Who is eligible to eat at a congregate meal site?

- Age 60 or older
- Any spouse who attends the dining center with their spouse who is aged 60 or older
- A person with a disability, under age 60, who resides in housing facilities occupied primarily by older individuals at which congregate nutrition services are provided
- An individual who is disabled who resides at home with an eligible older individual participating in the program

What exactly is Canteen?

Canteen is out of Appleton and makes the food daily for many of the meal sites. It is delivered and served at the meal sites. Canteen also prepares the food that is used for the home delivered meal program through Advocap. The exception to this is that the Pickett Community Center prepares the food for their site as well as the rural sites in the county.

What is the cost?

All of these meals are served Monday through Friday (unless there is a holiday). The actual cost of the meal is \$13.75; though the suggested donation is \$4 per meal or any contribution that the person is able to make. There is NOT a required donation amount and people can attend without having donated. Note that if a person does not live in a housing authority meal site and wants to eat at the location, they still can as long as they meet the above criteria. If a participant would like to have a family member/ friend (who does not meet eligibility criteria) enjoy a meal with them, that person would need to pay \$13.75.

Do I need to RSVP?

RSVP is required by 12pm the business day prior to the meal. There is a sign up sheet facilitated by each meal site manager. Any questions? Please call Advocap at 920-725-2791.

- In just 2 minutes the Biodex SD System's Fall Risk Test measures your risk of falling in comparison to people of your same age.
- It's a starting point that gives you the motivation to improve your balance.

Farmhouse Chicken Cornbread Casserole

FILLING:

- 1 (10.5 oz) can condensed cream of chicken soup, not diluted
- 1 (10.5 oz) can condensed cream of
 mushroom soup, not diluted
- ³/₄ cup milk
- 4 cups cooked, diced chicken
- 1 cup grated cheddar cheese

CORNBREAD TOPPING:

- 1 (8.5 oz) box corn muffin mix
- (such as Jiffy brand)
- 1 (14.75 oz) can cream style sweet corn
- ¹/₃ cup sour cream
- 1 egg
- 2 tablespoons melted butter



INSTRUCTIONS:

- Preheat oven to 400°F. Spray a 3-quart baking dish with cooking spray. If you use a 2-quart dish, the cornbread topping will be slightly thicker and may require a few extra minutes in the oven.
- In a large bowl, whisk together condensed soups and milk. Stir in cooked chicken and cheese.
- Pour chicken mixture into prepared baking dish.
- In a separate bowl, whisk together corn muffin mix, cream style corn, sour cream, egg, and melted butter. Spread evenly over the chicken mixture.
- Bake, uncovered, for about 40-45 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the center of the topping comes out clean. Tent the casserole loosely with foil if the top starts to get too dark before it's cooked through. Let stand for about 5-10 minutes, then serve!

New Long-Term Care Program Option in Winnebago County: Family Care Partnership

Starting January 1st, Family Care Partnership will begin in Winnebago County. The organization that has a contract with the State of WI to operate this program in our county is called My Choice. My Choice is also administering the Family Care Partnership program in these WI counties: Brown, Columbia, Dane, Dodge, Fond du Lac, Jefferson, Manitowoc, Ozaukee, Sauk, Washington and Waukesha. This program joins two other long-term care programs in Winnebago County: Family Care and IRIS (Include Respect, I Self-Direct).

Family Care Partnership can provide acute/primary health care coverage and pharmacy benefits for those eligible for Medicare, along with long term services in an individual's home or community setting (like an assisted living or adult family home). The goal of this program is to help improve the quality of health care and services, to keep the cost of services down, provide a more comprehensive approach to an individual's care (they have a nurse practitioner on staff that works with your current medical team) and improve efficiencies in the current health care delivery system.

To be eligible for this program, an individual must be 18+ years of age, be a frail elder or be an adult with a disability, be eligible for Medicaid, be functionally eligible for this program (through a screen administered by the ADRC), have a long-term health condition that will last more than 90 days, and live in a county that has this program. Limit of one order per residential address. One order includes 4 individual rapid antigen COVID-19 tests. These will be delivered by the United States Postal Service.
