
ADAM ALEXANDER

DISABLED AMERICAN VETERAN OF THE YEAR

While fighting in Afghanistan a sniper bullet hit Alexander through the center of his forehead, causing him to lose his right eye.

Today Alexander co-hosts "The Outpost" on public access television which aims to bring awareness to the DAV and gives a platform for veterans to share their stories. He has also provided testimony to the WI State Legislature for a bill that would expand eligibility for property tax credits for disabled veterans. Now his main goal is to be a voice and provide a platform for those who saw their careers unexpectedly cut short due to illness or injury.

The Disabled American Veteran of the Year is awarded to veterans who, despite their wounds, have had a substantial impact in serving their brothers and sisters in arms.
