April: Autism Awareness Month

What is Autism? Autism is a developmental disability that typically appears before the age of 3. Autism impacts brain development in areas that affect social interaction, communication skills, and cognitive functioning. Autism is a spectrum disorder, so there are varying levels of severity.

According to the website "Autism Speaks", 1 in 44 children in the United States were diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder in 2018. The diagnosis is 4 times more likely in boys than girls. Autism does not discriminate and can affect children in all ethnic and socioeconomic groups. About 40 percent of people with Autism are nonverbal.

The Autism Society of Greater Wisconsin is a great local agency that offers a number of resources. They have an information and referral phone line for people who have Autism, their families, and caregivers. They provide one-on-one support to help provide information, make referrals, and educate others on Autism. They provide a number of virtual trainings, support groups, and social activities. April 2nd is World Autism Awareness Day. The "Friends of Autism" organization generally hosts a local, annual "Walk-4-Autism" event. The event is on hold for 2022, but will resume next year. Some ways to celebrate April 2nd would be to wear the color blue, donate to "Friends of Autism", or simply embrace people who are different from you.

Ham & Cheese Quiche

- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1/2 medium yellow onion, chopped
- 4 eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 cup half-and-half
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 1/2 cups diced ham
- 1 cup shredded swiss cheese
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 deep dish frozen pie crust




- 1) Preheat oven to 375 degrees.
- 2) Melt butter in a small nonstick pan and cook onion until soft. Let cool slightly.
- 3) In a large bowl, whisk together eggs, half-and-half, salt and pepper.
- 4) Stir in ham and both cheeses.
- 5) Stir in cooked onion.
- 6) Pour filling into pie crust, set on a baking sheet and place in oven for 40 to 45 minutes, or until set.
- 7) Serve warm or chilled.

Senior Centers and Community Centers in Winnebago County

Senior and Community Centers are a great gathering place for adults to visit, learn, exercise, share a meal, and travel with each other! In our last newsletters, we have featured the Omro Area Community Center and Menasha Senior Center. This month we will feature the Pickett Community Center. In a future newsletter, you will learn more about the Oshkosh Senior Center.

The Pickett Community Center's mission is to enhance the quality of life for all ages by providing social and educational opportunities, resources, and services. Their vision statement is to be a one-stop Community Center for all ages.

Their Center was purchased from the Ripon School District in 1975 by member of the community. A non-profit organization was then formed called the Jasper Pickett Foundation.

They are a sub-contracted provider of Advocap for the Winnebago County Nutrition Program. They are unique in that they are the only nutrition site in Winnebago County that cooks and serves their meals onsite in their state certified kitchen with their own cook! They serve about 1900 meals per month to three other meal sites and homebound individuals.

They are an accredited Senior Center through the Wisconsin Association of Senior Centers (WASC). In their Center, they also have a state licensed preschool program for 3 year olds that is held three mornings per week.

They have regular crochet classes, card classes, and Sheepshead. On the 2nd Sunday of the month, they host an affordable "all you can eat" country breakfast that is sponsored by different local organizations. They also host other fundraising events like a pizza sale, dart ball and bowling tournaments, Fall Fest, and Christmas Tree Lighting.

Community members can rent their shelter, shelter grounds, kitchen, dining room, and activity room. They have a monthly newsletter called "Pickett Community News" as well as a nice website and Facebook page. Take a minute to check them out!


In-Home COVID-19 Vaccination Service




SHOUT OUT!

Day by Day Warming Shelter - Closing for Spring/Summer

The last day that individuals can stay at the Day by Day Warming Shelter in Oshkosh is April 15th. Their overnight shelter will re-open on October 15th. They will be having summer outreach on Mondays-Thursdays from 10am-2pm. The start date of this is to be determined yet. During their summer outreach hours, they offer snack items as available, showering facilities, and can assist with washing laundry. They are able to give out 1 sleeping bag per person (also based on donation). They can give out hygiene items, clothing items, etc... (based on donations). Individuals are able to take a nap if needed as well. Programming is also available throughout the summer to assist individuals who are homeless in accessing resources and achieving goals.

There are still many efforts underway to raise money to build and new warming shelter in Oshkosh that will be open 365 days per year and increase capacity from 25 to 50. The campaign is called "Building Hope". You can donate by using the link below or contacting the shelter at 920-203-4536.
