# **NULES & REGULATIONS** Hours: 7 am - 11 pm daily

April 1 - November 1 annually

- No vehicles on grass
- Parking in designated lots only
- No off-road motorized vehicles (ADA mobility devices excluded)
- No overnight camping
- Catch and release fishing only (barbless hooks recommended)

- No glass containers
- No smoking, campfires or fireworks
- Carry In/Carry Out all trash
- No Dogs allowed
- No swimming, boating or golfing
- Biking allowed on 8' wide trail only

# Points of Interest

- **1** Site Entrance—Site gate on Walter Street opens daily at 7 am and closes at 11 pm for dusk to dawn park operating hours.
- Parking Lot—Park here for hiking trail access. Parking lot construction features canopy shade trees along curb. Lot constructed using recycled asphalt shingle

- **Products. B ADA Parking Stall**—ADA accessible parking spot and drop off area.
- Drop off Loop—Easy access loop for visitor drop off. Area features natural wood barriers and seating opportunities.
  Hiking Trail—Access to the hiking trail
  - Hiking Trail—Access to the hiking trail northern loop. Hiking trail constructed with natural granite material. Hiking trail reserved for walkers only (no bicycles beyond the restroom).
    - Bike Trail Connection to Fernau Ave—Paved access to bike trail and park from Fernau Avenue. Trail open to hiking and bikes.
- Ponds—Northern site pond features catch and release fishing opportunities for all ages. Southern site pond features wooded wetlands and bird watching opportunities. Bird species observed at the ponds include Green Herons and Yellow Warblers.
- S Fishing Pier—Pier for fishing and nature observation. Pier constructed using recycled composite deck and railing materials.
  - Stacked Stone Fishing Access—Two stone fishing access areas provide room for observing nature and fishing line casting.
    - **D** Restroom—Site restroom includes an ADA accessible facility in a screened enclosure.
