Dana Frey has an extensive background in public finance and budgeting both in the US and in a number of other countries. He is currently the Polk County Administrator and previously served as the County Administrator for St. Louis County, MN, a county with a population of over 200,000 and an annual budget of over \$350 million. He has directed a council of county governments in Minnesota and is a former lead fiscal analyst for the Minnesota Senate on intergovernmental finance. Internationally, he has advised the governments of a number of developing countries and directed long-term multi-advisor financial reform projects in Kyrgyzstan, Armenia and Bosnia on behalf of the US, Dutch and Swedish governments. He currently provides training as a short-term expert for the International Monetary Fund and for the government of the United Kingdom in the Caribbean region and is also listed on the expert roster for the United Nations. He has taught graduate courses in public administration and policy evaluation for the past ten years and has authored several articles including as a contributing author to two World Bank publications.
