RIGHT TO REPORT

If you, or someone you know, are experiencing sexual abuse or sexual harassment Winnebago County Sheriff's Office wants to know. We want you to report right away! Why?

- We want to keep YOU safe; it is our job! It is your right to be free from sexual abuse and sexual harassment.
- We want to conduct an investigation of the reported incident.
- We want to hold the perpetrator accountable for his/her actions.
- We want to provide YOU with relevant information and support services.

HOW TO REPORT

The Winnebago County Sheriff's Office offers multiple ways to report sexual abuse and sexual harassment. Reports can be made anonymously.

- Call Reach Counseling at 222 (free call on inmate phone system) or (920) 426-1460.
- Report to any staff, volunteer, contractor, or medical or mental health staff.
- Submit a grievance or a sick call slip.
- Report to the PREA coordinator or PREA compliance manager.
- Tell a family member, friend, legal counsel, or anyone else outside the facility. They can report on your behalf by calling Reach Counseling or The Winnebago County Sheriff's Office at (920)236-7300.
- You also can submit a report on someone's behalf, or someone at the facility can report for you using the ways listed here.

VICTIM SUPPORT SERVICES
