

Winnebago County Health Department COVID-19 Data by School District Geographic Boundary

August 5, 2021 Cases are rising. Get vaccinated & wear a mask.

Summary

- Due to a <u>substantial level</u> of community transmission of COVID-19 in Winnebago County, **the health department** strongly recommends that everyone, vaccinated and unvaccinated, wear a mask in public indoor settings and crowded outdoor venues. Public facing establishments are urged to continue or re-instate masking and distancing indoors and minimally masking for crowded outdoor venues. The <u>new county recommendations</u> are in response to recent <u>guidelines issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)</u> that recommend masking for everyone in areas with substantial and high transmission.
- This fourth wave of COVID-19 cases is dominated by the faster spreading Delta variant. Not enough people are vaccinated to prevent this wave of new cases that will result in more severe COVID-19 symptoms, preventable hospitalizations and premature death in many unvaccinated people. Not since April have case counts been this high and they will continue to rise protect yourself, family, and friends by <u>encouraging vaccination</u> and wearing a mask. Even if vaccinated you may bring this Delta variant home to unvaccinated or immune suppressed family and friends.
- Vaccination and prevention efforts are needed to help prevent more infections. We are making progress on vaccination rates; however, our region is still lagging. Getting vaccinated against COVID-19 prevents severe illness, hospitalization, and death; it also helps reduce the spread of the virus in communities. The vaccines are extremely effective and safe, and the best way to prevent rising cases is for every eligible adult and child to get vaccinated. Communities that are experiencing high rates of infection today are the ones with low vaccination rates. If you are unvaccinated, continue to wear a mask, social distance, and make a plan to get vaccinated.
- Situational Awareness
 - Over the past two weeks, we have reported a total of 211 confirmed + probable cases, a **69% increase** compared to the 125 confirmed + probable cases reported in last week's report.
 - The confirmed + probable case burden is **high** for our jurisdiction. The confirmed + probable case rate over the past 2 weeks for our jurisdiction is **137.2 cases per 100,000 people**.
 - There are at least 300 PCR tests being performed every day in our jurisdiction and this is trending upwards.
 - Over the past two weeks, 4.2% of PCR tests were positive in our jurisdiction. The percent positivity has continued to increase each week since our lowest point in mid-June.
 - There are currently <u>11 COVID-19 patients hospitalized</u> in Fox Valley Area hospitals.
 - The Delta variant is increasing rapidly and is more likely to affect groups of unvaccinated people.
- Current COVID-19 activity level is indicated as <u>high</u> for Winnebago County based on a high burden status over the past two weeks. As long as the virus is still circulating, children under the age of 12 and all other unvaccinated individuals are still at risk of getting COVID-19.
- Vaccines are available any day of the week at a <u>site near you.</u> A <u>regional COVID-19 vaccine tour</u> is occurring throughout the summer with vaccine clinics being held in Winnebago, Calumet and Outagamie counties. Visit <u>www.wcvaccine.org</u> to find answers to your questions about the vaccine and see where you can get vaccinated.
 - 58.5% of Winnebago County residents aged 12 or older have received at least one dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.
 - Everyone <u>12 and older</u> is eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine. *Pfizer is the only vaccine currently approved for 12- to 17-year olds.* Not <u>all locations</u> administer vaccines to those under 18, and not all locations carry Pfizer.
- COVID-19 testing remains an important tool in reducing spread of the virus. Whether you are vaccinated or unvaccinated, get a COVID-19 test if you have symptoms, were exposed to the virus, or feel you need a test.
 - The CDC encourages widespread testing to identify asymptomatic cases to avoid the spread of COVID-19.

Confirmed Cases by School District Geographic Boundary for the Past Two Weeks (July 21 – August 3)

There have been 161 new confirmed cases reported in the past two weeks within the geographic boundaries of the Neenah, Omro, Oshkosh, and Winneconne School Districts. An additional 17 confirmed case reported was within the geographic boundaries of other school districts that only partially fall within our jurisdiction.


Confirmed Case Counts Among Individuals under Age 18 Trended Over Time by School District Geographic Boundary





The graphs on the following pages show how case rates by age group have changed over time for Oshkosh and Neenah School District boundaries. The first graph on each page shows the biweekly confirmed case rates per 100,000 residents. The second graph shows the cumulative confirmed case rates. Cumulative case rates will always trend upward, it is the rate of increase in that trend that helps us understand what populations are being impacted the most. Omro and Winneconne do not have similar graphs due to small population size and small confirmed case counts in these geographic areas.






OSHKOSH AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT GEOGRAPHIC BOUNDARY

Background Information

This report provides *preliminary* data on the confirmed COVID-19 cases from July 21, 2021 – August 3, 2021. A person is counted as a confirmed COVID-19 case if they had a positive confirmatory laboratory test (for example, polymerase chain reaction (PCR) tests or nucleic acid amplification tests (NAT) that detect genetic material of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19). Antigen positive tests are counted as probable cases and are not currently included in the case count rates and graphs in this report. Please view the General Weekly Data Report to learn more about the confirmed and probable case counts, rates, and burden level.

Dates utilized for all graphs and tables are based on test result date and may not represent final reported case counts. Data may be underreported for recent days because results can take multiple days to be reported to the health department. This means the number of tests and percent positivity may change in next week's report. As this is a weekly report for the past 14 days, there will always be a week of overlap between reports.

Data by school district geographic boundary may differ from data provided by the respective school district. School district geographic boundaries are the geographic area from which children are **eligible** to attend a certain school district. Data by school district geographic boundary includes cases among all individuals that live within that boundary regardless of age or where they attend school. In this report, data for school age children (5-17) does not differentiate between where they actually attend school or if they are homeschooled.

*The COVID-19 data provided in this report is specific to the Winnebago County Health Department (WCHD) jurisdiction (population: 153,748). It does not include the portions of the City of Menasha or City of Appleton that fall within Winnebago County as those areas fall within the jurisdiction of the <u>City of</u> <u>Menasha Health Department</u> and <u>City of Appleton Health Department</u>. As of October 3, 2020, data reports from the Winnebago County Health Department do not include test results from residents in Wisconsin Department of Corrections facilities, which includes the Oshkosh Correctional Institute. This data can be found on the Wisconsin Department of Corrections <u>website</u>.

Data provided on the <u>Department of Health Services website</u> may be different than the information provided by WCHD because the state reports data for the entire county based on address, which includes those portions of Menasha and Appleton as well as the correctional facilities.
