When finished, if you wish to proceed, click on "Start new case form". If you have a case number already, click on "Start existing case forms"

You will be required to choose the county before proceeding. Read this carefully before "Choosing the county." Once a county is chosen, a link to "Basic Guide to Divorce in Wisconsin" will appear. It is highly encouraged that you download and save or print this Basic Guide.

When reviewing this Basic Guide to Divorce in Wisconsin, you will have detailed step-by-step directions, a flow chart, and information to guide you through a divorce or legal separation action. This can answer numerous questions you may have. This document will be useful in getting you through the court process over the course of your case.

If you are **not** filing your action electronically, after preparing your original, make a copy for each party. If there are minor children, or if spousal support is requested, make an additional copy. The filing fee is \$194.50 if there are minor children, or if spousal support is requested. Otherwise, the filing fee is \$184.50. Bring the original and all copies, along with your payment by cash, check or money order (payable to "Clerk of Courts") to the Clerk of Courts office, 415 Jackson Street, Oshkosh WI –Room 110. There may be a wait in line before working with a clerk. Once you are with a clerk, the process can take 30 to 45 minutes.
