WINNEBAGO COUNTY BOARD MEETING TUESDAY, MARCH 17, 2020

Chairman Shiloh Ramos called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the County Board Room, Fourth Floor, Courthouse, 415 Jackson Street, Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance and the invocation by Supervisor Locke.

Supervisor Eisen shared an e-mail from Eric Fowle, Executive Director of East Central Wisconsin Planning Commission who announced his retirement from the Commission at the end of February.

Supervisor Eisen announced that the Solid Waste Management Board meeting scheduled for Wednesday, March 18, 2020 has been cancelled.

Supervisor Wingren thanked the facilities staff for making the County Board Room safe for the meeting. He thanked the Public Health and the Park View Health Center staff for everything they have done. He thanked Supervisor Singstock and Supervisor Smith for their years of dedication serving on the County Board.

Supervisor Wingren asked the board to forward any requested County Board rule changes to him or the County Clerk's office before April 1.

WHEREAS, Janie Gee Aviation Inc. desires to lease Building I-2 at Wittman Regional Airport for a three (3)year period, with rent to be established as follows: \$892.67 per month plus sales tax during the first year of the lease; \$892.67 plus sales tax and the year one average Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U) rate for the second year of the lease; and the year two monthly rate plus sales tax and the year two CPI-U rate for the third year of the lease; and

WHEREAS, said lease would be effective from February 1, 2020, through January 31, 2023; and

RESOLUTION NO. 288-032020: Authorize Winnebago County to Renew a Five (5)-Year Agreement with Winnefox to Participate in a Federated Public Library System Pursuant to §43.15(4)(b), Wis Stats

WHEREAS, in accordance with §43.15(4)(b), Wis Stats, Winnebago County may participate in a federated public library system if it does all of the following:

1. Adopts and maintains the plan of library service submitted and approved under §§43.11(3) and 43.13(1).

2. Provides the financial support for library services required under §43.15(2).

3. Enters into a written agreement with the public library system board to participate in the system and its activities and to furnish library services to residents of those municipalities in the county not maintaining a public library; and

WHEREAS, the plan of library service for a county . . . (§43.11(3)(c), Wis Stats, <u>shall</u> provide for library services to residents of those municipalities in the county not maintaining a public library under Chapter 43. The services shall include full access to public libraries in the county participating in the public library system (subject to limits provided for in §43.15(4)(c)4, Wis Stats) and the plan shall provide for reimbursement for that access. Services may be provided by contracting with existing public libraries in the county or in adjacent counties or with the public library system or by creating a county library organization under Chapter 43. The plan of library service for a county may provide for improving public library service countywide and in municipalities that have libraries. The plan shall specify the method and level of funding to be provided by the County to implement the services described in the plan, including the reimbursement of public libraries for access by residents of those municipalities in the county not maintaining a public library; and

WHEREAS, Winnefox has been organized and operates as a federated public library system within the meaning of §43.19, Wis Stats, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to §43.24(2), Wis Stats, in order to qualify for and maintain its eligibility for state aid, Winnefox must provide:

a) Written agreements to provide to any resident of the system area the same library services, on the same terms, that are provided to the residents of the municipality or county that established the member library, except for group programming and remote electronic database access preferences under §43.15(4)(c)4, Wis Stats, and to provide for the interlibrary loan of materials among all participating public libraries as evidenced by agreements with those libraries.

b) Backup reference, information and interlibrary loan services from the system resource library, including the development of and access to specialized collections, as evidenced by an agreement with that library.

c) Referral or routing of reference and interlibrary loan requests from libraries within the system to libraries within and outside the system.

d) In-service training for and professional consultation with participating public library personnel and trustees.

e) Electronic delivery of information and physical delivery of library materials to participating libraries.

f) Service agreements with all adjacent library systems.

g) Professional consultant services to participating public libraries.

h) Any other service programs designed to meet the needs of participating public libraries and the

residents of the system area, as determined by the public library system board after consultation with participating public libraries.

i) Promotion and facilitation of library service to users with special needs.

j) Cooperation and continuous planning with other types of libraries in the system area which results in agreements with those libraries for the appropriate sharing of library resources to benefit the clientele of all libraries in the system.

k) Planning with the Division and with participating public libraries and other types of libraries in the area in regard to library technology and the sharing of resources. By January 1, 2000, and by every 5th January 1 thereafter, the public library system shall submit to the Division a written plan for library technology and the sharing of resources.

I) That, if the system reimburses a participating public library for the costs of providing interlibrary borrowing services to an individual who holds a valid borrower's card of another participating public library, the

reimbursement shall not exceed the actual costs incurred by the public library in providing such services. The department shall promulgate rules defining "actual costs" for the purposes of this paragraph; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of Winnebago County to contract with Winnefox to provide for the extension and development of library services described in the Long-Range Plan of Library Service, hereinafter called the Plan, which is part and parcel to the attached Agreement as Appendix A, and which is incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IS RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby authorizes the Winnefox Library System to negotiate and execute such Agreements as are necessary to implement the Plan for the calendar year 2020 and each subsequent year of the Plan's life, and to exercise such powers and duties afforded Winnefox under Chapter 43, Wis Stats.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that the Agreement with attached Appendix A (Long-Range Plan of Library Service 2020-2024), is attached hereto, incorporated herein by reference, and made a part of this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Agreement shall be effective from January 1, 2020, through December 31, 2024.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Agreement may be amended by mutual agreement of both parties.

ORDINANCE 297-032020: Amend Section 13.09 of the General Code of Winnebago County

WHEREAS, it is well documented and widely recognized that nutrients and organic matte from mismanaged or misapplied livestock waste contributes to water quality degradation in the surface and groundwater throughout Wisconsin, including in Winnebago County; and

WHEREAS, the degradation of the water resources in Winnebago County poses a threat to the environment, health, and economic welfare of the citizens of Winnebago County; and

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County Land Conservation Committee and Land and Water Conservation Department, in an effort to further protect the water resources of Winnebago County, must periodically revise and update referenced State Statutes, technical standards, definitions, and other wording within the Winnebago County Livestock Waste Management Ordinance (Chapter 13 of the General Code of Winnebago County); and

WHEREAS, the Winnebago County Land Conservation Committee and the Land and Water Conservation Department, in an effort to communicate the proposed changes and garner input from the constituents of Winnebago County have conducted a separate public hearing on the matter.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF WINNEBAGO DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS: that it hereby amends Section 13.09 of the General Code of Winnebago County to read as follows:

13.09 STANDARDS AND SPECIFICATIONS.

(5) LIVESTOCK WASTE MANAGEMENT AND UTILIZATION. Livestock wastes for which *transfer/storage* permits are issued under this Chapter of the Code and all wastes from existing livestock waste *transfer/storage* facilities shall be managed and utilized in accordance with all applicable current <u>USDA-NRCS Field Office Technical Guide</u> standards. A current Nutrient Management Plan shall be submitted to the Department by the owner or operator of the livestock waste *transfer/storage* facility annually by March 31 until the livestock waste *transfer/storage* facility is no longer in use and has been properly abandoned/closed.

(6) LIVESTOCK WASTE MANAGEMENT AND APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS. All livestock waste shall be managed and applied in accordance with all applicable technical standards. A "Winnebago County Livestock Waste Application Guidance Document" is available at the Department office and on the Winnebago County/Land and Water Conservation Department website. The following setbacks and separation distances are required for all sources of livestock waste applied within the County:

(a) Livesteck waste and organic byproducts shall not be applied to the following areas unless injected or incorporated within 72 hours:

1. Within 300 feet of surface water.

2. Within 300 feet up-gradient of sinkholes, cracked bedrock, or wells.

(b) Livestock waste and organic byproducts shall not be applied on frozen or snow-covered ground in the following areas:

1. Within 300 foot of surface water.

2. Within 300 feet up-gradient of sinkholes, cracked bedrock, and wells.

3. On slopes greater than 9% (Exception: Up to 12% is allowed if contour stripped with sod, or contour farmed with all crop residue remaining).

(c) Livesteck waste and organic byproducts shall not be applied in waterways, non-cropped wetlands, terrace channels, ditches, or any other direct conveyance to surface water or ground water.

Because of the diversity of the County's collection activities, a variety of applications, interfaces, portals and equipment may be required to provide this functionality. This could include direct point of sale processing, web-based portals, interfaces with our existing business system(s), kiosks, interactive voice recognition (pay by phone), etc.; and

WHEREAS, Winnebago County seeks, if possible, to partner with a single vendor that possesses the understanding, experience, expertise, and resources to identify, provide, and implement the most appropriate, effective, and low-cost solutions to our card payment needs; and

WHEREAS, a Request for Proposal (RFP) was issued for contract proposals for this service; and

WHEREAS, a team consisting of staff from several of the departments that will be large users was assembled to evaluate the proposals; and

WHEREAS, the selection team recommended MSB (Municipal Services Bureau) to provide the credit card/debit card, E-check processing, and merchant services.

RESOLUTION NO. 300-032020: Proclaim the Week of April 6-12, 2020, as National Public Health Week in Winnebago County

WHEREAS the week of April 6-12, 2020, is National Public Health Week ("NPHW@25: Looking Back, Looking Forward"); and

WHEREAS, the goal of celebrating the 25th anniversary of National Public Health Week is to highlight some of the greatest public health successes while looking to the future to set goals and work to ensure equity; and

WHEREAS, since 1995 public health organizations have used National Public Health Week to educate the public, policymakers, and public health professionals on issues that are important to improving the public's health; and

WHEREAS, U.S. life expectancy has decreased in recent years and the three-year drop represents the longest sustained decline in expected lifespan since the Great Recession; and

WHEREAS, according to the National Academy of Medicine, despite being one of the wealthiest nations in the world, the U.S. ranks below many other economically prosperous and developing countries with respect to measures of health, including life expectancy, infant mortality, and maternal mortality rates; and

WHEREAS, there is a significant difference in health status, such as obesity, poor mental health, and drug use, among people living in rural areas compared to urban areas, and this variance increases because rural residents are often more likely to face social determinants that negatively impact health, such as poverty, transportation barriers, and lack of economic opportunity; and

WHEREAS, public health professionals collaborate with partners that are outside of the health sector, such as city planners, transportation officials, education officials, and private sector businesses, recognizing that other sectors have an important influence on health; and

WHEREAS, public health professionals help communities prevent, prepare for, withstand, and recover from the impact of a full range of health threats, including disease outbreaks such as measles, natural disasters, and disasters caused by human activity; and

WHEREAS, public health action, together with scientific and technological advances, has played a major role in reducing and in some cases eliminating the spread of infectious disease, and in establishing today's disease surveillance and control systems; and

WHEREAS, vaccination is one of the most significant public health achievements in history and has resulted in substantial declines in cases, hospitalizations, deaths, and health care costs associated with vaccine-preventable diseases; and

WHEREAS, 60 percent of Americans live with a preventable chronic disease, and health risks such as alcoholism, obesity, and tobacco use are the primary reasons for 7 of every 10 deaths annually in the U.S.; and

WHEREAS, each 10 percent increase in local public health spending contributes to a 6.9 percent decrease in infant deaths, a 3.2 percent decrease in deaths related to cardiovascular disease, a 1.4 percent decrease in deaths due to diabetes, and a 1.1 percent decrease in cancer-related deaths; and

WHEREAS, efforts to adequately support public health and prevention can continue to transform a health system focused on treating illness to a health system focused on preventing disease and promoting wellness.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby proclaims the week of April 6-12, 2020, as National Public Health Week 2020 in Winnebago County and calls upon the citizens of Winnebago County to observe this week by helping our families, friends, neighbors, co-workers, and leaders better understand the value of public health.

REPORTS FROM COMMITTEES, COMMISSIONS AND BOARDS

Supervisor Gabert reported that bids for the new aviation facility were opened on April 23. All five of the bids came in under budget. Supervisor Gabert stated that the Aviation Committee will have more information for the board after further review of the bids.

Supervisor Norton reported that NACo's website has important information pertaining to the Corona virus and the economic impact it is having on counties across the country. He encouraged people to contact their US Senators and encourage them to include additional funding for county governments with populations under 500,000. Supervisor Norton stated that the WCA as contacted Governor Evers and asked that the State of Wisconsin allocate money from the Cares Act to smaller counties in Wisconsin.

Supervisor Ellis reported that the Park View Health Center Committee will be meeting at the Coughlin Center on May 5. The size of the room there will allow for appropriate physically distancing of the committee members and attendees.

COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S REPORT

Executive Harris discussed and expressed his support of the following resolutions:

- Resolution No. 004-042020: Ratification, Alteration, Modification, or Repeal of March 20, 2020, Proclamation Declaring a State of Emergency
- Resolution No. 007-042020: Authorize Winnebago County to Enter into a Contract with Double Tree Neenah for Quarantine Purposes
- Resolution No. 008-042020: Authorize Winnebago County to Enter into an Employment Services Lease Agreement with the Oshkosh Area School District to Provide Health Care Services

COUNTY BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Chairman Ramos reported that there will not be a Special Orders Meeting on May 5 and that the annual County Board Tour scheduled for May 18 is postponed.

Chairman Ramos reported that former County Board Supervisor, Tim Hamblin, passed away recently. Chairman Ramos stated that Mr. Hamblin had an extensive career in public service and leaves a wonderful legacy in Winnebago County and the City of Neenah.

COVID-19 UPDATE

Doug Gieryn, Director of Public Health, gave a PowerPoint presentation that explained the Winnebago County Health Department's response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Mr. Gieryn went over the timeline of the progression of the disease, as well as, the steps taken by the State of Wisconsin and Winnebago County to combat the spread and transmission of the disease.

Mr. Gieryn explained that Governor Evers "Safer at Home" order was put in place on March 25. By April 4, the number of flu cases "dropped dramatically" across the state, which indicated that the Safer at Home order and physical distancing was working.

On April 20, Governor Evers announced Wisconsin's "Badger Bounce Back Plan," which is the state's plan to gradually begin reopening the state and loosen restrictions on physical distancing.

Mr. Gieryn explained that except for the WIC Program, all other functions of their office are focused on COVID-19. Their primary areas of work include:

- Case Identification and Contact Investigation
- Surveillance and Data Analysis
- Public Information and Education
- Consultation for Public/Community Partners
- Isolation and Quarantine
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
- Situational Awareness

Mr. Gieryn showed the board the Public Health Department's website and explained all the various kinds of information on COVID-19 that is available to the public on a daily basis.

Going forward, Mr. Gieryn stated that more testing will happen as more tests and testing equipment becomes available. He also stated that because more people are going to be tested, we will see an increase in the number of cases of COVID-19. An increase in COVID-19 cases will require more contact tracers to follow-up with these people.

Mr. Gieryn explained that "data goals/thresholds" have to be established before area businesses can gradually re-open. Then after things open up, they will need to carefully monitor the number of cases and be able to quickly respond to a crisis.

Mr. Gieryn stated that adequate hospital and isolation center capacity is critical as the state re-opens. He also believes that physical distancing and PPE will be needed for months. People need to be flexible so they can respond to a crisis, should it occur.

REVIEW PROPOSED CONTRACT FOR DOUBLE TREE NEENAH FOR QUARANTINE PURPOSES

Mr. Gieryn explained that this hotel is located in the City of Neenah and would be used for people who need to be isolated and quarantined, but don't require hospitalization. People can only stay here if they are referred by a health care provider or by the Public Health Department.

The facility will only open when and if there is sufficient need for the facility. The costs for this facility will be covered by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services through the duration of Governor Evers state of emergency order of May 11. Mr. Gieryn stated that it is likely that the state will be extending the deadline for the reimbursement of costs associated with this facility sometime later this week.

<u>REVIEW PROPOSED CONTRACT WITH OSHKOSH AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT</u> <u>FOR SCHOOL NURSING STAFF SUPPORT</u>

Mr. Gieryn explained that a contract with the Oshkosh Area School District for nursing staff support will allow the Public Health Department to do contact tracing, which is vital to controlling the spread of COVID-19. He explained that the county has already hired additional nurses on a temporary basis, but that more are still needed because the other work the Public Health Department does continues as well.

Mr. Gieryn explained that the 10-12 school nurses that would be available, are a perfect option since school is not in session and they are available. He stated that these nurses have the required skills and can be available very quickly if the county's COVID-19 numbers rapidly increase.

Mr. Gieryn then took questions from the Board on all three of these topics.

WHEREAS, it is deemed appropriate and necessary to provide Winnebago County Executive Mark L. Harris the general authority to order, subject to ratification if practicable, whatever is necessary and expedient for the health, safety, protection, and welfare of persons and property within Winnebago County in the emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby ratifies the March 20, 2020, Proclamation Declaring the Existence of a County Emergency in Winnebago County (attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference) issued by Winnebago County Executive Mark L. Harris.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that it hereby vests Winnebago County Executive Mark L. Wrase Re-zoning Site Map





Chapter 9 – Town of Clayton Zoning Code of Ordinances

Amended May 15, 2019. otherwise permitted in the zoning district in which it is located, he or she shall render a written determination that states the best available facts related to the development constraint and other reasoning as may be appropriate. Examples of development constraints include unfavorable topography, rock formations, shallow depth to bedrock, unstable or otherwise unsuitable soils, wetlands, stormwater runoff, inadequate drainage, and high groundwater. Once such a determination has been made, the zoning administrator, building inspector, or other governmental official or body shall not issue a development order or other approval authorizing the development in the area subject to the development constraint. Because a determination rendered by the zoning administrator pursuant to this section is an administrative decision, the property owner shall have the right to appeal such determination consistent with the procedures and requirements in article 7 of this chapter. The zoning administrator may reconsider his or her determination at any time and render a new determination if new or additional facts become known or if the facts upon which the determination was made are not accurate.

9.08-30 Map of conditional uses

The zoning administrator is authorized to prepare a map showing those properties that have an active conditional use permit and to amend the same from time to time.

9.08-31 Personal Storage Facility (PSF) Overlay District.

(a) Purpose. The purpose of the PSF Overlay District is to promote positive financial impacts to the recently established tax increment finance district (TID #1) and to promote the ability to fund required improvements within the district as shown by the Overlay District Map. In order to foster development that maximizes value and job creation in the overlay district, it is necessary to halt construction which may not promote the long-term value of the established TID district such as enhancing assessed values and increasing employment within the Town.

(b) Applicability. To meet the referenced purpose, the Town shall preclude the issuance of building permits for personal storage facilities for lease or rent which require significant land area but do not require utility services such as public water and sewer within the PSF Overlay Zoning District. The requirements of the PSF Overlay District shall apply to personal storage facilities as defined by Article 3, Section 14.02.

(c) Exemptions.

- (1) Personal storage facilities which are accessory to the principal use and are not for lease or rent.
- (2) Personal storage facilities previously approved through site plan approval.



- 5. PUBLIC FORUM (Opportunity to comment about an Agenda item or new business; say your name & address (no action taken by the Board) State Senator Dan Feyen reach out if need anything, here to help. Some of the best bills come from us (local level).

Tim Oliver – part of the grass was snowblowed to allow room for parking. Is there a way to look into paving a strip along the ditch? Gravel or seal coat, no need to blacktop. During rentals, people park in front of fire truck doors and under the hydrant. Walt Whiting suggested to pave going to the trees to the corner, stay away from the tile. Chairman Schmick said to come up with ideas and drawings, can then try to get excavators here. Walt Whiting suggested to contact the County to grade it and take a look at it.

Walt Whiting – had a conversation with another Town Chairman about problems with fire dept issue of the constant push for training. This is a volunteer fire dept, spending more time training than anything else. State is mandating more. Under impression that this was driven by Tech Schools or whom sells equipment, but heard it's from the insurance companies. Tim Oliver mentioned can't have anyone with facial hair going to a fire, another town mounted razors to the trucks to shave. Eric Whiting stated this is still a volunteer fire dept, if there are too many hoops, won't have volunteers; will need to hire and that will be expensive. Walt Whiting said the Town would need to hire 4 full-time fire fighters to give people time off, that would eat the budget.

- 7. FULL VALUE ASSESSMENT NON-COMPLIANCE

Troy Zacharias from Action Appraisers reduced the woods in 2018, will do a Market Update to lower woods and will look at the buildings to make any adjustments; over by .08, currently is 110.08. There are no fines to the Town of Utica and no charge to the Town for making these changes. If not corrected, the State will do a revaluation. August 15 is when the State releases numbers for compliance and will capture 2019 sales also. Open Book will probably be the end of August, Board of Review in September. Market Update means to review sales and make any adjustments, anyone with a value change will get a notice and will have the opportunity to come to Open Book; won't go door-to-door.

A motion to adjourn was made by Batley/second Devens. The meeting was adjourned at 7:55 p.m.



December 16, 2019





<u>WISCONSIN COOPERATIVE PURCHASING</u> <u>CUSTOMER SERVICE AGREEMENT</u> (Pricing per State of Wisconsin Contract #505ENT-M17-WIRELESSPH-03)

THIS WISCONSIN COOPERATIVE PURCHASING CUSTOMER SERVICE AGREEMENT including all Exhibits attached hereto (this "Agreement"), dated June 1, 2020 (the "Effective Date"), is by and between USCC Services, LLC on behalf of its operating licensed affiliate doing business as U.S. Cellular in the Home Market ("USCC"), and Winnebago County on behalf of its employees and permitted subsidiaries and affiliates ("Customer").

WHEREAS, USCC and the State of Wisconsin entered into Contract # 505ENT-M17-WIRELESSPH-03 ("State Contract") setting for terms and pricing for the State of Wisconsin to procure wireless communications services from USCC; and

WHEREAS, USCC agreed to provide the same pricing to municipalities and other government entities authorized to cooperatively purchase with the State under Wisconsin Statute §16.73, subject to minimal conditions as outlined in USCC's form DOA-3333 including entering into a separate agreement with Customer; and

WHEREAS, Customer desires to purchase wireless telecommunication services and equipment from USCC; and

WHEREAS, USCC is willing to provide Customer with wireless telecommunication services and equipment in accordance with the provisions and conditions set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. **DEFINITIONS.**

(a) "Equipment" means wireless telephone, data, and other similar devices and ancillary devices or accessories purchased by Customer from USCC, otherwise provided to Customer by USCC for use in connection with Service, or approved in writing by USCC for use in connection with Service(s).

(b) "Home Market" means the market in which the USCC switch, to which your account is assigned at the time your service is established, is located.

(c) "Service(s)" means each and every wireless service (including, without limitation, telecommunication, voice, and data services) and

Business Solutions Services that USCC provides directly or indirectly to Customer.

2. <u>PROVISION OF SERVICE.</u>

(a) USCC shall provide and Customer shall purchase Service and Equipment pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement and the pricing terms provided in the State Contract. This Agreement shall govern and control the provision of Service and any purchase of Equipment or other transaction.

(b) Service is available to Equipment only when such Equipment is within the operating range of Service as set forth in USCC's standard coverage maps. The standard coverage maps are attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u>. Such maps may be updated periodically by USCC. For greater coverage detail and for the most up to date coverage maps, Customer may refer to uscellular.com/coverage. Service is furnished for Customer's use only. Customer may not resell Service to third parties.

(c) At least 50% of Customer's monthly voice usage on each line of Service must be used in USCC's licensed markets. No more than 400 MB of Customer's data usage in any month on each line of Service may be used in USCC's non-licensed markets.

(d) USCC may impose usage or service limits, suspend service or block certain categories of transmissions in its sole discretion to protect its customers or its business. Customer may not use the service for any unlawful, improper, harassing or abusive purpose or in such a way that interferes with USCC's network, business operations, employees or customers.

(e) Business Solutions Services. Business Solutions Services is a subset of Services. Business Solutions Services consists of Internet of Things ("IoT") and Value Added Services ("VAS"). IoT and VAS are Services where data is transmitted over USCC's network between or among devices (including wireless devices, modems, computer servers, or other machines) and between devices and application servers in the cloud with limited to no manual administration, supervision, or intervention and which may or may not require additional Equipment. If Customer utilizes any Business Solutions Services, the requirements for use of such Services including data rates, equipment, and service-specific terms and conditions, shall be set forth in <u>Exhibit B</u>. Business Solutions Services are also governed by any applicable third party terms and conditions. Business Solution Services may require third party equipment, third party services

such as software-as-a-service ("SAAS"), and/or the acceptance by Customer of third party end-user license agreements. Except as may be provided in the State Contract, USCC makes no warranties, representations, or other statements regarding such third party equipment, agreements, or services and Customer agrees that it may only use such third party equipment or services that are approved by USCC for use on its network. USCC may prohibit standard wireless devices and equipment from being activated on IoT lines.

(f) Wireless Priority Service. USCC is under contract with CSRA Inc. ("CSRA"), the Federal Government's Priority Telecommunications Services contractor, to provide call data for a user's Wireless Priority Service ("WPS") calls and Government Emergency Telecommunications Service ("GETS") calls to CSRA and the Department of Homeland Security Office of Emergency Communications for the purpose of evaluating service performance and protecting against fraudulent or unlawful use. If and when Customer uses WPS or GETS, Customer consents to USCC providing Customer's call data for WPS or GETS calls, as applicable, to these parties and for this purpose.

(g) Services offered by USCC may be subject to specific terms and conditions. Those additional terms and conditions are included in the applicable brochure or material for that specific Service and are incorporated herein and made a part of this Agreement.

3. <u>EQUIPMENT.</u>

(a) USCC will sell Equipment to Customer at the prices set forth in <u>Exhibit B</u> or <u>Exhibit E</u> for each new line of Service activated by Customer and each Eligible Upgrade which shall be no higher (and discounts no less) than as established in the State Contract. An "Eligible Upgrade" means Customer's first upgrade of wireless handset Equipment for a line of Service after completing 15 months of Service on such line. Except for Eligible Upgrades and new activations, all other purchases or upgrades of wireless handset Equipment shall be at full retail price or at a discounted price if that discount would otherwise apply to the State Contract.

(b) At Customer's option, Customer may change the Service plan for any of its then-existing Equipment to any other Service plan set forth on Exhibit B or Exhibit D, provided that such Equipment is compatible with the chosen Service plan.

(c) For Business Solutions Services, Customer may only utilize Equipment sold by or otherwise provided by USCC, or in the case of Equipment that is obtained directly from a third party, only Equipment that is approved by USCC for use on its network. USCC reserves the right to revoke any previous approval for Equipment and to refuse to provide Service(s) for any customer-owned Equipment at any time and for any reason in its sole discretion.

4. <u>CUSTOMER SUPPORT.</u>

USCC will provide Customer with customer support as set forth in Exhibit C.

5. <u>RATES AND CHARGES.</u>

(a) Customer shall pay for Service and Equipment at the rates set forth in this Agreement. Customer shall also pay applicable additional fees and charges as set forth in the State Contract. Customer acknowledges that if such additional fees and charges are set by law they may change. USCC will measure and bill voice Service usage in one-minute increments, and each partial minute of usage will be rounded up and billed as a full minute. USCC may bill Customer for calls that are not completed but ring longer than 59 seconds. For completed calls, Customer will be billed from the time Customer pushes the "send" button until the call is terminated.

(b) The business address (not the billing address if different) will be deemed to be the primary place of use of Service for all Equipment for the purposes of calculating certain taxes, surcharges and fees. Customer agrees to inform USCC of any changes to the business address. That business address must always be within USCC's licensed markets.

(c) If Customer desires to purchase any Services and/or Equipment offered by USCC for which rates and charges are not set forth in this Agreement then upon request from Customer, USCC may provide to Customer a written offer setting forth the applicable rates and charges therefor. If Customer accepts the rates and charges, USCC shall provide the Services and/or Equipment and the provision of such shall be controlled by the terms of this Agreement.

6. <u>BILLING AND PAYMENT.</u>

(a) USCC shall bill Customer on a monthly basis for all amounts due hereunder. Billing for some calls made/received by Customer outside of Customer's Home Market may occur after the close of the regular billing cycle. Typically this occurs when Customer makes/receives calls late in the billing cycle outside of the Home Market such as when Customer is roaming on another carrier's network or is making/receiving calls on a USCC network other than the Home Market. When this occurs, the minutes used, and associated charges, will be applied against Customers monthly calling plan in the month that the usage appears on the bill rather than the month the calls actually occurred.

(b) USCC may charge a late fee of 18% per annum or the rate permitted by applicable State of Wisconsin law for any amount not paid when due. Except where prohibited by law, USCC may charge a processing fee of up to \$5.00 on any credit balance due upon termination of Service for any reason. Customer agrees that it may be charged a collection fee if the account is referred to a third party agency for collection. The collection fee will be assessed up to the maximum amount permitted by applicable law. Customer agrees to reimburse USCC for all costs (including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees, collection fees and similar expenses) incurred by USCC in connection with the collection of amounts due from Customer hereunder.

7. <u>COVERAGE.</u>

Customer acknowledges that Service may be interrupted or unavailable due to atmospheric or topographical conditions, governmental regulations or orders, or system capacity limitations. Representations of coverage by USCC or its agents are not guarantees. Customer also acknowledges that Business Solutions Services may be interrupted or unavailable due to the failure of third party suppliers or the termination of one of more third party supplier relationships.

8. <u>TERM AND TERMINATION.</u>

(a) <u>Term.</u> Unless terminated earlier as provided herein, the initial term of this Agreement shall commence as of the Effective Date and shall expire two years thereafter (the "Initial Term"). The term of this Agreement shall renew thereafter for successive thirty-day terms (each a "Renewal Term") unless either party notifies the other party in writing of its intent not to

renew this Agreement, and such notice is provided at least thirty days prior to the expiration of the Initial Term or the then-current Renewal Term, as the case may be. The Initial Term and any subsequent Renewal Terms shall collectively be known as the "Term".

(b) <u>Termination.</u> Either party (the "Non-defaulting Party") may terminate this Agreement if the other party (the "Defaulting Party"): (i) is or becomes insolvent; (ii) makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or a receiver is appointed to take charge of all or any part of the Defaulting Party's assets or business; (iii) is the subject of a bankruptcy, whether voluntary or involuntary; or (iv) materially breaches any of its obligations under this Agreement, and such breach is not cured within ten days after the Non-defaulting Party notifies the Defaulting Party in writing of such breach. Additionally, USCC may terminate this Agreement at any time if it ceases to provide Service in Customer's Home Market. Monthly recurring charges for Services shall be prorated to coincide with the termination date and depending on the type of Service and usage incurred during the month of termination, such a proration may result in Customer incurring overage charges.

(c) <u>Cost Difference Reimbursement.</u> USCC agrees not to charge early termination fees for the termination of Customer's Service prior to the end date of the agreement (including any renewal), provided that Customer agrees to reimburse USCC for the Cost Difference on any subsidized or discounted equipment received during the six month period preceding termination (whether of the initial term or any renewal of this Agreement). Cost Difference means the difference between what Customer actually paid for the equipment and the full retail price of the equipment as defined in <u>Exhibit B or Exhibit E</u> or the manufacturer's suggested retail price if the model and/or full retail price is not identified in <u>Exhibit B</u> or <u>Exhibit E</u>. This charge is a reimbursement and not a penalty.

(d) <u>Consequences of Termination</u>. Upon termination or expiration of this Agreement: (i) Customer shall pay all amounts due hereunder to USCC; (ii) USCC shall cease to provide Service hereunder; and (iii) Sections 7 and 9 through 19, as well as any other provision that should naturally extend beyond the termination or expiration of this Agreement, shall survive such expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason.

9. <u>AUTHORIZED USERS.</u>

Customer may appoint one or more persons to manage Customer's account ("Authorized Users"). These Authorized Users will be able to access and make changes to Customer's account, including but not limited to; view

information about the account, add and/or terminate lines of Service, purchase equipment, extend and/or renew the contract term, make payments on the account, etc. Customer is responsible for any account changes made by the Authorized Users.

10. <u>THEFT.</u>

If any Equipment is lost, stolen or otherwise absent from Customer's possession and control, Customer is responsible for all charges until Customer reports the loss, theft, or other occurrence to USCC. USCC may require Customer to provide USCC with a police report or sworn statement verifying the loss or theft before waiving any charges. No such report shall be deemed to be a notice of termination of this Agreement.

11. <u>DISPUTE RESOLUTION.</u>

ANY CONTROVERSY OR CLAIM ARISING OUT OF OR RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE RESOLVED WITH CUSTOMER AND USCC APPOINTING REPRESENTATIVES TO RESOLVE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROCESS OUTLINED IN THE STATE CONTRACT, EXCEPT THAT CUSTOMER AND USCC ACKNOWLEDGE THE STATE WILL NOT BE A PARTY TO ANY DISPUTE .

12. <u>CERTIFICATE OF AUTHORITY.</u>

If Customer is a person, firm, or organization other than the individual user of the Service, the individual agreeing to this Agreement on behalf of such Customer hereby certifies having authority to agree on behalf of Customer.

13. <u>LIMITS OF LIABILITY.</u>

USCC'S LIABILITY REGARDING CUSTOMER'S USE OF THE SERVICES OR RELATED EQUIPMENT, OR THE FAILURE OF OR INABILITY TO USE THE SERVICE OR EQUIPMENT, IS LIMITED TO THE CHARGES CUSTOMER INCURS FOR THE APPLICABLE SERVICE OR EQUIPMENT DURING THE AFFECTED PERIOD. THIS MEANS USCC IS NOT LIABLE FOR ANY INCIDENTAL, INDIRECT CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES (INCLUDING, WITHOUT OR OR LIMITATION, LOST PROFITS LOST **BUSINESS** OPPORTUNITIES), PUNITIVE OR EXEMPLARY DAMAGES, OR ATTORNEYS' FEES.

14. **DISCLAIMER OF WARRANTIES.**

EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE CONTRACT (EXCLUDING THE REQUIREMENT THAT EQUIPMENT BE NEW), USCC MAKES NO WARRANTY REGARDING THE SERVICES. EOUIPMENT OR SOFTWARE AND DISCLAIMS ANY IMPLIED WARRANTY, INCLUDING ANY WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY, INFRINGEMENT OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE. USCC IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR CIRCUMSTANCES BEYOND ITS CONTROL, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION, ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF OTHERS, ATMOSPHERIC CONDITIONS, OR ACTS OF GOD. USCC DOES NOT MANUFACTURE EQUIPMENT OR SOFTWARE, AND CUSTOMER'S ONLY WARRANTIES AND REPRESENTATIONS WITH RESPECT TO EQUIPMENT OR SOFTWARE ARE THOSE PROVIDED BY THE MANUFACTURER (WITH RESPECT TO WHICH USCC HAS NO LIABILITY WHATSOEVER). USCC SHALL HAVE NO LIABILITY TO CUSTOMER OR ANY END USER FOR THE ACCURACY, TIMELINESS OR CONTINUED AVAILABILITY OF ANY SERVICE. 18. <u>NO WAIVER; SEVERABILITY.</u>

USCC's failure to enforce any right or remedy available under this Agreement is not a waiver. If any part of this Agreement is held invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement will remain in force.

22. IN BUILDING REPEATER SYSTEMS.

Customer acknowledges that, pursuant to Section 22.383 of the FCC's Rules (47 C.F.R. 

- WHEREAS, in December, 2019, a novel strain of coronavirus known as COVID-19 was detected, and

- WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services declared a Public Health Emergency; on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic; on March 12, 2020, the Governor of the State of Wisconsin declared a Health Emergency in the State; and on March 20, 2020, Winnebago County, through Winnebago County Executive Mark Harris, declared a local state of emergency
- 16 pursuant to Chapter 323, Wisconsin Statutes; and
- WHEREAS, the federal government has enacted various laws and regulations in response to the COVID-19
 pandemic including, without limitation, the Families First Coronavirus Response Act and the Coronavirus Aid, Relief,
 and Economic Security Act; and
- WHEREAS, because of the COVID-19 pandemic, on March 24, 2020, Secretary-designee Andrea Palm of
 the Wisconsin Department of Health Services issued Emergency Order #12, Safer at Home Order ("Safer at Home
 Order") requiring that everyone in Wisconsin stay at their home or place of residence, except in limited
 circumstances, until April 24, 2020; and
- WHEREAS, on April 16, 2020, Secretary-designee Palm extended the Safer at Home Order, with certain
 modifications, to May 26, 2020, pursuant to Emergency Order #28; and
- WHEREAS, federal, state, local, and individual responses to the COVID-19 pandemic, and the uncertainty as to the effectiveness of those responses in mitigating the duration of the COVID-19 pandemic, have created economic hardship and uncertainty in the County's business community, households throughout the County, and for every County property taxpayer; and
- 30 WHEREAS, prominent economists have predicted record level unemployment rates for the coming months 31 and this prediction suggests that Winnebago County residents will also experience record-level unemployment rates 32 in the coming months, and an unprecedented number of businesses and employers throughout the State and in 33 Winnebago County have been required to suspend operations; and

 waiver is contingent upon a taxation district adopting a resolution in similar form and content as to Winnebago
 County's resolution; and
- 45 WHEREAS, this Resolution (1) serves as Winnebago County's enabling resolution for purposes of Section 46 105(25) of Act 185; (2) authorizes any taxation district located in Winnebago County to waive interest on installment 47 payments of property taxes due and payable after April 1, 2020, in a manner consistent with Act 185, provided the 48 taxation district adopts a similar resolution and otherwise satisfies all conditions precedent to waiver contained in Act 49 185 and this Resolution; and (3) declares that all property taxpayers in Winnebago County are experiencing hardship 50 as a result of the economic conditions associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, the various federal laws and 51 regulations implemented as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the various emergency orders and regulations 52 implemented by state and local governments, and Act 185; and
- WHEREAS, while the plain language of Section 105(25) of Act 185 allows for either a general or a "case-bycase" finding of hardship to qualify for the above-referenced waiver of interest, the County intends, by this Resolution, to authorize a taxation district to waive interest for all property taxpayers in the County otherwise eligible for waiver under Section 105(25) of Act 185 on a finding of general hardship based upon the economic conditions described in this Resolution, which the Board determines has adversely affected all taxpayers in the County; and
- 58 **WHEREAS**, this Resolution is not intended to be construed as authorizing any sort of "case-by-case" finding 59 of hardship by a taxation district.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that, pursuant to
 Section 105(25) of Act 185, it hereby finds and authorizes the following:
- Because of the COVID-19 Pandemic, the various federal laws and regulations implemented as a result of the
 COVID-19 Pandemic, the various emergency orders and regulations implemented by state and local
 governments, and Act 185, the Board finds that all property taxpayers are experiencing hardship as that term
 is used in Section 105(25) of Act 185.
- A taxation district is authorized to waive interest for property taxes payable in 2020 for an installment
 payment that is due and payable after April 1, 2020. This Resolution authorizes a taxation district to waive
 interest as provided in Section 105(25) of Act 185 for all property taxpayers in the taxation district such that if
 a taxation district authorizes the waiver under Section 105(25) of Act 185, it must offer the waiver to all
 property taxpayers in the taxation district. Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing in this Resolution
 authorizes a taxation district to waive interest for property taxes payable in 2020 for an installment payment
 that was due and payable prior to April 1, 2020, except as otherwise permitted under applicable law.
- As provided under Section 105(25) of Act 185, the County shall deviate from the settlement procedure set
 forth in §74.29, Wis. Stat., and instead the County shall settle property taxes and interest collected on or
 before July 31, 2020, on August 20, 2020, as provided under §74.29(1), Wis. Stats., and settle the remaining
 unpaid taxes and interest on September 20, 2020. The August 20, 2020, settlement shall be distributed
 proportionally to the underlying taxing jurisdictions according to payments collected on or before July 31,
 2020.
- Notwithstanding §74.57, Wis. Stats., the County Treasurer is authorized, but not required, to omit from the
 tax certificate delivered to the County on September 1, 2020, all parcels of real property for which a taxation
 district has waived interest and penalties as provided in this Resolution.

89		IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Winnebago County Board of Supervisors that all actions heretofore taken	
90	by the Board and other appropriate public officers and agents of Winnebago County with respect to the matters		
91	contemplated under this Resolution are hereby ratified, confirmed and approved.

93	<u>Fiscal</u>	Note: Winnebago County makes the taxation districts 'whole' each August. Therefore, the County takes on	
94		the responsibility of collecting any remaining unpaid property taxes. Delaying the due date of tax	
95		payments to October 1, 2020, will have a negative impact on County cash flow. In addition, the County	
96		will incur a loss of investment income on cash paid out in August ahead of the October 1 st collection	
97		deadline. Total fiscal impact on the County is unknown at this time. However, the County has a strong	
98		cash position and should be able to manage the cash flow issues.
