Interpreter's Agreement to Safeguard Confidential Information

Any information about individuals and the facts of their family situation learned through this interpretation service is considered confidential per §49.83 Wis. Stats. (*see below*). The information may only be used for purposes of the child support program. Unauthorized use or disclosure of this information violates federal and state confidentiality laws. Other sensitive information, in which disclosure could violate a person's right to privacy, must also be protected.

Information considered confidential includes, but is not limited to:

- Names and addresses of individuals involved in a child support case
- Names of individuals identified as potential fathers
- Results of genetic testing
- Income of individuals involved in a child support case
- Any other specific information about the child support case
- Social Security numbers

Confidential information must be safeguarded in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes. The translator's signature on this form constitutes acceptance of responsibility for compliance with §49.83 Wis. Stats. for the current and future interpretation services provided for the child support program.

§49.83 Limitation on giving information. "Except as provided under §49.25 and §49.32 (9), (10) and (10m), no person may use or disclose information concerning applicants and recipients of relief funded by a relief block grant, Aid to Families with Dependent Children, Wisconsin Works under § 49.141 to 49.161, social services, <u>child and spousal support and establishment</u> <u>of paternity services under §49.22</u> or supplemental payments under §49.77 for any purpose not connected with the administration of the programs. Any person violating this section may be fined not less than \$25 nor more than \$500 or imprisoned in the county jail not less than 10 days nor more than one year or both."
