The Early Intervention Program is a system of services available to support families who have children with developmental delays and assist them in helping their children develop and learn.

The earlier a child's developmental delays are discovered, the more opportunities there are for a child to increase their abilities.

The goal is to help children participate in their family activities and communities. The Early Intervention program is committed to providing services in a way that makes sense for each family.



Intake/Screening: After receiving the referral, our Intake Coordinator will contact you to find out what your concerns are for your child's development and conduct a screening to determine if an evaluation is warranted.

Evaluation: A developmental evaluation will then be conducted to determine eligibility for the program. A child is eligible for enrollment if they are demonstrating a significant delay or if they have a diagnosis which may lead to delayed development.

Family Assessment/IFSP Development: If your child is eligible, we will ask for more information about your family, your routines and what you'd like to see your child participate in more easily. That information is used to develop an Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) which includes goals you have and a plan for services and support from the program.

Transition: As your child approaches age three or your family is no longer in need of Early Intervention support, we will help you identify programs that your child and family could participate in and guide you through the transition process.



Our Services

The services outlined in your child's IFSP will include the designation of a primary coach who will work with you most frequently, but your family will also have our full team of professionals to provide support in any area you might need, whenever you need them.

The Early Intervention team will provide ideas and strategies to help your family enhance your child's development and learning potential. They will focus on what is naturally happening in your child's life, therefore, services are provided in your home, your child's child care setting, or other places in the community.
