

Key Points:

- Monkeypox does not spread easily to others, and the risk of monkeypox spreading widely throughout our community remains low.
- How to reduce spread of monkeypox:
 - Get vaccinated (if eligible).
 - Ask your healthcare provider to test you if you have a rash consistent with monkeypox.
 - <u>Isolate</u> if infected.
- Winnebago County Health Department is currently offering the JYNNEOS monkeypox vaccine, by appointment only, to individuals at the highest risk of infection based on the <u>Wisconsin</u>
 <u>Department of Health Services</u> prioritization. To make an appointment or see if you are eligible, call 920-232-3026 or email <u>wchd.cd@winnebagocountywi.gov</u>.
