At 9:30 am the program will begin in Circus World's Hippodrome building. Sergeant Major Bryan Ward will deliver the keynote address, Circus World Director Scott O'Donnell will lead the proceedings with an invocation and prayers, the Pledge of Allegiance, The National Anthem and a medley of armed forces service songs honoring all branches of the military, by vocalists Nancy Rago and Dave SaLoutos, accompanied by Circus World Musical Director Larry Stout.

At the ready will be a display of patriotic themed circus wagons from the unparalleled collection of authentic parade wagons housed at Circus World. Among the priceless vehicles will be the "UNITED STATES" Tableau and Our Country Tableau. Both were constructed in 1903 to inspire folks who attended the street processions created by the Barnum and Bailey Circus of Bridgeport, Connecticut, and the Ringling Bros. Circus of Baraboo.
