TO BUILD OR NOT TO BUILD...

That is the question. Ok... Perhaps that does sound a bit lame....

During the January 2025 MVMEC Board of Directors meeting, all members that were present were asked to express their opinions and concerns as to our most recent Capital Campaign attempt. In an 8-4 vote, the BOD decided to suspend it. The BOD also agreed unanimously that the future expansion of the building is a good goal for the future.

In the last two capital campaign feasibility studies (one in 2018 and one in 2023), one thing really stands out. Potential donors are not aware of our existence or overall mission. This is something that clearly needs work, but after several years of increased spending on marketing, we have been unable to really change that perception. The number one reason people stop in is the eye-catching position of the building and flag plaza. Additionally, we are getting some visitors through the museum's web sites on the internet.

There is still a definite need for increased fundraising for our organization. Two examples of future needs are:

1. The current building will need repairs as it continues to age. Roof or rooftop HVAC replacement will be quite expensive.
2. The US flagpole in the Flag Plaza is nearing failure and is in need of replacement. If you would like to see what I mean, come down during one of our windy days and watch that pole whip around. Passersby have expressed concerns that the current 4X6 US flag looks "wimpy", but our Buildings and Grounds Committee has serious doubts that the pole would survive the stresses even a 6X10 flag would place on it during heavy windy days. In addition, with the implementation of Space Force, we are short one pole if our goal is to honor all major military branches.

Assuming we are serious about eventually attaining the Phase 2 addition to our current building, we will need to add to our current savings reserve to attain that end goal. The current estimated cost of the addition is approaching \$5,000,000 (5 million dollars). The bottom line is we will need to identify and apply for monetary grants from foundations and perhaps even the Government (tourism dollars, for example) to bring in a flow of cash so we can attain the above goals. Pursuing grants is something we have yet to do.

So, what does that mean for us as an organization? During the December 2024 meeting the BOD decided to disband the Building Task Force and transfer responsibility for a possible building expansion and related fundraising to the MVMEC Executive Council. The Executive Council consists of MVMEC Board President Dale Anderson, Vice President Zach Zabel, Treasurer Joe Miller, Secretary Terri Schlack and the previous Board President Stu Tribbey. I have also asked the Fundraising Committee Chair Tom Sonnleitner to attend so we can have his insights into the issue of fundraising. We have a lot of items we will need to address as we try to lift up our level of professionalism as an organization so we can be more appealing to possible future donors.

I have heard several questions as to when the building expansion will happen. The answer is simple; when we have the money. I have also been asked if we will borrow money for the expansion. That answer is also simple; No. The risk is too great for the gains we would receive from an expansion.

NATIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR DAY

March 25

The Medal of Honor is the United States' highest military decoration. It is awarded to armed forces members who risk their lives, act above the call of duty and fight the enemies of the United States.



For the first fifty plus years, this was the only medal for valor in the military. The youngest to receive the medal was eleven-year-old Willie Johnston during the Civil War. The only female to receive the award was at the beginning of the Civil War. Dr. Mary Edwards Walker made outstanding contributions to medicine.

The Military Veterans Museum & Education Center has dedicated a wall to the 63 Wisconsin recipients of the Medal of Honor. Come visit and hear some of their stories.

AIR FORCE RESERVE BIRTHDAY

April 14

In 1948, President Harry S. Truman created the Air Force Reserve by moving the Army Air Corps Reserve to the Air Force. The history of the Reserves goes as far back as the National Defense Act of 1916.

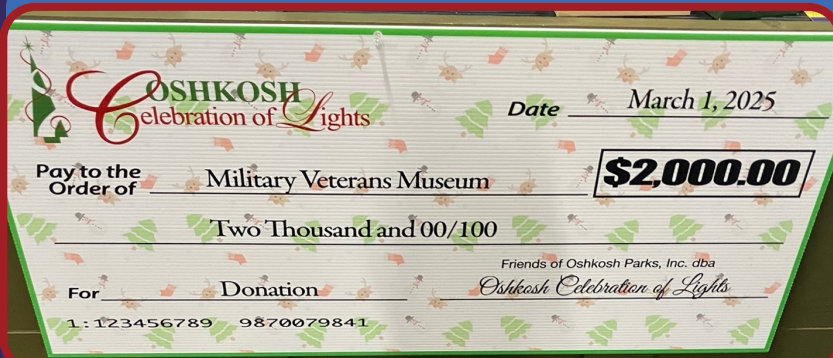
