (a) it is duly organized, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of the jurisdiction of its formation; (b) the execution, delivery and performance of this Agreement has been duly authorized by all necessary corporate actions; (c) its performance hereunder shall be in compliance with applicable state and federal legal and regulatory requirements.
15. **Indemnification.** Each party shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other party from and against any and all claims, losses, injuries, or demands asserted by third parties (collectively "Claims") arising from the material breach, negligent acts or misconduct of such indemnifying party, its agents or employees, in the performance of any of its obligations hereunder. Except for the foregoing express indemnification, each party shall bear its own liability and costs of defense for any third party claims.
16. **Force Majeure.** Either party may suspend all or part of its obligations hereunder and such party shall not otherwise be held responsible for any damages, delays or performance failures caused by acts of God, events of nature, civil disobedience, military action or similar events beyond the reasonable control of such party.
17. **Severability.** If any of the provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed invalid or unenforceable under the laws of the applicable jurisdiction, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not invalidate

or render unenforceable the entire Agreement, but rather the entire Agreement shall be construed as if not containing the particular invalid or unenforceable provision or provisions, and the rights and obligations of ICS and County shall be construed and enforced accordingly.

18. **Special ADA.** ICS will install Equipment in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and any related federal, state and local regulations in effect at the time of installation. ICS shall make any alterations to the Equipment as necessary for its correct operation and/or compliance with applicable laws at no cost to County.
19. **Limitation of Liability.** IN NO EVENT WILL EITHER PARTY BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER PARTY FOR ANY LOSS OF PROFITS, LOSS OF USE, LOSS OF GOODWILL, CONSEQUENTIAL, SPECIAL OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES REGARDLESS OF THE FORM OF ANY CLAIM, WHETHER IN CONTRACT OR IN TORT OR WHETHER FROM BREACH OF THIS AGREEMENT, IRRESPECTIVE OF WHETHER SUCH PARTY HAS BEEN ADVISED OR SHOULD BE AWARE OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES.
20. **Warranty.** Subject to County's compliance with its obligations hereunder, Equipment shall be free from defects in workmanship and material, shall conform to ICS' published specifications in effect on the date of delivery or as otherwise proposed to County in writing, and shall not infringe any patent or trademark. This warranty shall continue while Equipment is in operation at each Location. County shall provide ICS with prompt written notification as to the specifics of any nonconformity or defect and ICS shall have a commercially reasonable timeframe to investigate such nonconformity or defect. As County's sole and exclusive remedy, ICS shall, at ICS' sole option and expense, either: (a) correct any nonconformities or defects which substantially impair the functionality of the Equipment in accordance with the aforesaid specifications; (b) use reasonable efforts to provide a work-around for any reproducible nonconformities or defects which substantially impair the functionality of the Equipment in accordance with the aforesaid specifications; (c) replace such nonconforming or defective Equipment; or (d) promptly refund any amounts paid to ICS by County with respect to such nonconforming or defective Equipment upon ICS receipt of such nonconforming or defective Equipment. ICS does not warrant that the operation of the Equipment shall be uninterrupted or error-free. No warranty is made with respect to the use of Equipment on or in connection with equipment or software not provided by ICS. Equipment may contain recycled, refurbished or remanufactured parts which are equivalent to new parts. ICS makes no warranties or representations that it will solve any problems or produce any specific results.

EXCEPT AS EXPRESSLY PROVIDED HEREIN, THERE ARE NO OTHER EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTIES AND ICSOLUTIONS HEREBY DISCLAIMS ANY OTHER WARRANTIES INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, ANY IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR ANY PARTICULAR PURPOSE. THE FOREGOING SHALL BE THE SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE REMEDY WITH RESPECT TO NONCONFORMING OR DEFECTIVE EQUIPMENT AND SERVICES. NOTHING CONTAINED HEREIN SHALL OBLIGATE ICS TO ENHANCE OR MODIFY THE SERVICES OR EQUIPMENT BEYOND THE SUBSTANTIAL FUNCTIONALITY INITIALLY ACCEPTED BY COUNTY, WHICH ACCEPTANCE SHALL BE DEEMED TO HAVE OCCURRED UPON THE GENERATION OF CALL REVENUE.

21. **No Hire/No Solicit.** During the term of this Agreement, and for a period of six (6) months thereafter, neither party shall solicit or hire the other party's employees, agents or representatives engaged by such party to perform work relating to this Agreement, without the express written consent of the other party.

- 22. Confidentiality.** During the term of this Agreement, each party may disclose to the other certain proprietary information including, without limitation, trade secrets, know how, software, source code, techniques, future product plans, marketing plans, inventions, discoveries, improvements, financial data and business strategies (collectively, “Confidential Information”) of a character identified by the disclosing party as confidential and that should reasonably have been understood by recipient, because of legends or markings, the circumstances of disclosure or the nature of the information itself, to be proprietary and confidential to the disclosing party. Each party and each of its employees or consultants to whom disclosure is made shall hold all Confidential Information in confidence, and shall not disclose such information to any third party or apply it to uses other than in connection with the performance of this Agreement. Each party shall use the same degree of care that it utilizes to protect its own information of a similar nature, but in any event not less than reasonable duty of care, to prevent the unauthorized use or disclosure of any Confidential Information. A recipient may not alter, decompile, disassemble, reverse engineer, or otherwise modify any Confidential Information received hereunder and the mingling of the Confidential Information with information of the recipient shall not affect the confidential nature or ownership of the same as provided hereunder. The obligations of this paragraph shall survive termination of this Agreement for a period of three (3) years.

This Agreement shall impose no obligation of confidentiality upon a recipient with respect to any portion of the Confidential Information received hereunder which is: (a) now or hereafter, through no unauthorized act or failure to act on recipient's part, becomes generally known or available; (b) lawfully known to the recipient without an obligation of confidentiality at the time recipient receives the same from the disclosing party, as evidenced by written records; (c) hereafter lawfully furnished to the recipient by a third party without restriction on disclosure; or (d) independently developed by the recipient without use of the disclosing party's Confidential Information.

Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent the receiving party from disclosing Confidential Information to the extent the receiving party is legally compelled to do so by any governmental or judicial agency having jurisdiction.

- 23. License to Use Software.** With respect to the Equipment provided under this Agreement, ICS hereby grants to County a nontransferable, nonexclusive license to install, store, load, execute, operate, utilize and display (collectively, “Use”) the runtime versions of the Enforcer® software in performance of this Agreement including, where applicable to the purposes hereunder, such Use on computers owned by County. Such license is specific to the County and Location(s) for which the ICS Services are provided and may not be transferred other than through an authorized assignment of this Agreement. Upon the termination hereof, this license and all rights of County to Use the Enforcer® software will expire and terminate. County will not transform, decompile, reverse engineer, disassemble or in any way modify any of the Enforcer® software or otherwise determine or attempt to determine source code from executable code of any elements of the Enforcer® software.
- 24. Third Party Software.** Third-party software licenses may be contained in certain software included with equipment and may therefore require a click-through acceptance by any users. Such software licenses are incorporated herein by reference and can be made available upon request.
- 25. Taxes.** Except as expressly provided for herein, each party shall bear responsibility for its own taxes and such other costs and expenses arising in connection with the performance of their respective obligations hereunder.

26. Insurance. At all times during the Term of this Agreement, ICS shall maintain in effect the following types and amounts of insurance:

- a. General Liability Insurance: \$1,000,000 per occurrence; \$1,000,000 personal injury; \$2,000,000 general aggregate; \$2,000,000 products/completed operations.
- b. Commercial Automobile Liability: \$1,000,000 Combined Single Limit.
- c. Workers' Compensation: ICS shall comply with all workers' compensation requirements for the jurisdictions in which employees/representatives perform applicable duties.

County shall be named as 'additional insured' on the general liability policy. ICS shall provide certificates evidencing the above coverage amounts upon request from County.

27. Application to Similar Parties. The parties acknowledge that certain counties within the same State as County (each an "Affiliated County") may wish to obtain equipment and related services substantially similar to the Equipment and related services set forth herein. ICS may, at no cost or obligation to County, enter into a definitive agreement with an Affiliated County and incorporate the terms and conditions of this Agreement by reference.

2 **RESOLUTION: Authorize Support of Increased Public Defender Access and Pay**

5 **TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:**

6 **WHEREAS**, criminal cases continue to rise due to a variety of factors including increased drug crimes; and

7 **WHEREAS**, both the United States Constitution and the Constitution of the State of Wisconsin provide that
8 persons accused have the right to counsel; and

9 **WHEREAS**, in Wisconsin, the Office of the Public Defender provides counsel to those persons meeting
10 income eligibility guidelines for services; and

11 **WHEREAS**, judges are being forced to appoint counsel at county expense for persons for whom the public
12 defender cannot find representation due to a lack of available counsel as a result of the low compensation rate; and

13 **WHEREAS**, this results in costs to counties to appoint counsel, increased costs to jail persons held before
14 trial pending appointment of counsel, and a delay in obtaining justice for victims; and

15 **WHEREAS**, the rate of compensation for private bar attorneys has not been increased since 1995 and
16 currently is the lowest hourly rate in the nation; and

17 **WHEREAS**, this has created a burden on the courts and Wisconsin counties.

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20 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby
21 urges the State of Wisconsin to provide sufficient resources to the Office of the Public Defender to ensure that the
22 criminal justice system operates effectively and efficiently.

24 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby supports
25 increasing the rate of reimbursement for assigned counsel attorneys to a market rate that will ensure the prompt
26 appointment of counsel and will ensure that cases are handled in a timely and efficient manner.

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28 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby directs the
29 Winnebago County Clerk to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Office of Governor Scott Walker, the Wisconsin
30 Counties Association, and all state senators and assembly members representing Winnebago County constituents.

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2 **RESOLUTION: Support a Constitutional Amendment to Allow Limits on Campaign**
3 **Contributions and conducting a non-Binding Statewide Referendum**

5 **TO THE WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:**

6 **WHEREAS**, free and fair elections are essential to democracy and effective self-governance; and

7 **WHEREAS**, the appearance of buying access to candidates or influencing policy, governance, and judicial
8 decisions because of large outsider donations erodes voter confidence in our elections and democracy; and

9 **WHEREAS**, Winnebago County has an interest in protecting itself and its citizens against intrusions on local
10 control by mitigating the influence of money and privileged access in state and federal elections; and

11 **WHEREAS**, the US Supreme Court's decisions in *Citizens United* and related cases allow unlimited
12 spending by certain groups known as Super-PACS to influence local, state, and federal elections; and

13 **WHEREAS**, the above-mentioned US Supreme Court cases have:

- 14 • granted corporations, unions, non-profits, and other manmade entities (such as Super-PACS) the same
15 constitutional protections given only to individual human beings by the framers of the constitution; and
16 • declared money to be "free speech"; and

17 **WHEREAS**, Winnebago County municipalities have called upon the Winnebago County Board of
18 Supervisors to support their resolutions supporting a constitutional amendment to allow limits on campaign
19 contributions and conducting a non-binding statewide referendum.

20
21 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby calls
22 upon our elected state assembly representatives and senators, and the Wisconsin State Legislature, to hold a non-
23 binding statewide referendum asking the voters if they wish the State of Wisconsin to support an amendment to the
24 US Constitution stating:

- 25 1. Only human beings are endowed with individual constitutional rights, not corporations, unions, non-profits, or
26 artificial entities (such as Super-PACS).
27 2. Money is not speech and, therefore, limiting political contributions and spending is not equivalent to limiting
28 political speech.

29
30 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby directs the
31 Winnebago County Clerk to forward a copy of this Resolution to the Office of Governor Scott Walker, the Wisconsin
32 Counties Association, and all state senators and assembly members representing Winnebago County constituents.
