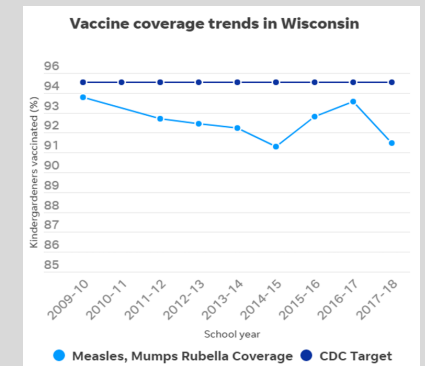

Spotlight: Measles

- As of April 19, 2019, 626 individual cases of measles have been confirmed in 22 states. The states that have reported cases to CDC are Arizona, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Georgia, **Illinois**, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Maryland, Massachusetts, **Michigan**, Missouri, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Oregon, Tennessee, Texas, and Washington.

Spotlight: Mumps Testing

- Buccal Swab for PCR testing (preferably within 3 days of parotitis onset and not more than 9 days after parotitis onset)
- Nasopharyngeal or Oropharyngeal swab should also be collected for Influenza PCR testing
