May: National Stroke Awareness Month

Strokes can happen to anyone, regardless of age. If you've had one stroke, you're at higher risk of having another one. Read on to learn more about the warning signs of a stroke. Recognizing the warning signs of a stroke and calling 911 immediately may affect whether someone recovers from a stroke or faces long-term disability or even death.

When you spot a stroke warning sign, act F.A.S.T.!

- F = Face Drooping: Does one side of the person's face droop, or is it numb? Ask the person to smile is the smile uneven?
- A = Arm Weakness: Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?
- S = Speech Difficulty: Is the person's speech slurred?
- T = Time to call 911! Stroke is an emergency. Call 911 immediately, and keep track of the time when any symptoms first appeared.

Other stroke symptoms may include sudden:

- Numbness or weakness of the face, arm, or leg, especially on one side of the body
- · Confusion, including trouble speaking or understanding speech;
- Trouble seeing in one or both eyes;
- · Trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination; and
- · Severe headache with no known cause.



Baked Ziti with Sausage



- cooking spray
- 1 (16 ounce) package dry ziti pasta
- 1 pound mild Italian sausage
- 1 (15 ounce) container ricotta cheese
- 1 large yellow onion, minced
- 1 large egg
- 2 teaspoons minced garlic
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1 ½ (26 ounce) jars spaghetti sauce, divided
- 1 (8 ounce) package shredded Italian cheese blend
- 1 teaspoon dried basil (optional)
- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease a 9x13-inch baking dish.
- 2. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a rolling boil over high heat. Stir in ziti and return to a boil. Cook pasta uncovered, stirring occasionally, until cooked through but still firm to the bite, about 8 minutes. Drain well.
- 3. While pasta is cooking, heat a large skillet over medium heat. Add sausage; cook and stir until brown, about 10 minutes. Drain sausage and set aside.
- 4. Stir together ricotta, onion, egg, garlic, and oregano in a large bowl until well combined. Stir in pasta, sausage, salt, pepper, and the half jar of spaghetti sauce; mix well.
- 5. Cover the bottom of the prepared baking dish with 1/3 of the full jar spaghetti sauce. Layer with 1/2 of the pasta mixture, 1/2 of the remaining spaghetti sauce, and 1/2 of the shredded cheese. Repeat layers once more using remaining pasta, sauce, and cheese. Sprinkle basil over top and cover the dish tightly with aluminum foil.
- 6. Bake in the preheated oven until heated through, about 20 minutes. Uncover; return to the oven and bake until cheese is melted, 5 to 10 more minutes.

Dear Fred,



There are a few options for you. The Valley VNA offers Foot Care Clinics at various locations. Each appointment is approximately 20 minutes and the cost varies, but is about \$28 per session. The appointment includes a foot exam by a Registered Nurse, foot soak, massage, callus reduction, toenail file/trim, education, and other referrals as appropriate. Please call 920-727-5555 for an appointment. The Valley VNA Winnebago County locations include the Neenah YMCA, Downtown Oshkosh YMCA, and the Valley VNA building. Valley VNA also goes to the Oshkosh Senior Center. To schedule an appointment at the Oshkosh Senior Center location please contact them directly at 920-232-5310. Currently they schedule appointments on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 9:00am to 3:00pm.

Below are some other local agencies that will come right to your home for foot and nailcare:

- * Nail Care, LLC: A registered nurse will come to your home to complete foot care. She serves the Fox Valley area. Please contact 920-840-3521 for more information and to discuss pricing.
- * Lotus Foot Care, LLC: Provides in-home foot care and serves Winnebago County. The cost is approximately \$55 per home visit. The visit is an hour long, which includes an assessment of lower legs and feet, trimming toenails, checking for corns and calluses and reduction, education, and referrals to doctor if needed. 

- WINNEBAGO COUNTY STATISTICS In 2023, Adult Protective Services received 869 referrals
- 60% of calls needed an investigation that took more than one contact
- 20% of the referrals were for financial exploitation
- 20% were for concerns with Dementia that impacted safety



WARNING SIGNS

- Unexplained financial transactions
- New names added to bank accounts
- Weight loss or malnourishment
- Withdrawal from family or friends
- Mood or behavior changes
